

Hopefully, as long as the *Australia Day Organising Committees* can find the strength to co-ordinate the sausage sizzle, the damper bake, the SES display, the school choir, and the deputy mayor is willing to hand out native shrubs to welcome new Australians, we should take a moment to re-discover the self-effacing tolerance that made this country worthwhile in the first place.

"Australia Day" contains bags of good old Aussie humour, buckets of course language, loads of political incorrectness, and will probably offend just about everybody (and you'll laugh yourself silly). Aren't Aussies best known for their ability to take the mickey out of themselves? If that is you, come along and take the mick.

August brings an inspiring initiative for Sandgate's more mature residents, a Healthy Ageing Expo.

This event is being held at the Brighton Health Campus as part of Senior's Week and will include a variety of stalls from community organisations, as well as displays from service providers. People will also be able to participate in some healthy ageing activities such as tai chi and walking groups.

The dedicated staff from the Brighton Health Campus will be on hand during the Expo to discuss rehabilitation and transition care, covering falls prevention, pressure injury prevention and more. Visitors to the Expo will be able to discuss these topics with physiotherapists, occupational therapists, social workers and nurses.

In addition, the Expo will have stalls from BreastScreen Queensland, the Heart Foundation and Heart Foundation Walking, Elder Abuse Prevention Unit, Sandbag Inc., the Sandgate Police, Sandgate District and Men's Shed, the Eventide Bowls Club and many more. Another purpose for the Expo is so that people in the local community can provide feedback on the draft vision for the Brighton Health Campus. This draft was originally developed through extensive community consultation last year but feedback is still very welcome. Currently the vision is focused on building strong links with the local community as well as increasing social activities at the campus. This sentiment is echoed by the project's Community and Strategic Relationships Manager Danielle Grant-Cross, who said,

Brighton Health Campus has a mix of permanent aged care residents and long term rehabilitation patients. It's important that when people are living here for months or years they are able to participate in a vibrant social community."

Those involved with the project are already working to move the Men's Shed to the Campus and are consulting with other community partners to get involved. "There is so much potential here on the foreshore for outdoor community activities and events in the auditorium," says Ms Grant-Cross.

The Healthy Ageing Expo will be held on Friday 19th August from 9am - 3pm at the Brighton Health Campus, 449 Beaconsfield Tce, Brighton.

Sand Garden Competitions

In 1921, a teacher/writer using the name Martin Hambleton, who contributed to the "The Young Folk" pages in the Daily Mail started the first of many sand garden competitions.

The competitions were held over the Christmas school holidays and continued annually. In 1933, the Daily Mail was merged with the Sunday Mail and these contests continued until the 1950s. They aroused the greatest interest at the beach resorts and provided competitive entertainment for the children.

Sand garden competitions were held on beaches in Northern New South Wales and as far north as Hervey Bay. A ring group of the beaches was formed and competitors from the various beaches (north & south) contested the grand final. First, second and third prize winners at all contests entered the final. With the help of many volunteers and the local councils, Martin Hambleton organised the timetable for all the districts. A system of marks was adopted and each garden was judged on neatness, balance, architecture and originality.

An area of beach was roped off and each competitor was given a similar sized area for their garden and a time limit of about forty-five minutes.

In designing their sand garden, the competitors could only use items found on the beach. e.g. plants, shells, rocks etc.

The newspapers reported in 1928, over 5000 people witnessed the efforts of the children on the beach at the Sandgate Sand Garden Competition and in 1930, over 3000 people watched the artistic and skilful work of the children competing in the annual grand final at Sandgate. The general opinion was that the scheme is the finest that has ever been instituted for promoting creative and educative enjoyment for the youngsters.



Family Gatherings

Organic eating is more than just a passing fad for a group of women in Sandgate and Brighton. It's a lifestyle choice for them and their families.

It was eight years ago when Brighton resident Tara Cross joined an organic fruit and vegetable Co-op. She wanted to give her young children the best food available. The Co-op however proved to be a bit more hectic than she liked so she decided to take it into her own hands and create her own group.

"We wanted to create a Co-op on a much simpler scale, one that was much less complicated," says Tara. Along with a friend, Tara sourced a supplier and in no time they had a group of committed like-minded members.

For Tara, "It's about sourcing the freshest, locally grown, chemical free produce. We have a ruling that we never buy from out of the country.

"It's also a fantastic vibe where great friendships have been formed."

When Tara's Brighton based group grew too big, fellow member Pippa van Wijk created a break away group in Sandgate. She has been running this group for the last five years. Pippa was so committed to the Co-op that when house hunting for a new home a key factor was that the house must be suitable to service the needs of the Co-op. A suitable property was found and a garage underneath the house provided a space to have produce delivered and packed ready for distribution. For Pippa it's about:

being able to buy local and organic produce at a price that is affordable for a big family. I love the social and community element too and the fact that you have to work a bit harder to get your food," says Pippa.

Members of the Co-op are required to order an eighty-dollar box fortnightly. They receive a box filled with seasonal produce. It varies depending on what is available at that time of year. Members need to be able to help pack the boxes several times a year. Frequency is determined by how many members are in the group.

The Co-op has compared prices at a local supermarket. Results showed that the same produce in the supermarket amounted to one hundred dollars and these were not organic.

Pippa and Tara firmly believe in living by organic and sustainable principles. Pippa has now ventured into sourcing Barambah dairy produce for Co-op members and she also holds a wholefoods shop from her garage three times a year.

Military-Style Training Session

Ex Paratrooper: Fitness Game Changer

It's 5:15am. The sun is not yet up, but a group of early risers gather to be pushed to the limits in a military-style training session at Shorncliffe's Moora Park.

