

f you prefer your cymbals splashy and your bass lines bluesy, then the crew at Mr Henderson have the perfect afternoon of jazz tunes for you.

The first of two planned events, to be held over the next few months – entitled 'Not Quite, Jazz Night' – will feature a combination of jazzinspired music from local artists, with some warming winter food, a great range of craft beers and cocktails.

Mr Henderson's Claire Hamlyn said the funky Sandgate venue loves variety in their live music, and with a few of the owners known to enjoy a jazz tune or two, a Sunday jazz session seemed like an interesting idea.

"Jazz is something that hasn't really hit Sandgate and we wanted to see if there was an appetite for a different style of music from some of our favourite artists," she said.

"We have named it Not Quite, Jazz Night as it's a Sunday afternoon and we'll see some jazz-style covers of songs that wouldn't traditionally be considered jazz.

"This will be our first time running a Sunday jazz session so we are very excited to see how it is received by the community and we really hope it takes off – it also gives us another way to support local artists." The afternoon will feature the musical stylings of talented duo, Flow & Sparrow, and special guests, as well as The Midnight Swim.

Flow & Sparrow vocalist Georgia Fullerton is no stranger to jazz, having performed in various ensembles since school.

Georgia now fronts her own band and is looking forward to bringing a touch of classy jazz (with a twist) to the Sandgate community.

"The owners of Mr Henderson approached me after a Flow & Sparrow performance and we got chatting about jazz music and the need for more of it in the area," she said.

"Not Quite, Jazz Night is going to be a great afternoon with fun tunes you'll recognise from both the radio and your favourite jazz record – a perfect mix of soothing guitar, smooth keys, sexy brass, and a whole lot of soul.

"Jazzy tunes, red wine, fun company – need I say more?"

favourite event for locals and visitors since the early nineties, the Einbunpin Festival, returns to Sandgate in July, bringing another great day of fun, music, stalls and entertainment!

Councillor Jared Cassidy, chairperson of the festival committee, has seen it grow and change over the years.

"The Einbunpin Festival has become one of the largest music festivals in the local area over the past decade, with the growth from one small stage to three entertainment areas at the 2019 festival," Cr Cassidy said.

"A few years ago, a small youth stage was added on the Lagoon Street side of the festival, which has seen steady growth over the years, to the point where we will now see a brand new and expanded youth area in a brand new location at the festival." The new youth space will feature a chill out zone, games, activities and food stalls, as well as a stage that is set to showcase lots of local performers, musicians and artists!

"These young performers rarely get the opportunity to play outside of their schools, or group of friends, so we want to give them the opportunity to break out into the music scene," Cr Cassidy said.

"We have for the first time a competition as part of the festival with the winners proceeding through to the new Sandgate Youth Music Festival in September."

The Einbunpin Festival began in 1992, as a celebration of our local community, and is named for its location, around the banks of Einbunpin Lagoon in the heart of the village.

Sandgate's own town crier, Fred Krebs, will kick off this year's festival at 9am, and the highriders from the Queensland Penny Farthing and Historical Cycle Club will pedal into the day as part of the Pennies By The Sea Tweed Ride.



This year's festival will feature over 160 stalls once again, showcasing our local schools, community groups and businesses. We are unashamedly local with the vast majority of our stallholders coming from the local community," Cr Cassidy said.

"The Einbunpin Festival has been the biggest and the best celebration of our community for the last 28 years and we think this one will be one of the very best!"

Council Budget Spending Announced

eagon ward Councillor, Jared Cassidy, has described this year's council Budget as a "mixed bag" for the northern suburbs. He said there had been a "significant reduction" in the number of road resurfacing projects, footpath reconstruction and park upgrades.

"However, through continued community advocacy, we have been able to secure funding for some important local projects," Cr Cassidy said. "Council has allowed \$250,000 to address the health of the Einbunpin Lagoon.

"I understand this funding will be used to come up with solutions to address the health of the lagoon long term.

"This is a significant step forward in addressing the health of the lagoon and something the community has been fighting hard for."

