Youth Theatre Group Proposed For Sandgate

spiring young actors and actresses from 4017 may be interested in hearing that a new youth theatre group has been proposed for Sandgate.

Members from Sandgate Theatre Inc. met late last month, to talk about a proposal for a youth theatre group – what was required as part of the planning phase and what a program for youth theatre may look like.

The group is calling for anyone interested in helping, with the planning for a potential youth theatre movement in Sandgate, to let them know.

Christine Linning, who has been a member of the Sandgate Theatre group for almost 30 years, said discussions about youth theatre classes followed keen interest in the initiative from parents in the area.

"At this year's display at the Einbunpin Festival we were asked by many parents if we had youth theatre as part of our company," Christine said.

"Youth theatre would help to give children more self-confidence, self-esteem, experience in working as part of a team, public speaking confidence, patience and an excellent opportunity to learn all about the theatre.

"The classes would introduce the children to theatre technique, script reading, voice projection, dance and choreography."

Christine said that, while the classes would be guided by qualified tutors, the sessions would be designed for children to have fun.

"At this stage, we are thinking about holding two one-hour classes; one class for children aged five to 10 years-old and then another class for children 10 years-old and over," she said.

During the next few months, members of Sandgate Theatre will be looking at the planning for a youth theatre program and firming up what the cost of classes would be, lesson times and potential tutors.

Sandgate Theatre Inc. is also on the lookout for a new venue for rehearsals and meetings. Ideally the adult and youth divisions of Sandgate Theatre Inc. would be run out of the same venue.

rganisers of the annual Bracken Ridge Christmas Carols Spectacular, this year, plan on illuminating the audience in a new and immersive concert experience.

One thousand wireless-controlled, mutlicoloured LED bracelets will be available for purchase on the night, for audience members keen to become part of the show. The wristbands will be pre-programmed and change colours in rhythm with the carols and on stage activity.

Bracken Ridge Baptist Church pastor, Graham Wray, said the LED bracelets formed part of the show's theme 'the light has come' and would make the event more interactive for the audience.

"The bracelets are controlled by the lighting operator, and when each bracelet changes colour, people wearing certain colours will be asked to do something," he said. "Dancers in the show also will be wearing them."

The Bracken Ridge Carols Spectacular, hosted by the Bracken Ridge Baptist Church, is one of 4017's most popular Christmas events. The 2019 event is expected to attract between 3,000-5,000 people.

Concert goers can expect singing, dancing, performances from local talent and fireworks.

Pastor Wray said the Christmas event's choir was a 50-person ensemble, including singers from the Multitude Community Choir, Counterpoint Choir and members of the Baptist Church Choir.

"Carols on the night will be a mixture of traditional songs and a modern reimagining of carols," he said.


Adding to the entertainment will be over 10 food trucks, markets with an array of gifts, toys and locally-made products, as well as some Ekka-styled games for the youngsters to enjoy. Fireworks kick off at 8.20pm.

The event is free to attend and the LED bracelets will be on sale for \$5. Visitors are encouraged to park in the nearby TAFE car park and walk down to the Norris Road State School oval.

ow in its fourth year, Jingle All The Bay has become a signature event for the 4017 community, and for Sandgate and Districts Chamber of Commerce president, Bill Gollan, it's going from strength to strength.

"We love seeing our local businesses decorated for Christmas," he said.

"Last year we had about 80 per cent of businesses doing Christmas lights in their windows and I think this year we're going to have a full house doing it, which is great.

"Also last year, we expanded Jingle All The Bay, extending from the Post Office Hotel on Rainbow Street all the way up Brighton Road and we'll be doing that again, it was so successful - we had 8000 people here and we hope to increase on that this year."

This bayside community event will feature a range of food trucks, market stalls and live entertainment, as well as the parade.

"The parade gets bigger each year as well and already we have a number of floats confirmed," Bill said.

"That's going to be massive and I hope everyone is looking forward to it.

