Hits McPherson Park

et your dancing shoes ready for a morning of music and melody when Brighton's Swingalicious Big Band sets up in McPherson Park in Bracken Ridge in October.

Playing everything from Glenn Miller through to the Spice Girls, this 17-piece outfit is one of Brisbane's most popular community bands.

Swingalicious was formed in 2013, and is made up of professional and keen amateur musicians who teach, study or perform professionally.

The band is comfortable playing a variety of music from the 40s through to contemporary pop tunes, and come the last Sunday of this month, will be in full swing in McPherson Park from 11am to midday.

If dancing isn't your thing, that's okay, because there are plenty of other activities happening at the park as part of the broader event billed as 'Steamed Up'.

Hungry park goers can head over to the sausage sizzle or drop by the coffee or ice-cream van. A raft of other stall holders with local products will also be attending.

Children will love the toy stall and jumping castle.

The Bracken Ridge Central Lions Club will also be running their steam and electric miniature trains, which are suitable for children and adults to ride.

Bracken Ridge Central Lions Club president, Jason Sutton, said their monthly train days had become hugely popular.



"We generally have anywhere from 500 to 800 people turn up for the day and it just keeps getting bigger."

"Last month we had the Big Brass Band, we've had a pipe band also," Jason said. "These events make for a great family day out."

The Lions' Club steam and electric mini trains will be running from 9am to 2pm, Sunday 27 October at McPherson Park. Train rides are \$2 per person.

The Steamed Up event is part of Brisbane City Council's Bands in the Park program.

Club member, Margaret Pettit, said the standard of entries had become more creative and stunning each year.

"Every year the quality seems to be improving," she said.

"It's funny, nearly everyone feels 'oh, my work isn't good enough' but really, every year it's getting better."

The exhibit, which will be at the Sandgate Town Hall from 10-12 October, and will feature a novice section, as well as a "\$30 and under table"; perfect for those looking to start some early Christmas shopping.

"People are looking for something unique, something handmade," Margaret said.

She also said the club was growing in popularity, with a number of enquiries each week about learning the art of pottery.





"We would get around 10 to 12 enquiries every week – they don't all stay of course, but people are very interested," Margaret said.

"I think too that people are looking to slow down and enjoy something, rather than rushing around all the time.

"We're lucky, it's such a lovely and supportive group here – everyone encourages one another and if there's new people, there's someone here to help them."

All the pieces on show at Expressions will be for sale. As well as pottery, the show will feature paintings, photography and sculpture.

"Everyone here really looks forward to Expressions – even those that don't enter a piece come along and have a look," Margaret said.

"We'd love to see members of the community come out to the exhibit."

Margaret acknowledged the importance of support from the local community for the event.

ack your camera and have your passport ready for a trip around the world – only you won't need to leave Sandgate for this adventure.

Community ensemble, South East Queensland Symphonic Winds, will take you there with their 'Postcards' performance on Sunday 20 October; it's an exploration of all corners of the globe featuring dances, folk songs, and inspiring music.

President of the group, Adam Pittard, said the inspiration behind the theme was the way music is seen as a universal language, even though it differs all around the world.

"We wanted this concert to take a snapshot of the different themes and styles represented by countries and cultures all around the world. Attendees can expect a variety of enjoyable pieces that allow them to travel across the globe, all from the comfort of their seat,"

Adam said.

Each time South East Queensland Symphonic Winds perform in Sandgate, they focus on a different theme, so even if you have been to a previous performance, there'll be something new for you to discover at this one.

"Our listeners can expect to be a part of the same fun and enthusiasm from our ensemble as with our previous concerts, but with the added benefit of a musical holiday around the world," Adam said.

Adam said one of the highlights of the concert will be a performance of Fantasy on a Japanese Folk Song by Samuel Hazo.

"It tells a love story and the internal struggle of a woman, choosing between her love for her country, Japan, and the American man she loves. The bold masculine tones contrast the feminine phrases that almost tip-toe throughout the piece. The audience can be swept away with their emotions as they're torn between the two countries and guided through this musical heartbreak," he said.

