Chamber of Commerce Aims for the Sky

andgate's Chamber of Commerce is building a strong relationship with the Brisbane Airport Corporation, in the hope of landing opportunities for the local community and businesses.

Chamber President Mr Bill Gollan explains; "It has the beginnings of some very exciting things for our area. The BAC has identified the Sandgate bayside as a potential day-tourism area for people using the airport. This will be great for many businesses, such as retail, in the area."

However, the Chamber sees the potential of such a strategic relationship as reaching beyond day-tourism. "Around 25,000 people are employed at the airport, and there is a lot of planned development by the BAC in the areas nearby," Mr Gollan says. "This means a lot of opportunity for our manufacturing and trade-type business to get in front of the people driving this development."

The third area of potential is in linking up our young people with the broad range of businesses

operating in the BAC precinct, ranging from airport-related to general retail, construction and more. "What [BAC] would like to do is to start working with our local schools so we can explore career opportunities for our local kids. That's a great thing!" Mr Gollan said.

Jessica Shannon is a Community Engagement Advisor for Brisbane Airport Corporation and is expecting significant growth in the number of jobs provided at the airport in years to come.

Working alongside education providers and business is critical because many of these employees will come from communities that neighbour the airport," Jessica says.

"Since 2012, Brisbane Airport Corporation has invested around \$1.7 billion in major projects... with an estimated additional \$1.8 billion earmarked over the next five years until 2022. Our investments will provide opportunities for businesses in Sandgate including tourism and export opportunities."

It's great news for our Chamber of Commerce, as well as local enterprise and the broader community. As the nearby Gateway Motorway construction stages near completion, it seems we can expect not only easier commutes but also more visitors and more opportunities in our unique corner of the world!

Spend A Night With Bernstein

eonard Bernstein and his vast array of musical work earned him a place among the most respected of American composers and conductors, and 2018 marks 100 years since his birth.

This August, the Sandgate Town Hall will host some of Bernstein's best work, presented and performed by some of his biggest fans.

Lucas D. Lynch is an acclaimed Queensland pianist and conductor and will lead the night's engagement with the work of Bernstein, which includes the scores from Westside Story and On The Town.

The performance will be held 'in the round' at the Sandgate Town Hall and will feature a trio of musicians; violin, cello and piano, and two vocalists in an intimate setting.

"It will be an up-close and personal experience for the audience," Lucas says.

"In terms of creating it, we've made an event featuring the best of [Bernstein's] most popular musicals and also some of his unknown works."

The show will feature songs such as 'Maria', 'I Feel Pretty', 'Somewhere', and 'A Little Bit In Love', and will also include a visual element.

"We want to have rolling images of the great personality that he was, as a conductor, a teacher and a musician, and as a pioneer of connecting with the human spirit," Lucas says. "I want people to be immersed in the music physically, but to also see who the man was."

The vocal accompaniments will be performed by Queensland Conservatorium graduate Elliot Baker, who sang 'Tony' in the 2017 Brisbane Production of West Side Story, and Samantha Paterson, an in-demand soprano featured in Bella Diva and Harvest Rain's Arena Spectacular productions.



New Chapter Begins For Bracken Ridge Library

Over the coming year, Bracken Ridge residents will witness an exciting transformation of one of their community hubs, with Council soon commencing construction on a brand new Bracken Ridge library.

he Bracken Ridge Library has been a place for local residents to read, work and play for more than 30 years and is now visited by more than 100,000 people every year.

In 2016, the Lord Mayor promised to bring new life to seven of our city's libraries as part of a \$17.7 million four-year investment and the new Bracken Ridge Library is part of our plan to create more to see and do right across the city.

Libraries are no longer just places to read or borrow books, they have become integral to our smart-thinking, easy-living, New World City, providing opportunities for learning, recreational reading and cultural activities.

Once completed, the city's newest library in Bracken Ridge will overlook Ferguson Park and,

at 1000 square metres, will be double the size of the current library with state-of-the-art borrowing technology, free wi-fi, a vibrant children's library, dedicated quiet room, a coffee cart and two meeting rooms with secure after-hours access which will be used for our world-class library programs or for community meetings.

The new building will also feature an undercover car park, lift and ramp access to ensure it is accessible for people of all ages and abilities, and will soon become the new home of the Bracken Ridge Ward Office.