"We're going to have a massive range of food trucks, as well as of course, all our amazing local food businesses; we're going to have heaps of market stalls where you can buy all kinds of Christmas goods — everything from baubles for your tree, to cakes, to gifts for pretty much everyone in the family.

"It's a great chance to buy local and do some Christmas shopping."





There will also be an opportunity to say hello to Santa and give him your Christmas wish list, plus 'Santa Paws' photos for the furry members of the family, alongside community stalls and children's rides.

Bill freely admitted he was an "absolute sucker for Christmas".

"You could say I'm a Christmas tragic, so I just love this event," he laughed.

It's great for businesses and the community, and you know, people have really grabbed on to it; they believe in it and it brings people to our community.

"People come here and they see our beautiful bayside-town lifestyle and it's great that we can tap into that."

he only game good enough for Sandgate Hawks is Aussie rules, since the club kicked out poker machines recently.

Over the past month, the club's pokies and licences were sold and a new strategy was announced.

Sandgate Hawks' president, Scott Albury, said gaming machines were no longer feasible for teh club.

"We were down in revenue, coming in from gaming, and to fix it we had to upgrade the machines, and we didn't have the money to do that or compete with some of the bigger places," he said.

"Also, there was a lot of slant - coming from the community from people who aren't into gaming - about addiction; there was a big split about that.

"The challenge we now face is how to manage this... we have to raise money to support our footy teams without a fully licenced venue.

"Any hurdle you step through you worry about, but we're in a good space."

There are nearly 500 juniors and more than 100 players (over 18) including mens and women's teams. Sandgate Hawks, which started in 1943, has a growing team base and plenty of upgrades underway.

"We've seen a real increase in participation from young girls and ladies with the surge of AFLW," Mr Albury said.

"We've been fortunate to receive grants from all levels of government for our dressing sheds, which should be finished by mid-January.

"That project was around making sure we had adequate space for boys and girls."

The Sandgate Hawks summer skills' programs just started with big hopes for their 2020 season

They also run Lions Academy youth football and a program to promote the participation of new Australians in the sport.

Mr Albury said things were on the up and now all the money raised would go directly into supporting football and their future.

"It's exciting, but there's plenty to do and we need many hands to get the job done," he said.

"This means that the Hawks become a community run, volunteer operated, family football club."

here are going to be some changes to Sandgate's 2020 Australia Day celebrations, but the spirit of fun and community will remain the same. Deagon Ward councillor Jared Cassidy, who is hosting the day, alongside State Member for Sandgate, Stirling Hinchliffe, and Federal MP for Lilley, Anika Wells, said the Australia Day by the Bay festival was a welcoming and friendly celebration.

It's a special day for our community, welcoming new citizens in the morning at the Sandgate Town Hall and then play some beach cricket in the afternoon," Cr Cassidy said.

"No matter how you mark January 26, this is a real celebration of our diverse community."

The main change to the day will be the starting time, with events kicking off at around 3pm at the Volunteer Marine Rescue grounds at Shorncliffe.

"We're looking at an expansion of the free community fun day that we have had in previous years and we're starting later in the day, as it's simply so hot at that time of year," Cr Cassidy said.

Activities could include a sandcastle building competition, fishing activities, water slides and stand up paddle boarding, as well as a jumping castle.

"There will be live entertainment as well and following from the successful Youth Festival, we'd like to have some of young musicians performing on the day," Cr Cassidy said.

"There will be a free barbecue, the VMR will have the bar open and we're looking at the possibility of an open-air movie with free ice-cream and popcorn.

"This is the first year that Stirling, Anika and I have run this event together as a team and with the refocus on the awards and on the citizenship ceremony, I think it's going to be a great day.

"We'll be welcoming 60 or so new Australians which is always very special."

Jazzy Opening of New Centre

he cool sounds of jazz will waft through the trees at the \$6.5 million Boondall Wetlands Environment Centre grand opening on Sunday, 8 December.

There will be music, a sausage sizzle, traditional ceremony, guided walks and the opportunity to get up-close to native animals as Brisbane City Council unveils the new facility.