Admission is \$15 per person with a discounted rate of \$10 available to concession cardholders. Children under 10 years are free. Tickets are sold on the day with doors open from 12.30pm.



he Brighton Bulldogs sure know how to end their soccer season in style – with its annual Gala Day to be held in October.

Jump in on Muddy Guided Tour

Be on the hunt for creatures that like to swim, dig, crawl and jump in muddy puddles, with a guided tour of Shorncliffe's tidal flats on Sunday, 6 October. Meandering Mudflats will see families and eco-enthusiasts learning about migrating shorebirds, marine invertebrates and the places they live.

Cr Jared Cassidy said the shorebirds migrated from Siberia, China, Japan, Mongolia and even Alaska.

"Our mudflats at Shorncliffe and Sandgate are so unique and many locals probably don't appreciate their significance," he said.

"This section of Moreton Bay is quite shallow for a long way out, which gives us hectares of open space to enjoy twice a day, every day when the tide is out.

"They are home to so many different animals and play a really important part in the ecosystem of Moreton Bay.

"The mangroves and sandflats play an integral role in supporting the lifecycle of prawns, crabs and bugs and many species of fish."

Participants are encouraged to wear a wide-brimmed hat, enclosed shoes and sunscreen on the day.

Meandering Mudflats tours are also held at Nudgee Beach and Manly.

The Bard Comes to the Bay

omething might be rotten in the state of Denmark (or so they say in Hamlet), but local theatre fans are certainly rejoicing as the Brisbane Shakespeare Festival returns to Sandgate this month.

Festival founder, Gary Thorpe, said this year's production, Hamlet, was regarded as the greatest of William Shakespeare's dramas, and was relevant to today's world of political upheaval.

"Hamlet has a strong message about the love of power and the destruction it can bring," he said.

"It is a message that is just as relevant today as it was 400 years ago.

"Shakespeare lived in dangerous times; the times of Elizabeth I. There was a constant threat of war, religious tension and widespread paranoia, especially about foreigners. Sound familiar?

"Hamlet is a play that everyone should see, as it tells us so much about the human condition."

The cast is lead by Tama Matheson, the artistic director of the festival, who is returning from performing in London, to play Hamlet. The cast also includes Eugene Gilfedder, one of Australia's greatest Shakespearean actors and who has won many awards here in Queensland, and interstate.

The Sandgate Library will host a special interactive, magical-themed Shakespearean story time for children aged 3 to 12, on Saturday 19 October.

"Kids' Classic Shakespeare is very popular – this year, kids can explore Shakespeare's world of witches in the play Macbeth," Gary said.

"The kids will be able to take part in the famous scene, 'bubble, bubble, toil and trouble' and add some of the ingredients to the witches' brew."

Gary said the festival started 13 years ago, with the aim of introducing the great plays of Shakespeare to people, in free performances and in an informal setting.

"This is an opportunity to experience one of the great theatre events for free in Sandgate's Einbunpin Lagoon park, and we encourage people to come early," he said.

There will be music and sword fighting demonstrations, before Hamlet begins at 2.30pm.

ith their super-smart identical suits, pencil-thin ties, and even a couple of mop tops, it's not such a stretch to liken the lads, from Brisbane-based Orava Quartet, to the image of the Beatles.

The young guns of the chamber music world, Daniel Kowalik (violin), Karol Kowalik (cello), Thomas Chawner (violin), and David Dalseno (violin) will certainly dress to impress when they deliver a wicked classical program in Sandgate.

Q: You've been likened to a boy band. What's the story on your style and age?

A: Karol Kowalik: "We're all low 30s. We wear suits to concerts as we treat every performance as a special and important occasion. The coloured and funny socks I suppose are just a bit of fun."

Q: What's in store for our Music By The Sea audience?

A: "We'll be performing Schubert's iconic 'Death and the Maiden'. At the end of Matthias Claudius's poem, which Schubert had set as a 20-year-old in 1817, Death cradles the Maiden in his bony embrace. Her fear, in the first verse, of encountering his tomb-cold touch is mirrored by his desire for her in the second.

