

A WORD FROM OUR REPRESENTATIVES

The foreshore parklands remain very popular, even through the cooler winter months.

I've been pleased to support \$480,000 in funding to upgrade one kilometre sections of the shared pathway to

the north of the Sandgate Pool.

A four hundred meter section between Ninth and Tenth Avenues has been rebuilt as a wider path, and around six hundred meters have been built from Nineteenth Avenue through to Twenty-Third Avenue between Eventide and the sea wall.

Further work to continue to widen and upgrade the pathway between Tenth and Nineteenth Avenues now needs to be done, which will be more costly due to the different levels of the pathway between the sea wall and the road. This is part of my budget submission for the 2015/16 Council Budget.

It's important for people using these pathways to remember they are shared paths- so courtesy like keeping to the left of the path and cyclists ringing bells when approaching pedestrians is very important.

Also, I'm pleased to allocate further funding of \$26,000 to replace bench seating along the Brighton foreshore areas.

The Council tennis / basketball courts in Ferguson Park, Bracken Ridge (behind the library) are open to the public and are extremely popular. The courts can also be used at night until 10pm. There is no booking

system for the courts, so it is a case of first in first served. If you are using them, please be mindful of others who may be waiting to use the courts so that everyone has a chance to have a game. The playground on the western side of the tennis courts in Ferguson Park is being upgraded. The work will include removing all of the playground equipment except the timber climbing wall, decking and attached bank slide. Soil and turf will be put in. Tree trimming and lifting of branches will also be undertaken to open up the area for better casual surveillance and security. A new playground with a shade structure will be built in the top two-thirds of the existing playground area. It is anticipated that the project will start in early May and the area will be fenced off for approximately 5-6 weeks until the turfed areas are established.






BARRY'S GARDENING TIPS

Barry Batchelor, Your Local Gardening Expert

t's a great time of the year to be planting vegetables and flowers in Sandgate. With plenty of moisture still in our soils and a reduction in those hot days, Sandgate gardeners should be in for a bumper crop of vegetables and a beautiful flowering winter garden.

It's also a good time to clean up your garden beds, and prune overhanging branches to increase winter sunshine. Why not make a fresh compost pile from your prunings, adding fine layers of fresh nitrogen rich lawn clippings for heat?

This time of year is an ideal time to plant evergreen fruit trees. Don't forget to clean up existing fruit trees, remove weeds, and apply lime, compost and fresh mulch; keep an eye out for citrus scale, and if present spray with white oil late in the day. Make sure you mulch to beyond your fruit trees' drip line or 30cm past the further most growth.

April is an ideal time to weed and clean up your pot plants, re-pot with a high quality potting mix and fertilise with a slow release fertiliser (all available from the Garden Gate Nursery). Keep an eye out for weeds which have gone to seed; weeds in seed should be carefully placed into your wheelie bin as composting may not destroy all seeds.

The approach of winter is the time to sow peas, plant brassicas (broccoli, kales and cabbages), and root crops like beetroots; continue planting onions and greens like spinach, rocket and silverbeet as they love the cooler months.

As the weather cools watering can be reduced to garden beds; a simple trick is to pull back your mulch and check the soil for moisture. A slightly damp, cool soil is ideal.

Cambodian soiree will be held in May to raise funds for the grass-roots, not-for-profit organisation Feeding Dreams. The organisation runs a community school, providing free education, school meals and community support to over 800 children and families living in the slums of Siem Reap.

The event will include three courses of traditional Cambodian cuisine serenaded by vocalist and acoustic guitarist Emily Gilhome, as well as a silent auction and raffle. The cost will be \$50 per person, and all proceeds go directly to Feeding Dreams.

The organiser of the event, Kylie Petit, is passionate about raising as much money as possible for Feeding Dreams after seeing how far a single dollar can go on her own travels in Cambodia.

"Education and a school meal can be life changing," she says. "Feeding Dreams gives kids an opportunity for a life that they could not otherwise have."

