

SEAWALL REPAIRS UNDERWAY

Repairs to the seawalls along Flinders Parade, Brighton and Sandgate, and Lover's Walk in Shorncliffe are underway.

The seawalls were damaged during the 2013 Australia Day storm event. A Council spokesperson said the works will involve:

- Repairing and replacing over 600m of damaged seawall capping;
- Repairing approximately 60m3 of damaged seawalls; and
- Backfilling minor voids behind damaged seawall sections.

Works commenced on 25 September 2013 and are expected to be completed by 31 October 2013.

HISTORY BITES

Geologically and historically some things are incredible to consider. To this end let's briefly pull back to a time in our history referred to as the late Triassic Period. More specifically . . . around 215 million years ago?

The dominant sedimentary environment back then consisted of fresh water swamps and streams into which the foliage of typical plants of the period fell or were washed... "Tree ferns, Seed ferns, Cycads, Ginkgos and Horse tails... The fossils of such plants are still contained in outcrops of rock at the mouth of Cabbage Tree Creek, Shorncliffe.

Rock-forms of this type continue around the headland above the present pier and then turn west towards the shopping centre of Sandgate. From here the cliff line continues on in a north - westerly direction along Brighton Road and Brighton Terrace, Running parallel to the present shore, it represents the former position of the coastline when the sea level was higher. Within the layers of this rock, carbonaceous shale deposits give us an indication of the rich plant life that existed then. A riverine rainforest of food for plant-eating dinosaurs of the time, possibly the unidentified bipedal dinosaur and a labvrinthodont amphibian, found in fossil evidence elsewhere in Brisbane.

More recently, that is, during the last million years, ice ages have alternated with warmer interglacial periods, with far reaching effects on the planet. This has resulted in fluctuations in sea levels, causing Moreton Bay to be emptied probably four times in the last 120,000 years.

During the last ice age the sea level was 150 metres lower than at present and the coastline was well east of Cape Moreton. The Brisbane River flowed across what is now the bed of Moreton Bay. North-easterly it was possibly joined by its tributaries the Pine and the Caboolture Rivers. It continued flowing north past what is now Moreton Island, before entering the ocean.

With the end of the ice age, sea levels rose to approximately a metre above present levels. Shorncliffe became an island at high tide with the sea breaking along the cliffs extending through Sandgate and north to Brighton. Since then sea levels fell again until approximately 2,000 years ago.

From this time levels have continued again to rise slowly. And so the cycle continues. The four fresh water lagoons are fairly recent formations caused by the sealing up of small drainage creeks blocked by levee deposition of sand or soil along larger creeks such as Cabbage Tree Creek, around 6000 to 3,000 years ago.