The Sandgate Library will receive an upgrade this year, with a new children's area, new check out facilities and the outdoor areas will be upgraded.

Sandgate will also receive new CCTV cameras and there will be several traffic calming measures across the 4017.

"We have secured funding for the consultation and design of traffic calming in the Kennedy Street/Brighton Road corridor and funding for a new zebra crossing on Flinders Parade," Cr Cassidy said.

"These have been high priorities for me over the last couple of years.

"Council is currently working on the modelling for a reduction in the speed limit on Flinders Parade, from Cliff Street to Ninth Ave.

"All indications are that this work will be completed soon and a reduction in the speed limit will occur.

"I am a strong supporter of a reduction in the speed limit down there – it would significantly reduce the severity of any injury when the speed is reduced from 50km/hour to 40km/hour."

Cr Cassidy said council would be funding four outdoor movies along the Sandgate foreshore in the coming year.

"The Sandgate foreshore is one of 10 locations across Brisbane that have been announced for this project," he said.

"We'll have more details on exactly where and when these movies will take place later in the year."



Lilley's New MP Ready for Work.

FOR ANIKA WELLS, the new Federal Member for Lilley, it was the sight of tens of thousands of women marching across the United States that made her realise it was time to stand up for what she believed in.

ne of a handful of millennial MP's recently elected to parliament, the former lawyer said she knew she had a responsibility to do all she could for her young daughter and the community she loved.

"During my pregnancy, in 2016, I was diagnosed with an auto-immune disease and, let's just say it was a tough pregnancy," Anika said.

"Overnight, I found myself reliant on the PBS and the hospital system. Our little girl arrived three weeks early, just days after Donald Trump's inauguration. I remember lying in the hospital bed watching the Women's March and I really identified with those women.

"Those woman had presumed that Hillary Clinton was going to win and that society would continue to progress and improve and they just took that for granted.

"With Celeste in my arms, I was just horrified that my daughter had been born into the Trump-era and in that moment, I realised that I too had been taking so much for granted."

Anika had some political experience behind her, as well as her years in the law. She said that when Wayne Swan decided to retire from politics, it felt as if "everything had aligned".

"I felt that federal politics was where I wanted to be – that's where the big questions are being answered," she said.

The election was a close one, with the seat of Lilley not officially being called for Labor, until some time after polling day.

"Labor have always treated Lilley as a non-held seat – 1229 votes was the margin in the end for me," she said. "I'm very excited about this job and I'll be advocating for all the projects the northside needs."

Anika added she had been inspired by the late Labor prime minister, Bob Hawke."I'm a child of Bob Hawke's 1980s Australia, I've been elected to the House that he built," she said.

"We're the generation that is going to be left with the consequences of what parliament does now, so I feel the weight of that responsibility. I just hope to be able to further his (Hawke's) progressive agenda and I want to say a big thank you, thank you, thank you, to everyone who supported me."

or the environmentally conscious kids at Sandgate State School, the amount of plastic going into the ocean is the last straw – literally! Now, thanks to two Year 3 students, the school's tuckshop has cut out plastic straws altogether.

Zara Kolishkin and Ruby Grendon, both aged 8, said they were motivated to act after talking about the environment in class.

"Our teacher showed us a video about plastic and about another girl who was trying to ban straws and we thought, maybe we should do that too," Ruby said.

"We were thinking about what we could do to make a difference, to help our marine life," Zara added.

"It's important to help them because they're endangered and once they're gone, that's it – you can't buy another one from the shop."

The school's tuckshop convenor, Catherine Commons, said she thought the girls were "very brave" to come and speak with her about the issue.

"We never gave out straws with drinks like milk, it was only juice poppers, and now we have officially sold out of poppers, so we no longer have any straws in the tuckshop," she said.

Mrs Commons added there had been some work involved in finding a replacement for the poppas.

"Trying to find products that were at a good price point, had no straws and also – thinking of the junior school – that didn't have things like silver seals on them," she said.