The current Bracken Ridge Library will remain open until the new facility is completed next year, and will then be transformed into a vibrant new green space, for residents to enjoy Brisbane's beautiful outdoor lifestyle.



et your hair down and rock out to the sounds of Aussie anthems on the deck at the Full Moon Hotel later this month.

One of Brisbane's best four-piece cover bands, Stevenson St, will help you relive the good old days with classic pub anthems of the 80s and 90s including Daryl Braithwaite, AC/DC, Cold Chisel, Silverchair and even some Kylie Minogue.

Full Moon Hotel publican Lucinda Black says Stevenson St Band were invited to play their debut performance at the hotel after hearing rave reviews from customers.

Stevenson St consists of husband and wife duo Chris Stevenson and Casey Watt backed by Lincoln Retallack on bass guitar and Paul Bain on drums.

Chris and Casey have been performing together around South-East Queensland for the past 10 years.

One thing that sets Stevenson St apart is its vocal harmonies. Three of the band members can sing and play multiple instruments.

"One of our greatest strengths as a band is our musical diversity in style, intensity, genre and era,' Chris says.

"We draw musical influence from a vast array of styles, making us remarkably versatile.

"Being able to go from Top-40 pop classics spanning from the 1950s through to songs charting now, with styles including rock, blues, reggae, funk, Motown, soul, country and disco.

Anyone who comes along will be able to hear our take on almost whatever song they love, no matter what age group."

Lucinda says the hotel has been a favourite watering hole for more than 150 years and she is keen to continue showing patrons a good time by offering live music on stage performed by soloists, duos and popular Brisbane bands like Stevenson St

"The old girl has witnessed numerous styles of music grooved to on her dance floor over the eras," Lucinda says.

"We're taking our punters back to the good old days of the 80s and 90s with some classic pub hits.

"You won't be able to help but belt out a tune and dance the night away."

ward-winning storyteller and author Sue McPherson believes in the power of stories — it's one of the reasons she's looking forward to the Sandcliffe Writers Festival (SWF).

"Stories are powerful regardless of the length and or who tells them. Stories can unite, inspire, move and build a person regardless of their background," Sue said.

Based on the Sunshine Coast, and of Wiradjuri, Torres Strait Islander and Irish heritage, Sue, is one of the featured authors at the Sandcliffe Writers Festival

"I'm looking forward to meeting people from all walks of life and answering questions about my journey and anything related to storytelling," she said.

"[At SWF] I encourage everyone to listen, read and watch a great yarn. I've grown from it, others can too."

Inspired to write by her two teenage sons, Sue won the inaugural black&write! Indigenous Writing Fellowship from the State Library of Queensland, with her manuscript, Grace Beside Me. It was published in 2012.

Sue is also a regular writer for TV and film. In 2017, Grace Beside Me was commissioned by NITV to be its first ever scripted live-action



series. It was recently nominated for a Logie Award for Most Outstanding Children's Series.

Her latest book, Brontide, is described as a groundbreaking, coming-of-age story about four boys and their lot in life.

Sue will be a key presenter as part of SWF's youth literacy program, aimed at children, young adults, and YA fans.





GARDENING AT THE GATE Green Thumbs Unite

ardening Australia's Jerry Coleby-Williams will be the special guest at Gardening at the Gate held at Sandgate's Einbunpin Lagoon on August 19.

Returning after a successful first year in 2017, Deagon Ward councillor Jared Cassidy is hosting the gardening event aimed at anyone interested in living more sustainably.

"This is a unique event for our local area where we can bring local groups together with people like Gardening Australia's Jerry Coleby-Williams to learn about how to make the most of your vard from the footpath to the back fence," Cr Cassidy says.

Jerry Coleby-Williams has been a presenter on the ABC's Gardening Australia since 2000. In 2003 he moved from Sydney to Brisbane to create Bellis, a model, affordable, sustainable house and garden at Wynnum.

During Gardening at the Gate, Mr Coleby-Williams will talk about how he gardens at Bellis, his award-winning house and garden he has been opening to the public for the past 11 years.

"Mainstream media coverage of subtropical horticulture that combines food production and biodiversity management is pretty poor, and gardeners learn best when they can see what is being discussed," Mr Coleby-Williams says.

Throughout the day there will be entertainment by local artist Blake Hadley, face painting, coffee van, bake stall, barbecue and giveaways.

The Jabiru Play Bus will also be offering lots of free children's activities.