"When Schubert returns to the song in 1824 and starts work on the string quartet, he has become acquainted with pain and disease during the bouts of the syphilis that he knows will kill him. He turns the song into a set of variations, preceding it with a ferocious Allegro, and following it with a Scherzo and a Finale that has been described as 'the dance of the demon fiddler' and 'a dance with death'.

"We'll also present Ave Verum Corpus, by English composer William Byrd, and the motet, O Magnum Mysterium, by Thomas Luis De Victoria, the most famous composer in 16th century Spain.

"We'll also be playing the much loved and adored Mozart 'Hunt' quartet."

Orava has been described as the most exciting young quartet on the block. Both the Pope and Queen Sophia of Spain have sat in audience. Now there's an invitation for you!

There is a lot of hype around hemp with it popping up in markets and shops recently.

ince hemp was legalised for consumption in 2017, it has attracted people who are looking to the plant to supply green alternatives, from building their brains and bodies to construction and fuel.

Thr333fold collaborator, Barbara Syassen, said people come from all over Brisbane to buy hemp oil at their monthly High Vibe Collective Market at Einbunpin Lagoon.

She is part of the Global Hemp Movement, but said that even with the legalisation, this country had lot of catching up to do.

"Australia is quite slow; about 25 years behind other countries," she said.

"[Locally] there's a buzz about it, they're very much into green and alternate living.

"It's sustainable; the plant itself is eco-friendly, good for the environment.

"They (the hemp products) are made out of the hemp seeds they're used for healing: Omega 3, antioxidants, and amino acids, which are what our body uses to make protein. "It helps with body building to arthritis to joint pain and weight loss."

Ms Syassen said hemp was very diverse and could also be used to create home insulation, carpet and clothing, better than traditional materials.

"Cotton requires a lot of water, but hemp doesn't require as much or the space to grow," she said.

"Nature has so much to give us and if we can focus on green, eco-friendly things it's great for the environment."

The success of the green movement led to Ms Syassen's decision to open a storefront, and so the Thr333fold collaboration started.

"We branch out in so many areas," she said.

Karen Cooper started the store in 2013. She is the managing director of the collaboration as well as being the resident intuitive reader, and is also a radio personality.

The third collaborator is Robbie Thompson, who runs markets and 'awaken the third eye' workshops and plays 432hz guitar music.

Ms Syassen also does aromatherapy, massage, yoga, reiki, writing and helps children connect with nature.



his year, locals will have even more time to enjoy the delicious food and wine, entertainment and hospitality on offer at the Greek Affair and Multicultural Festival

Organisers have decided to host the popular Taigum event on Saturday 12 October, with the program of events running from 10am to 8pm on the grounds at the Parish of St Paraskevi.

Parish of St Paraskevi Secretary, Maria Comino, said normally the festival was held on a Sunday, but this year organisers had decided to host it on a Saturday and run it into the evening.

"By the time it gets to the afternoon on a Sunday, people start thinking about getting ready for work or getting children ready for school, so by having it on a Saturday - guests can come and relax into the evening," Maria said.

"Plus, if anyone has to work on a Saturday and miss lunch, they can come afterwards and enjoy dinner."

Festival goers will be able to enjoy mouthwatering moussaka, halloumi cheese, spanakopeta (spinach pie) and pitta wraps. Red and white Greek wine will be available, as well as an assortment of soft drinks.

hat do you get when food, music and Elvis Presley collide? Hint: the answer isn't deep-fried peanut butter and bacon sandwiches. It's actually the theme of two of the biggest nights of entertainment in Sandgate this month.

So where did the name 'Death by Carrot' come from?

"Death By Carrot is a way of analysing the carrot and the stick metaphor."

Now back to Elvis. This month's Unplugged Café, on Friday 4 October, will feature Jim Hansen and his band playing 'Good Rockin' Tonight – The Sun Sessions' with the songs of Elvis Presley, 1954-1956.

Garry Hunt from SANDBAG said the musical line up would include Harvest, performing acoustic, classic tunes from Neil Young, and Jess Martyn on keyboard/vocals playing soulful ballads.

