Well known for great jazz, experimental work and improvisation, Abrahams combines a probing approach to the sonic potentialities of the piano with a strong emotional and melodic sensibility.

Unfolding from simple starting points, at times his sound maps an almost psychedelic trajectory, expanding to become something hallucinatory and epic.

Abrahams transcends the generally perceived world of music with his use of touch and dynamics, exploring the minutiae of the mechanism by which a piano hammer hits a piano string. The journey so far encompasses a discography of over 20 works — solos and collaborations — with fellow travellers including Sabine Vogel, The Church, The Whitlams, Midnight Oil, Wendy Matthews, Skunkhour, and Silverchair.

Chris was nominated for Best Original Music Score at the ARIA Awards after producing and arranging music for the Australian film The Tender Hook in 2008.

This year there are no organised activities close by, but getting involved can be as simple as going for a walk outdoors, solo, or with family and friends. Make some time, if not on the 5th, perhaps the weekend before. It's really very easy.

STEP 1. GO OUTSIDE.

In Sandgate we are spoilt for choice. It's almost impossible to get from A to B without passing some kind of park, reserve, waterway or the foreshore. Sometimes we forget their significance and the enjoyments they offer. Choose your favourite green place or somewhere you've yet to visit. Dowse Lagoon provides a gentle paved stroll with abundant bird life and towering gums. A little wilder, Third Lagoon allows a chance to feel immersed in your surroundings. Raised boardwalks at Tinchi Tamba Wetlands lead you through mangroves and salt marshes. The list goes on...

STEP 2. TAKE NOTICE.

You may have been there before but make an effort to see something new. Stay still and be

surprised by the creatures that pass by. Look at the miniature: tiny organisms living on tree trunks and in the leaf litter, the way ants make trails, the veins in leaves, and the camouflage of certain insects. Observe patterns, and the interactions taking place.

STEP 3. ENJOY AND CONTEMPLATE.

Isn't nature amazing? All these different plants and animals, from the ones we can see down to the microscopic. Their lives inextricably entwined, with such robust, yet fragile relationships.

CULTURAL FLAVOUR FUSION

It might be called 3 Blind Mice Café, but you could never accuse its owners of lacking vision thanks to this Sandgate eatery's intense blend of flavours and cuisines.

Wher Misbah Kane has a long history in the culinary arts, with a background in Pakistani and Indian cooking and a long-held dream to own her own café.

"I was brought up cooking for my family as a young girl, which led to the ownership of an Indian restaurant here in Australia for many years," she says.

"However, during a particularly difficult time in my life, I decided to leave it all behind to study a diploma of hospitality and management at TAFE.

"Now with my experience, qualifications and my goal of owning a cafe, I am looking forward to offering the people of this community something new and fresh."

It was love at first sight when Misbah first saw the café earlier this year, and the result is the culmination of many years of hard work, struggle and focus.

Misbah says she is excited by the way the cafe pushes her creativity, continually improving and changing as time passes.

We are very unique and differ from all other cafes around because of my heritage," she says.

"I wanted to infuse my Pakistani upbringing and cooking skills into a traditional cafe setting, and this is starting to take shape.

"I wasn't sure exactly what a Pakistani fusion cafe would look like as there are very few examples, so I am forging my own path in this way, but each day it's becoming clearer what this exciting journey looks like and the customer feedback has been tremendous."

Misbah says the future holds a greater exploration of unique Pakistani fusion cafe dishes.

"At the moment it's going really great, but will only get better as I come up with new flavour combinations and innovative new dishes," she says.

"I also am hoping that the cafe becomes a very real part of this community by supporting community needs.

"I love that Sandgate is such a diverse group of people who join together to make this community beautiful - there is a real sense of ownership and pride within the people here."





Big Change, 'Small' Business.

Big tax change becomes law (Definition of small business now up-to- 10 million in turnover, instant asset write-off still there for another 12 months)

The government's hard-fought change to the corporate tax rate for small businesses has also altered the definition of "small business" to now include companies with up to \$10 million in annual turnover, meaning budget pledges to extend a number of tax concessions to more Australian companies will be realised.

When it unveiled its Ten Year Enterprise Tax Plan in the 2016 federal budget, the government promised to "put small business first" by extending the turnover threshold for a number of tax benefits previously on offer for companies with up to \$2 million in annual turnover.

These include access to the immediate asset write-off scheme when investing in items worth up to \$20,000, simplified rules around stock takes, the option of accounting for GST on a cash basis, and the opportunity to take up more simplified PAYG processes.

While the changes do not change eligibility for capital gains tax concessions for small businesses, which currently apply to those with a turnover of \$2 million or less, they were projected at the time of last year's budget to extend benefits to 90,000 more Australian businesses.

Small businesses are the engine room of our economy. The changes will mean businesses of up to \$10 million in turnover will be able to immediately start claiming the concessions;



the government's tax bill that has recently passed on Friday essentially shifted the definition of small businesses to those with up to \$10 million in annual turnover.

The tax rate for eligible companies has reduced from 30% to now 27.5% from 01/07/2016 and if you operate your business through an entity other than a company the threshold for 8% tax discount (up to \$1,000) is for businesses turning over up to \$5 million.

Businesses can buy office equipment, install fit-outs, new tables, chairs, photocopiers, and 3D printers [through that write-off] ...

The notion of going out and replacing old equipment with the new has become a lot more attractive. It's a really good example of how things should work.

The Budget handed down on 09/05/2017 has indicated the \$20,000 instant asset write-offs are for companies turning over up to \$10 million and now runs until 30th June 2018.