"You don't want the teachers having to spend their lunchtime opening drinks.

"So, it had to be a product that fit with our staff, our kids, our parents and the environment.

We needed something that was 99.9% juice, to fit in with our Smart Choices policy, and we went with Orchy products."

The girls, who spoke at the school assembly about their bid to remove straws from the tuckshop, were delighted the project came to fruition.

"We were a bit nervous before our speech, but now that there's no more straws in the tuckshop we feel better," Ruby said.

"We feel like we have done something to help," Zara said.

Mrs Commons added: "You know, one of the great things about this school is that we have such a nice community and this project had a lot of support from the school and from the P&C."

Hollywood & Sew On

here's a sense of excitement and anticipation when you head off to see a film on the big screen. The special effects, music and cinematography all comes together to create the magic of movies. However, have you ever stopped to think just how many costumes each actor requires, or what's involved in creating them? One of our local residents does.

"I've just completed 77 of exactly the same maroon coloured jacket for the male lead in the upcoming movie, 'Monster Problems', the first international feature film to be produced in the new Hemmant studios," local costume maker, Margie Stafford, said. "Sometimes it's very tedious, every copy has to be the same, continuity is important."

It's Margie's previous projects that really showcase her attention to detail, problem solving and patience, all of which are required to create costumes for film.

Making King Orm's (Aquaman) suit and scales has been my favourite. We sewed over 40,000 manmade fish scales for his outfit. One boot took 1,300 scales and we had three different-sized scales on each boot. "It took a team to create each individual scale with multiple layers to create the effects, then after two days of filming in water the scales lifted and they had to be stuck down again! It's such an incredible process to be involved in."

"For Thor, we had to make armour look like metal but be soft so stunt people didn't get injured. Each character has a 'glamour costume' which is used for promotion, displays and events, then several costumes, sometimes in different lengths for close ups and effects, then the same costumes for stunt doubles. And at the end of the day, there's repairs. It's a huge, crazy business.

"I love the teamwork and comraderie, we value each others skills highly. We are makers, we love costume," Margie said of her colleagues.

In between films, Margie creates amazing stage costumes for the Queensland Ballet, Opera Queensland and video clips. "I enjoy being busy," she said.

So next time you're at the cinema, save some popcorn for the credits, because you never know whose name might appear on the big screen.

A Rainbow At Your Fingertips

Local resident, Ryan Elwell, was about four years old when he developed a fascination with birds.

ad bought me two budgies as a kid, a boy and a girl, and they had babies, and of course we had to get a bigger cage..." he said with great enthusiasm.

Ryan's hobby exploded and he now has 250 budgerigars. The variety is mind boggling. They chirp and flutter around their huge cage in an exquisite kaleidoscope of colour.

We all know a family budgie — the familiar green and yellow, or a lovely shade of blue with the distinctive black, scalloped markings, but Ryan has bred a rare and beautiful rainbow budgie with expertise and careful breeding.

"I am breeding a special kind of bird. I first saw it in Germany. In Australia, only two or three people were breeding them, about seven years ago," Ryan said.

He was the first to breed them successfully in Queensland.

Everyone was more into show birds, but no one was seeing the colours. Now with social media, people are seeing that and it's sort of bought the kids back into it. Kids like the smaller, prettier, rainbow-coloured birds."

"Eventually, once we had the numbers up, we started to swap to give [the birds] different bloodlines. The colours that the rare mutation created were just really vibrant and something next level. That's why people love them. They're gorgeous."

His hobby is shared by thousands, and he is somewhat of an expert in the field, attracting interest from all over the world. His Instagram page, Birds_Australia, has over 28,000 followers, with some being interested international buyers, however his sales are limited to local bird lovers.

"The weirdest call would have to be from a guy in England. He wanted me to send him, for \$1000 a bird, twenty birds. But it's illegal to ship birds

overseas, and although it would be amazing, I can't do that. I was surprised to think someone was willing to spend that money on birds."