Flugelhorn player, Jason Nyenhof, will be part of a music quartet performing on the day.

"We're looking forward to being out in the open air and being part of one of the council events," Jason said.

"Jazz is a good match for any occasion; it brings people together – so it's the perfect scenario musically.

"We have been studying at JMI (Jazz Music Institute), and playing together for two years, but only came together as a quartet about six months ago. "(Our performance) is all straight ahead jazz which means it's jazz standards and originals; we're inspired by the cool sound of West Coast jazz.

"I have not been to the wetlands since they've built the new centre, so I'm looking forward to playing there."

Along with the jazz performance there will also be a wildlife expert on site, and a gentle guided walk is planned for around the Billai Dhagun circuit, to learn about the shorebirds who call the wetlands home.

Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner said the new facility will create more for residents and visitors to see and do, while protecting the natural environment.

"BCC worked closely with residents and local businesses throughout the consultation process, to create a family-friendly destination that can be enjoyed by the whole community now and into the future," he said.

"The new centre aims to showcase the ecological significance and values of Brisbane's northern wetlands and its connection with Moreton Bay.

"The centre will have plenty of new features, including flexible activity spaces and interactive educational displays, and Council has updated on-site facilities, including the entrance road and car park."

It took two years for planning and consultation, with construction starting on the project in April this year.

Queensland's new Plastic Pollution Reduction Plan – what do you think? As you know, last year the Queensland Government banned plastic bags and introduced the Container Refund Scheme to reduce litter and encourage recycling.

Research shows seven out of ten people already take steps to reduce their use of single-use plastics, but there is always more we can do to tackle pollution. The government's new Plastic Pollution Reduction Plan is the next step in helping Queenslanders fight the war on waste. This plan is an Australian first in its scope and structure, and one of its actions is to introduce legislation next year, to ban the supply of plastic products including plastic straws, cutlery, plates and stirrers. All of these single-use plastic items, we propose to ban, have a preferred and available reusable or 100% compostable alternative. Other actions in the Plastic Pollution Reduction Plan include increasing the uptake of recycled plastic materials in new products and investing in plastic recovery and reprocessing. Plastic in the marine environment is long-lived—for example, a 30-40 year old plastic bag was found in a Sunshine Coast waterway. 



Emma Malthouse helps you do exactly that with her workshops that use living plants to create beautiful sustainable Christmas decorations for your own home or as a thoughtful gift. The process of making either a living wreath or kokedama (living plant ball) has many therapeutic properties. Research shows that just looking at greenery is beneficial for your mental health, said Emma.

"I would like to say that I am a green thumb but I'm not, I have just experienced what life can throw at you and discovered the healing power of gardening."

"When it comes to creating a living wreath or kokedama you get to connect with your creative side as well as re-fuelling your mental health and wellbeing."

"Taking a piece of that creativity home with you is a bonus" Emma said.

Living wreaths are made from natural materials where living plants have been bound with organic resources to attach to the wreath. Kokedamas are similar but a ball shape is formed to hang from a vantage point. Emma said that they are simple to make once you have been shown.





Deagon Upzone Excluded From Sandgate Plan

Mayor Adrian Schrinner proposed announced changes Deagon will be excluded from the draft Sandgate District Neighbourhood Plan.

Consultation to prepare the draft strategy was launched early this year after a community petition requested council update the Neighbourhood Plan in the area to guide future development.

Almost half of all submissions related to rezoning around Deagon train station and a majority of responses raised concerns.

"Based on the intensive consultation undertaken. feedback indicated a strong objection to the idea of allowing any townhouses or units up to three storeys in the immediate vicinity of the Deagon Train Station," Cr Schrinner said.

"I have listened to concerns and as a result I want to assure residents that this aspect will not be included in the Neighbourhood Plan going forward.

"Council also received a lot of submissions expressing views on how to revitalise Sandgate's town centre to ensure the special character of the area is maintained while also creating a vibrant commercial precinct that drives jobs and economic growth.

