"One of the biggest improvements is the field itself, which has recently undergone a \$110,000 upgrade to improve the playing surface.

"Ten years ago the field was capped, and with the volume of football played over the past decade, the club is very proud that it held out so long — the field now is one of the most premium playing surfaces in Brisbane.

"Head groundsman Kenny Lake has worked tirelessly to ensure the grounds are in tip-top shape for the beginning of round one."

Dylan says there are many other changes in store for Roosters club members and fans.

"The Roosters have recently joined forces with the Murri Taipans and the Sandgate Brighton Gaters," he savs.

"The three clubs combined hope to provide a pathway from under-6s all the way through to the Brisbane Rugby League competition.

"Nostalgia will play a part this season from the original retro jerseys the players will wear from the club's earliest years to the special Old Boys Reunion Night, Back to Brighton weekend and family fun days."

Dylan is proud of the reputation and community spirit the club has maintained over the past 50 vears.

"Life members, former players, families and current players are all very excited about the club's celebrations planned throughout 2018," he says.


"It's a testament to our family club that it has seen five decades of rugby league and has been a stalwart for our sport throughout this region.

ighly recommended! The London Klezmer Quartet, in demand on the global folk, world and pop music scenes, introduces the celebratory and soulful music of Eastern European Jews.

Formed in 2009 by a group of Klezmer specialists keen to explore the field of almost-lost wedding music - Ilana Cravitz, Susi Evans, Carol Isaacs and Indra Buraczewska perform with violin, clarinet. accordion, double bass and vocals.

Their publicity states that they play old and new traditional material, guaranteed to move audiences with toe-tapping Bulgars and festive Freylekhs to tears with sorrowful doinas — and back again in moments.

The subtleties of the original tradition combined with this kick-the-chairs-over ability to party have ensured the band is already popular throughout the UK, with five sell-out tours in Australia, and performances in Brazil, Germany, Holland, Latvia, New Zealand and Switzerland.

In this country, they have performed in six states, headlined at the National Folk Festival in Canberra two years running, and wowed 'em at the Port Fairy Folk Festival in 2013.

The quartet has also spiced-up the mix by recording and touring with The Indigo Girls (US), Sinead O'Connor (Ireland), Natacha Atlas (Egypt), She'Koyokh (UK), and Ahmed Mukhtar (Iraq).



THE HIPPOCRATES DIET

Hippocrates, born around 460 BC, coined the famous saying, "Let food be thy medicine and medicine be thy food."

onsidered the greatest physician of his time, Hippocrates understood the importance of nourishing the human body with healthy, wholesome food. The body, if fuelled correctly, can achieve optimal health, and many diseases and sicknesses can be avoided.

Naturopath and Food and Nutrition coach Cherie Gorringe, from Evolve Your Health at Sandgate, offers excellent advice regarding eating for optimal health. She explains that our food is becoming deprived of essential vitamins and minerals due to modern farming practices, pesticides, toxins and even the chemicals in our water supply. We no longer entirely rely on getting our basic nutrition from food as easily as we used to; but, it's not all bad news. By being aware of what is in our food, and how to eat properly. we can still incorporate nutrient-dense foods, which are healing to the body.

Cherie recommends we read the labels on our food: know where the food comes from and exactly what's in it. Avoid genetically modified corn products, choose organic wherever possible, and when it comes to fruit and vegetables, try to pick those with thicker skins, such as bananas and pineapples, as they are less affected by chemicals. Add clean sea vegetables to your diet, such as wakame, dulse, nori and kelp, and use a good quality Celtic sea salt.

Cherie also recommends investing in a good quality water filter as it will help remove chlorine and any pharmaceutical residue in the water supply. Eat organic meats that are ethically sustained, and when grocery shopping, stick to the fresh food area of the supermarket. As for kids, feed them a rainbow each day; that is, a range of different coloured fruits and vegetables that contain a variety of nutrients that their growing bodies need.


By asking questions about food, sourcing organic where possible, we'll limit the toxins we put into our bodies and will be improving our health one small step at a time.

Catherine has a strong vision for what she wants to create in film. "My desire is to bring a unique, fresh perspective to storytelling," she says.



t was the end of an era last month with the closure of iconic Sandgate landmarks the RSL Memorial Club due to debt.

Sandgate RSL Sub Branch vice president and senior welfare officer Peter McNamara says the closure was a huge loss for the community, but the Sandgate RSL Sub Branch is focusing on moving forward.

"At present, the Sandgate RSL Sub Branch is actively searching for a new tenant and also looking at every way we can assist the community in this situation," he says.

"We have had two companies looking at the site, and one has expressed a deep interest in further discussions with both Worrells and Sandgate RSL Sub Branch, so there is definitely more to follow in this matter.

"It would be ideal if that tenant was a like-minded business or club of some nature that would fill the gap for entertainment and social climate that the Sandgate area is needing.

"Should that not eventuate, we are willing to consider all options, but our primary concerns are for the likeminded club-type of tenant, who will employ that labour, that were, unfortunately, the main victims of this situation."

Peter says that the role of veteran affairs will continue in the community as it always has, both in events and veteran support.

"We have our duty to continue our pensions and welfare work to support the needy amongst the veterans and families within the community," he says.

"And the closure of Club Sandgate will have no effect on our major commemorative services this year.