"I usually try and sell them as hand-tamed. I ask a lot of questions before I sell. I try to sell them in pairs, so the birds don't go into some stress-related anxiety like plucking feathers from boredom. They are very good at entertaining themselves though, as long as they have plenty of toys or run around the house, they are pretty content."

Budgerigars are native to Australia. They are also pretty tough. In the wild, they roam in huge flocks and have survived the harsh inland conditions for the last five million years. Their presence was first recorded in 1805, and forty years later, English bird enthusiast, John Gould, described budgerigars as "the most animated, cheerful little creatures you can possibly imagine."

They are delightful, social little birds, check them out on Ryan's Rainbow Budgies Facebook page or follow him on Instagram at Birds_Australia.





n Friday July 26, Sandgate resident Andrew Pearson will take off from Busselton, WA, on his Triumph Tiger Explorer for an epic 15,700km ride around Australia.

Andrew is one of 65 other bike riders, who together will embark on a 35-day journey around the nation to raise awareness of depression and suicide prevention.

Known as the Black Dog Ride, this is the 10th anniversary of the national charity ride, which officially starts in Busselton. Riders will cover about 500kms each day and will be riding for up to six hours.

Along the way the group will be making 90 stops into local communities, to talk to schools, local businesses and organisations about depression and suicide prevention.

A keen rider, Mr Pearson said that while he didn't know any of the other 'Around Australia Riders', and that it would be his first time undertaking the national ride, he was looking forward to getting the word out there.

"I just want people to understand depression is a real thing. It's not something that you can just get over," he said.

• For me, this ride is about raising awareness, having the conversation with people and helping people to understand there is help available."

Mr Pearson said he was taking part in the Black Dog Ride after losing six of his friends to depression and suicide.

"I don't think people realise how serious it is and how many people this is killing."

Mr Pearson rode his motorbike across to Busselton in early June and will be flying back over to WA prior to the start of the ride.

He has set himself a goal of fundraising \$5,000 to support the national charity, which funds small grants for projects supporting mental health initiatives.

"I've set up a personal page to support the ride and I'm a third of the way to reach my goal of \$5,000. Not sure if I'll make it but I'm giving it a go," he said.





Local Heroes take a Bloody Long Walk for Mito

ocal Sandgate mums, Nicki Walsh and Tina Rostrum, are walking 35kms from Sandgate to Southbank to raise awareness and funds for mito (mitochondrial disorder) – a debilitating genetic disorder that robs the body's cells of energy and causes organ failure, often with devastating results.

Nicki and Tina are part of team 'Stella's Galaxy', created in memory of a friend's little girl, Stella, who passed away before her second birthday because of mito. This makes the walk very personal and both Nicki and Tina said they felt privileged to be included, and that it reminded them of how precious their own children are.

35kms sounds like a long way, but it's just a blip on the radar compared to what families of mito sufferers go through" Tina said. "Mito is very painful in so many ways – for the person with it and their family, who have to watch them suffer," said Nicki.

Mito affects 1 in 5000 people, making it the second-most common genetic disease after cystic fibrosis. It is highly complex, can affect anyone of any age and there are no cures and few effective treatments.

Nicki and Tina have known each other for eight years, since meeting when their children started prep together, and this is their fourth walk with Stella's Galaxy. Both said they aim to raise as much money as possible for this disease, as it needs its profile raised and funds go to better and earlier detection, treatment and, eventually, a cure.

"It would be horrifying to have any member of your family have mito, but especially crushing to have a child with it," Tina said.

"We would love more support - if you donate money, tell me which kilometre of the journey you would like me to dedicate to you and I will put up a Facebook post at that point," Nicki said.

10km a Day to Send Cancer Away

auren Dixon has set herself a physical challenge like nothing she has endured before - to run 10kms every day for 30 consecutive days.

The month-long task follows a recent breast cancer scare, which had such a profound impact on the 24-year-old. So she has decided to turn a negative into a positive and create her own fundraiser. As part of the Cancer Council's 'Do it for Cancer' community fundraising initiative, Lauren is testing her endurance with her own 10km a day physical challenge. The Sandgate resident is confident she'll be able to see the challenge to the end.