Kylie first came to be involved in Feeding Dreams after meeting the founder, Kerry Huntley, while volunteering for a different organisation in Cambodia. When she arrived back in Australia, Kylie shared the story of her travels in Cambodia with the students at Shorncliffe State School.

Kylie promised to take her own daughter back to Cambodia as soon as she could. "I feel it is important that my daughter sees how children in poor countries live so that she can appreciate her own life, and maybe be inspired to live it in a way that gives back," she says.

Other families were interested in going along, and a trip has been planned for December this year. The families will volunteer at Feeding Dreams, with the children working in the classrooms assisting in English lessons, and the parents helping out with whatever else is needed by the school. "Our plan is to roll up our sleeves for two weeks and have a great experience we'll never forget," says Kylie.

If unable to attend the event, donations can still be made directly to Feeding Dreams. "We'd love it if local businesses could support us," Kylie says. ••

SHORNCLIFFE PIER – REBUILD COMMENCES

Deagon Ward Councillor Victoria Newton said rebuilding works commence this month for the new Shorncliffe Pier following the final removal of the old Pier.

"I know there is a great deal of mixed emotions in our community as we watched the old Shorncliffe Pier come down – the old Pier held a great deal of personal memories for so many people over its 130 year history," Cr Newton said.

"While it has been very sad to see the Pier go, I know we're all eagerly awaiting the construction of the new Pier which has been promised to be open in time for next year's Bluewater Festival at Easter-time 2016.

"Work to completely remove the existing Pier was completed last month – with the rebuilding works starting with the installation of the new piles to support the new structure.

"People living or working near the site or visiting the park will have noticed some of the sound from the pile driving.

"Some of these piles are for the special

temporary platform which will support the construction machinery where the new Pier lands close to the shore, while others are for the permanent piles for the new Pier.

"Visitors to Lower Moora Park will notice the large crane which is in place to assist with the works.

"It's quite a sight to watch these works take shape – and while much of the parkland and car parking spaces are available to the community to use there will be times when vehicles relating to these works will be accessing the site.

"So if you're heading to Lower Moora Park please be sure to take care and follow the instructions of traffic controllers when necessary.

"While there have been some delays in March due to the wet weather, hopefully with the drier winter months ahead of us the new Shorncliffe Pier will take shape quickly."

Having commenced in April, the permanent piling works from the temporary platform and also from a construction barge will commence and continue to mid-August 2015, weather and construction conditions permitting.

The concrete girders and headstocks are being cast off-site to be ready for placement following the piling works.

Once the piling works are completed and the supporting concrete structures are in place, work will commence on the timber decking works which are expected to start around July 2015.




Capital Growth in Median \$ (Houses)

WIRED ON SHORNCLIFFE

The arrival of The Wired Owl Coffee Co on Rainbow Street at the beginning of April has brought fresh aromas of coffee to Shorncliffe. Cafe owners, Aaron and Tracey, have already received great reviews of the shop, as well as a growing number of happy regulars.

Aaron and Tracey started out in a small coffee van in Lawnton, travelling around to cater at various events. They had always loved the Shorncliffe area, and would come on weekends to walk their dog and try out the cafes at Sandgate. "It was just a bit of luck we came past one day and saw the building was up for lease," Aaron says.

Nestled in a quieter part of Shorncliffe, The Wired Owl is a bit further away from the hustle and bustle of central Sandgate. Because of this, the cafe has a relaxed atmosphere and an extremely chilled vibe. Aaron says they are happy with the homely feel of the shop. They wanted a small and

more intimate space, rather than a large echoing area.

The couple oversaw the entire fit out process themselves with the help of Aaron's father. The decor includes brightly coloured chairs coupled with darker wooden tones, and a definite owl theme. The name 'The Wired Owl' comes from Tracey's interest in owls, as well as the tendency for people to become completely 'wired' on coffee.