"All of these views, whatever they are, will be taken into consideration as part of the plan's preparation.

"The draft strategy is based on local community submissions - feedback received on the draft strategy then guides the preparation of the draft Neighbourhood Plan.

"This is only the first step in the consultation process. Residents, businesses and community groups will again have the opportunity in 2020 to have their say on a revised plan.

The next phase of consultation will be next year as Council works to create a draft Neighbourhood Plan for the future of Sandgate, Deagon and Shorncliffe.





Repair Café members aim to curb the throw-away culture, by bringing back regular repairing and tinkering sessions in Sandgate.

About 30 volunteers have put their hands up to join the first Repair Café in Brisbane, a worldwide phenomenon which first started in the Netherlands 10 years ago.

There are now more than 1,500 Repair Cafés globally, where people share their skills by fixing broken household items, guided by skilled volunteers.

For Sandgate residents, the idea to form a new group was started by Dan Martens, who was soon joined by Juliet Reny and Mardi McNeal.

"We have been overwhelmed with the groundswell of support we've received. People are really keen to see this initiative up and running in our district," Mr Martens said.

The group held a soft start in November, and have already fixed an amplifier volume knob, a cloth bag, blunt mower blades, loose hedge shears, a broken mower handle and two porcelain figurines.

Repair Café Sandgate will officially launch to the broader community in 2020; providing a regular, free meeting place where people can fix just about anything that can be carried in by one person, with the exception of 240 volt electrical wiring.

laire Payne was chosen as Miss Sandgate in 1948, and was an entrant in the Miss Australia Quest, raising funds for the Queensland Ambulance Transport Brigade.

Claire Lihou (nee Payne) turned 91 in October. She grew up at Payne's Garage on the comer of Rainbow Street and Washington Street (now Connolly's Garage). She is an active participant in the "Sandgate Voices from the Past" project.

Miss Sandgate is also the name of a Linton Hope Rater vessel, one of a 22-ft "one design" class, derived from a "1- Rater" designed by innovative English designer, Linton Hope.

The Raters were first adopted by the Royal Queensland Yacht Club in 1910, followed by the Sandgate Yacht Club from 1914 up until 1957, and in Bowen in the late 1940s. The first vessels were built by A.J. Whearet & Sons and Norman Wright & Sons.

Miss Sandgate was built by Ted Rice of Sandgate. Ted sailed her up until he died at the tiller, aged 71. She continued to be sailed in the Vintage Yacht Regattas at Sandgate, until donated to the museum by Ted's wife, Margaret, in May 1992.

Miss Sandgate is in original condition, and has been left as she was on her last race at the Vintage Yacht Regatta, QCYC, Sandgate, in May 1991.

Like many of Hope's designs, the Raters have a retractable rudder that fits into a slot through the deck and hull. They were originally rigged as gaff cutters, with a bowsprit. Later boats had gunter rigs with no bowsprit.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN DEBATE

State local government minister and Member for Sandgate, Stirling Hinchliffe, has waded into the debate over Brisbane City Council's draft neighbourhood plan.

Releasing a statement on his Facebook page, Mr Hinchliffe said he would normally "resist getting involved in matters that are Council issues."

"However, as member for Sandgate, I need to make my position on the Sandgate and districts Neighbourhood Plan clear," he wrote.

"Disappointingly, there are some people misrepresenting what I have said about it, on social media, so it is better that I be clear."

Mr Hinchliffe said he welcomed BCC initiating a process to consider the planning environment for the area, and that he had not made any submission on the draft strategy.

"In response to the reality of population growth in our city, I support higher residential densities in the right places (note, not 'high density' - a different thing)," the statement read.

"I do not think that a simple increase of the currently permitted four storeys to six storeys in Brighton Road, Sandgate will work.

"I do welcome the intent of strengthening the connection between Brighton Road and the waterfront.