"So there will be dancing towards the end of the night and people are encouraged to 'frock up' in their best rock and roll outfits and join in the fun," he said. "There will be a prize for the best dressed rock and roller. People who are attending for the first time will be surprised by the great community atmosphere and the fantastic local talent on display."

Food will be provided by Agnes Lunani, who has been involved with SANDBAG's Green P Farm and Global Kitchen. She will be cooking some traditional Kenyan Dishes.

Tips for saving money on purchasing hearing aids

1. Get the facts - Don't buy a hearing aid if you do not need one. Make sure you are not being over-prescribed.

If you do need a hearing aid, should you get one aid or two? The price for two aids is usually twice the price of one. It's a waste of money to buy features which you do not need.

3. Get hearing aids that actually work

Choosing the correct brand and technology level, selecting the correct hearing aid features and style, carefully programming the hearing aid settings, determining the sound quality and ensuring successful outcomes are more important in a hearing aid than how expensive it is. A higher technology hearing aid does not always perform better than a lower technology hearing aid.

4. Are you getting an older model?

As an unsuspecting client, are you purchasing an older model hearing aid? Ask questions. You should not invest in an older hearing aid if a newer, better performing model has already been released.

ACCC encourages clients to research the price. Don't assume a bigger hearing aid retailer always offers the lowest price. Some hearing clinics quote 30-40% higher for the same products than the prices offered at Sandgate Hearing.

6. Used hearing aids

Don't purchase used hearing aids online or wear a deceased family member's or friend's hearing aid. They won't match your hearing levels and it may even harm your hearing. Hearing aids are medical devices. You need to see a professional.





oreton Bay is home to a number of dolphin species, with two residing within its waters all year round-The Australian Humpback Dolphin (Sousa sahulensis), and the Indo-Pacific Bottlenose Dolphin (Tursiops aduncus). They are similar in length and weight, but quite different in their behaviour.

The Australian Humpback Dolphin is listed as a vulnerable species by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), and is more restricted in its distribution. Numbers are estimated at only a few thousand individuals in total. Despite high human population densities nearby, in booming South East Queensland, Moreton Bay remains a stronghold for them, relatively speaking.

They are considered an 'inshore' species, preferring shallow water such as bays and river mouths. This preference puts them at greater risk of human activities. Shy and elusive by nature, their main threats are habitat loss and degradation, boating accidents and becoming entrapped in commercial fishing nets.

The Indo-Pacific Bottlenose Dolphin has a much wider distribution, right up into South East Asia, and the coast of east Africa, although insufficient

data is available to determine their conservation status. This is the species most frequently seen in captivity because of their ability to form bonds with humans and to be trained. They're also the ones you've probably seen riding the waves on surf beaches.

Not nearly as shy, and instinctively curious, they can be quite bold. They may come to investigate swimmers, kayakers and paddlers, or swim alongside boats, and are regularly spotted near the Redcliffe Pier and around Scarborough.

They are a delight to watch: relaxed yet nimble in their movements, aware of our presence, yet trusting in their safety, and instantly capable of bursts of speed to escape danger or to catch their prey.

Dolphin/human interactions have taken various forms throughout history, and in different parts of the world. In certain places they had an almost mythical status, and have captured our imaginations for millennia. Elsewhere they have been, and to some extent still are, an important part of the diets of many cultures.

They are undoubtedly intelligent, inquisitive, playful and complex creatures. Although they are quite well-researched, we still have so much to learn about them.

Interactive Display Taps into Sandgate's History.

new creative project, set to bring the history of Sandgate to life through an interactive audio-visual display, is gaining momentum, as well as keen engagement from 4017 locals.

The community project, Sandgate: Voices from the Past, is the brainchild of local creative agency director, Catherine Cox. It will draw on the memories of people, with connections to the bayside town, from the 1920s to the 1950s.

The initiative proposes capturing the area's rich history through video interviews that will be displayed on an interactive touchscreen display.

