

FESTIVE FEAST BRINGS LOCALS TOGETHER

SANDBAG will host their annual Christmas lunch on December 25th, providing an occasion for locals to come together and celebrate the festive season. If you or your family will be on your own this year, for any reason at all, please feel welcome to come along to this free community event.

The initiative began ten years ago, with generous volunteers from around Sandgate gathering to organise a Christmas day feast for socially isolated people who would generally spend Christmas alone, such as those who are homeless or have no family.

Held at the Sandgate Community Centre, the event usually draws a crowd of around 100 people of all ages, who enjoy a feast and receive a Christmas gift from Santa. On the day, a gourmet Christmas banquet of ham, chicken, vegetables and desserts are served by volunteers, along with a variety of drinks and Christmas cake.

Every year, the dining hall and tables are decorated with spectacular fairy lights, wreaths, tinsel and Christmas trees, which adds to the festive ambience. In addition, local entertainers perform live music and Santa Claus will make an appearance to greet attendees, who all receive a Christmas gift.

Gary Hunt, a support worker at the Sandgate Community Centre, has been involved with SANDBAG for several years and says the event is always a fantastic occasion for locals to socialise. "I get a big kick out of seeing people who normally wouldn't have anywhere to go, come together on Christmas day and celebrate the festivities."

An event like this requires the efforts of volunteers to perform a variety of tasks, such as decorating the center, wrapping gifts, carving ham, working in the kitchen, serving food and assisting with the clean up. Last year, SANDBAG was inundated with volunteers and is hoping for an equally successful Christmas lunch event this year.

Donations of gifts from the community are required to ensure that disadvantaged people receive a Christmas present on the day. SANDBAG is encouraging the local community to get behind this event by donating Christmas gifts to those less fortunate, which can be dropped off at local MP Stirling Hinchcliffe's office. Presents suitable for men are in particular demand this year, so give generously to this wonderful cause.

A meeting will be held for volunteers later this month to allocate jobs and discuss the upcoming event. Anyone who wishes to help out as a volunteer or register to attend this year's Christmas lunch can contact SANDBAG on 3869 3244. ••



The show runs for eighty minutes, culminating in a huge fireworks display. The theme is about Christmas and focusing on 'Christ' in Christmas. There is an adult choir along with soloists. Children will be dancing and singing as well as a variety of Christmas Carols for the audience to sing along with. There will also be media dances. This is where a group of teen dancers interact with moving images projected onto the stage.

The festival however, is not just a one-night celebration. "Another aspect to the festival week is 'Acts of Kindness'. This provides an opportunity for us all to get into the Christmas spirit," Rachel says.

"We like to encourage the community to present an 'Act of Kindness' for a neighbour or a complete stranger that is in need. We are super excited about starting the construction of a sensory garden for the Autism Queensland School in Brighton."

There is also a hamper night on December 8, where people from the community are invited to help pack hampers for people in need in the 4017 area.

A number of Seniors Lunches are also coordinated in the second week of December in various venues across the 4017 area. The community is also encouraged to hold Street Parties, as a way to get to know your neighbours at Christmas, when for some, it can be a time of great loneliness.

The Bracken Ridge Baptist Church is passionate about the 4017 community and wants everyone to be inclusive of one another this Christmas. The festival provides an opportunity to share this meaning of Christmas. ••

The Unplugged Cafe, the monthly concert run by SANDBAG, will celebrate its 10th anniversary on Friday 4 December.

Since its inception, Unplugged Cafe has seen thousands of patrons enjoy a night of entertainment and hospitality with family and friends.

The event was the brainchild of Susan Black (former SANDBAG staffer) and Zoli Moritz (Music By The Sea coordinator) as an opportunity to bring the community together socially to enjoy local talent.

Assisted by Steve Williams (former head of SANDBAGs social enterprise, SEED), who organised the first group of kitchen volunteers, Unplugged Cafe was up and running, with all proceeds going to help SANDBAG assist local people in need.

Over the years, scores of musicians, comedians and actors have graced the Unplugged stage, supported by a team of volunteers who run the kitchen and bar, sell tickets, set up, clean

up, manage the sound desk, and compère the shows. SANDBAG also partners with local restaurants and eateries to offer quality meals on the night.

Unplugged has a history of long serving workers. Zoli Moritz coordinated Unplugged Cafe right up until the end of 2013. Other locals with long associations include Paula Evans, Karen Williamson, John Bambrick and Po Childs, while Garry Hunt has been keeping the kitchen and bar going since 2010.

