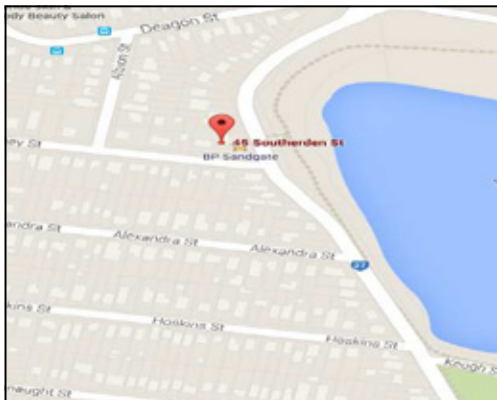

Have the night off and make some children very happy at The Bayside's Night of Nights on Friday, 8th July.

The evening is a fundraiser for the local Fun For All campaign, committed to installing an all-abilities, all-inclusive playground at Arthur Davis Park on Flinders Parade, Sandgate.

Fun For All campaign spokeswoman Tamara Wecker says international inspirational speaker Cam Calkoen will be the highlight of the evening.

"We're so excited to have Cam flying from Auckland especially to join us here in our little bayside village," Tamara says.

"We first saw Cam speak at a RE/MAX event in 2014, and still to this day his message inspires us. We're certain he'll leave a lasting impression on our community here in 4017.

"Born with Cerebral Palsy, Cam has gone from having his ability doubted in every regard, to exceeding expectations in every field. And the best bit is he shares his story with a wicked sense of humour... He's a very entertaining guy."

Other entertainment for the evening includes; local musician Cohen Anderson, who will set the tone of the night with his soulful and rhythmic tunes; and Sandgate's Town Crier Fred Krebs, who will officially open the event.

The evening will run from 7pm-10pm at the historic Sandgate Town Hall, and will feature raffles and a charity auction.



This is sure to be a light-hearted night that puts the "fun" back in "fundraising", and one that will be remembered for years to come," Tamara says.

"Our plan is to create a public, cost-free playground with specialty equipment that goes far beyond being simply fun, to being a playground that is truly inclusive for all. This includes children with a physical disability and those who are wheelchair bound."



Music by the Sea: Notes from the Cave

On Saturday, 9th July at 7.30pm, popular Acacia Quartet (Sydney) returns to Music By The Sea to perform *The Harp & The Harpoon*.

The program includes Beethoven's famous *Harp String Quartet in Eb Op 74* which is nicknamed for the arpeggiated pizzicato passages in the first movement.

Two other compositions that reflect Australia's unique landscape will also give the concert audience more outstanding music by Lisa Stewart and Myee Clohessy (violin), Stefan Duwe (viola) and Anna Martin-Scrase (cello).

The first of these works, *Kudikynah Cave*, is by Moya Henderson who is one of the country's most established composers with a career spanning four decades.

This single movement, with its beautiful, stirring harmonies, takes its name from a cave hidden along the banks of the Franklin River in the rain forests of Tasmania.

The second work presents the world premier of an intriguing work titled *Law Of The Tongue* written by Nicholas Vines, one of our new generation composers.

Inspired by a unique piece of history from the small whaling town of Eden on the New South

Wales coast, this soundscape tells of the collaboration between man and the orca whales in their hunt for baleen whales.

Vine's composition mimics different whale songs, an Aboriginal corroboree, the orca's tail slaps, the exhilarating hunt and the whaler's final thrust of the harpoon.

On Saturday **6th August**, one of the country's most loved chamber music ensembles, **Flindres Quartet** brings the works of Britten, Stuart Greenbaum and Beethoven to Sandgate.

Described as a quartet for the twenty-first century, members Shane Chen and Nicholas Waters (violin), Helen Ireland (viola), and Zoe Knighton (cello) play a full spectrum of repertoire hailed by audiences and critics alike.

ABC Classics label released their 2011 ARIA-nominated CD *Fandango*, and the 2015 release of *Intimate Voices: Sibelius String Quartet*, while their first commercial work *Reinventions* was later re-released by ABC Classics.

