Feeling Hot, Hot, Hot...

We have really felt it this year! In the garden and almost everywhere else in the Sandgate suburbs, the celsius has soared over this summer!

February has always been one of our hottest months; as the season sails towards its autumnal successor and the relief that March may (or may not) offer, in Brisbane we still seek the shade and lots of water to get us through.



Our gardens also struggle in these times. As the temperature rises in the air, water from the soil evaporates and heads up to the sky, leaving plants with less of the essential elements they need to survive.

You can help to prevent the subsequent stress that plants go through by putting into practice a few tried and true tips in your garden, and even with your potted plants! Plants need increased water consumption on hot days.

You may have noticed your potted Peace Lily (Spathiphyllum wallisii) wilting and waning in the increased temperatures. Or maybe you noted that your favourite fruit trees are showing signs of stress as the heat wave hovers oppressively over them? Did you know that the time that people are most likely to be dehydrated is first thing in the morning? A long sleep with no water, then often a coffee or two to start the day; our bodies need water in the morning and so do our plants!

Here's what to do: look at your plants, look at the soil and the sun/shade ratio, and consider their needs. Is the soil dry? Give it some water. Mulch your plants to recycle the evaporating moisture from the soil. Try to water around the root zone rather than the foliage; on a really hot day the leaves transpire (or give off water) quickly and direct watering can sometimes be harmful to sensitive specimens. Is the plant in direct sunlight? Move potted plants into the shade and try to offer some shade to plants in the ground if you can — set up some shadecloth over your veggie patch.

Stay cool people, autumn is 'round the corner!

Forty years on for Sandgate Uniting Church Men's Club



The Brisbane City Council who funded its restoration donated the light pole to the Sandgate Historical Museum. Now, following the careful restoration works carried out by the Historical Society, this piece of history takes pride of place in front of the museum building.

"

The light pole will display a commemorative plaque dedicated to the preservation of our local heritage and to those who work so hard to maintain the history of this community," says Pam Verney, President of the Sandgate Historical Society.

The plaque is mounted on a piece of timber, also salvaged from the historic pier. As well as this, the ornate cross-arm at the top of the light pole has been adapted to be used as a flag pole. To complement this, the Sandgate Historical Museum has formally adopted the emblem of the original 1880 Borough of Sandgate, and will now use this emblem as its official corporate logo. To show the residents of Sandgate, the official unveiling will showcase the new flag design.

"A newly created flag with the new logo will also be broken out at the official unveiling by longtime resident, and legendary Sandgate Scout Master, Bert Midgley, and will be heralded by the Sandgate Town Crier, Fred Krebs," says Pam.

Everyone is welcome to enjoy this special occasion. An exhibit of pier photographs and memorabilia will be in the museum on the day, as well as displays of old Sandgate Town. Additionally, local historical publications and photos will be on sale at special prices, along with a raffle of a magnificent pier photograph.

"A portion of the footpath will be enclosed with boarding from the pier construction site where there will be a sausage sizzle, coffee van and seating available," Pam says.





Telegraph Road upgrade reaches new stage

Detailed designs for the final stage of the Telegraph Road corridor upgrade have been revealed. Once complete, it should halve peak travel times and deliver significantly improved bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure.

Lord Mayor Graham Quirk said the \$140 million project would greatly enhance one of the busiest corridors in northern Brisbane and would deliver a safer, less congested road for all road users.

"Earlier (last) year we revealed the concept designs for the project which had been fast-tracked and sought feedback from the community about the project," Cr Quirk said.

"Now we have finalised the detailed design


for the upgrade, with the community's views contributing to the development of the design unveiled today.

"The second and final stage will focus on upgrading Telegraph Road and Depot Road between Mustang Street and the Gateway Motorway ramps, as well as upgrading the Lemke Road to Tallowwood Place.

"The stretch between Mustang Street to the Gateway on-off ramps as well as Lemke Road to Tallowwood Place will be widened to four lanes, and a new signalised intersection will be installed in place of the Telegraph Road, Lemke Road and Depot Road roundabout."

Infrastructure Chairman and local Councillor Amanda Cooper said a key part of the project was the delivery of upgraded bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure, with separated bike lanes to be installed.

"We have been working closely with local bicycle user groups such as the Brisbane North Bicycle User Group, to ensure this project benefits everyone, and we continue working with the community throughout the length of this important project," Cr Cooper said.

LITTLE BIT ABOUT THE HISTORY of

For many of us at this time of the year,

we get caught up in the romance of Valentine's Day, without understanding the origins of this love-filled day or why, year after year, we continue to celebrate it. This year, I delved into the history to understand our modern-day take on this day of celebrating love and admiration.

The first thing that became apparent to me was that Valentines is really a combination of Christian martyrdom stories, Roman and Greek mythology that bring together the legend surrounding Valentine's Day and its rituals.

Roman mythology suggests that Cupid was the son of Venus, the goddess of love. As such, Cupid is often considered the mischievous little boy god who goes around aiming arrows at his victim's hearts, making them fall in love.

Equally, Eros is the Greek equivalent of Cupid and is known as the god of love. During the Middle Ages, the idea of 'love's arrow' evolved into messages and poems of love, eventually leading to our modern-day love letters and greeting cards to mark the celebration of admiration for another.

Many Christian stories are associated with various Valentines, but the most popular is an account of a Christian bishop who performed forbidden marriage ceremonies in secret for Roman soldiers. This was an act in defiance towards the Emperor (Claudius II), who believed that the soldiers only love was to Rome. Legend has it that Saint Valentine was imprisoned for his crimes, and during his imprisonment, healed the daughter of his jailor. Before his execution on 14th February, Saint Valentine wrote her a letter signed 'from your Valentine' as his farewell.

Altogether, the combination of tales and legends help to explain some of the histories of the traditions still celebrated today, such as the secrecy that surrounds love messages from a 'secret admirer', the giving of gifts, symbols such as Cupid and his arrows and the colloquial phrase 'Your Valentine'.

So however you choose to express your love and affection for you chosen one this February 14th, I hope that like me, a little understanding of its history will help to make the day more symbolic and romantic than just a poetic verse on a greeting card.


