Glimpse Into Pier's Past

Shorncliffe's iconic pier will have guided walking tours take place next month, as part of Brisbane's National Trust Heritage Festival for 2016.

A series of events and tours will be held across Brisbane to celebrate this year's theme of 'discovery and rediscovery', a suitable subject given the recent reopening of the Shorncliffe pier. It is an opportunity for locals and those interested to step back in time, hear stories dating back to Sandgate's settlement and catch a glimpse of how life in Sandgate has evolved over time.

Walks will commence at the Moora Park rotunda, covering area from Shorncliffe Parade along to Park Parade and then onto St Patricks College. Groups will be intimate in size, with about ten guests and one guide per tour, allowing plenty of opportunity for story sharing and questions. Once the top section of the tour has concluded, a morning tea break will be

held before the second half of the tour begins. Lower Moora Park, Lovers Walk, the rock wall and Shorncliffe Pier are some of the landmarks covered during this segment.

As an added bonus, touring visitors will have access to multiple storyboards on display in upper Moora Park, featuring some very old photographs of Sandgate and Shorncliffe. Members of the Sandgate District Historical Society and Museum, Pam Verney and Catherine Cox are the brains behind the upcoming tours, responsible for searching through archives to source fascinating photos and stories.

"After working on this project for more than six months, I am excited to see how it will all come together," said Pam. "There are plenty of surprising tales to be heard, as Shorncliffe was once a popular seaside holiday spot, where travellers would come to bathe, fish and picnic."

Tours will be held on 7th and 15th May starting at 9:30am. They will run for approximately two hours and cost \$25 per person, with all proceeds being donated back to the Sandgate District Historical Society and Museum. Another programme highlight in what will be a jam-packed night of music nostalgia is titled 'Flower Power Under The Tower'. This feature pays reverence to many of the hits from the 'Summer of Love' era of the 60's and rounds off a full evening of song, dance and laughter.

Event organisers, the Sandgate Branch of the Police-Citizens Youth Club are keen to promote their role in the community and to draw a link between light-hearted entertainment and the more serious functions of Police Service, which include the Police-Citizens Youth Clubs.





Tides Turning for HMQS Gayundah

It took a mutiny, many voyages and seven decades at sea before the HMQS Gayundah was permanently scuttled off Woody Point.

But as the world premiere of *Mutiny on the Gayundah* reached its climax last month, there was heaviness about the audience.

Was this to be the gunship's final scene? Are the old girl's days really numbered?

The film's producer and star, Culture Vulture Richard Lancaster, is confident they won't be — Despite the suspicious collapse of the ship's bow on 28 March.

"The damage is quite severe and now the bow will crumble very quickly," Mr Lancaster said.

"However we are very confident about the probability of preserving the wreck for another 50-60 years."

Mr Lancaster has been working with Clontarf businessman and industrial chemist Barry

Richards to find a way to preserve the ship.

"We found a product that can protect the ship from rusting further, and we are in discussion with the Heritage and Marine Parks departments about going ahead with this plan."

Once the flagship of the Queensland Navy, the Gayundah drew Mr Richards' attention – even before he started fighting for the ship's restoration.

"I'm a jogger and I'd been running past the wreck for many years, always thinking to myself that we've got to preserve this incredible local landmark" Mr Richards said.

A specialist in surface coatings, Mr Richards has suggested the use of rust-proofing product, *Rust Conqueror*, which is manufactured by Australian owned company, Xtroll Global.

The company owner, Steve Ashworth, has since jumped on board to support the project.

Mr Richards said the good news "is that, in principal, we have approval to do some trial preservation".

Mr Richards estimates the preservation process would cost \$10,000, including preparation and cleaning, careful handling and relocation of marine life, structural bracing and rust stabilisation.

Deagon Deviation Upgrade Progress

Gateway Upgrade North project underway

Great developments are in the pipeline for the Deagon Deviation with many positive outcomes for Sandgate.

As part of the Gateway Upgrade North project the Deagon Deviation will be undergoing a transformation. Works will include a widening of the roads between Depot Road and Bracken Ridge Road with two lanes in each direction.

Two new northbound lanes will be constructed to separate Redcliffe bound traffic from the Gateway Motorway. Motorists will travel along Sandgate Road and continue onto the new Deagon Deviation without needing to use the motorway.