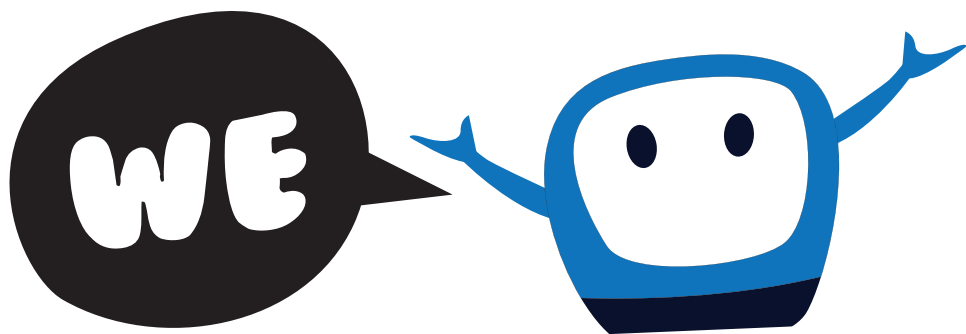

Spokes people will come to the bayside from far and wide to catch history in motion as old-school bike riders pedal their way around Sandgate at Pennies By The Sea on Saturday, 23rd July.

Event organiser and current President of the Queensland Penny Farthing and Historical Cycle Club Aaron Wray says it is a unique and much-loved event.

“Everyone loves Penny Farthings, from kids to older people as they are a fascinating mode of transport,” he says.

“We will have bicycles from a variety of eras and people will get the opportunity to see them in action and learn about the history of the bike.”

The event kicks off at 8:30am with the annual Queensland Penny Farthing Championship, a 1-mile race around the closed track, followed by a tricycle ride, the Queensland Turtle Ride at Einbunpin Lagoon and the much-anticipated penny farthing stack.

Aaron says everyone is welcome to come along and watch the free events on the day.

“Visitors can expect to see a number of penny farthings, penny farthing tricycles, old fashioned kids’ games, historical dancing and they can get close and ask questions of the riders,” he says.

Aaron says the event was the idea of Brett Richardson, who runs a course to build your

own penny farthing through Tafe Queensland Skillstech at Bracken Ridge.

“Pennies by the Sea started in 2010 as an opportunity for those who had either built or owned their own penny farthing to meet up and talk about their bikes and show them to the public,” he says.

“ Since that time it has become a bigger event with more opportunities for the public to be involved.

Aaron says Pennies by the Sea is evolving into a significant event for Sandgate.

“Our event compliments the rich history of the Sandgate area, bringing a focus on the heritage of the local area to the broader community.

“We are great believers in using local suppliers and having local involvement in our event, using local cafés and restaurants for some of our events, local food and coffee vans attending, and we also donate money from the Sandgate Tweed Ride to the Sandgate Men’s Shed to support their great work.

“We actively work with the members of Parliament in the area to ensure our event supports the local community.”

Midwinter Theatrics in Sandgate

Get set to be drawn into the lives of everyday characters experiencing extraordinary life situations as the Elysium Theatre perform two emotion evoking plays at Sandgate Town Hall.

The Elysium Theatre will be performing two Alan Bennett plays, *A Chip In The Sugar* and *Lady of Letters*. The audience can expect to experience a mix of emotional responses to the characters represented in each play.

Toby Chittenden brings about nine characters to life in *Chip In The Sugar*. The audience will discover his commitment and sensitivity to the characters he portrays. The focus of the play is how Graham Whittaker's relationship with his mother is upset by a visit from an old flame – Frank Turnbull. Frank suddenly appears on the scene and sweeps Graham's mother off her feet.

Sharyn Henry's character in *Lady of Letters* is Irene Ruddock. Miss Ruddock is unmarried and previously a full time caregiver to her mother who has now passed away. She is a 'curtain twitcher' with too much time on her hands. With very little social interactions to speak of, she has become a prolific letter writer to people she doesn't know which ultimately lands her in trouble with the law.

Director of Elysium Theatre Sharyn Henry chose to perform these plays because the themes and issues they raise are of universal appeal.

“ The characters in each of these plays are rooted in a particular social environment. With humour and pathos, each production has a focus on the isolation of each protagonist within the protective social roles they have adopted or had thrust upon them.

“There is a mountain of behind-the-scenes work that is essential in order to bring any play to the stage. The collaborative effort between the actor and director is of great importance because in the end, set and costumes become secondary to a studied and exciting interpretation of a text. It is essential to get inside the head of each of the characters. Giving truthful and thoroughly believable performances pulls the audience into the lives of the people portrayed on stage,” says Sharyn.

Alan Bennett, author of the play recently made into a film *Lady In The Van*, has been a household name in British theatre ever since 1960.