Current kitchen volunteers Jacqui Geary, Kamlesh Singh, Naema Abadselam and Chris Butler have also been involved for many years.

In December, Unplugged will feature the artists nominated by patrons as their favourite performers of recent times.

A TWIST TO ROCK UNDER THE CLOCK

t would seem Sandgate can't get enough of its very own homegrown rock band, The Sonics.

Back for their third concert, the band is eager to showcase what they do best and that's playing their much loved 50's and 60's hits. With crowd pleaser Jim Hansen on vocals, Sandgate Town Hall will come alive once more with rock 'n' rollers taking to the dance floor.

This show however is one with a difference. The Sonics have brought an exciting dimension to their musical repertoire with the introduction of 'Ladies of Rock' presented by the versatile singer Nicky Steele. For band member Garry McDonald, bringing Nicky into the line-up means they can pay special tribute to the many female artists of the era - Dusty Springfield, Connie Francis, and legendary 'girl groups' like the Shirelles and The Ronettes.

Nicky originally trained in classical opera. At the age of sixteen years she performed in a talent quest that lead her to sing in a jazz band, and her musical career grew from there. She has since had a diverse performing history of jazz, pop and funk. She has been singing with the Allan Brown Big Band since 1990 - which plays all genres of music from 1940's jazz to 2010's rock.

Nicky says, "I feel very flattered to be asked to join The Sonics who have had such a long history together, and I am really looking forward to performing on the night. This music makes you smile and tap your feet, you just can't help it."

Nicky will be performing Lesley Gore's 1963 song, 'You Don't Own Me'. This has recently gained prominence by Australian artist 'Grace' who topped the Australian charts with her version of the song.

There will also be a duet with Jim and Nicki – likely to be a Sonny and Cher number, tells Nicki.

Garry says, "Nicki will bring a lot of fun to the stage and with that a lot of glamour too".

Nicki leads a completely different lifestyle by day, as she is a Sergeant in the Queensland Police Service, training officers in firearms, taser and hand-to-hand operational skills. But as she says, "it's a refreshing change to take off the holster and wear some heels!" ••

A FABULOUS FASHION AFFAIR

December 12 will mark the opening of the first 'FAB 14 Plus' markets, which are a perfect opportunity to clean out your wardrobe, fill it with something new, and meet others with similar fashion interests in the process.

The idea for the markets sparked from a conversation between market organisers, Juls and Ange, who both work at Brighton Health campus, and it grew from there.

After spotting the need for more ways for ladies to sell their FAB (Fashions Already Bought) sizes 14 and over clothing, Juls and Ange set about making the markets a reality. "We really came up with the idea one day when we were just gossiping about clothes", says Ange.

"We know that for us, we have clothes we don't use anymore, and there are probably a lot of other ladies in the same position, so why not have a market?" The market has around 25 stalls

already booked out, and is continuing to grow.

Juls and Ange believe there is a real need for a market of this type, "Sizes 14 and over, can often be more expensive in retail stores," says Ange. "This is why it's a great opportunity for people to sell their clothes back for money."

While the market is for clothes size 14 and over, Juls emphasises that the markets will have something for everyone. "There will be an array of jewellery, handbags and accessories in the stalls too, so you might find something great, even if it's not clothing," she says.

It's clear the ladies have put a lot of thought into the accessibility and convenience of the markets for both the shoppers and the stall holders. They decided to have it indoors at the Brighton Health Campus, so it will go ahead come rain or shine, and it is on a large flat area to make it easier to move around. There will be a coffee cart, as well as a change room attached to each stall. They will also provide each stall with a table and tablecloth, a dressing room and a mirror.

Following the first market in December, Ange and Juls plan to hold the markets every two months, so there will be plenty of opportunities to shop the markets, or even pick up a stall.

Tucked inconspicuously between the Sandgate Post Office and Classic Images Beauty Salon on Brighton Terrace, the bar is a hidden gem on the suburb's main thoroughfare.

Owner Jason Davis says the idea stemmed from a conversation on his back deck eight months ago.

"Four friends and I were sitting around talking about starting together a bar that we ourselves would like to hang out in," he says.

"We looked around at different places, even as far afield as Nundah and Clayfield, but we gravitated back to home base, found this premises and it all fell into place".

Fellow owner and next door neighbour Marco Agostini, who owns II Forno Pizzeria on 3rd Avenue, and Jason banded together the troops to turn the idea into a reality.

