

Putters Poised for New Golf Centre

ave you ever dreamed of playing a few rounds of golf on the Old Course at St Andrews in Scotland, or the impeccable grounds of Georgia's exclusive Augusta National Golf Club?

It may be tricky to organise the real thing, but a new indoor golf-driving simulator that is set to open in November at Boondall, will provide golfing enthusiasts with a virtual experience of playing on some of the most prestigious courses from around the world. The three-bay, 137sqm, indoor, golf-driving simulator offers players a choice of 100 golf courses, from different countries, to play on and is part of a new golfing centre, currently being built, at 23 Zillmere Road, Boondall.

The site will also feature an 18-hole miniature golf course, kiosk, garden courtyard, new landscaping and ample car parking spaces.

Josh Butterfield, from Butterfield Holdings, who are developing the site, said the complex should be up and running by the middle of November – just in time for the school holidays.

"The unique thing about the outdoor course, is that it will be the first putt-putt course that has a large portion of the facility under a shade sail. People playing the course will enjoy the shade in summer.

The putt-putt course will have 18 interesting holes, each hole with its own challenges," Mr Butterfield said. "It will be a proper putt-putt course, not just for kids, but appropriate for people of all ages."

"The indoor driving range simulator bays are 5m wide. Players use a real golf club – their own if they like, and hit a real ball into a screen that has a pic of the golf course that you choose to play on. There will be 100 different courses from around the world to choose from."

Mr Butterfield said the golf drive simulator was a popular training method for professional golfers as the technology is able to give users the key statistics on their golf swing mechanics.

"A lot of golfing professionals are using these types of facilities to train in. Players can get the statistics on how their club was facing when it hit the ball, how far you hit it, how fast it was ... it's all very real," he said.

The golfing enthusiast said the popularity of golf simulators was increasing, with more people keen to experience golf courses where you would normally need to be a club member or to be playing in a tournament.

ike a lot of Sandgate residents, Lulu enjoys a walk along the foreshore. From September, she might be enjoying it a little more freely.

Brisbane City Council will be starting a 12-month trial of a dog off-leash area, from Second Avenue, extending along the beach area in front of Lover's Walk.

Lulu's owner, Sandra Robertson, said her pampered pooch loved a walk along the beach.

"We walk Lulu down here everyday, the foreshore is why we live here," Sandra said.

"Lulu is part of our family, so I'm excited to finally have an off-leash area on the sand that the whole family can enjoy.

Fingers crossed that everyone acts responsibly, so that it becomes permanent."

Deagon Ward councillor, Jared Cassidy, said there would be a range of community engagement in the lead up to, and during the trial.

"There will be clear signage to identify the foreshore dog off-leash areas, an information kiosk at the location and an online community survey to gather information on the area and resident's understanding of shorebirds and responsible dog behaviour," Cr Cassidy said.

"Following the trial, there will be an additional online community survey."

The area in Sandgate for the dog off-leash trial was chosen after extensive research by the University of Queensland, and the Queensland Department of Environment and Science, which included data on shorebird habitat, and the community's demand for dog walking.

"I know there are strongly held views on both sides of the debate that has occurred locally around this issue, but it's clear that there is a desire for people to see an area for dog off-leash use along the foreshore," Cr Cassidy said.

"All of the locations around Brisbane for this trial must comply with strict Queensland Government standards in relation to the protection of shorebird habitat and other marine environmental values.

"Having a specific dog off-leash area means there can be greater protection of valuable migratory bird habitat along the rest of the foreshore."

he folk tradition of maypole dancing will be one of the highlights of Shorncliffe State School's Centenary Celebration Fete, this month.

The bayside school marked the start of their centennial year on 29 January, and now the focus is on several celebrations over the weekend of September 13 and 14.

Shorncliffe principal, Melanie Rehm, said a formal assembly would be hosted by the current school leaders, followed by a special afternoon tea for past students, on Friday, 13 September from 2pm

That evening, the school's P&C Association will host a fundraising cocktail party (18+ years) at

the Queensland Cruising Yacht Club (QCYC) from 6pm.

P&C president, Kristen Davie, said past students were travelling long distances to attend the reunion.

"This is a lovely opportunity for past and present parents, past students and past and current teachers to enjoy a night in Shorncliffe," Kristen said.

The evening will include an online raffle and silent auction. Tickets are \$30 and can be purchased from the school's office.

The focus will then shift to Saturday, 14 September for the Centenary Celebration Fete and further reunions of past students and teachers.