As producer and presenter of Elysium Theatre Sharyn strives to ensure that each production leaves the audience wanting more.

Calling all skateboarders and scooter riders to show off your skills and win prizes at local skate competition.

With the aim of bringing communities, families and kids together, the 'Off the Wall Skate Comp' has been initiated and is all go for Saturday, 30th July at Bracken Ridge Skate Park.

Event Coordinator from 'Off the Wall Events' Kathleen Browne says, "Competitions like this allow kids to discover they can set and achieve goals while overcoming obstacles. Working together, we can empower our youth through the creation of quality events and programs through scooter and skateboarding."

For Kathleen, the aim of the event is to show the community that skate facilities are not just recreational facilities. They can be a catalyst for healthy communities in which young and old come together, socialise, have fun, develop new skills, make new friends and practice the sport they love.

The idea of the skate competition came about as a result of event students at Martin College coming up with an idea for their final assessment. They were tasked with developing a live event.

Kathleen also wanted to bring about more awareness to scooter riding. This will be the first competition for scooter riders in Bracken Ridge Skate Park.

The event will feature a skateboard and scooter competition. There will be various categories, and judging of the competition will be by members of the Australian Skateboarding Community Initiative. There will be an under twelve and an under fifteen category. An 'Open' skateboard category and a 'Pro's' scooter division. Plus there will be a 'Jam' session for all with a cash grab theme with great prizes to be won.

Alongside the competition there will be entertainment too. Renowned street artist Michael Powell will be demonstrating street art. Female DJ duo DJ Corbett will be mixing their

decks alongside rapping by Australian rap artist TJ Young. Market stalls will also be featuring on the day.

Registrations will commence at 11am and there will be free park riding from 11am -1pm.

There is no cost to enter the competition, and a free sausage sizzle will be on offer.

Sandgate's premier event will come to life on Sunday, 31st July when the annual Einbunpin Festival will put a spotlight on our "Bay of Sunshine".

Now in its 24th year, the festival is a celebration about everything that makes Sandgate special.

Deagon Ward Councillor Jared Cassidy has attended the festival since he was a young child, has worked as a volunteer with the festival for the past 10 years and is now the 2016 festival chairman.

"I remember the Einbunpin Festival as a great day out with friends and when I was attending Shorncliffe State School, the Festival was always marked in our school calendar - it was almost like a local Ekka for us," he says.

"As I got older I started appreciating the sense of community it has, which is what's very special about it now.

"Something that hasn't diminished is the interest the Bunpin gets from children - I remember giving the Bunpin a high five as a youngster - now they get selfies."

Cr Cassidy says this year's festival will build on the success and format of the previous years, with over 150 stalls ranging from local schools,

community groups, service organisations, sports groups and local businesses.

There will be more than 50 acts spread across three stage areas, with a focus on young and up and coming artists.

"People can expect to have a full day of activity with the festival," he says.

"They can get some great products and food from local groups, watch some fantastic acts and listen to fantastic local musicians and participate in some fun activities with the kids.

“ There really is something for everyone at the festival once again themed 'Little Bay of Sunshine', which incorporates not only the natural beauty of the area we live in, but also the friendly and active community.”

Cr Cassidy says The Einbunpin Festival was originally set up as a way for the community to come together once a year and celebrate.

"Nothing has changed in 25 years for that reason - it's our opportunity to shine," he says.

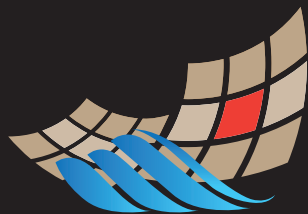

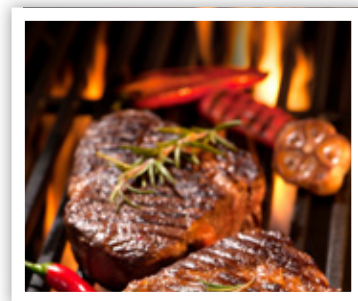

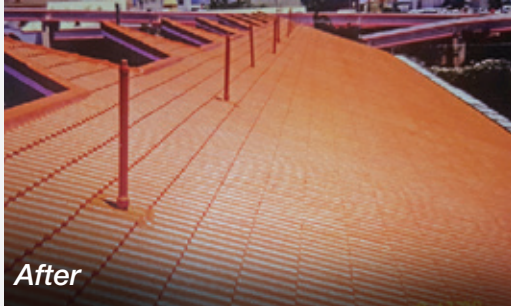

Reach Out – Put Your Hands Up!