"I've always been a keen gardener and growing up in the local area I know there are many other like-minded people who take a lot of pride in their yards," Cr Cassidy says.

"Gardening is a great way to keep fit and healthy in your own yard and is a great way to help reduce household waste through composting."

INFRASTRUCTURE NEWS

The 2018-19 Brisbane City Council budget has allocated funding for several projects in the 4017. Up to \$160,000 will be spent on building new toilet facilities along the front of Board Street, which will service the playground and skate park.

Also, \$80,000 has been allocated for lighting in Curlew Park in the dog off-leash area. The project is in the design phase and the lights may be solar powered, although no decisions have been made on this just yet. The lighting is due to be delivered this financial year.

And the basketball court at Decker Park is almost complete. The community is eagerly awaiting this new addition to our outdoor sporting facilities.

NORTHSIDE PETROL PRICE SLUG

Wondering why your petrol bill seems higher than ever? The RACQ has revealed north side motorists are paying 3.6 centres per litre more on average for unleaded fuel than those on the southside of Brisbane.

RACQ spokeswoman Lucinda Ross said, "Those on the north side were not only slugged with higher prices than other parts of the city, but at 151.3 centres per litre, they were charged more on average [than] the rest of south-east Queensland."

The Gold Coast was, on average, the cheapest centre to buy petrol in south east Queensland, with an average of 145.1 cents per litre, followed by Moreton Bay and the Sunshine Coast.

olk balladeer Dan Tuffy pours his smoking lyrics: "I've drunk red lemonade from ashtrays on the floor... And I've got stories galore to fill in the gaps. More than you could poke a stick at. Songs from Dan is my solo project. Come to a show and I'll tell you a story."



Spend time with your Dad this Father's Day; it's the best gift you can give.





Safety First for Sandgate Seniors

eeping seniors safe and active in the community is the aim of the annual Seniors Safety Forum being held in Sandgate. Hosted by State MP for Sandgate Stirling Hinchliffe and Deagon Ward councillor Jared Cassidy, the forum aims to showcase services available to seniors and also tips on safety at home, as well as personal and cyber safety.

Cr Cassidy said although the event was focused on seniors, it was open to all members of the community.

"For any family that is going through that transition time of having an older person in the family, if they're getting worried about them, this is a chance to look at all the options available in the community," he said.

There will be presentations from the Queensland Police Service, Queensland Ambulance Service, Home Assist Secure and All About Living, as well as Cyber Guru.

Mr Hinchliffe said one of the most popular presentations in previous years had been about cyber safety, including Internet and phone scams.

"Some of the new technology coming through now is really great for older people who may be living by themselves," he said.

"There's a new device, like Siri for the home, which replaces things like the wearable medialert. It monitors movement, it talks to people when they get up in the morning and if there's a lack of movement or interaction from the homeowner, the device can call a family member or friend."

Seniors can also learn about local community groups such as All About Living, which offers home maintenance, respite care, cleaning services and activities and excursions.

"A lot of older people do live by themselves and may not feel confident in getting out and about or going to new activities and we really want to try and change that. Community interaction is so important," Cr Cassidy said.

Mr Hinchliffe added: "We are seeing more multigenerational living — families all living together in the one house and the forum will be great not just for older people, but for younger members of their families as well.

"There's plenty of help and options out there and the forum will be full of useful information for everyone."

The Seniors Safety Forum will be held at the Sandgate Town Hall on Friday, August 17 from 1.30pm to 3pm. A free afternoon tea will be served.



During both days of KiteFest, adrenaline junkies can enjoy Jet Ski stunt shows, aerobatic displays, live music and loads of live entertainment.


There are also many options to keep the whole family entertained for the weekend. Roving performers will travel around Pelican Park during the day, entertaining everyone they encounter.



t's a dead-set guarantee. You and I, he and she, us and them; every single human being will one day cease to exist in our current form. We share this singular fact, and yet strangely the subjects of death and dying are not often discussed until we hear the proverbial knock on our own front door.

Nycole Lloyd and Carol Tollis are working to improve the way we understand death and the grieving process, and they are co-hosting the annual 'Dying To Know Day' event in Sandgate on Wednesday, 8 August.

"It's a topic people are often awkward about," Nycole says. "It became apparent to me that here is a big gap in our understanding of the whole 'end-of-life' stuff. Most people learn by experience, they don't discover what's required until a family member or loved one dies and they've got to step up and help."

