

et ready for a supercharged night of music and raw talent when up-andcoming musicians from around the area perform at a special Unplugged Café youth event at SANDBAG.

A monthly musical staple in Sandgate for the past decade, Unplugged Café is held on the first Friday of each month at the SANDBAG community centre. For a small fee, locals can enjoy live music and relaxed vibes.

To celebrate Youth Week (1-9 April), SANDBAG has organised a special Unplugged event on 3 April that will showcase young talent in the area. The night will feature performers and musical acts from the northside of Brisbane, with performers aged 12 to 24.

Neighbourhoods and Community Program Coordinator at SANDBAG Erin Williams said guests could expect a great night of live music and fresh new talent.

"There'll be a variety of music genres on the night including blues, rock, folk and everything in between." Erin said.

"The idea for the night is in keeping with the theme of Youth Week this year, 'Yeah the Youth',

which we've interpreted as one that celebrates what young people have to offer.

"We want to give young people a chance to showcase their unique talents and skills."

Erin said that during Youth Week, SANDBAG also would be running a number of workshops and offering mentoring opportunities for young musicians.

"These may include the same musicians that performed at the special youth Unplugged event, but also will be open to other local young musicians," she said.

"Workshops will be facilitated by established musicians and cover topics such as songwriting, music and technology, and tips on breaking into the music industry."

Erin said details for the workshops and mentoring opportunities would be released closer to the event.

### Neighbourhood Plan: A Turning Point for Sandgate

■ This month, the Sandgate Guide highlights the view from the Advance Sandgate Districts Association on how the new proposed Neighbourhood Plan could benefit our community into the future.

ood planning and a calm, rational public discussion are the keys to maintaining our precious lifestyle. The "business as usual" approach will not serve our area into the future.

Sandgate and surrounds are hot property right now, with people flocking here from around Australia and overseas for their city sea-change.

And it's no wonder. From the natural beauty of Bramble Bay, RAMSAR wetlands and large green spaces, to social attractions like the Shorncliffe marina, pier, golf club and Deagon racetrack, there's so much to see and do.

The area also has an enviable public transport system, diverse school options, a public library, sports fields and clubs, a central shopping hub and a blossoming arts and music scene.

But a limited supply of housing and growing demand can only mean one thing - escalating property prices. That's good news for people already in the market but bad news for those looking to get in. It's even worse for renters with many being priced out of their budgets.

Single mums and dads with children want affordable housing, retirees want to downsize without moving out of the area, pensioners who can no longer afford the maintenance of a timber and tin home want more modern options in the place they know and love, and visitors and tourists need short-term accommodation.

While this might sound like a problem, it's actually a symptom of our area's success. It needs careful management to ensure that we can continue to enjoy the lifestyle we love, even as our region continues to grow and succeed.

That's why our community called on Council to develop a new neighbourhood plan. We need to be in control of our own future. If we bury our heads in the sand and pretend we don't need to adapt, then population growth and development will get away from us.

The last Neighbourhood plan for the area was 20 years ago. Brisbane has changed – for the better – in the last two decades. And while the pace of change in Sandgate has been gentler, our lives and the way we live them are being dramatically reshaped.

More and more people don't want to mow or maintain a big garden. Many people prefer to eat out with friends than entertain in a large home. They love the share economy and UberEats and more than anything they need to be fully wified.

We have an opportunity with our neighbourhood planning process to accommodate these new trends. We can future-proof our community - attracting new industries and businesses to our area that will generate new local jobs, especially jobs for our youth.

We also have a responsibility to limit urban sprawl. With its current population of 2.4 million set to increase to 4.2 million by 2050, Brisbane needs to intensify its land use.

We cannot keep cutting down trees and spreading out. The responsible, sustainable option is to go up. The footprint is already cleared, so we need to make better use of it.

City planners all over the world recognise this fact and they intensify on transport corridors. That is the responsible thing to do. We need to consolidate and share resources better.

The alternative is to live in a clogged metropolis of solid residential sprawl from Noosa to Coolangatta, and out to Toowoomba.

That's not how we want to live. We need to control and plan for that growth, so we can protect the lifestyle we treasure.

Any proposed development needs to include strict guidelines around new parking, roads and infrastructure. It also needs to be sympathetic to our coastal aesthetic.

New building designs should be environmentally conscious, with communal spaces for recreation. We need to think about electric car charging stations, shared transport options, sustainable water practices, and much more.

We can achieve all this, and do it well, with strong planning guidelines and good local consultation.