Sports fans put their hands up, winners put their hands up, children put their hands up and volunteers put their hands up. Funk musicians have been telling us for decades to put our hands in the air!

To raise your hand(s) is usually an action expressed in response to something you encounter in your environment, often with a positive meaning.

It can also be a simple, rewarding physical motion; to reach for the sun, a big stretch with your hands up in bed in the morning can prepare you for almost anything you come across in the ensuing five minutes (after that you're on your own)...

Plants stretch too, and reach for the sun. They instinctively stretch upwards every day and we often do not notice. Bamboo can stretch towards the light at up to one metre per day, and many flowers will stretch and turn their necks to face and follow the sun from morning till dusk.

Always be conscious of your plants growing in a gangly fashion or on a strange angle. It could mean that they are not getting enough light! You can greatly improve your likelihood of success in the garden (or with your indoor plants) by making sure your plants can see the light.

Most garden advice regarding light will refer to the general terms 'full sun', 'part shade' or 'shade'. The right amount of sun can make or break your chances to enjoy your plant's growth.

When a plant is recommended to have 'full sun', that means you should aim for at least five to eight hours of (shadow-casting) direct sunlight each day; 'part shade' refers to less direct sunlight than this, while shade-loving plants will tolerate an almost complete lack thereof. Often, a plant will continue to survive in the wrong light conditions, but it may not thrive and it certainly won't reach its potential. Over-watering, an increased risk of fungal problems and pest attack, and general poor health can result from insufficient light; so if you see your plants reaching out, then give them a hand to a brighter location in the garden!

Should you choose to, you can reach out often in life; physically, by stretching, moving or dancing; or metaphorically, by simply putting your hand up to volunteer to help someone out. A balanced life may have all of these things!

RizeUp and Out

Local removalists help domestic violence victims move for free

Local Brisbane removalists have joined forces with charities such as DV Connect, Rize Up and YourTown to help victims of Domestic Violence in South East Queensland.



With the increasing number of calls charities are receiving, they need more help relocating the victims, and this removalist company is doing just that.

Each year DV Connect receives over 55,000 incoming calls related to domestic violence, family violence and sexual assault, and the Womensline calls are received mostly from the southeast corner of Queensland, particularly Brisbane.

At least twice a week, Your Local Movers receive a phone call from a charity needing help either assisting a victim out of their home, moving items in and out of storage and setting up and relocating safe houses. All removalists are hired following background checks and sign a confidentiality agreements, allowing them to do this type of work.

Noticing the growing trend, Managing Director Zachary Rook made contact with DVconnect and Rize Up to formalise an agreement, and the rest is history. Your Local Movers donates around \$6,000 a month worth of services from moving to storage and packing materials.

The five-time '30 under 30' winner, Zachary says, "On top of calls from charities, we also receive a number of calls from victims themselves, organising the move with police assistance, we do whatever we need to do to help the victims out in this situation to ensure the move goes safely and quickly.

"One of our company values is that we believe in doing everything right, and this is just one way we can help out the community in the right way. I hope more removalists in Brisbane are able to start helping in the future to create positivity towards the industry."

Zachary believes that "not only are we able to help victims safely relocate homes, we are also able to create awareness for our staff as they are seeing first-hand how it affects everyone in the situation.



At RizeUp, we complete approximately four homes per week, and we rely on the generosity of the community to fulfill this. If it wasn't for the amazing help that Your Local Movers gives us, then we wouldn't be able to provide the much needed home filled with furniture for the families.

It is businesses like Your Local Movers that make a change for victims of domestic violence and help raise the awareness so we can work towards zero tolerance of domestic violence in our country," said RizeUp founder Nicolle Edwards.

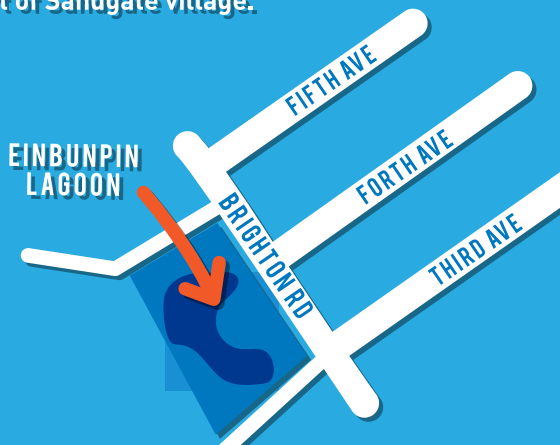

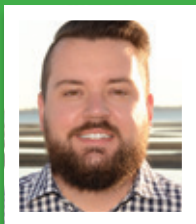

A WORD FROM OUR REPRESENTATIVES

The Council Budget has been handed down, and while we have secured some funding for local works, there have been some big omissions. While I made clear to the Lord Mayor that upgrading the Brighton Foreshore was a

very high priority for me locally, it has missed out on funding once again.

