ARTISTS UNITE FOR 'EXPRESSIONS' EXHIBITION

ocal artists are embracing the opportunity to let their creativity shine this spring at the annual 'Expressions' exhibition at the Sandgate Town Hall.

From October 8th to10th, members of the community are invited to join the Shorncliffe Potters in their annual celebration of all things creative, including pottery, painting, prints, photography, sculpture and jewellery.

The works of around 150 local artists in the community are expected at the Sandgate Town Hall for the three day exhibition.

Maureen Addenbrooke from Shorncliffe
Potters says, "It's an event to promote art in the
community and an opportunity for the artists to
place their work into the public arena."

The exhibition, now in its ninth year, always attracts an array of visitors; from locals interested in the local art scene or visitors who happen to stumble on the exhibition during a visit to Sandgate.

"A broad spectrum of ideas and talents will be on show," says Maureen. The art will vary greatly from caricature themed pot plants to ceramic homewares to intriguing paintings. One piece of art that will be in the exhibition is a miniature teapot. The artist is from Taiwan but spends a month in Australia every year visiting his daughter. He is a member of Shorncliffe Potters and has made a wheel thrown working teapot and lid smaller than a thumb nail in the studio in Sandgate.

"The exhibition is open to the community so anyone can enter. There are cash prizes and vouchers to be won," says Maureen. Judges for this year are artists Pete Martin and Cameron Hess. There will also be a public vote for the 'People's Choice Award' so don't forget to vote!

Art can be purchased at the exhibition although the works need to remain for the entirety of the exhibition. There is a section 'Art Under \$30' and these items may be purchased and taken on the day.

The exhibition is a joint venture between Shorncliffe Potters and the Sandgate Art Society with financial assistance gained through the Lord Mayor's suburban initiative fund. All profits go directly back to these groups and also to the Police-Citizens Youth Club (PCYC) in Sandgate where the Shorncliffe Potters have a studio and two electric kilns.

SUNSET RUN RETURNS FOR 2015

Sandgate is gearing up for its most unique fun run and community festival, with the Sandgate Sunset Run back for a second year.

The event, on Saturday October 10, features a 2-hour relay at 6pm, where teams of up to 4 participants race around the Sandgate Roundabout, which is closed to traffic for the event.

Adding to the atmosphere is the World Food Markets, a main stage featuring a live DJ and hip-hop performances, plus a dedicated kids entertainment area. The event runs from 4pm-8pm.

This year, children will be kept busy with a jumping castle, face painting, Street Science, Peebo & Dagwood, glow products and the Photo Booth Guys.

For the first time, kids will also have their own dedicated events, with a Kids Dash for those aged 9 and under, plus a Junior Relay for ages 10-15.

The Kids Dash will be a hot lap around the roundabout while the music pumps and onlookers cheer, while the Junior Relay will see teams run the 250-metre course for 30 minutes.

All participants – including the kids - will receive a medal.

Event Director Dean Gibson says there really is something for everyone.

"We've worked hard to make it an awesome event for the whole family," he says.

"We want families to come down and experience the atmosphere of a fun, healthy and active community event."

It will be a stein of the times at Sandgate Hawk's Twilight market this month when all of the fun of Oktoberfest descends on the popular event.

Launching in 2013, the markets have become a much-loved addition to the north Brisbane market scene.

The Sandgate Hawks' Vicki Sinclair says it started with an idea from a few members about the Hawks Club as an ideal venue for a market, and it snowballed from there.

"We thought it was a great way of giving back to the local community by supporting small businesses after the football season had ended." Vicki says.

"The feedback so far has been great, with many of the original market holders coming back time after time

"We are usually known for our prowess on the field during footy time, but I think people are

enjoying having access to some talented locals in a spot close to home."

Vicki says the markets are all about celebrating our little pocket of the world.

"Being close to home holds a lot of positives in these changing times, and it's nice to know that a venue like us can be used in different ways," she says.

"We have some amazing talent and hopefully the Hawks can help promote them and let them shine."

Held at the club's expansive Lemke Road fields, the markets offer a range of activities and stores with everything from kids games to a popular car boot sale.

"We have candles and handmade goods, consultants from Avon, Intimo & Enjo, and everything in between - think soaps, homewares, posters, jewellery, handbags, clothing, accessories, toys, lingerie and gifts," Vicki says.