We have the opportunity. It's time for our local representatives to step up and make a positive contribution to the debate.

### **ROOSTERS NEGOTIATE LEAGUE PATHWAY**

or a club that turned 50 and also secured club of the year in 2018, its latest venture has the coop crowing.

The mighty Brighton Roosters have entered into an affiliation with the Redcliffe Dolphins, where they'll field BRL A grade and reserve-grade sides.

Brighton Roosters president and A-Grade coach Dylan Slater said he was approached last year by Redcliffe Dolphins general manager of football Grant Cleal, with the proposal of being one of two feeder clubs to take over the running of the Dolphins' Brisbane Rugby League sides.

"He liked what we're doing here, not just on the field but what we do behind the scenes, and when he asked me would we be interested I wasn't shy in saying yes," Dylan said.

"The key element means we'll be able to cater from under 6s through to BRL A-Grade, but more to the point, our little pocket in the north-east

district will have a direct pathway all the way to the game's elite level."

The teams will comprise players who've grown from Roosters' junior ranks, former Sandgate High and St Patrick's College students, Australian service men, other BRL clubs and a Cook Islander international.

There's also an opportunity to witness two players from the Canberra Raiders system, both looking to reignite their careers. One of them, Ryan Cronin, has a well-known surname in league circles. Dolphins Intrust Super Cup players could also drop back throughout the season.


Dylan said this was basically going to be a reserve-grade competition for the Intrust Super Cup, with Dolphins coach Adam Mogg looking over the players first-hand.

"We're getting 40-plus men turning up for our training sessions and they are tearing the house down," he said.

"The support network and guidance professional entity like the Redcliffe Dolphins is able to provide us is reflecting in the attitude from juniors right through to our seniors."

The BRL will hold a three-week pre-season competition starting on 14 March. The Roosters' first game of the BRL 18-round season will be an away match against Beenleigh on 4 April.

The most important part, however, is the cause behind the event – as tickets, raffles and proceeds from food and drink sales will be going towards a bushfire organisation.


"We want to donate directly to whichever organisation is helping out the families on their rebuild," Renee said.

### April: Lloyd Spiegel acoustic blues guitarist

e's lauded as an acoustic blues master, and in a fizz of writer's creativity, a fret board wizard. But in true secular blues style, Lloyd Spiegel stands on the spirituals of social worker and truth seeker.

Q: The tag 'social worker' makes a surprising appearance in the midst of accolades including Australian Guitar Magazine's Top 50 guitarists of all time. What role does this play in your profile?

A: I've always felt like the best part of my job is connecting with people. There's no delusion of rock stardom or changing the world with me. I just figure my job is to take the eclectic group of people in front of me on a ride, get them smiling and tapping their feet. If people leave happier than when they came in, I get to know I've mostly done good in the world.

### Q: How did taking counsel from the founding fathers of modern blues deepen this understanding?

A: Since my days of working with those blues legends in the States I've been on a mission to bring blues music out of pubs and into theatrestyle settings. That's where I can really connect and break down the clichés of what people think the blues is. Blues music belongs to all of us and the most common thing I hear from first time audience members is, "I don't like blues, but I loved that!" What I hear is, "I had a preconceived idea of what blues is and I've learned a lot more tonight."

### Q: You've worked with the likes of Ray Charles, Bob Dylan and Etta James. What are they like as people?

A: It's an interesting thing to meet your heroes. The most inspiring thing is that most of those people are just who they present themselves as. When an artist of such stature is humble and kind and still enjoys music as just music, it reminds me that a great artist is ultimately still just an artist.

# Road Safety Improvements for Flinders Parade

Pedestrian safety improvements are on the agenda for Flinders Parade and intersecting streets in Sandgate, after the Brisbane City Council notified residents of proposed changes to the area and conducted a community consultation during February.

nfrastructure chair David McLachlan said Brisbane City Council is committed to ensuring people can travel around the suburbs safely.

"Council is prioritising pedestrian safety in Sandgate, with improvements to Flinders Parade including zebra crossings and pedestrian refuges to ensure residents and visitors are safe when walking to our fabulous foreshore." Mr McLachlan said.

Flinders Parade and intersecting streets in Sandgate were identified as an area in the local road network requiring improvements to enhance safety and accessibility for both motorists and pedestrians.