I was successful in lobbying for works on Lemke Road over the coming years where we will see the road widened to four lanes and the bridge duplicated and flood proofed over the Cabbage Tree Creek.

We are also seeing a boost to the mossie spraying budget which is great news and comes after a lot of community pressure from Northside locals who have to deal with mossies almost all year round.

I am very pleased to have been able to secure funding for a number of local events and festivals in the budget. The Einbunpin Festival, Bluewater Festival, Christmas in Sandgate, Music By The Sea Festival, Sandcliffe Writers Festival, South Pacific Islander Christmas Celebrations and Zillmere Festival have all been funded once again.

Sandgate locals are set to benefit from public transport fares being slashed from January 2017. The Palaszczuk Government's Fairer Fares Package will deliver real cost of living relief to public transport users in our community.

The Sandgate electorate is currently split across four zones. Under the fare reform, it will be only a single zone. What this means for locals is, it will cost the same for you to travel to the CBD whether you're travelling from Sandgate, Brighton, Bald Hills, Bracken Ridge, Fitzgibbon, Taigum, Deagon or Shorncliffe. Commuters traveling from Sandgate Station to the CBD could save \$578.88 per year, while those taking the bus from Bracken Ridge to the CBD could enjoy savings of more than \$889.92 per year; based on commuting 48 weeks of the year.

It is not only those travelling to the CBD who will save. For example, a commuter travelling locally from Bracken Ridge to Sandgate could save more than \$315.36 annually on their journeys; based on commuting 48 weeks of the year.

These savings will do a lot to help locals manage hip-pocket expenses.

Public transport fares will remain frozen for the rest of this year, and in 2017.

The beginning of a new financial year means Council's Free Native Plant's Program is again underway. This is a great Council initiative that allows Brisbane ratepayers, Housing Commission and Defence Housing residents

to claim two free native plants.

Residents can collect their free trees voucher from Council libraries, Council offices or a Ward Office upon presentation of a current, paid rates notice or evidence of a recent rental payment for Housing

Commission and Defence Housing residents.

Schools, registered community groups and charitable organisations are also eligible to apply for up to 50 free plants. This is a great opportunity for schools who will be celebrating Arbor Day in October as plants are available in the months prior.

In addition to the above, clubs on leased Council land and Body Corporates may also be eligible.

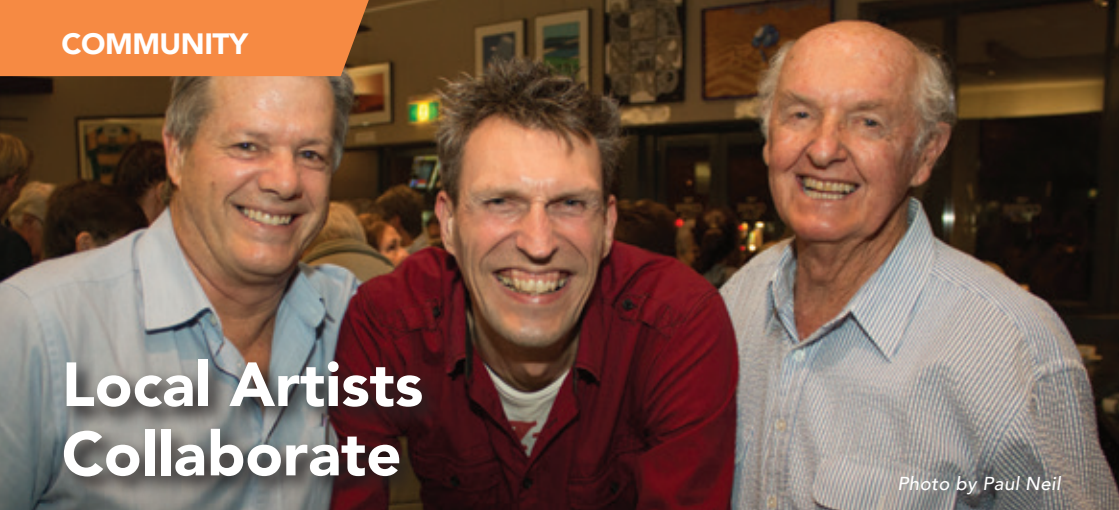

Three local artists and friends exhibit their similar style works at Sandgate's Coffee Club. An exhibition entitled 'Three Artistic Friends' is to take place at 'The Coffee Club' from late June until mid August.

