Join the community at Africa Extravaganza, a dinner and dance fundraiser hosted by Enterprising World International to support emerging communities, starting with the Anyuak of South Sudan.

Enterprising World International (EWI) is a non-profit organisation committed to improving the lives of people living in the world's toughest places, as well as supporting emerging communities throughout Australia. It was started by Dr Roxanne Zolin in 2014 with an aim to stamp out poverty around the world by 2050.

EWI treasurer Abang Anade Othow says the money raised at the dinner will go towards agricultural development in South Sudan to relieve the looming famine about to hit the region.

"It will be a rich African experience of food, music, dance and African culture. This will also be an opportunity to hear about the latest developments in South Sudan and what this project will bring," Abang says.

"Subsequent fund-raising efforts will contribute to various ethnic groups and other emerging communities, with a particular emphasis on creating sustainable income streams through entrepreneurship and business mentoring."

Abang knows first-hand what life is like in South Sudan. She was born in war-torn South Sudan, her father was killed and she was separated from her mother at a young age. Abang came to Australia as a refugee and worked as a fashion model while studying at university to become a teacher. She continues



her work in the community, volunteering and advocating for disadvantaged communities.

My goal is to see suffering eradicated throughout the world. Specifically, my goal is to advocate for minority groups and bring awareness to their plight," she says.

"It is very important to see the people of South Sudan, including minority groups, provided with equal opportunities and also living in harmonv."

The historic Sandgate Town Hall will be filled with song on Saturday June 11 when the Bayside Divas host their ever-popular annual concert, *I've Got the Music in Me*.

The Bayside Divas is a women's community choir based in Sandgate, who perform mainly contemporary music in and around North Brisbane. The choir began in 2004 and currently has about 50 members.

Concert co-ordinator Christine Reed says *I've* Got the Music in Me will feature a range of songs from different musical eras and genres.

"We have enjoyed sell out performances in recent years and have a loyal following," Christine says.

The choir is directed by Sandra Milliken, an accomplished musician and conductor and an internationally published composer.

"Sandra's extensive experience both in Australia and overseas, together with her passion for choral music ensures the Bayside Divas continue to grow and improve in their musical journey." Christine says.

Concert goers can expect to hear well-known musical hits such as *Rhythm of Life* and *You Can't Stop the Beat*, together with John Lennon's *Imagine* and Pharrell Williams' 2014 hit *Happy*.

"Some of the songs may be less familiar, for example, *Down in the River to Pray*, an American gospel-style song, whilst songs from the musical *The Sound of Music* will be instantly recognisable," she says.

Audiences will also have an additional treat as the Divas are joined by some special guest artists.

"I think our sense of enjoyment and fun comes out in our performances, and anyone coming to the concert this year will leave having had a good time," Christine says.

A WEEKEND OF Jachting

The upcoming Vintage Yacht Regatta will be a perfect opportunity for Sandgate locals to see an eclectic mixture of beautiful boats, and the new Shorncliffe Pier will serve as the perfect spot for spectating.

It will be held on the weekend of the 4th and 5th of June this year, with two boat races to be held on each day.

The race will have participants from around Brisbane and as far away as the Gold Coast, but it also welcomes anyone who is completing a longer passage around Australia. There is a special trophy that the Club awards to those who have come a long way for the race. In a previous year, it was awarded to a man who'd sailed up from Hobart. There will be a mixture of prizes including awards for the best looking boat as well as prizes for the faster and slower boats in the race, the most competitive yacht, and a 'Misfortune Award'.

Nigel Statham has been the Regatta director for 7 years, and has a background in sailing. "It's a fairly laid back race," says Nigel. "Most of the competitors are racing more for enjoyment than the competition, the event is more about having fun, showing off your boats and going for a sail, although some do get quite competitive.

It is the biggest and most significant yacht event in Queensland."

The course is set out as a large circuit, indicated by markers placed in the bay. The faster boats complete the perimeter of this course, and the slower boats complete a smaller course set out inside the large one.

The weekend is a celebration of vintage and classic boats and is open to all who have a vintage boat, or an interest in them. There will be around 40 boats in the race, and on the Sunday morning, the Cabbage Tree Creek marinas will be opened for close-up exploration of the boats.

Cardigan Bar gets Mojo

For a dose of live, original solo blues music you have to venture no further than your local music joint, the Cardigan Bar to hear the voice and music of Mojo Webb.