"I have expressed to some constituents ... I am concerned that City Hall have not resourced this Neighbourhood Plan well. I reserve the right, as your local MP, to raise these concerns at the appropriate time but would welcome efforts by BCC to correct this."



hile we struggle with the concept of Christmas decorations in department stores as early as September, for some, the planning starts long before then. "We start creative planning in May. The casting call for auditions is in July and the audition process throughout August", Natalie said. "As the Lord Mayor's Christmas Carols is for live television, our brief can change at any moment from the producers and we have to restructure and rethink our performing strategies very quickly; so, that's always a challenge but it's par for the course in performing arts – never a dull moment!"

Natalie was Inspired by her grandmother, and began ballet, jazz and tap, aged five. "Most visits to Grandma's ended in tap dancing lessons in the kitchen."

It was a move to Singapore that gave Natalie an opportunity to broaden her teaching skills. "I was able to teach across a number of educational bodies during my time there. The language of dance is universal but your teaching methods have to adapt to each student so working across a variety of cultures in a multicultural city like Singapore was very beneficial in expanding my teaching abilities."

Currently teaching at Footlights Dance Studio, Deagon, Natalie is thrilled to be working with local children, "The carols are such a wonderful community event for individuals and dance studios, we are privileged to work with over 200 dancers, of all ages, across Brisbane and beyond every year."

Snakes Come

taff at a Northside pizza shop got a big surprise recently, when they found an eastern brown snake curled up in their kitchen.

From that kitchen in Samford, all the way to the sandy bayside beaches, snake season officially started heating up in October/November.

Northside Snake Removals catcher, Nico de Rooy, said the pizza shop staff did the right thing by keeping their distance and calling an expert.

"It was in the kitchen, when they called me," Mr de Rooy said.

He said that during this year's peak snake season, they've seen more activity in the area.

"The snakes were moving around more than normal, with the extra heat and lack of water.

"Most of the males have been out fighting for females and are now in the breeding stage, if not already finished. This time of year is when we will start seeing baby snakes emerging.

"Places snakes will hide or be found are in bushes, amongst yard rubbish and clutter, near pools looking for water, rock walls or out in the open if they are moving around."

However residents have nothing to according to the snake catcher.

"They're (usually) out in the open, in gardens and at front doors," Mr de Rooy said.

"If you see a snake, (and it is safe to do so) send a photo, so I can see what it is.

"Stand back, don't move around, they usually just move on. The majority of people who get bitten are trying to catch or kill them.

"Everyone is brought up to fear snakes, but it is not necessary; if you stay clear of them, they're pretty safe."

Mr de Rooy said he got into the industry because snakes "are incredible creatures".

I'm trying to save and help as many as I can, because people have the wrong opinion of them," he said. "They're so different from every other animal and very misunderstood.

"I've always been fascinated by them and watching Steve Irwin when I was younger."

Mr de Rooy said he's had a lot of calls to catch snakes this year, "I have been busy as there has been a lot of eastern brown snakes and Red bellys around the Northside of Brisbane recently."

ome of you may know about, or have read my articles on Tilapia before; well here is a reminder. Now is the time to go and catch a few! They are very active and are breeding, in the warm weather.

These "cane toads of the waterways" are in almost all of the creeks, ponds and water catchments in our area and are causing havoc to our local native fish populations. They are good fun to catch on light gear and great for kids to learn about fishing and identifying pests in our environment. These fish must be euthanised and disposed of, away from the water as soon as practical and cannot be let go, taken home or eaten!


My preference is to catch them with garden worms, on a size 8 hook under a small float. The float, being visual, is a lot more exciting for the kids than just throwing out the line and waiting. My rig has a sliding float with a rubber band stopper that slides up and down the line for the desired depth. Most of the time it's only about 30cm deep.

There are now some very popular local "pest" fishing competitions being held to get rid of these fish and to reintroduce natives, such as Australian Bass with the proceeds.

Please make sure you can fish the area you choose; there are a few parks with "no fishing" signs. If you are unsure, don't hesitate to contact me for places to fish.