The fete will be opened by lord mayor, Adrian Schrinner, and will include a Welcome to Country and an indigenous dance performance.

A reunion space will be set up where past students and staff can come together in decade groups to reminisce and enjoy a Devonshire tea. Tours of the original school buildings will be led by current year five and six students.

During the fete, senior students will perform a maypole dance, a tradition at the school dating back to the 1920s.

"A Shorncliffe tradition is the maypole and our dancers have been learning their routines since the beginning of Term 2," Melanie said.

"Our year six students are writing letters to the future to be placed in the time capsule, when it is unsealed for the first time since the 90th celebrations."

The school's oval will be packed with amusement rides, games and stalls, while the students dance

through the decades and the school bands and choir perform.

"Past Shorncliffe instrumental music strings students will combine with our current students to perform," Melanie said.

Kristen said the weekend of celebrations are a great opportunity to give back to the community.

100 years of servicing the community is a really important milestone to celebrate." Kristen said.

"We're looking forward to welcoming our past students back to the school to see the differences in the school."

NEXT TO NORMAL IS A WINNER

riters have long been captivated by the human condition. Racial prejudice, religiosity, sexuality, oppression, adversity and much more have been diversely documented in theatre and film. It isn't surprising that in this era of actively addressing difficult issues, contemporary writer, Brian Yorkey, has brought a topic to the forefront that has always been confronting – mental illness.

In the production, Next to Normal, playwright, Yorkey brings a script to audiences that is laced with all the frustration, pathos and heartbreak that occur in a family trying to cope with a wife and mother affected by Bipolar Disorder. Add to this complex story a stirring musical score by Tom Kitt, and it becomes a Pulitzer Prize winning rock opera, which highlights the loss of self for the wife and mother, Diana, and the dilemma she faces of choosing an appropriate therapeutic treatment that works for her. For Diana, loss and grief are woven through the plot and her experience of these emotions is exacerbated by the Bipolar Disorder.

CAST Georgina Lock - Natalie Isaac Nelson - Henry [Hat] Michael Pitman - Doc Fine/Madden Gary Conwell - Dan Julie McCoy - Diana The play also exemplifies how the husband, son and daughter are each impacted by their wife and mother's manic and depressive episodes.

The play will be performed locally by JAFA, a performance group formed from the parish of St Joseph's and St Anthony's Catholic College, Bracken Ridge. JAFA is not new to productions emphasising social issues. It has previously performed Oliver, The Sound of Music, and My Fair Lady, all dramatic interpretations of compelling stories intertwined with complex social concerns.

Producer and director, Lisa Harrison, said of the production, "There are moments of levity and moments of seriousness which are represented in an authentic and thought-provoking manner by the scintillating and soaring musical score."

This presentation of Next to Normal coincides with Qld Mental Health week (6 – 14 October). All profits will be donated to Headspace and Centrecare's Catholic Psychiatric Ministry. Tickets are \$20 per person and available through TryBooking www.trybooking.com/BDJRN. The musical contains some mature language and adult themes and is not suitable for young children.

into the new Season!

Finally winter is over! As the days steadily grow longer and the weather becomes warmer, it's the perfect time to get out into your garden!

he benefits of gardening are well-known. It's a great way to stay physically active; gentle activities, such as spreading some mulch, mixing compost, preparing sumptuous soil, pruning plants and trees or even mowing the lawn, will raise your heart rate and stretch your muscles, helping you to live longer!

It's likely that we've all heard the adage, 'gardening soothes the soul', so to be active in your garden will indeed provide a way to relax, reflect, and find a sense of calm in an increasingly erratic world.

Surely though, the greatest benefit of gardening is the produce – a seasonal harvest of tasty treats to cook with and enjoy! Growing and cooking with your own food adds a diversity of nutrients and flavours to your diet. It also helps the environment, by reducing the impact of large-scale food production and reducing the 'foodmiles' of what we consume.

Buying locally grown, seasonal produce is surprisingly easy. Try shopping for your groceries at local farmers markets, rather than at the big supermarket chains, where fruit and vegetables are often imported, or transported from other parts of the country on fuel-guzzling trucks.

Growing your own food is so rewarding! Build yourself a garden bed in a sunny spot in your yard; remove any turf, turn over the soil to a depth of around 30cm, add some organic matter, such as cow manure or compost, sprinkle with some blood and bone, add some lime and mix well.

Give your new veggie patch a couple of weeks to settle in, watering occasionally, and you'll be ready to plant your crops!

If you don't have the space or you are renting, then pop some fruit trees in pots; there are lots of dwarf varieties available that will happily grow in a large pot, and you can take them with you if you move.