"We needed someone who could build so we roped in one of our friends who can build anything from scratch, and another of our friends is an accountant and a Czechoslovakian brewer, which seemed to fit perfectly," Jason says.

"I am in marketing so I handle that and Phil works for Nightlife Entertainment, who organise music systems for bars, so we thought: 'Hang on it's the dream team.'

"We did most of the work ourselves, pulled in every favour we've ever had and then some, all in about 14 weeks."

Jason says the bar embraces a slice of Sandgate history, from the furnishings, design and even the name.

"The name comes from the old boot maker Bob Henderson, who operated in Sandgate from about the 1920s to the 1970s," he says.

"We have a picture of Bob at the top of the stairs standing in this spot, with a dirt road out the front and nothing else around.

"We have tried to preserve the old boot making, handmade feel; the original brick wall in the front is featured, as well as the galvanised iron, leather, steel and original handmade wooden tool boxes."

Jason says there is more in store for Mr Henderson, with gourmet food trucks, community collaborations and future events, including a potential laneway festival.

"Sandgate's awesome and we want to make it so you don't have to go to the Valley to go to a bar," Jason says.

"We want to work with other bars and restaurants and get more happening in the area." ••

OLD SHORNCLIFFE PIER IMMORTALISED IN MURAL

t seems very fitting that a mural of the old Shorncliffe Pier now resides at the Volunteer Marine Rescue (VMR) Club in Shorncliffe. An organisation based around marine safety.

The heritage of Shorncliffe Pier is special for many VMR members as it has been a significant landmark to the small seaside suburb of Shorncliffe. Over the years, VMR has played a key role in the Brisbane to Gladstone Yacht Race patrolling and keeping boaties safe during this period. The Shorncliffe Pier marked the start of the race.

The concept for the mural all began when a representative from Brisbane City Council sent a letter requesting ideas for the use of the wood from the old pier.

The club put their heads together and came up with a submission to erect a Memorial Wall. VMR member Tony Lloyd says, "it is dedicated to all of our past, present and future members."

Col Nielson also a VMR member headed the building project and the club all chipped in to build the wall that screens a water tank.

The idea then was put forward for a mural to

be painted of the Shorncliffe Pier. A member supplied a photograph of the pier and artist Kim Mancini was commissioned to paint the mural.

"It was about capturing the essence of Shorncliffe and the Pier" says Kim. Particular reference has been given to the boardwalk of the pier that carried so many locals out along the pier and for many holds so many memories.

Kim has managed to fuse her adaption of the pier seamlessly with the wooden timber of the Memorial Wall. There is a real synthesis between the mural and the wooden boards of the pier.

Kim has also created the clever illusion that wherever you are standing the pier appears to be directly in front of you. For Tony Lloyd, "seeing the mural hits you with the 'wow factor'."

The timber came from two sources - the Brisbane City Council and Envirosite, who were contracted to pull the old pier down.

It certainly is worth a trip down to Allpass Parade to view the mural. You may even spot Kim working on a second mural. This mural takes a step back in time and reflects on the yesteryear of Shorncliffe. Perhaps a visit to VMR could coincide with Friday night 'Sunset Drinks' at the newly opened bar. ••

The 'Log On' and 'Log Off' service is available free of charge, to log all the details from you for your trip; by either telephone or marine radio. Our Call Sign is 'Marine Rescue Brisbane' and we monitor the following frequencies: VHF Radio: 16, 67, 73, 21, 81 and 27 Mhz Radio: 88, 91

Of course we have an emergency service 24/7 on ph:0428 022 881.

Our Waterside Assist membership is invaluable should your vessel run into problems, and it can

happen to anyone. You are covered for towing (up to 2 hours) without charge. Join in December for just \$35* and this will cover you up to 30 June 2016. You will then be invoiced in June 2016 for a full year membership of \$60 p/a.

"DUGONGS" DEFEND THE REEF

The Mavis Filmer award, given to honour environmental efforts in the Moreton Bay region, hasn't been endowed to anyone for at least ten years.

But this year, things have changed!

Local environmental group, the Dugong Collective, are the Mavis Filmer Award winners for 2015 and have been recognised for an outstanding contribution to the environment.

The group were awarded the honour at Redcliffe Seaside Artists gallery on 4th November.

The Mavis Filmer award was originally created to honour the late owner of the Filmer Palace Hotel by the original dugong group the Redcliffe Dugongs. This troupe was the brain child of Richard Lancaster and started in 1998 out of concern for a small heard of dugongs in Moreton Bay. The group grew enormously in popularity, inducting prominent members Peter Beattie and Steve Irwin. When they disbanded there was a void left within the environmental community.