Cardigan Bar owner Chris Fisher describes Mojo Webb as "one of Brisbane's most preeminent blues musicians. We are so happy he's returning again to play in June," Chris says. Advice from Chris is to arrive early for this high calibre performer.

Mojo Webb will be performing solo at the Cardigan Bar on June 10th. He describes his music as straight authentic blues. "It's original blues style with a dirty 1950's electric sound to it," says Mojo. His songs are an acoustic style, but played with an electric guitar.

My solo act has a big sound through intricate finger picking guitar and using a stomp box," describes Mojo.

Mojo has been a professional musician since 1990. He learned to play the guitar from a jazz guitar player at the age of eleven and has been playing and singing ever since.

Mojo has released his own album called 'The Burden'. He wrote and sang all the songs and played the varying musical instruments of guitar, harmonica, saxophone, bass and drums. He also recorded and mixed the entire album. In 2006 he won the accolade of Australian Blues Music 'Chain' Award for 'Best New Talent of The Year'.

As well as solo performances, Mojo plays in his band the 'Mojo Webb Band' who have been together since 1998. The Brisbane based members play locally and have travelled throughout Australia performing at many big musical festivals.

Although Mojo enjoys performing at big venue gigs with his band, playing at smaller venues like the Cardigan Bar is something Mojo loves. "The intimacy of small venues like the Cardigan Bar means you get to see everything and feel the emotion of the audience — it's something I really love," he says.

At the Cardigan Bar "the audience will experience an evening of honest, emotional music. Music with a mixture of emotion and movement," says Mojo. "Blues style music can traditionally be quite slow and mournful but I like to create party music where people want to get up and dance," says Mojo.


Admission to the breakfast will be \$25 which

Acacia, fiery music from around the world

On Saturday 4th June Cello-guitar duo Umberto Clerici and Karin Schaupp brings together two of Australia's finest and most expressive instrumentalists for the premiere of an exciting new work, and a fiery program of music from around the world at Sandgate Town Hall.

During a collaboration for the 70th anniversary of Sydney's Musica Viva festival in 2015, Schupp and Italian cellist Clerici discovered an immediate musical rapport within the engaging tonal combination of the cello and the guitar.

German-born Australian guitarist Schaupp makes a popular return to Music By The Sea as a multi-award winning guitarist with a distinguished history of solo performances, recordings and collaborations.

Sharing the stage in this new endeavour, recently arrived from Italy, Clerici is also in high demand as a soloist and chamber musician worldwide, and also holds the position of principal cellist with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra.

Starting at 7.30pm, Schubert's beautiful Arpeggione Sonata features in the first half of the program, along with the premiere of work by Australian composer Natalie Williams.

During the second half of the program, you are invited on a sumptuous musical journey

through Spain and South America — featuring works by De Falla, Piazzolla, and the Brazilian great Radames Gnattali.

Due to the federal election on Saturday 2nd July, Music By The Sea will present its July concert the following weekend.

Consequently, **Saturday 9th July** heralds the return of outstanding Acacia Quartet (Sydney), whose concert (The Harp and The Harpoon» will include works by Beethoven, Moya Henderson who is one of the country's most established composers, and new generation composer Nicholas Vines.

Violinists Lisa Stewart and Myee Clohessy, violist Stefan Duwe and cellist Anna Martin-Scrase have released many albums, are ARIA nominees, have been Limelight Magazine's 'Ediors Choice", and ABC Classic FM's CD of the week.

They are considered to be 'darlings' of the musical world because of the personal warmth that flows into their music, the passion of their performance, and special relationships with top composers.

Awe-inspiring Show to Dazzle the Peninsula

When a local Councillor and Mayor got together in 1949 to establish one of the first Shows on Brisbane's north side, they could have hardly guessed the value of what they were creating.

The first Redcliffe City Show was underpinned by an admiration of Moreton Bay's local agriculture industry and the families involved.

The Show awed, inspired and brought locals together. And indeed the strength of the Redcliffe community has only amplified in the years since – despite the growing population and rezoning of local Council boundaries.

Of course we're not a farming community anymore, but today's Redcliffe Show is still one of the most anticipated events on the Redcliffe calendar.

WHAT'S ON OFFER?

Those fortunate enough to have wandered the Show's tents and alleyways before will be familiar with the monster fireworks and the crowds at Wood Chopping Championships. This year's Show will again feature the traditional favourites – a V8 Ute Challenge, freestyle motocross and show jumping.