"This year celebrates the Armistice - the end of World War One, the war to end all wars, and our commemoration of this will be a solemn and respectful experience starting with the Anzac Day commemorations and concluding on the 11th November at 11:00am, when the official end of the war was signaled 100 years ago to the day.

"Veterans Day on the 18th August will also be remembered with a solemn service that veterans of the community will be encouraged as always to attend."

Peter says they must continue to grow the membership by engaging with the community to help take the RSL







Come and join us on Friday 2nd March," Daniel says. "There will be traditional music and food provided by Iragi, Turkish and Iranian members of our local community.



OUR CINEMATIC HISTORY

ost locals of a certain age would have a memory or two of the Boondall Drive-In Theatre. I recall my first car, an HG Holden with bench seats, and driving home after a movie, with my arm around my girl.

The Sandgate and District Historical Society and Museum is presenting an exhibition that examines the Sandgate area's history with cinema, as part of the upcoming SANDGATE FILM GALA. Society President Pam Verney says that cinema's history in the Sandgate area goes back further than 1956 when the Boondall Drive-In was built.

"Not many people know about it. We've had lots of cinemas; there was one on Pier Avenue in Shorncliffe; built in 1928 and demolished in '63; there was the Bon Accord on Rainbow St from 1923-60, the Beach Theatre which opened in 1924 on Flinders Parade, and burnt down in 1978; The Strand, The Mayfair (behind town hall), one at Eventide, and prior to that there were outdoor screens."

Pam's interest in Sandgate's silver screens stems from a love of local history.

"A few years ago, a man named John Andrew enquired at the museum about the Boondall Drive-

In, and we started looking into it; we did a lot of research to find out about the history. People came out of the woodwork with stories. We heard from people who had worked in the ticket booth, projectionists... I heard a story of a man whose job was to check the car boots for people trying to speak in."

There was a time when silent movies were shown at The Bon Accord, accompanied by a 3-piece band of trumpet, piano and violin. Pam tells me a story of a man who used to carry his piano on the back of his truck, to play for the open-air movies at the Pier. Then load it up and go home afterwards.

"There's a lovely lot of history there with it," Pam said.

A key thing about history is that it needs to be shared. Pam would love to hear stories and memories you might have about the local area and its history, so pop into the Sandgate Museum and share the history sometime!

The exhibition can be seen at the museum from 10am-3pm during the Sandgate Film Gala, on the weekend of March 23 and 24.

TENANCY TIPS AND RENTING ADVICE

ommunity Education and Network Development Worker Phebe Wong will be giving free tenancy advice at a SANDBAG community lunch in February.

Phebe is part of an organisation called Tenants Queensland, a community legal centre that gives free advice and assistance to people renting, whether they are in private rentals, public and community housing, caravan parks, or boarding houses.

"The top issues people often seek advice on are having repairs done, bond refunds, and ending their leases early," Phebe says.

"If they access our service, we can give them advice on the spot, or if they require further assistance, we refer a caseworker to the person, who will work one on one with them. Assistance could be as simple as helping them to fill out a tenancy form, or advocating on behalf of the tenant to get a repair done." As indicated by 2016 census data, the 4017 area has over 3500 rental dwellings, with only half of these being affordable to median renter households. The data also indicates that 31.9% of renters in the Sandgate area experience rental stress, with the area having a moderate 'Rental Vulnerability Index' score, a measure devised by Tenants Queensland to gauge "the vulnerability of persons to problems that may make their rental housing unaffordable, insecure or inappropriate."

Phebe hopes that the Lunch will help people recognise the services that are available to them.

"We want to reach out to the Sandgate community," she says. "Hopefully people will realise we are here to assist them, and this might even become a regular event."

The Lunch will be held on Wednesday 28 February from 12pm-12.30pm at the SANDBAG Community Hall, 153 Rainbow Street, Sandgate.

PIGEON NESTS A PEST FOR PANELS

igeons may not always rule the roost, but when it comes to solar panels, their nests become the ultimate pest.

Pure Sunshine Solar Cleaning owner Luke Vervoorn says pigeons nesting in solar panels are a big problem in the local area.

"We can't be sure where the problem started, but the bird numbers are constantly going up," he says.

"The boom of the solar industry has provided hundreds of new nesting areas for the birds, and they breed constantly — the homing nature of the bird means they stay local.

"We have completed more than 200 bird proofing jobs in our region alone and close to 500 in total."

Luke says the reason behind the rising numbers is the solar panels sit on rails above the roof to allow air to flow underneath and to prevent them overheating, but this space is a perfect nesting and roosting area for pigeons.

These birds can cause thousands of dollars worth of damage, and if ignored, the problem gets worse with time," he says.

"Once new birds have been hatched at the property, they consider it home, and it is then harder to move them on, and the numbers grow rapidly.

"The amount of poo these birds make is incredible, and it is not only smelly but can corrode metal roofs and gutters in time, block gutters and downpipes that cause water to spill during storms.

"Bird poo on solar panels also dramatically drops the efficiency and causes hot spots, which can burn out the panels."

Luke says a solution is to get a pest proofing system, which extends to other pests including possums.

"Clips fix to the underside of the solar panels and are attached to a heavy-duty, outdoor plastic mesh to keep the pigeons from getting under," he says.

"The mesh is plastic to prevent any metal-on-metal reactions and can be clipped on and off easily, so it doesn't interfere with the system.

"People should get the problem sorted straight away as it only gets worse and more costly as time goes on."














Sandgate Pest Control turns 50