The Dying to Know Day was initiated in 2013 and is now marked all around the country on August 8. The concept is to encourage the development of death literacy for local communities; to normalise and socialise how we deal with this inevitable experience.

"This year we will have a range of information and it will be quite interactive. We have three main things we will be looking at which are 'having the conversations', 'planning and preparing', and 'death care and funeral arrangements'," Nycole says.

We will be doing some myth-busting around death and funerals. We will have a mortician presenting, who will demystify some of the aspects of the death process."

There will also be some legal information available that will be relevant to all attendees, as well as a presenter from Donate Life about the Australian Organ Donor Register. It's relevant for people of all ages and from all walks of life.

"One of the things we want to do is encourage people to start having these conversations, and address some of the fears that come up," said Nicole.

"We want to contribute to creating compassionate communities; to build a community around the end-of-life experience."

The event will be held at the Sacred Heart. Parish Hall on Brighton Road, Wednesday 8th August from 6:30 - 8pm; contact Nycole on 0402 143 633 for more information.




PART OF SANDGATE'S THEATRE HISTORY

heatres and movie houses were a favourite form of entertainment in the 1900s and Sandgate had its fair share. Sandgate Museum is hosting a talk on Sunday, August 26 featuring the history and stories of Sandgate's many cinemas.

The Old Town Hall in Kate Street, now Pier Avenue, was home to early picture projection shows but burned down in May 1910 after a hurricane lamp was dropped while someone was retrieving projection equipment.

In 1910, open-air theatres operated at the pier, Moora Park and Flinders Parade. The theatre at the pier was on the beach and movie-goers had to sit with their feet up to keep them out of the water when the tide came in during the movie.



In the 1920s the open air theatres made way for purpose-built movie houses.

The Bon Accord operated in Sandgate from 1922 to 1960. It had a dirt floor until it was closed for renovations in 1932-33

The Beach Theatre first opened in 1924 and by the 1960s it was the place to go for local teenagers who occupied the canvas front stalls. The building later became a youth recreation centre and was gutted by fire in April 1978.

The Felix, built in 1928, was renamed the Strand in 1930 after renovations, and the Mayfair, built

SANDGATE'S MAYFAIR THEATRE claimed to be the most popular and comfortable theatre in suburban Brisbane with the best sound in Queensland.

in 1934 was closed in 1947. Three of the wooden seats from the theatre are on display at the Sandgate Museum.

Brighton too had its own cinema during World War II with the Sea Breeze at the Sandgate RAAF base — now the site of Brighton Health Campus. It was used to entertain RAAF trainees and staff stationed there in 1942. The Sea Breeze continued to operate until the early 1980s when it was demolished.

DURING THE ERA OF SILENT FILMS, a pianist would accompany the movie, setting the mood. On occasion, a three-piece orchestra would play. The first feature-length talkies movie The Jazz Singer was released in 1927.



Fishing Squid

quid! No, they are not a fish but you can catch them and eat them and they taste great. Now is the perfect time of year to try your hand at squid fishing locally as they are quite plentiful and easier to target.

Tiger Squid are around Shorncliffe Pier and Woody Point where they can be caught with a fishing lure called a "Squid Jig" (basically a prawn imitation with specialised hooks).

Many people are amazed at the colours and shape of these creatures and upon asking me what they are, did not realise they are the "Calamari" they order at the local fish and chip shop. (I wonder what they thought they were eating?)

Weed beds, rocky gravel beds, and around ietties with well-lit areas are their favourite hunting grounds; feeding on crabs, fish, prawns and whatever else they can catch. The clearer water at this time of year really helps them to hunt as they rely a lot on sight using their oversized eyes. Masters of camouflage as well, squid can change colour like their relatives the cuttlefish and octopus.

Most squid only grow to about 60cm in length, however, the largest recorded was about 13 metres long leading scientists to believe they can grow much bigger. I doubt you will catch them that big around here as they are primarily deep sea creatures, some of which even glow in the dark.

As they grow very fast, many only live up to 12 months, long enough to mature and reproduce. They have very sharp beaks similar in shape to a parrot, which is very hard to scratch or break and even harder than most metals and polymers, therefore they hurt when they bite.

A popular catch with anglers, there are now dedicated Facebook pages and fishing guides that will show you how to catch squid around Brisbane, as well as some good recipes. I like mine with salt and pepper coating and a bit of lime.