# The Council's Proposed Improvements Include:

- Three zebra crossings with concrete islands on Flinders Parade:
- Pedestrian refuge and associated line marking to assist pedestrians crossing Flinders Parade:
- Three speed platforms along Flinders Parade;
- Two painted threshold treatments on Flinders Parade including painted speed limit road surface markings to reinforce the speed limit;
- Yellow stopping lines to improve visibility and formalise no-parking areas;
- Upgrading and installing kerb ramps and sections of the footpath;
- . Upgrading street lighting; and
- · Turfing.

Local residents were informed of the proposed changes through a letter campaign, and were invited to provide feedback to the City Projects Team on the proposal via email or phone call up until 12 February.

"An important part of Council's work to boost safety in Sandgate is community consultation," Mr McLachlan said. "We are dedicated to continually updating residents to ensure they can share their feedback and have their say on the proposed safety improvements."

It is unknown exactly when the proposed works will begin, but Brisbane City Council assures residents they will be kept informed about the future works. The final design will need to be determined following the community consultation process, and the council will continue to notify local residents of any works as the upgrade progresses.



David O'Keeffe plays Harry, and James Reid plays Bill – both are RMT regulars that audiences love to see on stage.



# **HISTORY**

# Sandgate, a matter of time

he current Sandgate Town Hall is the second in the town, after the first one, a wooden structure in Kate Street, Shorncliffe, was burned down in 1910.

Designed by well-known architect Thomas Ramsay Hall in 1911, it was decided that the second town hall should be more centrally located on what is now Brighton Road. The builder was Mr J Gemmell, who took 11 months to complete the construction. The design was unlike others of the time. Rather than incorporating classical elements, Hall's design showed more of the 'Arts and Crafts' movement of the time.

It was constructed with a tall clock tower at the corner. However, for over 10 years after the building was finished, it was a clock tower without a clock (Several prominent residents even offered subscriptions for the purpose of purchasing a clock).

The current clock, with four faces, was cast in 1877 by Gillett and Bland's steam clock factory in Croydon, London.

Serving as a memorial to Governor Blackall, it was originally given to the residents of Ipswich; it was installed in their School of Arts building. At the time of the federation, the city fathers decided that a newer and more prominent post office clock would serve the town of Ipswich, and the clock was removed and put into storage, to be forgotten for many years.

In 1913, Mr F J Bright Snr, head of Herga & Co, a Brisbane jeweller and watchmaking company, bought the clock and stored it under his family home at Nundah, where it lay abandoned for about ten years.

Mr. Bright Snr eventually sold the clock to the Sandgate Town Council in about 1923. The clock has two 20-inch chiming bells and one 26-inch strike bell. Both the time and the bells were driven by weights and had to be wound every three days. It is now run by satellite, dramatically reducing the effort to keep it running and on time.

Mr Alan Bright Jnr helped to install the clock in June 1923, and assisted in maintenance and repairs until his retirement in 1966.

This beautiful landmark remains a focal point of the Sandgate village.

# Research before you renovate

he new year — a time for celebrating, entertaining, and making plans. House plans, that is.

De Gee Group Builders owner, Josh de Gee, said February and March were busy months for those in the building trade, with a significant increase in enquiries at this time of year. However, he said while this could be an exciting time to embark on new projects, it paid to do your research first.

"It's a bit of a catch 22," he said. "On the one hand, you don't want to go to the expense of having plans drawn up too early in the process, but on the other hand, it's really helpful to have a good idea of what you want before you meet with a builder."

Driving around the local area and looking online at properties for sale were good ways to get ideas, he said.

"It helps if people can start with a wish list," Mr de Gee said. "This should ideally include two or three things you won't budge on, and a couple of things you'd be willing to sacrifice if necessary."

Shorncliffe-based business owner, Kim Alexander of Kim Alexander Builders, said local home owners typically underestimated costs by up to 30%.

"I can't tell you how many times I see people and they've got these beautiful plans, and then you price it and they're very disappointed," Mr Alexander said.

He also stressed the importance of shopping the real estate market before embarking on renovations.

"It's worth doing, no matter your situation," he said. As well as being a useful way to source inspiration, renovators are more likely to be able to withstand the annoyances of renovating if they've ruled out selling their home first."

Mr Alexander said that once you've decided you're staying put, speak to a few builders to get different opinions and most importantly, to establish whether they're the right person for you.

"It's so important to find someone you can work well with and who's on the same wavelength," he said.

Mr de Gee said the right builder was one that you could be open and honest with from the outset. He also advised looking for a builder who was upfront about the costs involved.

"Choose wisely," he said. "Once you start working with a builder, look for a detailed breakdown on your quote to ensure you minimise any hidden costs."