Richard Lancaster, the chairman for the Mavis Filmer Awards, says the Dugong Collective filled this need to give a voice to the marine life in Moreton Bay.

"This year because of the tremendous work of Ray, Angie and Malaika Gannon in the dugong

collective, we decided we would award them the Mavis Filmer Award". he said.

"They literally picked up what the Redcliffe Dugongs were doing. They have built on what we did in the 1990s and early 2000s. The Mavis Filmer award is given by our little committee, which are all ex-Redcliffe Dugongs, to people who have done great work in relation to looking after the environment and indeed the wild creatures of the Moreton region."

Angie Gannon, who started the Dugong Collective with her husband Ray, says they are just a group of people who love marine life and want to make a difference.

"We're just very passionate about the dugongs, turtles and dolphins in the bay," Angie said.

Their enthusiasm for the reef has certainly attracted a lot of attention with over 5,000 people signing up to be members of the Dugong Collective. Their latest campaign is concentrated on trying to prevent littering in the bay.

"We have a lot of followers who go along picking up rubbish, fishing line, hooks and plastic from the shore. We're also trying to get the council to have a patrol sweep along the rocks where the rubbish gets caught. I know the Redcliffe council have a tractor that cleans the beach to get rid of all of the bits, but nothing gets up on to the rocks. When it's high tide or it has been stormy all the rubbish gets stuck up there."

The group are also currently trying to raise money to install a life-size dugong statue featuring a Mother and her calf in the Redcliffe CBD area.

"There are tourist signs with the dugongs on and everybody always drives around and says well, where are they?" Angie says.

"We don't want people to actually go out there looking for the dugongs because they are very shy creatures and very important too. We thought why not have a designated spot in Redcliffe so that people can come and see it. They can sit and have a coffee and admire the statue. They don't have to go out there to disturb the dugongs."

The Dugong Collective have a stall at the Redcliffe markets every Sunday with all of the proceeds going towards conservation efforts.

Next year the Mavis Filmer awards will be back with another deserving recipient. ••

PROPERTY MARKET REVIEW

The recent sales market remains very active, and good sales results have been achieved across all price brackets.

You know the market is tracking northwards when recent Auction results have premium priced properties selling under the hammer, with multiple bidders registered and bidding. A sale on Flinders Parade for over \$2 million is clear evidence of these results.


These results are a reflection of the lack

of houses advertised for sale. This can be attributed to a number of reasons, but is mainly a result of reduced interest rates. Buyers who purchased through the 2010-12 period can be saving as much as \$10,000 per annum on their repayments with today's rates compared to when they bought. Therefore mortgage pressure is not a determining factor when selling at the moment.

Reduced listings and low interest rates lead to increased buyer competition, and therefore an increase in sales prices achieved. The only market condition slowing some investor buying is an increase in deposit requirements by most lenders.



WHAT'S IN A NAME?

WOULD YOU BELIEVE - that the Sandgate museum has extensively researched house names and street addresses in Sandgate, Shorncliffe, Deagon and Brighton, and has compiled an alphabetical list from "ABBEVILLE" to "ZENDA" - and the list totals 430 names.

Research dates back as far as 1850 and from Brisbane City Council maps dated 1953. The list is also formatted alphabetically by street names from "AGNES ST" to "YUNDAH ST".

The Brisbane City Council did not issue street numbers until the late 1940s, and it was common to include house names in addresses.

This means you can research what the original name of your house was in earlier times.

WOULD YOU ALSO BELIEVE - the museum has a STREET REFIDEX dated 1954 that shows residents names in each street.

This means you can look up who lived at your address 60 years ago.

AND WOULD YOU ALSO BELIEVE - many streets have had their names changed over the years.

Flinders Parade was originally Lower Esplanade.

Eagle Terrace and Park Parade was Upper Esplanade.

Pier Avenue was an extension of Kate St until the pier was built in 1882.

Allpass Parade was once Wharf Street.

All of the avenues off Flinders Parade - 1st Ave to 18th Ave - all had names

2nd Avenue was called Wilson Street after the Minister from the nearby Baptist Church.

18th Avenue was Regent Street.

The Historical Society has 65 recorded altered names of streets.

Call in at the Sandgate museum and ask staff to research your house or street. [Original maps and publications are archived and require the use of special gloves]

The Historical Society would love to update and record your house name and the reason why you chose the name. ••