"And that doesn't even include the food. We have hotdogs, wood-fired pizzas, kebabs and great coffee, to name a few."

This year also marks the launch of the markets' inaugural Oktoberfest, with the inclusions of German beer, German sausages, pretzels and German music.

"There will be a stage set up and we'll have entertainment on the day from local bands as well as the Fuller Band, who are made up of some of our Senior footballers," Vicki says.

He is also an acclaimed musician, songwriter, screenwriter and novelist.

Sharyn Henry plays Shirley Valentine in Elysium Theatre's newest production. Sharyn has been involved in Brisbane theatre since returning from London in 1993 after some seven years of living abroad. She is an active theatre practitioner and her skills developed over the last twenty years, include acting, directing, writing for performance, storytelling, puppeteering, clowning, co-ordinating theatre festivals, cabarets and large events. ••

MUSIC BY THE SEA

An exquisite concert of Violin Sonatas will give lovers of quality music an opportunity to savour unforgettable classics at Music By The Sea on 7th November at Sandgate Town Hall.

Performed by Melbourne violinist Rebecca Chan and French pianist Jeremy Eskenazi, the program features famous works by Johannus Brahms, Claude Debussy and Ludwig van Beethoven.

A description of one of these musical high notes can be attributed to Clara Schumann, who said the Violin Sonata no.3 in D-minor by Brahms, is "like a lovely girl playing with her lover."

Composed between 1886 and 1888, the extroverted and vitruosic sonata opens with a lyrical theme of shimmering beauty played by the violin, while the piano accompanies with syncopated piano rhythm creating a feeling of urgency.

Crafted in four pieces, the last movement in particular contains large-scale sections that can be characterised as symphonic, requiring ample space of a concert hall for its sound to resonate.

Our next composer, the patriotic Frenchman Claude Bebussy, produced his Violin Sonata in G-minor between 1916 and 1917, in the context of historically turbulent World War I.

Written while visiting the seaside at the very end of his life, he dedicated this superbly balanced,

sweet, fiery and humorous piece of 'French Musical Impressionism' to his wife, Emma.

Another fascinating story is woven around Beethoven's Violin Sonata no.9 in A-minor, or 'Kreutzer', considered to be a one off and something of an enigma.

Known for its demanding violin part, unusual length (up to 40 minutes) and emotional scope, its 1st movement is predominately furious, while the 2nd is meditative and the 3rd joyous and exuberant.

One of the world's great writers, Leo Tolstoy, was so inspired that he wrote the novella The Kreutzer Sonata which was published in 1889, and promptly censored by Russian authorities.

After reading the novella in 1901, Rene Francois Xavier Prinet painted the two 'Kreutzer' lovers in passionate embrace at the piano, becoming the longest kiss in advertising history as the image for Tabu perfume.

Tasked with bringing these treasures to life both Ms Chan and Mr Eskenazi bring excellent credentials to the stage.

Ms Chan was a member of the Australian Chamber Orchestra from 2010 to 2015, is a member of the Melbourne Chamber Orchestra and the Australian Piano Quartet. She has degrees in medicine, art and music, has also performed as a soloist with many major Australian orchestras, is a prize winner at the International Citta di Brescia Competition in Italy, and has performed in Europe.

Mr Eskenazi is also a sought after soloist, chamber musician, adjudicator, and scholar with a PhD in Performance Practice from the Royal Academy of London, founder of Muzio Clementi Society, and has performed at leading venues such as Festival Chopin in Paris, Queen Elizabeth Hall London and Istanbul Opera House.



VEGAN AND ORGANICS LEAD THE WAY FOR CAFÉ VALLETTA

After ten months in the business, James Bugeja has boldly crossed the line to venture into veganism and organics at Café Valletta in Brighton.

When a few health issues were raised for him it seemed obvious for James to take a closer look at what he was fuelling his body with. In an attempt to lead a healthier lifestyle, James started exploring and researching the facts behind organics and the vegan diet.

This in turn gave him the notion to invest in the health of his customers and meet a gap he saw in the market. He was also influenced by some new businesses in Brighton such as a health coach he had met and the new 'Medical Clinic For Women' specialising in holistic healthcare for women just across the road. James felt taking the café into this market "was good timing and a good fit for the business".

