Luci says.

"We've just finished a project at Shorncliffe State School setting up a veggie garden for the kids and grandparents to use, and the results are fantastic! Our trainees get so much from the project, and so does the community."

A comedy hypnotist performer for 10 years, Matt says audiences can expect a fun, friendly show suitable for all ages.

"The show will make you laugh a lot and show you how incredible the mind is," he says.

Shorncliffe Pier Kiosk Faces Delay

The anticipated opening of a new kiosk on the Shorncliffe foreshore has been delayed after SANDBAG (The Sandgate and Bracken Ridge Action Group) announced its recent withdrawal from the venture.

Expected to open in January, the kiosk would have served a variety of food and beverages to the many visitors and locals who frequent the popular precinct.

SANDBAG CEO Maggie Daunt says that after careful evaluation by the SANDBAG board, the decision was made to step aside and allow another organisation to take on the project.

"We greatly appreciated the opportunity to discuss with the Brisbane City Council a coffee kiosk at Shorncliffe Pier," she says.

"The SANDBAG board did not make this decision lightly, but did so to ensure that we focus our efforts in our core areas of service delivery to the community that include our existing programs such as the community centre and Skilling Queenslanders for Work, as well as preparing for the National Disability Insurance Scheme and Disability Employment Service.

"We thank the Brisbane City Council for the opportunity to be considered in the process, and offer our best wishes to the organisation that will operate the Shorncliffe Pier coffee kiosk."

Brisbane City Council will seek new tenders for the project.



Superb Cello Recital

July: Umberto Clerici (Italy) Solo Cello Recital

f you sit with your eyes closed and listen to the cello, you'll hear why it's described as the closest sounding instrument to the human voice, with shades of an heroic male tenor's deep, emotional vibrato.

And when cellist Umberto Clerici performs at Music By The Sea, you'll not only enjoy listening but feel the sound of these magnificent instruments broadcast through the timber floorboards of the town hall stage.

This visceral experience will unfold at the hands of the master, channelled through two antique cellos, a 1722 Matteo Goffriller from Venice, and a 1758 Carlo Antonio Testore from Milan.

Back in the 16th century, the bass violin was trimmed down to produce the shorter length violincello or 'big little violin', and later called the cello.

Then, when wire-wound strings replaced the original gut version, a finer bass sound emerged making it easier to play virtuosic passages.

And to this end, since taking up the cello at the age of five in his hometown of Turin, Italy, Umberto has crafted his virtuosity as a multifaceted artistic and creative solo performer.

This has spawned a career that includes performances with the world's most prestigious orchestras, and appearances in all the great halls from Carnegie to the Musikverein in Vienna.

On the local scene, he was appointed principal cello of the Sydney Symphony Orchestra and Cello Lecturer at Sydney University in 2014, which means he now calls Australia home.

The Sandgate program presents some of the greatest cello works ever composed.



In late May, a General Meeting was to be held at the community centre in Rainbow Street to discuss a proposed Special Proposition involving a name change for the organisation.





"Another exciting development is the possibility of additional operating hours including lunch on the weekends, and we are also in the process of expanding our catering options."



Scarlet Honeyeaters: Our Light-Weight Songsters

he months of May and June mark the arrival of one of our wintertime wildlife visitors. The Scarlet Honeyeater, Myzomela sanguinolenta, announces the beginning of the cooler months with its distinctive trilling voice. Flitting mostly high in the branches of Eucalypts, you will hear this little fellow more often than you will see him.

But once familiar with their song, you will never forget it. And like other nature lovers, you will smile and mentally note the first time you hear it each year.

A walk in the vicinity of Third Lagoon from May to October will more than likely have a background accompaniment of their lively twittering. Males are territorial and declare their presence by constant calls. Territories are not particularly large so often more than one can be heard coming from different directions, as you stroll along. The honeyeater family of birds are found nearly exclusively in Australia, Papua New Guinea and nearby islands, with the Scarlet Honeyeater, at a mere 10cm in length and weighing only 8g, being the smallest species in our own country.

It is the male that is brilliantly coloured and easily identified. Females and juveniles are a dull brownish grey with cream underparts, making them hard to discern from many small brown birds.

As with others in their family, they feed on nectar following the blossoming of flowers within their range. Insects also form part of their diet. Often they are chased away from prime feeding trees by larger and more aggressive honeyeaters such as friarbirds.

Although similar in appearance and habits to other nectar feeders around the world, such as sunbirds and hummingbirds, they are unrelated. The explanation for this is the process of convergent evolution. This means corresponding features are present in species of different lineages.

They have evolved in partnership with the flowering plant species of Australia, and play a significant role in the fertilisation of many of them.

If you want to hear what they sound like, listen to some audio recordings online, and keep your ears tuned next time you're out and about in nature.

2018/2019 BUDGET REPORT What's Important!

he main changes announced in the recent federal budget are the introduction of Low to Middle Tax Income Offset (to the value of \$530 per year).

Starting from 1st July 2018 (if passed by legislation), the offset will provide some relief for low and middle-income earners, but really is the equivalent of just over \$10 per week. Taxpayers with taxable incomes of \$37,000 or less will receive a benefit of up to \$200. There is also a threshold change for the 32.5% tax rate. Instead of earning up to \$87,000 before the tax rate jumps to 37%, taxpayers can now earn up to \$90,000.

The government's tax strategy is geared towards more tax cuts in the future for individuals. Removing the 37% bracket completely by 2025 is a bold move meaning someone earning \$42,000 p.a. pays the same rate of tax as someone earning \$190,000 p.a. The extension of the instant asset write-off of \$20,000 has been a welcome surprise and now continues until 30th June 2019. From our clients' perspective, this policy has proved to be very popular.