"Some days are easier than others. I am a runner, but I don't usually run this far," she said. "The Cancer Council let you design your own challenge, so I have been running 10km a day and mapping each run on Strava (a fitness app), which shows where you have run and for how long."

"As clichéd as it sounds, the running is nothing compared to the pain and suffering people with cancer go through."

BUSH STONE-CURLEWS (Burhinus grallarius)

largely nocturnal and mostly grounddwelling bird, the Bush Stone-curlew, also known as the Bush Thick-knee, is still quite common in Queensland. However, they can be elusive at times. During the day they seek safe places to rest, relying on their mottled colourings for camouflage, as it makes them difficult to see.

At other times they can be downright conspicuous - staunchly maintaining their positions, even when the light of day exposes them to full view. In heavily developed parts of Brisbane, such as West End, they can still be frequently spotted and are notorious for choosing odd hangouts along busy streets and sidewalks, attracting the attention of passers-by.

They are curious to observe in the daytime; standing or crouching statue-like with an unblinking yellow eye. Once disturbed they proceed with stealth on their long nimble legs, then abruptly come to a stop, where they will again remain motionless.

Though they are not seen in our neighbourhood that often, sightings have been made recently in Deagon (at the racecourse), Sandgate, and nearby in Boondall. Their preferred habitats are open woodlands and forest edges, but like many of our native fauna species, they have somewhat adapted to life in the suburbs.

Their success or failure in any given setting is difficult to explain and predict. They have disappeared from some of the natural range of places that still have reasonable conditions, particularly in southern Australia, yet are surviving well, further north.

After sundown they forage for small insects, amphibians and reptiles. Although they are good flyers, they are rarely seen in the air, and nearly always only at night. This is also when you may hear their call- an eerie, lilting and far-travelling sequence of notes.

Their breeding period is from June up until December. One or two eggs are laid in a small scrape on the ground. The chicks are flightless for about nine weeks. At this time they are at their most vulnerable from predators, especially foxes, dogs and cats (pet owners, remember to be mindful).

No one really knows the whys and wherefores of their comings and goings. I count any sighting as lucky, and feel drawn to stop and watch these curious birds with their quirky behaviours.

Miss Sandgate and the Man who Built her

here's an extraordinary link between Sandgate and Sikorsky Helicopters – Vladimir Victorovich Slusarenko.

Born in Piflis in Russia in 1889, Vladimir was always interested in aviation, and in 1911 he became the first Russian to hold an aviation licence. Vladimir late teamed up with friend and fellow aviation enthusiast, Igor Sikorsky, to establish an aircraft and design factory near St. Petersburg.

The chaos of the Russian Revolution, in 1917, forced them to flee. Vladimir Slusarenko ended up here in Sandgate – a Russian refugee in exile. Igor went to America, going on to become famous as the man who developed the first commercial helicopter. They remained friends, however, and for years letters in Russian flew back and forth across the Pacific.

Vladimir worked as an aircraft mechanic and anglicised his name to Bill Slusar. Together with Arthur Perkins, he later established the Sandgate Motor Company.

In his spare time, Bill applied his skills to building a small monoplane, copying the design from an aviation magazine. It took him almost seven years to build the plane 'that anyone could fly'. She was christened Miss Sandgate. Modelled on a 1931 Heath Parasol, she was tiny, having a wing span of just 25 feet.

In 1934, after a somewhat shaky start, Miss Sandgate became a regular "hack" at Archerfield for aspiring pilots wishing to build up their flying hours.

She passed through several owners, until the 1960s, when Len Neale's brother, Kevin, and a mate found her in a garage in Gympie. They transported her to Biloela in the hope of restoring her, but it was a daunting task. In 1991, Len took on the project. He lovingly rebuilt the plane using modern materials and very kindly donated one of the original spruce wing struts to the Sandgate Museum, where it hangs today.

Just recently, Len took her for a 'nice 30-minute flight'.