The café regularly features local artists however, in July there will be three local artists work on display. All three artists reside locally and all take much inspiration from the natural landscape of Moreton Bay.

Owen Hutchison is a print maker with a gallery in Sandgate. Owen's prints are relief prints and are formed by carving an image onto a surface of wood. Owen is drawn to printmaking though his penchant for working in wood, the printmaking process and the artistic power of a good print. Owen says, "Common threads about my images is that quite a number of them contain a narrative element... I like to tell stories in my art... and also to provide an attractive image. It's a compromise between creating an image that has artistic appeal and a narrative. I think a significant number of art lovers also like a story that they can relate to."

Ed Schimmel is also a print maker, although his techniques are digital based, beginning with a hand drawn sketch that he then translates onto a computer.

"To me, creating art is almost like meeting a new friend. When drawing figures I really enjoy

it when they develop a personality and all of a sudden come alive and greet me. That feels magical," says Ed.

Ed takes much inspiration from the local natural landscape of Brisbane. This is reflected in his work of beach scenes, birds and soldier crabs.



As a nature lover I am often inspired by the beautiful nature around me, but every colourful or cheerful subject can trigger me to make a new print," says Ed. Ed describes his work as a mix of modern, minimalism and abstract art.

Rob Stevenson's work is similar to Ed and Owen, in that his work is bold, colourful and graphical, but he is a painter. Rob specialises in zentangles, which can be described as an abstract drawing, or as Rob calls it, "A fancy name for doodles."

Rob calls his art business 'Wandering Mindscapes' which summarises his unique style. Inspired by the natural landscape, Rob also takes inspiration wherever his mind takes him. He describes his work as a fusion between impressionism and abstract art with a touch of naivety.

The Lord Mayor's 2016/17 Budget includes funding for a pop-up cafe at Shorncliffe, near the recently completed renewed Shorncliffe Pier.

Lord Mayor Graham Quirk said the Shorncliffe Pier is a landmark destination, and a new pop-up cafe will help to create a vibrant new community space that will be enjoyed for generations to come.

"This will have a similar design to the shipping containers at the Eat Street Markets and will provide a boost to the local economy, fulfilling my commitment to revitalise Shorncliffe," Cr Quirk said.

Brighton Foreshore Works

Council has commenced works to upgrade sections of shared pathway at Brighton to ensure it can continue to be enjoyed by cyclists and pedestrians well into the future.

Works are being undertaken on a 400 metre section at Eleventh and Twelfth Avenue and a 220 metre section near Decker Park, that have suffered long term wear and tear caused by salt water erosion and tree roots in the area.

The project will deliver a new, wider pathway surface that will increase safety and convenience for residents and visitors travelling through the area.

These works are expected to be completed mid-July.

The Sandgate School of Arts

History Spot

The Sandgate School of Arts was situated on the seaward side of Seymour Street in the vicinity of the Seniors Citizens Building. The building was supported by a network of timber bearers, and it seemed to hang over the cliff side. It commanded a magnificent view along Flinders Parade to the Pine River. It was built to be an educational institution and was originally established by the business people of Sandgate and operated as an independent community organisation assisted by government subsidy and overseen by a group of elected trustees.

There was a reading room and a piano and music room which was used for small venues. Other activities include social events, meetings, and a town library

The building, designed by architect Mr G W O Wilson, was built on a parcel of land comprising of a triangular piece of land near the station master's house and obtained from the Commissioner for Railways and another piece of equal size adjoining given by the Sandgate municipality. It was built in 1887 for the cost of £391 which had been donated by local business and influential people.

In 1898 the Sandgate Technical College was

established as part of the School of Arts, with teachers being appointed by the Education Department who also provided the necessary equipment for the courses. The college provided technical education for an annual fee of £1 for courses including dressmaking, cooking, commercial subjects such as shorthand, carpentry and plumbing. The Technical College closed in 1939. From then, the building was used mainly for meetings and as the town library.