James sources spray free produce from the popup Farmers Market outside of Satori Organics in Sandgate. "This means food is locally sourced, seasonal, fresh and of course organic," says James. He also sources food from the Organic Farmers' Market at Northey Street, Brisbane.

James is certainly passionate about food. A qualified chef, he doesn't take any shortcuts. All food at Valletta is handmade except for some of the sweet treats which his sister makes off-site. James is very committed to the quality of his food and is known to start work at 3am to get things like Valletta's own ice-cream made. Mango, Lavender, Banana and Cacao are some of James' ice-cream specialties. All guilt free with no sugar added only the sweetness of the fruit used to sweeten the ice-cream.


Instead of conventional flour, butter, eggs and sugar as in traditional baking, vegan baking means using alternative ingredients such as coconut oil, coconut flour, almond meal, pure maple syrup and lots of fruit and vegetables.

James says there is a stigma surrounding vegan and organics and sometimes that can interfere with customers' preferences. He says, "I have one customer that buys her cakes here but doesn't tell her husband that they are vegan. He boasts how amazing they are but if he knew they were glutenfree, vegan and organic he wouldn't touch them".

With the arrival of Spring, James has introduced fresh juices and smoothies to his menu. James says "the roasted pumpkin, raspberries, almond milk, and cinnamon is delicious and one to try".

by playing with chaos-movement-transformation-structure, this installation creates an ambiance that places its viewer directly in a situation of vulnerability, experiencing a lack of visibility. We do not see much from the inside for we lack a sense of perspective. From a distance and from above, we become informed spectators and we can see the picture as a whole; the big picture.

This event is a 'first step' in the larger international "Giant Steps" project by Swiss artist, Viliam Mauritz. He plans to produce similar installations in a variety of locations around the world. We have agreement in principle on the feasibility of the next step in our project in Switzerland, Paris (France) and Peru.

The following is a brief description of the 'First Step' that will take place on October 10th and 11th, 2015 on the tidal sands of Sandgate beach.

"Giant Steps" is a large-scale outdoor Art installation. It is a construction of two giant-sized foot prints; each 'footprint' measuring 100 metres long, 40 metres wide and 3.8 metres high and will

be constructed by placing 380 prepared bamboo poles, in the tidal sands at low tide.

The public will be able to walk between the bamboo poles, without having any concept of the form taking shape, and how it looks from above. This creates a lack of visibility experience because it is a seemingly random form or indeed, chaotic. At high tide, the water will hide the bottom third of the bamboo but the 'foot prints' will remain visible above the water and they will appear to be floating. The image of the Artwork will change as the tides ebb and flow. The installation at Sandgate will stay in place for two days and then will be de-constructed.

"Giant Steps" allows us to shift our ways of seeing. It focuses our gaze on the beautiful natural environment of northern Moreton Bay at Sandgate, and invites us to participate in and witness the making of a universal symbolic structure in large scale. It symbolises human presence and it invites us to see how a large scale impact is developed, piece by piece, giving us a way of 'seeing the whole picture' from above. The event will be filmed from above and projected onto large screens onshore.

How one woman's dream became her reality

Two thousand and nine was the birth of Ruby Purple - the artist. Through the support of her husband, Ruby escaped the daily grind as an auditor and embarked on a journey to become an artist.

Much of Ruby's art bears significant meaning and messages, however Ruby is always interested at what people draw out of her paintings.

Ruby is an active member of the art community, belonging to various groups such as the Bluewater Festival Art Exhibition and Art Trail, Expressions Art Exhibition, Sandgate Art Society, Artists Afloat, Warrior Women and The Originals. Ruby says, "being an artist can be isolating and I wouldn't be where I am without the groups I'm involved in."

This reinvention has been empowering for Ruby and inspiring for those who meet her. It proves that with focus and determination and the support of family, dreams can become reality. For Ruby, "painting allows me to express what I love doing. I love painting and I love making people happy." ◆◆



1. Pruning and dead heading

Pointsettia can be cut back hard, along with spring climbers such as jasmine. It's also an idea to cut off any dead flowers to conserve the plant's energy. You can also deadhead annuals and perennials to keep them flowering as long as possible and avoid them going to seed.

2. What to plant now

Veggies – capsicum, cucumber, eggplant, French beans, lettuce, pumpkin, radish, rock melon, spring onion, squash, sweet corn, sweet potatoes, tomato, zucchini.

Herbs – basil, chives, coriander, oregano, parsley, sage, thyme.

