Lang's songwriting career had been heavily influenced by the folk music of Southern United States and British Isles, but has distinctly Australian lyrical content.


And his guitar playing is enriched by folk, blues and rock styles with Indian and African modalities.

"It's like plucking a muso from several bands, and they come together for a mashup of guitars, mandolin, banjo, bouzouki, percussions, harmonica and double bass.

"These musicians just have so much fun with it. They smile the whole time, and you can't help but feel wrapped up in what they do.



These guys are seasoned musicians, they live and breathe it — this style isn't just a flash in the pan for them."

Lucinda says the idea of a blues afternoon has sent ripples of excitement through the Sandgate community.

"Funnily enough, everyone's ears have pricked up when we tell them the plans," she says.

"Sandgate and the people here never cease to amaze."

Due to popular demand, Sandgate Bowls Club have launched Rock 'n Bowls afternoons once a month, with the first game of Jack Attack on Sunday, April 9.

The game of Jack Attack was introduced by Bowls Australia to fill the current gap in the market between competitive (pennant) play and social/barefoot bowls.

Sandgate Bowls Club marketing manager Robert McDonell says Jack Attack is a two bowls triples game with its own rules, and Rock 'n Bowls will have something for everyone live music, bowls, food and drink.

"We had numerous enquiries over a long time period to produce a weekend event that was attractive to people of all ages," Robert says.

A two set Jack Attack game takes about one and half hours, unlike four hours. People do not want an all afternoon game, which is currently the norm."

It is the perfect event for the inexperienced bowler, with club members on hand to help out.

"Players can be as social or competitive as they wish," Robert says.

Teams can consist of three, four or five players, with three bowling at any one time. If you have less than a team, the club will organise you and your friends into a team.

Children are also very welcome, with the club setting up a free junior Jack Attack system with rubber bowls.

Entry costs \$10, and the competition runs in two-hour slots, with games starting at 11am, 1pm and 3pm.



Now held on one full day, Good Friday, the Bluewater Festival's 20th year promises to be better than ever and a great way to start the Easter long weekend.

Since 1997, the Sandgate and Districts Chamber of Commerce has hosted the annual festival to coincide with the start of the Brisbane to Gladstone Yacht Race.

The day will include market stalls, gourmet food stalls and trucks, festival rides, a trackless train running to and from the festival and a fireworks finale at 7.30pm.

This year's full-day schedule will kick off at 7.30am with a yoga session on the beach. Live entertainment will begin at 9.45am with the 2RAR Pipe band.

Festival entertainment coordinator Gary Wood says with lots of big acts on the main stage; festival-goers should look forward to a vibrant, party scene by the beach.

It will be a full day of nonstop entertainment that will have something for all ages including the littlies," Gary says.

This year sees the introduction of surf boat racing. The surf boat regatta will begin at 9am with entrants from local high schools competing in a series of heats before finals start at 1.30pm.

The Shorncliffe Pier offers the best spot to view the races and catch the start of the Brisbane to Gladstone Yacht Race at 11am. Luke Hobbs, the son of the late Anne Hobbs, founder of the Bluewater Festival, will be firing the cannon to start the yacht race this year.

At 11.30am, head over to the main stage with the kids to see Brisbane's number one rock band for children perform, the Fabulous Lemon Drops.

Other talent appearing on stage includes Mad Murphy, Nik Phillips, Jive Cats, GBass and Buster's Duelling Pianos, with The Beach Boyz playing at 2.30pm.



A turn up for the Books.

Author and journalist, Matthew Condon, will be offering participants in the Sandcliffe Writers Festival a captivating insight into the intriguing stories and unforgettable experiences that have encompassed his career thus far.

Matthew is the author of over ten books including a true crime trilogy based on the former Police Commissioner Terry Lewis, who was convicted for corruption after the Fitzgerald Inquiry. His latest book, 'Little Fish are Sweet', was written as a companion to the trilogy. Matthew has been working on this series for the past seven years and has interviewed over 1000 people.

I could be working on this project for the next 20 years," he says, "It's been an eye-opening experience, wading through the reality of the human condition."

Matthew has been a Brisbane resident for most of his life and has always had a special connection with the bay side area. "My father's grandparents had a little place at Sandgate, and I had a great aunt who had a place near the bridge at Scarborough." He says. "I often went there as a kid, sometimes for school holidays."

Matt knew he wanted to be a writer from a very young age and started writing his first novel when he was 21 years old. He had it published when he was 26 after typing out the entire book 11 times on the typewriter during editing. "It was certainly a matter of patience," he says, "building the book brick by brick."