Friday is the Show's 'People's Day'. Highlights of the day are bound to be the Championship Dog Show (9am), pig racing (from 1pm), and the Trackskill V8 Ute Challenge (5pm).

Saturday's special will be the Wood Chopping Championships (9am). Catch the Caboolture Junior Motocross team at the main arena from 6pm.

Sunday's program includes judging of exotic horse breeds (8.30am), a Children's Pet Parade (11am), and a variety of stage shows including the Brisbane Celtic Fiddle Band and magician Eric Summons.

The Show grounds will be abound in exhilarating rides, carnival games and food stalls. Oh – and let's not forget the abundance of show bags!

The 67th annual Redcliffe Show will run on Friday 24, Saturday 25 and Sunday 26 June at the Redcliffe Showgrounds. Admission for adults \$10, children \$5, pensioners \$5.

Winter is upon us!

It's a bit cheeky to complain about the cool wintry weather of June in Sandgate, so I will refrain.

We are blessed with a season that is both moderate and temperate; a cold day's temperature in Sandgate might drop to the late teens according to our Celsius scale, and the nights may plunge to below 10 degrees on occasion. To put this in perspective, should you venture just a couple of short hours south-west from here to Stanthorpe, the nights may greet you with something uncomfortably close to zero degrees.

Rest assured in your flannelette pyjamas that we are in a good place for winter.

It's also a good time to be out in the garden. Violas, pansies and azaleas are flowering, a waft of lavender in the air and camellias near the peak of their annual – and striking – floral show. It is said that to walk amongst a camellia grove in bloom can make you feel like a ninja or a pretty Japanese girl.

Useful as a hedge or a feature plant; camellias can be utilised as soft backdrops to cottage gardens or as standalone small trees in a variety of garden design concepts. The main species that we encounter here in southeast Queensland are C. sasanqua and C. japonica; sasanqua has a smaller leaf, a denser habit when pruned and is sun-hardy. Camellia japonica, sometimes known as the Rose of Winter, possesses a larger leaf and prefers semi-shaded environs. For our region, C. sasanqua is a more reliable bet, although both are hardy, relatively pest and disease resistant and are abundant of flowers.

Famous for its flavours rather than its flowers, by far the most popular camellia in the world is Camellia sinensis. You may know it as simply 'tea'.

Camellia sinensis is grown predominantly in China and India, with numerous cultivars known to exist. While it may be tempting to try to grow your own tea, my recommendation is to purchase an expertly (and ethically) grown, harvested and processed tea to drink; in this case, it's better to direct your growing garden vocation towards visual values over qualities for consumption.

Camellias like a rich and well-drained soil, and this means lots of organic matter like manure or compost. Visit your local community nursery for more advice on growing camellias and other winter loving plants, and get the most out of the cooler months!



There are plenty of areas to explore, and as Laurie says, "we are also privileged to have great preserved areas such as Tinchi Tamba Wetlands Reserve, Boondall Wetlands, Deagon and Brighton Bushlands, and Bramble Bay foreshores all on our doorstep. The benefits these areas give are widespread and often they escape notice in the daily pressures of our lifestyles."

Aside from the vast foreshore ecosystem which is always an exciting place to discover unusual creatures, Tinchi Tamba and Boondall Wetlands offer great places to launch a canoe and explore the waterways, bushwalk or have a picnic. The bird hide at Tinchi Tamba is also an excellent place for spotting a large variety of shorebirds that dwell in the mangroves and mudflats. The Bushlands at Deagon and Brighton are perfect for a relaxing stroll, also having several walking tracks. 'Building Our Community'

Program a Success

Everyone likes a success story, and in this instance, we need to look no further than our very own community centre SANDBAG.

It was last November that the SANDBAG 'Building our Community' initiative commenced. It was a program inviting unemployed participants to partake in. The program targeted building skills, and on completion, graduates received a Housing Industry Association registered 'Certificate 1 in Construction'.

Luci Davey, SANDBAG's Work Skills and Pathways Facilitator says "The Work Skills programs at SANDBAG offer local people with barriers to employment a range of formal and practical skills to assist them into the workforce or on a pathway to further study. Much of the success has been due to the wonderful support of 4017 community groups, volunteers and local businesses."