You know you're at the right place when you see the army jeep and instructor Tim Cuming dressed in army fatigues.

The next hour is a combination of bodyweight circuits and what Tim calls 'Battle PT'. This could involve running through the sea to crawling commando style along the sand to press-ups and sit-ups in the sea shallows.

What gets people up at this hour to be put through a gruelling hour of physical and mental exertion?

For Sally-Anne Carey, "I like the military aspect. I have never been pushed to my limits as much as Tim would have in his career and I remind myself of this when it hurts. I refer to him as being positively annoying! He is like your conscience and makes you just keep going."

For the man behind 'SF Training', Tim Cuming or 'Stomps' as he is mostly known (a name that he hasn't managed to lose from his military days), "It's amazing to see the sense of achievement when people push outside their boundaries. I will push people to as far they can go and a bit more. I feel quite exhilarated watching people grow or in some cases shrink," says Tim.

The physical training however is just a small part of the business for Tim. He is most passionate about running what he calls his 'SF Challenges'.

Sessions are usually about three hour missions where Tim has devised an entire scenario where you have to role-play in the particular mission. He will provide you with a map of the area and within that location you are on a 'tour of duty'. This may be rescuing an injured soldier over a water barrier, building a casualty evacuation centre, towing a broken down land rover or drawing out that ingenious side of you to construct a raft.

Tim believes, "In every civilian there is a little soldier waiting to get out."

An integral part of Tim's business plan to provide a place for combat veterans to rehabilitate back into civilian life. Tim is very aware how real the issue of veteran suicide is.

"We are losing way too many [veterans] and these really are our country's finest and so deserve some much needed support. They don't need a handout, they need a hand up". Tim's intention is to use SF as a vehicle to train them up, use their skills and experience and at the end they will be certified for fitness instruction.





Getting the Balance Right

You will need a sunny, protected spot in your garden with a reasonable amount of air circulation. They're a bit greedy of nitrogen and will be thankful for rich soil, good drainage and occasional doses of seaweed based fertilizer.

These are all plants that love being picked at regularly, and they are all great for your body too. Calcium is beneficial in maintaining healthy teeth and bones, and there's loads of this in tatsoi. One serving of bok choi or pak choi can pack in almost half of our daily requirement of vitamin k, which is also a bonus for bones. Whatever your choi-ce, your body will thank you!

When conditions in your garden strike the right balance, growing greens is easy! But greens are just one element - don't forget chocolate, wine, friendship and sleep; they're important too! Strive to find a balance in your garden, a balance in your diet and a balance in your life!

Saving Bramble Bay

The Indigenous Dreamtime story of the dugong relates its journey from grazing grass lands as a large four legged mammal, to grazing sea grass in the shallow tropical waters surrounding Queensland.

Bramble Bay's once clear waters and extensive sea grasses, supported large colonies of Dugong before European settlement. A description by the Sandgate Historical Society mentions the way much of the coastline from Nudgee Beach to the Pine River supported a multitude of life, especially shellfish and crabs that were widely used by the Turrbal People, the Traditional custodians of Sandgate and surrounds.

Since European settlement however, waterways throughout all of South East Queensland including those that flow into Bramble Bay, have experienced steadily declining water quality.

Dr Alistair Grinham, from the University of Queensland, has worked in the area of sediment and nutrient dynamics. "Much of the pollution that flows into Moreton Bay and Bramble Bay, comes from further inland," he explains. "After rain, the water that flows out of the Brisbane River usually carries a lot of sediment as well as nutrients from chemical fertilisers and sewage pollutants. A lot of the water spreads into Bramble Bay, and since the tidal currents are weaker around the western parts of Moreton Bay, the sediments that get pushed into Bramble Bay do not disperse easily."

Bramble Bay is also very shallow, meaning the sediment and silt are continuously stirred up by wind and waves. This turbidity has in more recent decades caused the lush seagrass beds to die off, and we sadly no longer see Dugong in Bramble Bay. As Dr Grinham mentioned, "The problem with Moreton Bay lies with the fact that it is influenced by so many different factors. There is no single cause and no single solution."

Although Sandgate is really at the end of all the processes that contribute towards water quality, there are still local actions that can be taken to help the bay as much as possible. As local environmentalist Laurie Jeays wrote, "Where possible use less water and fewer chemicals, particularly garden herbicides. Allow gardens and lawns to absorb rain runoff."

Though the dugong may never return to Bramble Bay, there is still plenty that can be done to conserve the host of life that still thrives in the bay and good water quality is essential for these lifecycles to continue.

Renovate or Sell?



Consumer Housing Market Sentiment Survey

The latest quarterly housing market sentiment survey by CoreLogic and TEG rewards revealed that almost two thirds of Australian's think now is a good time to be purchasing residential property while roughly the same proportion believed the housing market is vulnerable to a significant correction.



According to CoreLogic research head Tim Lawless, the latest CoreLogic and TEG Rewards Housing Market Sentiment Survey highlights the paradox in housing market attitudes, with the large majority of survey respondents indicating that it's a good time to buy a home at a time when the market may be vulnerable to a significant downturn.

Of the 2,432 Australian residents who participated in the June quarter CoreLogic TEG Rewards Housing Market Sentiment Survey, 64% of respondents thought it was a good time to buy a dwelling, up from 60% of respondents a year ago.

The survey also explored attitudes toward foreign investment.

94% of survey respondents believe that foreign buying activity is placing some degree of upwards pressure on Australian home values, while 17% of those surveyed believe foreign buying is placing 'extreme' upwards pressure on home values. However more than half of those surveyed felt that any upwards pressure on dwelling values caused by foreign demand was modest, slight or non-existent.