Shortly, Matt hopes to add 3 or 4 more books to his current crime series, and possibly get back to writing fiction after that. "I think I've learned a lot about research, about human beings and about myself through this project." He says. "I am interested to see what shape my writing will take, given the experience I've had with crime writing, when I get back to fiction. Fiction is a completely different headspace. I've come across characters; you simply couldn't make up."

Students from more than 14 local schools will march alongside veterans and community members at this month's Anzac Day ceremony in Sandgate.

On this day, April 25, we honour all the men and women who have participated in wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations around the world, including the ANZACs who fought at Gallipoli in World War I.

Internet safety will also feature as a topic of discussion in the workshops. "We remind our players to be mindful of the information they share in the world chat system," she says.

Most of all the workshops will be a chance for children to apply their creativity within a new and diverse platform.

It will encourage students to be digital creators rather than digital consumers," says Rebecca.

Mother's

Intimate stories about family life in Sandgate during the Depression era will come to life on the big screen, thanks to a unique collaboration between a Brisbane author and the South Korean Cultural Centre of Australia.

'Passage to Pusan' tells Thelma Healy's story, beginning when Thelma's husband abandoned the family, leaving her to raise ten children alone, in Third Avenue.

Author Louise Evans says, "We've been busy filming all the great old Sandgate sites including the Town Hall, the Sacred Heart Convent, where the Healy children attended school, and the magnificent old houses which have been lovingly restored and still stand proudly today."

Filming began here in February, and has continued in Sydney and Canberra, and travelling to South Korea in May to retrace Thelma Healy's historic journey.

Sandgate's safe and peaceful village is described as a place where no one locked their front door. Children roamed free after school on the beach and surrounding cliffs until the sun set and they were called home to dinner. They were carefree times of water tanks, dunny lanes and cows and chooks in the backyard.

When her eldest, Vincent, died while fighting in the Korean War in 1951, Thelma vowed she would travel to Korea and find where her son was buried.

Times were tough. It took ten years to save enough money to embark on a solo 15,000km journey to war-torn South Korea to find

Vincent's grave in Pusan. Thelma kept a diary about her brave journey of self-discovery. Fifty-five years later, her life story is told in print. 'Passage to Pusan' is written by Thelma's granddaughter and journalist, Louise Evans.

The Passage to Pusan documentary will be screened as part of the annual Australian-Korean Film Festival, held in all Australian capital cities, including Brisbane, 8-10 September at Event Cinemas Myer Centre.

Additionally, the Korean Cultural Centre of Australia will curate an exhibition of photographs and memorabilia relating to Thelma Healy's story, showing in Sydney and Canberra, before coming to Brisbane later this year.

I am proud and honoured that my grandmother's story is becoming a multi-media project," author Louise Evans said. "I can't wait to see old Sandgate come to life on the big screen."

FROM THE ARCHIVES

This month, SANDGATE STATE SCHOOL will celebrate the opening of the school on its present site in April 1874. The school has a rich and interesting history, having undergone many changes over the years.



Sandgate State School was opened in a temporary building in September 1873, with an enrollment of 47 students. This building was the first Baptist Church and was situated behind the Osbourne Hotel on Louden Street. In April 1874, the school was provided with its first permanent building on the present site, which consisted of a main classroom capable of seating four classes. The building faced eastward looking across the present site of St Margaret's Church of England.

By 1875, the school was away to a good start. The District Inspector at the time reported that "the buildings are in good order. The ground has been enclosed with a three rail fence, and an underground tank has been built. The teacher and pupils have cleared the playground to a large extent, and a small flower garden has been enclosed. Swings are provided for the amusement of scholars. The school is well furnished in all respects, and as a whole, this is one of the pleasantest schools housed in the

colony." Enrolments gradually increased and so more buildings were constructed. However in 1925, due to the continuing increase in numbers, there was a reorganisation whereby all buildings erected before 1917 were removed to form the present layout.

From 1914-1916, the principal of the school was David Staig Warren. Mr Warren lived in a school residence in Sandgate with his wife, Susannah, and three daughters, Ethel, Isabel and Norma.

Upon retirement from his position in 1916, Mr Warren was presented with a silver plated tea kettle on a stand warmer by the school students.

His granddaughter, Ailsa Bayliss, has kindly donated this teapot to the Sandgate Historical Society who have provided it to the school to commemorate this special occasion. The teapot is currently on display in the school office, bearing its original inscription.