Catherine said she had been thinking about producing a video about Sandgate's history for some time and that following a meeting with one of Sandgate's long-time locals, 105-year-old Lynda Paddon, the professional film producer felt compelled to move on the idea.

"The vision is to capture first-hand the history of the area using a series of video interviews with a group of between 10 to 15 people," Catherine said. "We're looking to interweave the stories into key themes for the touchscreen display.

"The interviewees could be talking on a range of topics, such as what it was like to live in Sandgate during the war, or during the depression; the beach culture, or cinemas. It's about bringing these stories to life for people."

The interactive display is proposed to be built into a 1.8m high replica of the Hornibrook Bridge.

Catherine has teamed up with Sandgate and District Historical Society president, Pam Verney, and a documentary consultant to determine the scope of the project.

They recently made a detailed submission to the Brisbane City Council, for a history grant to fund the project. The Historical Society will find out in December 2019, if the submission was successful.

Future Waves

ur communication platforms are expanding again and we are about to receive access to the latest 5G network, which promises download speeds of up to 1 gigabyte per second.

5G is currently rolling out across the country and many regions of Brisbane already have access to the super-fast network, with plans to have Sandgate online soon. Still, many people are worried about the possible effects on humans.

So should we be worried? It's true that a couple of cities in the world have put a hold on making 5G available to its citizens pending further research. This includes Brussels, after protests from people who have concerns about the use of ultra high radio frequencies.

Here's a snapshot summary of the science: 5G uses ultra high frequency radio waves to transmit data. The higher frequency means more data can be carried, but the technology has less ability to pass through objects such as buildings, which is why a greater number of transmitters is required around our neighbourhoods.

People's concerns are around the fear of a type of electromagnetic radiation, which can damage atoms and create ions. This is called 'ionising radiation', and is known to cause cancer.

Scientists believe that the 5G radio frequencies exist on the spectrum of electromagnetic radiation that is 'non-ionising', meaning that, in theory, it does not damage atoms. Other frequencies in this range are already used in microwaves, TV's, FM radio and all existing mobile phones.

The people, who are worried about 5G, believe that this level of radiation may still be harmful to humans, and that a cautious approach may be more prudent in the implementation of large-scale projects that use the new technology. They worry about elements of the technology, which may affect children and old people particularly, such as cancer.

Some concerns also exist about the overall thermal impact of the large-scale use of 5G radio waves on the environment.

While the science community continues to research and develop the use of electromagnetic radiation in communication technologies, it's always a good idea to do your own research and draw your own conclusions on how these new technologies may affect you.

he Old Fire Station will be 'ablaze' with action in November to celebrate its 70th birthday.

Kathy Coller from Redcliffe Art Society shared some interesting history of the notable structure.

"The construction of this building responded to the growing population's interdependence on the land, once seen only as a tourist destination," Kathy said.

"Post WWII, the community was in need of its own fire station to protect the needs of the local community."

The construction of the red brick building was completed in 1949 at a cost of 11,000 pounds.

This iconic building stands proud, tall, and midway on the highpoint of the Peninsula's earliest main road between Scarborough and Woody Point," Kathy said.

Redcliffe Art Society [RAS] moved into the Old Fire Station Art Hub in February 2015, and has continued to breathe new life into the old space, with over 400 members and 17 weekly studio art classes.

RAS also manages the Old Fire Station Art Gallery and Gallery Shop in the refurbished Redcliffe Fire Station.

On the same site, the Redcliffe Pottery Group has pottery studios, kiln, and display space.

The Redcliffe Art Society, with the support of the Redcliffe Pottery Group and Moreton Bay Regional Council will be welcoming residents and visitors to the 70th birthday event.

"There will be a barbecue providing food, and drinks will be available too," Kathy said.

"Members of both the art and pottery groups will provide demonstrations during the event and the Gallery and Gallery Shop will be open.

"Fire Station themed art from local primary school children will also be on display."

A fire engine and firemen from Kippa-Ring Fire Station will visit during the afternoon and evening, as well as the SES and volunteer Marine Rescue.

Fire Station memorabilia and historic photos will be on display, with some historic costumes available for photographic opportunities.