Grow and eat with the seasons, you'll love it!

Wax, dirt and moisture: These are the leading causes for hearing aid malfunctions. Wipe your hearing aids with alcohol wipes or clean tissues. If your hearing aids are fitted with wax filters, replace or clean the filters according to instructions. Ensure the microphone and receiver (speaker) sound bores are clean. Replacing the earmould tubing can make a significant difference to sound quality. A hearing aid vacuum chamber can remove moisture from hidden places inside the aids. Also an audio listening check by an experienced audiologist can determine if the hearing aid quality is degraded.

"I still can't hear my family. The background noise is too much. I can't hear clearly": Once possible common faults have been ruled out, a further investigation will help pinpoint a solution to enhance your hearing aid's performance, such as measuring your hearing aid's performance in guiet situations and with speech stimulus, realising and improving your hearing aid's limitations, measuring the nature of your hearing loss and the severity of any hearing distortion.





Look Out! It's Swooping Season!

ith beautiful waterfront trails and parklands, Sandgate is a favourite for families all year round. However, as spring approaches, swooping magpies are the talk of the town, as everyone anticipates the wrath of these perceived feathered foes during nesting season.

Whereas these highly intelligent, accomplished songbirds generally live peacefully among us, they are fiercely protective when it comes to their little ones. Avid cyclist, Rebekah Mannering, is one of the many locals who

knows just how vigilant these birds can be. "I cycle along the foreshore about two to three times a week," Rebekah said. "I have been swooped many times and the noise they make is beyond terrifying!"

Aside from fleeing the country each spring, to avoid the birds altogether, you can take less drastic measures to ward off a potential attack. Take note of any magpie activity along your usual walking/cycling routes throughout the year and avoid these areas in the springtime, whenever possible. As magpies are very territorial, they normally raise their young in the same location, year after year. "There are a few spots where I notice magpies each spring," Rebekah says. "One particularly protective male tends to nest in a tree on Twelfth and Flinders and another one along the Deagon Deviation path."

As it's impossible to avoid nests altogether, it's good practice to protect your head and eyes when venturing outside, this time of year. This could be as simple as attaching cable ties to your bike helmet, or wearing a wide-brimmed hat while walking. Others swear by adding googly eyes or sunnies to the back of their hat or helmet to help to ward off an attack from behind. However, Rebekah has witnessed an even more unusual strategy. "When my friend came over from England, we saw a group of students with ice cream containers on their heads," Rebekah says. "Understandably, my friend was guite shocked when I explained that they were trying to protect their heads from magpies!"

It's good to be cautious, but there's no need to panic. "I try to remember that they are only protecting their young," Rebekah says. "When they aren't feathered bringers of death, they are beautiful and funny birds."

here's a buzz around Brighton and it's got the locals heading to their backyards. At just 4mm in length this tiny wonder is drawing people outside, to plant gardens, share stories and marvel at the adventures of something so small.

It's known to purists as Tetragonula Carbonaria, but locals call it by its common name, the native stingless bee. Whilst it's estimated that there are approximately 2,000 species of native bees in Australia, this social bee is primarily found in South East Queensland and is rapidly gaining popularity as a backyard buddy in Brighton.

A local 4017 resident, Fraser, installed a log hive (rescued from tree loppers) to help pollinate his garden and create a little eco system.

"I picked an area where we could sit and enjoy watching them. As a landscape gardener, I chose the log one first, to encourage the garden to flourish. It's very easy, no maintenance and nice to have as a feature in the garden," Fraser said.


"We got ours from local native bee hive supplier, Greg's Native Stingless Bees. He stabilised the log with a base and roof and has helped us out with information. Now our neighbours are installing hives too."

Whereas many native bees need native trees, this species is happy to feed from exotic plants as well, making them ideal for suburbia. Brighton based Greg Coonan of Greg's Native Stingless Bees, said, "The number of hives I sold last season (Sept-Sept) was 50, this next season it's estimated to be over 100.

"They are such a joy to have. I prefer the rescued log hives, but there's plenty of interest in the built hives too. They're a really popular gift for weddings, birthdays, anniversary's and especially Christmas. They are a gift with a difference and zero maintenance. I give people a hand to set up and the bees just thrive."

These busy bees only travel up to 500m to find food, so planting flowers and native trees, and allowing old trees to remain so the bees can nest in the holes is essential. The benefit for us is a much stronger eco system, especially in farming and of course, relaxation, you can watch them for hours!