Aaron wants the focus of the cafe to be on the quality of the coffee more than anything else, and wants to share his passion with the community. "We have filter coffee as well as espresso," he says. "Some of the locals were almost more excited than I was on our first day. There is a real sense of community here." Aaron has tried to keep this sense of community alive within his cafe.





MUSIC BY THE SEA

Simon Tedeschi

As a kid, Simon Tedeschi was so focused on mastering the piano that he once rolled up to school in his PJs.

Now, having evolved from child prodigy to classical superstar, the formally attired concert pianist is often described by respected critics and musical peers as "one of the finest artists in the world", and in a stunning coup returns to perform for Music By The Sea on Saturday 6 June.

Sandgate's 102 year old heritage-listed Federation style Town Hall is renowned for its excellent acoustics and will provide a gracious backdrop for the concert, starting at 7.30pm.

Those attending will be privy to the same musical majesty enjoyed by audiences that have included Their Royal Highnesses The Crown Prince and Princess of Denmark,

Vladimir Putin, George W Bush, Nelson Mandella and the Dalai Lama.

The book of his life is an interesting read-metaphorically speaking - with Tedeschi giving his debut performance of a Mozart Piano Concerto at the Sydney Opera House when he was nine, playing for Pavarotti at 13, lauded as an international award-winning concert pianist since he was 18, and currently signed at the top end to Sony Music Australia.

You may have even spotted him hanging about, the subject of Cherry Hood's 2002 Archibald prize winning painting titled 'Simon Tedeschi Unplugged'.

He said, "I get so excited to be doing this for a living - because I have the honour of touching creation. I get inspiration from every where not just museums and concert halls. I might



get inspired by a film, an animal or even a car. For instance, I am inspired to create macabre darkness in Shostakovich's First Piano Concerto. by watching 'A Clockwork Orange' or literally see the permutations of a fugue by watching the sinewy 'Don't Look Now'. I've even been known to be inspired by some of John Water's older films - but that's another story."

Meanwhile, in yet another chapter Simon performs to a different beat, engaging in one of his non-musical passions as Official Patron of the charitable organisation Microloan Australia. The aim of the Foundation is to help the poor help themselves to eradicate poverty by providing small loans to groups of women in sub-Saharan Africa.

"As someone who is not an economist, it struck me as being very pragmatic and common sense." he said.

He would like to see more classical musicians adopt a socially engaged focus.

"Music is not divorced from the social context in which it operates," he said.

SECRETS OF OUR PIONEERS

Guided History Walks

Catherine Cox

The Historic Bald Hills Cemetery sits quietly on what was known as Bracken Hill on Barrett Street, Bracken Ridge. It holds many of the secrets to Sandgate's and Brisbane's colonial history. Now these secrets come to life with guided walks by Pam Verney, organised by the Sandgate Historical Society.

A large part of Sandgate's early colonial settlers can be found resting in these grounds. Pam Verney, from the Sandgate Historical Museum, will be taking guided walks past these resting places, to share the stories of their lives. Pam has thoroughly researched the history of this cemetery and the lives of those who rest here.

On these walks Pam will transport you back to the days when Sandgate was a newly established settlement, to a time when horse and buggy was the main mode of transport. You can find hints to parts of the settlers' lives by tracing the births and deaths of family members that rest beside them. Pam will share some of their secrets with you as well.

Pam says, "What I have been really enjoying in my research is the linkages between the lives of our early pioneers and our understanding of our history.

"My favourite stories to share about these outstanding early settlers are Margaret Mitchell, Agnes Thorne, Ellen Wickham and Paul Peppler."

Come along on one of the guided walks and share their stories. This tour includes a special opportunity to enjoy a short "smoko" with the settlers. Some of the pioneers include William Barfoot, the 1st headmaster of Sandgate State School; the Best family, the most well-known historically being Isaac Benjamin Best from I. B. Best Butchers; the Verney family; and the Wickham family.