Flowers – aster, begonia, cosmos, marigold, poppy, petunia, salvia, sunflower, zinnia.



3. Fertilise and mulch

If you haven't already done so, it's a good time to feed your soil with good quality fertiliser. Remember that we can get some dry periods this month, so make sure you water your fertiliser in well.

Start to apply mulch to increase water retention (particularly for the warmer summer months ahead) and to discourage weeds. There are some fantastic organic mulch options available such as bamboo mulch. The mulch is eco friendly and grass seed free – which your garden will thank you for!



THE HISTORY BEHIND MUSGRAVE HOUSE

istory sadly reveals that over the 44 years between 1888 and 1931 a total of 3825 young children were cared for at the Lady Musgrave Sanatorium located at 8 Allpass Parade, Shorncliffe. The sanatorium closed in December 1931, and the building became derelict until April 1940 when James Brown took up the lease and the building was named "Musgrave House".

In the era before antibiotics (1940), prolonged convalescence was normal for children's diseases everywhere. There were no curative drugs. The reason for the establishment of the seaside Sanatorium at Sandgate was the belief that sea air and sea bathing were especially beneficial to health and convalescence. Sea bathing became popular as a cure for chronic illnesses, especially those involving joints and muscles. Dr Richard Russell contended "Not only was it beneficial to bathe, but that the salts of

sea water were curative if swallowed in copious quantities."

Many of the children were under the age of 3 years and almost all were under the age of 10. Children with viral poliomyelitis, post-traumatic amputations and recovering from diphtheria were cared for.

Lady Musgrave, the wife of Queensland's fifth Governor, was instrumental in establishing an outreach sanatorium by the water for the humanitarian benefit of chronically ill children, and was successful in obtaining a piece of land from the State Government

Architect, Mr Richard Gailey, with funds totalling 600 pounds, designed a purpose- built building comprising two wards each of six patient beds. The building included a bedroom for the Matron and another for the nurses. The ceilings were 5.2 metres high, had large windows with vertical sashes, two internal bathrooms, and each ward was warmed by a brick fireplace. Each iron cot had it's own mosquito net. A garden with trees surrounded the Home enclosed with a paling fence. Kerosene lamps lighted the Home; electric light was not installed until 1925.

Sadly, none of the family names of the 3825 children, for whom the Home was their home for weeks or months, has been recorded in any archive. Almost none of the names of more than 100 nurses who cared for them are known.

"Musgrave House" is today a private domestic residence and has been heritage restored over 15 years. The original architectural and structural materials, built by the original architect, have been preserved or re-created.

Musgrave House is one of the earliest buildings in Shorncliffe, and its graciousness is a heritage in itself. ••



THE GOAL POSTS HAVE BEEN MOVED

ince the beginning of the year, there have been a number of changes occurring in the finance world, more specifically around investment lending. APRA (who are the body that oversees lending in Australia) have flagged their concerns over banks lending to investors. The main reason for these concerns are the levels of investment lending in Sydney and Melbourne, and they have asked the banks to keep their growth in investor loans to below 10%; investment lending was growing at a rate of 21% year on year. Whilst the focal point has been Sydney and Melbourne, these changes effect investors Australia-wide.

In response to these concerns and to keep their commitment as responsible lenders, many institutions have reviewed their acceptable loan to value ratios for investment purposes. Some lenders have made changes such as a minimum 20% deposit to purchase an investment property. Other changes include implementing a differential in the interest rate charged for investment loans as opposed to owner-occupied home loans. We have seen CBA and ANZ announce increases of

0.27% on all their variable investment loans and AMP increasing their investment variable rates by 0.47%.

APRA has also announced concerns regarding loan affordability, and lenders have made changes to the way they assess an applicant's capacity to repay the debt, in turn making sure there is enough of a buffer so investors can afford the debt, even if rates increase.

So, what does this mean for buyers in our local areas of bayside Brisbane? Already we've seen a noticeable drop in rental property purchases within our region, with many investors explaining their lending capacity has been seriously affected by the changes. Likewise, we are hearing cases of purchasers trying to buy their own home to occupy also experiencing a change in financial advice from late last year until now.

Our professional advice? Make sure you have clarified your financial lending capacity prior to making an offer on a new home. Even if you did so 6 months ago, we strongly recommend you get updated confirmation.