The success rate of the first program is evident. The first intake of eleven students graduated on the 4th March and seven of these participants have since found employment. One of them is local Sandgate resident Lachlan Treadwell. Since graduating, he is now working as a Trades Assistant with a licensed builder on the south side of Brisbane. He also recently completed a small building project for local Sandgate business 'Thimble and Co'. "The program taught me to be more patient and considerate

to people's needs and circumstances. I've fully regained my drive and ability to help others and discovered how to reach my full potential. The community projects gave me a higher sense of feeling awesome!" says Lachlan.

Luci Davey says as well as offering the program to teach practical building skills it also goes beyond that. "We are helping participants in areas of communication, numeracy and literacy skills – the core skills required to become employable," Luci says.

Luci has been thrilled with the community support that the program has attracted. One example of this support was from Felice's Barber Shop which offered free haircuts to the graduates in preparation for job interviews and future employment. "It's a great program, I'm happy to offer a haircut to make them feel good about themselves and help them on their way to employment," says Felice.

The program has positive outcomes not only for the participants, but also for the local community. The 'Meals on Wheels' organisation has had outdoor bench seating made for them and 'The 'All About Living' organisation has had land clearing and general maintenance work completed.

SANDBAG are currently in the middle of its second intake, with a third and final intake to commence 4th July 2016.

2016 TAX PLAN **STRATEGIES**

The end of the financial year is fast approaching. Below is a list of important strategies to consider for small businesses to reduce their tax bill.

Superannuation - Maximising the amount that you put into your superannuation is a well known strategy to reduce taxable income. Contributions are taxed at 15% in the fund. The maximum amount that you can put into superannuation is \$30,000 for people aged 18-49 for the 2015/16 and 2016/17 years. The limit is \$35,000 for those 50 and above. These caps move back to \$25,000 for all taxpayers effective 1st July 2017. Super guarantee is included in these caps. So do no exceed the limits as 49% tax could apply. Your Superfund must receive contribution by 30 June 2016 (Pay employees super by 30 June 2016 to get a tax deduction). Consider whether a Self Managed Super Fund (SMSF) is for you if you don't have one. Compulsory Super is 9.5% of Ordinary Times Earnings from 1st July 2014 fixed for 4 years.

Write-off items up to \$20,000 for Small Business with turnover less than \$2 million. An example is if your business needs to spend \$15,000 on a new computer server – then you may be able to write that off all at once. The turnover threshold should increase to \$10 million in 2016/17 financial year.

Spend on tools of trade (Fringe Benefits Tax) Exempt Items – Includes Handheld portable tools of trade, computer software, notebook laptops, electronic organisers, digital cameras, briefcases and mobile phones (All immediate write-offs for your employees).

Defer Income – Where practical, defer issuing further invoices and/or receiving cash / debtor payments until after 30 June 2016.

Bring Forward Expenses – Purchase all consumable items before the end of the financial year such as stationery. Consider repairs to items.

Defer Capital Gains Tax (CGT). If you're looking at selling a property in June 2016, defer contract date until after 1 July 2016. This buys you an extra year and more time to prepare for the planning of the capital gains tax situation.

Ensure motor vehicle log books are upto-date. Every 5 years this must be done. If the motor vehicle use has gone up, this is then highly worth considering.

Prepayment ideas – Consider prepaying something that will work tax effectively (up to 30 June 2017 period – 12 months). For example, you could buy some shares and prepay the interest on the loan before 30 June 2016 for 12 months. Prepay rent for 12 months. Prepay travel expenses. Prepay subscriptions.

In Summary, consider all the above strategies where appropriate to reduce the taxable income for 2015/16. Talk to Tim of Confidential Tax & Business about how to get ready for the next financial year; Trust Resolutions for Discretionary Trusts; Review Budget Changes; Review changes to Superannuation. And if you are employing staff, make sure you are super stream compliant.

Another reason why you don't need to leave 4017 is the new arrival of an aqua park in Bracken Ridge.

There may still be some things you would like to see come to our 4017 community, but now you can strike aqua park off the list.

Due to the initiative of the Bracken Ridge Indoor Sports Complex, there is now an aqua park similar to that operating in Bli Bli on the Sunshine Coast.

Looking to expand their business, owners and operators Riwhi Puru and Tina Warren came up with the idea to install a water park over two of their tennis courts at their Bracken Ridge Indoor Sports Complex.

While offering netball, soccer, beach volleyball, tennis and a batting cage for baseball and softball, a water-based activity was something they felt was needed particularly in the hot climate of Brisbane.