A LOCAL HISTORIC FIND 118 YEAR OLD ORGAN

A Kimball "Cherry" pump organ made by the Kimball Organ Manufacturing Co. in Chigago, USA in 1897

AND WOULD YOU BELIEVE IT STILL WORKS? (apart from 5 keys)

This historic artifact originally came from the Baptist Church, Flinders Parade, Sandgate, and was donated to the Sandgate Museum by Mrs. Fay Davis and Mrs. Lynette Cuthbert from their family's private collection. They had purchased the organ from the Masonic Hall on Eagle Terrace, Sandgate in 1975 for \$50, from an advertisement in the local paper.

Research by way of both photo and serial number identification confirms the organ was made in 1897.

The organ is in excellent condition, made from solid mahogany hardwood with ivory keys, and operates from two foot pumps which supply air from two bellows to 61 thin flat brass reeds, that

have tongues which vibrate to make the sounds. Short reeds are treble and the longer ones for bass. The organ has 11 stops which can alter sounds and vibrato over a wide range, capable of making sounds like a harp, horn, oboe, piccolo, violin, trumpet and many others.

The organ is on display at the Museum in front of a full wall mural of the Baptist Church, painted by local artist Mrs. Jean Cayser when the museum opened in 1994. ••

TACKLING SANDGATE!

t is Tailor time in the Moreton Bay area and we need to make the most of the cooler weather to put your fish on the table.

We need to make sure that we are geared up, Rods checked, Reels checked and serviced if needed and the all-important Tackle is up to speed.

There will be a few fisho's out there that may not have serviced their gear prior to putting it away last season so it is really important to get it checked now and make sure you're not left behind when they arrive.

For those that have not chased Tailor before, there is no big mystery on what to do or what you need. Basically a 2-4kg or a 3-6kg rod is ample and a reel between 2500 – 4000 will get the job done. Now if you want a reel that will last you almost a lifetime, grab an Alvey Reel, no mess no fuss it gets the job done.

A few of us use both Mono and Braided lines but this comes down to personal preference, one does not normally fish better than the other. If you are just getting into it I would recommend using a quality Mono line like Schneider or Super 100 and then you may upgrade when you are ready.

What do I use, Bait or Lures? Well I do a lot of my Tailor fishing at night on a High Tide and after a long day I like to relax a little so I use either Blue Baits or Pilchards. Cast it out with a small ball sinker and a set of either 2/0, 3/0 or 4/0 Gang hooks (I use Tru-Turns) and sit back and relax with friends

I use lures during early morning or late afternoon, small Slugs with a single hook or my favorite Halco Redhead Popper.

Tailor will be wide spread, from the mouth of the Brisbane River through to Bribie Island, but you will normally find us at the Sandgate Swimming Pool.

For those that are new to Tailor fishing I would strongly suggest a packet of Band-Aids as they have very sharp teeth!!

MORETON BAY RAIL LINK STEAMING AHEAD

The Moreton Bay Rail project is on track, as work progresses on laying more than 52 kilometres of track and construction of Kippa-Ring station continues.

The first piece of track was laid on 18 March 2015, about 1 kilometre out from Petrie Station.

Federal Member for Petrie, Luke Howarth MP, said the stations are being built to a modern design with prefabricated standard parts that can be installed onsite, providing an efficient solution that offers value for money during construction.

Kiss'n'Ride drop off points, as well as taxi and bus areas, will also be built at the station, and 1000 car spaces will be provided.

Moreton Bay Rail will revolutionise public transport in the north of Brisbane and will significantly free up capacity on our road network.

"It's exciting to see the Moreton Bay Rail project come to life with each development and with every milestone," Mr Howarth said.

"I'd like to thank Transport and Main Roads and the workers on site who are making sure the Rail Link is being delivered on time and under budget."

The Moreton Bay Rail project will deliver 14 kilometres of new dual-track passenger rail line between Lawnton and Kippa-Ring, connecting to the existing North Coast line.

The \$988 million project is jointly funded by the Australian Government, Queensland Government, and Moreton Bay Regional Council.

Passenger trains should start running on the tracks by late 2016.