There have been no significant superannuation changes, and there is nothing regarding investment property changes or housing affordability. The main focus of this budget appears to be a small tax cut for everyone.

What we get out of this budget is that there is still a need to reduce taxable income in the current year by deferring income (an optimal strategy) so that more income goes into next financial year, and deferring tax to a tax period where less tax is paid.

Taxpayers should also consider bringing forward deductions where possible, utilise prepayments and the instant asset write-off, and maximise the \$25,000 superannuation contribution limit.

This time of the year is great to take stock of things. Is your estate planning in order? Do a business and personal budget in time for 2018/9.

High Tea For Cancer Research

andra Robertson, owner of Call Me Old Fashioned in Sandgate, knows better than most how cancer can affect families. Her son was aged just 3 months when he was diagnosed with Wilms tumour, a common childhood cancer that starts in the kidneys. Sandra said she could still recall how she felt when she heard that diagnosis.

"I was devastated; I felt like, 'this only happens to other people'," she said.

Despite the fact her son, who is now 19 and studying at university, was diagnosed with the rarest form of Wilms tumour, Sandra said that at the time, she was "hopeful".

"He had a very treatable cancer," she said. "This particular type of cancer had an 80 percent survival rate, which is very good for childhood cancers.

"I actually felt lucky, because my child had a curable kind of cancer, that had been heavily researched."

Today, he is a fit and healthy young man, but Sandra said she realised there were too many children who were not so lucky. In the past couple of years, Sandra said she had been stunned at the number of families in her community that had been affected by cancer.

"I can think of six families off the top of my head, who are part of my community, my network of friends, who have been affected by cancer," Sandra said. "We're talking about local people, including local mums' whose lives have been claimed by breast cancer. It's so unfair."

Sandra will be hosting a vintage high tea as part of Australia's Biggest Morning Tea, an initiative of the Cancer Council, to raise vital funds for cancer research.



Bill Brown: AN OFFICER, A GENTLEMAN AND A CRICKET LEGEND

Bill Brown Sports Reserve in Bracken Ridge will feature a storyboard sharing the tale of its namesake, following the completion of the Telegraph Road upgrade.



HISTORY

The sports reserve was named in 1990 in honour of the former Carseldine resident and one-time Australian cricket captain Bill Brown who made his Australian test debut against England in 1934 aged 22 and was a member of Sir Donald Bradman's Invincibles team touring England without defeat in 1948.

Still guest speaking into his 90s, Bill died on March 16, 2008, at the age of 95. Though he finished playing professional cricket in 1948, his legend lives on as a humble sportsman and a true gentleman.

During his career, Bill played 22 test matches including three tours of England and three Ashes tours with an unconquered 206 runs against England at Lord's in 1938 — during the first televised test match.

Bill was also the first and only Queensland born player to lead Australia in a test when he shepherded Australia to a landslide win against New Zealand in 1946.

Ever humble, Bill was not one to sing his own praises. Before his first test in Australia, Bill caught a tram to Sydney Cricket Ground. The tram conductor didn't recognise him, and after watching Bill drag his cricket coffin on to the tram, he said, "You won't get a game there today son. There is a test match on". Bill didn't offer a come back which would have embarrassed the conductor in front of the other passengers.

In 2000, Bill was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia for his service to cricket and was one of the 150 inaugural inductees to the Queensland Sports Federation's Hall of Fame in 2009.

He also served Australia during World War II flying transport aircraft with the Royal Australian Air Force in New Guinea.

Former Sandgate Historical Society researcher Grace Beecher was pivotal in having the park named in honour of Bill Brown in 1990 after the Brisbane City Council declared the area a sports reserve in 1985.

SUN Power!

hey call it Sunny Queensland! That's right, we actually live in the Sunshine State! Now I don't want to seem like Captain Obvious, but wouldn't this, therefore, make Queensland an excellent location to harness the power of the sun?

It was the late 1800's when we first discovered that sunlight could be converted into an electric current, and by the 1960s we were using it in space exploration. By the 80s and 90s the use of solar energy was common in homes, usually in the form of solar hot water systems. This might seem like fast progress, but as we all know the last few technological decades have been moving even faster.

Wendy Seeto operates Solahart Strathpine and has seen the more recent developments in solar power first hand.

"This sector has seen extraordinary growth," Wendy says. "Solar solutions are changing at a rapid pace, 7 years ago the standard PV panel wattage was about 190w. Today, the average panel is around 290watts."

Cost has also been a factor in the increasing take-up of solar, according to Wendy.

"The bottom line is the ever-increasing cost of energy; both electricity and gas have increased in cost massively over the past 10 years.

"Many customers also want to take control of cost, especially those moving into retirement or those people just wanting the power back in their own hands."

So what does the future hold in solar? "The future is all about Home Energy Management Systems or HEMS. These systems will connect all powered appliances via the Internet of Things (IoT)." Wendy says. The Internet of Things is the network of devices, appliances, cars and more, across the world; any item that is able to connect to the Internet. There is likely to be around 30 billion objects on the IoT by 2020!

In home energy management systems, the ability to control when appliances and other things consume power, and where that power comes from, can result in both a reduced cost and an increase in convenience for users.

It's really about optimising the relationship between the sun, the existing electricity grid, your solar energy system, and your day-to-day life! "Get ready because HEMS is the future," Wendy said.

Solar powered smart homes sound pretty cool (or pretty warm, depending on the season). It's exciting to imagine what the future holds!