The Deagon Deviation northbound off-ramp will be relocated. Motorway traffic travelling north to Redcliffe will now exit left off the motorway just before the Depot Road off-ramp and travel over the Gateway Motorway on a new overpass to seamlessly join with the new northbound Deagon Deviation.

Federal member for Petrie MP Luke Howarth says "Peak times are particularly horrific, with traffic at a standstill from the on-ramp at the Deagon Deviation. The project will not only reduce this congestion but improve safety and

increase efficiency of the motorway network".

Work commenced on the Gateway Upgrade North project in February of this year with a project cost of \$1.162 billion. The Australian Government has committed \$929.6 million to the project, in partnership with the Queensland Government, which has committed \$232.4 million.

The upgrade will include widening 11.3 kilometres of road between Nudgee and Bracken Ridge from four to six lanes.

Known to be one of the busiest stretches of motorway in South East Queensland the project is aiming to improve road safety and reduce congestion for over 80,000 motorists who use the motorway each day.

MP Luke Howarth wishes to assure locals "that the construction team is making every effort to minimise impacts to our community."

Please be patient as these works will mean safer and easier travel for road users once complete."

Works have been taking place at night from mid-February and will continue in off-peak times until the project is complete. The project is expected to be completed in late 2018.

Sharing the Dignity

An Issue Rarely Discussed

Sandgate local and personal trainer, Rochelle Courtenay, has worked passionately over the past year to raise awareness of the difficulty thousands of women face as a result of the unaffordability of sanitary items.

As an issue rarely discussed in Australia, Rochelle was determined to start the conversation. "Many women, especially those facing homelessness or escaping domestic violence situations, face the need to prioritise the purchase of food and other basic necessities over the purchase of pads and tampons, and are forced to resort to using newspaper, paper towels or anything else they can find," says Rochelle.

As such, Rochelle set about organising the delivery of donated sanitary pads and tampons to homeless shelters across Brisbane. It started out with just donations from people Rochelle knew, however the more people that heard about it, the more donations she received. Through this, Share the Dignity was born. The foundation now supplies frontline workers with pads and tampons to deliver to homeless women and survivors of domestic violence, and has over 450 volunteers and 1000 collection sites all around Australia.

As Rochelle was delivering bins full of pads and tampons to the Gold Coast Homeless Connect a few months ago, a woman came up to her in tears at the sight of the bins. Speaking to her, Rochelle discovered that she had fled a domestic violence situation, was living in her car with her children, and didn't have the money for sanitary items. She had one tampon she had found on the floor of a public bathroom to use for her entire period. Meeting this woman

deeply affected Rochelle, and as she was handing her a pack of tampons, she was struck with a sudden idea. Why not put the domestic violence 1800 RESPECT number on the inside of the flip top lid of tampon boxes?

Rochelle was able to put this idea into action, and now Share the Dignity has partnered with the brand Cottons.

It really shows what a passionate group of people can do when they put their minds to it."

As a Sandgate local, Rochelle believes that the sense of community that pervades the area has really assisted her in everything she has achieved so far. "I love Sandgate," she says. "Even if I won a million dollars I would never leave. There is such a strong community spirit."



Twice each month, the Urban Observers come together to gaze skyward, and share their common interest in all that is celestial. The Urban Observers meet on the first and third Sunday of each month at the Barrett Street Reserve, from dusk (weather permitting).

Everyone is welcome to attend, and details will be posted on the group's facebook page: Urban Observers Group.

Julie Straaver started the Urban Observers evenings as a member of the South East Queensland Astronomical Society (SEQAS) 18 years ago. "We provide the opportunity for people to learn how to use their own telescope, or have a look through someone else's, all free of charge!" Julie says. She could see the need for gatherings like this because people would be enthusiastic about telescopes but unsure how to use them. "There are so many types of telescopes now, and they all have different ways of operating," she says. "It's difficult to know what you're looking at or even where to start looking. So people can come along to these evenings, gain some assistance, and meet others with similar interests."

As a former primary school teacher, Julie always had a special interest in Astronomy and started conducting observation nights with her classes. The idea grew from there. Some of the more exciting objects Julie has spotted over the years include Jupiter and several of its moons, as well as globular clusters.