Shortly after the building had been erected, it became evident that the building's foundations should have been constructed more securely. Because of lack of funds at that time, a decision was made by the trustees and council against attempting to make the structure more rigid. Despite this, the building survived in this condition. In the 1960s it was dismantled.

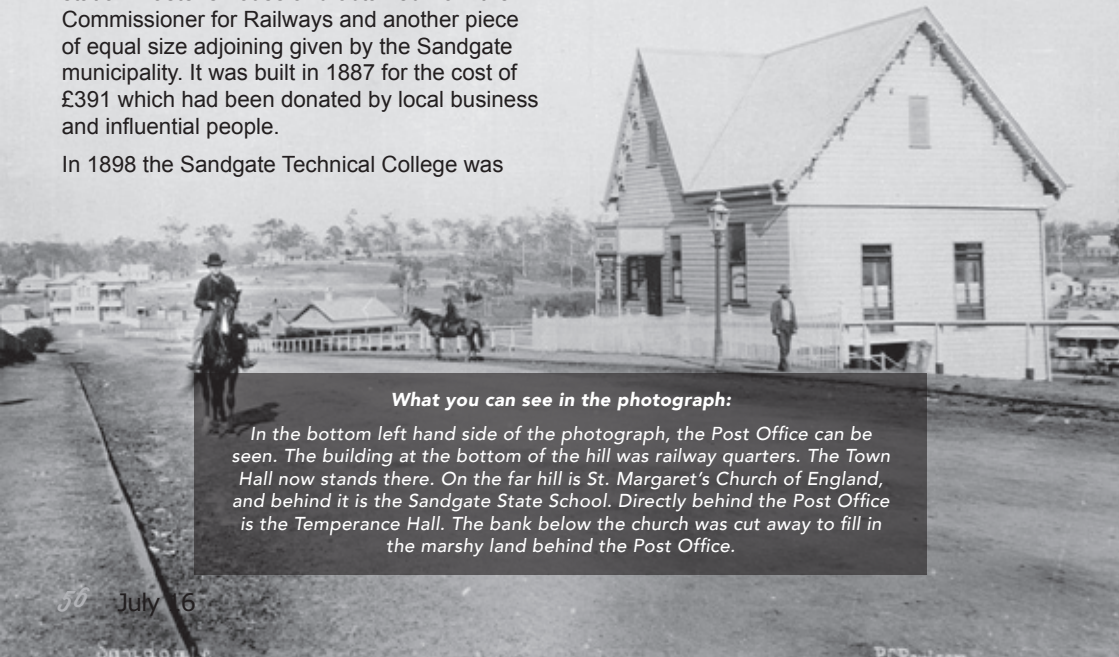

In the bottom left hand side of the photograph, the Post Office can be seen. The building at the bottom of the hill was railway quarters. The Town Hall now stands there. On the far hill is St. Margaret's Church of England, and behind it is the Sandgate State School. Directly behind the Post Office is the Temperance Hall. The bank below the church was cut away to fill in the marshy land behind the Post Office.

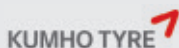

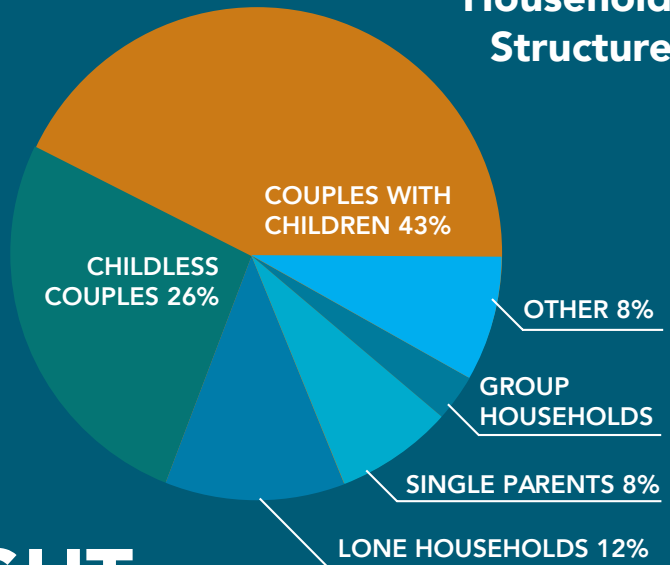