It was about six years ago that the idea came about,"

says Tina. "We had young kids and thought what would they enjoy?" After much research and planning, Tina and Riwhi ordered the inflatable equipment from China and the aqua park opened in May — much to the delight of local children who commonly express how "awesome" it is.

"Our intention is to keep the local kids busy," says Riwhi. "We have installed two Olympic-sized swimming pools over the tennis courts each with its own obstacles and slides," says Riwhi. "One is similar to the Bli Bli Aqua Park and the other has big castles around it with slides off them," he says.

The challenges Riwhi and Tina experienced were discovering punctures to the equipment after the journey from China. At port, a forklift punctured the equipment. This hiccup meant a later opening date than scheduled, but as Tina says, it has given them time to work out their processes and be ready for when the park gets busy later in the year.


The park will be open only on the weekends, and it is for kids fourteen years old and under.

The park will have lifesavers on duty to monitor the children and make sure all regulations are adhered to.

Group bookings are welcome and encouraged. Birthday parties can be held here and catering will also be available.

Remembering Sandgate Kiosk

To benefit the numerous visitors to our beaches the Sandgate Town Council decided to construct two kiosks one in Moora Park and another on Flinders Parade. Both were similar and designed by T R Hall and built by Sandgate builder Samuel Drew. The Moora Park Kiosk was built in the late 1890s and the Flinders Parade Kiosk in about 1902.

The Flinders Parade Kiosk was positioned on the foreshore in the vicinity of Fourth Avenue. Mangroves were still growing on the foreshore, and a jetty was built across the rocky ground to access the beach and sea water. The existing rock wall was built during the depression years of the 1930s by relief workers.

The Sandgate Town Band played at both kiosks on alternate Sundays. Teas and locally made soft drinks and ice cream (Kreamco) were served. Also lollies were sold, costing about one penny, and a vending machine dispensed 'three penny' Nestles chocolates.

An open-air theatre was built on the seaward side of the kiosk. Gas lamps were installed for lighting and a water tank installed until town water and electricity were established in the district in the 1920s. In 1927, the salt water baths were built just to the north of the kiosk.

The council owned and maintained the kiosk and over the years, there were several different tenants. For many years the tea rooms were well patronised and popular for functions. By the 1940s,

visitors to the area had decreased considerably
— mainly because of the increase in motor
transport and the opening of the Hornibrook
Highway which made access to northern
beaches more accessible.

At this stage, the council renovated the kiosk and added another tea room. The rotunda (bandstand) was removed and placed on a brick base. The larger tea room was built on the seaward side closer to the salt water baths. To enhance the building, the entire structure was enclosed with brick and cement.

As the popularity of the Sandgate seaside reduced, patronage died off and the tenants found the tea rooms unprofitable. The Brisbane City Council called tenders to purchase and demolish the building. Despite efforts from concerned citizens requesting the council to preserve the building as a local landmark, the kiosk was demolished in July 1962.





BUILDING YOUR 'HOME SWEET HOME'

Building a new home can be an exciting time. It's the one time we get to make a decision about where we want to live, how big our house will be and how the house will look, inside and out, plus much more. However, it can also be a stressful and time-consuming experience. Knowing where to start and what to expect goes a long way to achieving the house of your dreams. We've put together some important tips to help with starting a new building project.

- 1) Know about the land you're building on, whether you're buying a vacant lot or knocking down an existing house and rebuilding. Before approaching a builder, know what your land size is, how your local council has coded your block and if there are any overlays, and the physical aspects of the block. All these can affect what you can actually build and knowing upfront can be a good indicator as to how many \$\$\$ you may need to build on your dream block.
- 2) Visit as many display homes as possible. Do your research and gather ideas about what look you want; external façade, internal design, interior decorating and colour schemes. Ask a builder for the address of other houses they have built that vou can view. Ask others who have built with that builder what their experience was. Ask for recommendations from family and friends as they will likely give you honest advice and won't recommend a builder who hasn't provided a favourable experience. Also visit websites such as www.gbcc.gld.gov.au to view if a builder is licenced, and www.productreview.com.au for consumer reviews. Also check to see if they are insured with either Master Builders or HIA. Whether you choose a project home builder or custom design builder, research what other's experiences have been.

All in all, do your research. Know what floor plan and design you are happy with, as well as what features you want in your house prior to beginning negotiations with a builder. Doing this and following the tips should put you in a prime position for a happy and exciting building experience.