Observers Organiser, And Julie's favourite ie Straayer started the Observers evenings see Omega Centauri with the naked eye," she says. Omega Astronomical Society Centauri is a globular cluster in the Centaurus constellation and the largest in the Milky Way.


It's made up of roughly 10 million stars, and it is thought that it's the remains of a galaxy that's been consumed by our galaxy."

There are always plenty of interesting astronomical events that the observers can help people find. In late May, Mars will be coming into opposition, meaning it will appear bigger and brighter as it is in a prime viewing position relative to earth, and later this year, Saturn will be coming into opposition around the 3rd of June. "You can see it as darkness falls and it's always a lovely sight through the telescope because you can see its rings as the sun's hitting them."



The Sandgate and Bracken Ridge Action Group (SANDBAG) is organising a peaceful walk against domestic violence, along with other local businesses and organisations, and a family and community event will follow.

Helping to organise the event, is Domestic Violence counsellor, and current Community Programs Manager at Sandbag, Maggie Daunt. Sandgate Yacht Club: The Formation

Sailing became popular with the holding of Sailing Regattas in Bramble Bay. The construction of the railway line to Sandgate in 1882 and with the extension to Shorncliffe in 1897 proved to be a bonus for the many visitors to these regattas. The first sailing races were conducted by the Gordon Club which was founded in 1897 by the St Nicolas Church of England that was situated in Yundah Street, Shornliffe.

However, the control of safety and rescue boats was inadequate and more support was necessary when the boats/crew needed assistance or had capsized Some of the boats competing in these events would sail from the Brisbane River.

In a boating accident in 1911 several young lives were lost out from the mouth of the Brisbane River and this caused grief and worry among members and the community. A public meeting was held to discuss the formation of a sailing club. In 1912 the Sandgate Yacht Club was formed. This club was initially restricted to the "Rater" Class (Linton Hope Raters), for a number of years, but gradually a number of other types, including the Flying Squadron, Skiffs, Trainee

Squadron, 16ft. Skiffs, and sabots for training etc, were catered for, so popular was the sport in this area.

The yacht club opening day was organized for April 1912. Invitations were sent to other sailing clubs namely:- Royal Queensland Yacht Club, Brisbane Flying Squadron, Brisbane Dinghy Club, South Brisbane Sailing and Oxley Sailing Club. Large crowds arrived for the festivities but because of the wind blowing to gale force the race was abandoned

Of interest is the Club House on the site. It was originally the Sunday School Hall at St. Margaret's Church of England, Rainbow Street, Sandgate. It was pulled down and re-constructed in its present site in 1948. The building was opened for the Sandgate 16ft Skiff club in that year.

The Sandgate Museum has a special display of photos and memorabilia on loan courtesy of the Sandgate Yacht Club. Also available is our own book, the "History of the Sandgate Sailing Clubs 1897 – 1990" written by our late member George Lestor.

Brisbane's Property Market Fundamentals Remain Healthy

The Reserve Bank's (RBA) decision to once again leave the official cash rate on hold at 2% for the past quarter was almost unanimously predicted. The overwhelming majority of experts now expect the RBA will either cut rates further or leave them on hold throughout the remainder of 2016.

Interestingly, comparison website finder.com.au's late February survey of 31 economists also revealed two out of five believe lenders will increase loan rates this year, outside of any official movements. During February alone, three lenders had already increased their variable loan rates, with the major banks expected to follow the trend.

But rate increases, along with APRA-driven tighter lending criteria for property investment implemented by financiers over the past year, is failing to damper investor interest in South East Queensland property. Middle-ring Brisbane was recently named as the country's new "hot spot" for income potential and capital growth by Performance Property Advisory (PPA). The latest group to have endorsed Brisbane in its latest Market Update, PPA proclaimed the city Australia's leading investment location, boasting strong population growth, good infrastructure investment and an under-supply of housing.

Meanwhile in Sandgate, the suburb continues to attract professionals, families with school aged children and retirees. The area appeals to buyers due to ease of access to major transport links, parks and recreation facilities, and close proximity to high quality education. Buyer interest is focused on houses in the \$550k to \$650k range which are in short supply.






