

y its very nature, the Sandgate area is a haven for creatives, musicians and artists. So it's no surprise that one of its deep musical talents, singer-songwriter Harry Phillips, has taken out one of the state's most coveted music awards.



The Billy Thorpe Scholarship is a \$10,000 grant given to one Queensland musician every year at the Queensland Music Awards, and this year Harry deservedly got the nod.

"It's a huge deal for me as momentum is a big deal when building a music career, and this win allows me to take all of the plans that I had for recording new music at the end of the year, and move them forward to now," he said.

I was actually one of the four finalists for the same award in 2018, and lost. So it was also a nice payoff for continuing to pursue the goals that I had set for myself since that time."

If you've seen Phillips play around the area, you'll know him by his patented mix of grungy Brit-pop and delicate folky tunes.

"Half of my first EP is Brit-rock, which is the style of a lot of bands that I grew up with, such as The Beatles, Oasis and The Killers," he said.

"The other half are acoustic singer-songwriter tracks styled after the likes of Jeff Buckley and Neil Finn. My second EP is more inspired by artists such as Charlie Puth and Ed Sheeran, but I've tried to keep my very earthy singer-songwriter lyrics."


Phillips - a proud Deagon resident - said he had a huge year planned, with the release of new music just around the corner.

"I am going to finish releasing my first EP Life Without Fairy Tales on 25 April, which people can find on Spotify and Apple Music. I am going to record my second EP in the very near future with the assistance of the Billy Thorpe Scholarship, so keep an eye out for that."

Despite the extraordinary times facing the world community, Phillips said he can't wait to get back to playing live once it was safe to do so.

"My favorite part of performing is looking out and seeing people really enjoying the music. I get a real buzz from that," he said.

NEW BASE FOR BAYSIDE FIRIES

he brand new and much-anticipated Bracken Ridge Fire and Rescue Station is opening soon for business – and bayside residents will be invited to have a sneak peek behind the scenes at the state-of-the-art facility.

Building of the station has been underway since April last year. The Bracken Ridge station, on Bracken Ridge Road, will respond to local fires and emergency situations in the area currently covered by the Sandgate Station in Brighton Road, Sandgate.

Member for Sandgate Stirling Hinchliffe and Queensland Fire and Emergency Services will hold a community open day at the station – a date for this event will be decided and communicated at a later date. Visitors can expect to be treated to tours through the inside of the station conducted by local Fire and Rescue crew, with a free sausage sizzle also on offer.

"I am really excited to have this new facility in our local community and to be able to share the privilege of touring the station," Mr Hinchliffe said.

"I encourage locals to take advantage of the opportunity to have your photo taken in one of the fire engines that will be stationed at the new facility."

The new multipurpose building incorporates a Technical Rescue facility, which will be staffed by four specialist technical rescue experts who will be transferred from another station.

The technical rescue facility includes an operational training facility, training rooms, a tower block for high angle rescues and a large storage area for small boats and equipment.

"With the closures to Pubs, Clubs, Restaurants and other entertainment venues that the Australian Government announced, we had no time to wallow in misery," Luci said.

"So as with all our best ideas, we were having a laugh with a beer in hand, when the idea for Winner Winner Drinks & Dinner presented itself."

Bottle shops have not been included in the closures, so all four of the couple's local bottle shop locations will be operating as usual, while still facilitating social distancing requirements. That's where the smart new concept comes in.

"But how could we combine takeaway food with our bottle shops? That's where Winner Winner Drinks & Dinner comes in." Luci said.

"Customers can call ahead and place your food order to our restaurant, which is cooked and prepared by our chefs and ready for you to pick up within 30 minutes as you pull through the Full Moon Hotel Drive-Thru Bottleshop.

Luci said the takeaway menu would include the pub's three-cheese chicken parmi, a soul warming Thai-style chicken noodle soup, salads, burgers and their famous homemade pie, to name a few.

"There are vegan and gluten free options as well, as we know that can usually be difficult to find on a takeaway menu," she said.

"It means our customers can still enjoy the Full Moon food they know and love and drinks from our bottle shop, with the convenience of a full drive-through service."

Luci said the challenges their industry faced at the moment would be a test of their resilience but they were confident the community would come together during this time.

"Businesses will need to think laterally and pivot quickly and often in order to survive," she said.

"But we wouldn't want to be doing it anywhere else — we are so thankful for our village right now."

hen the tide goes out you can see who has been swimming naked. This is a very apt allegory for our current unprecedented situation in the small business world. Here is how to make sure you are not too exposed right now and beyond this challenge.

CASH

Now is a great time to do a cash-flow projection. I call this the sleeping pill – if you know what's coming in and out of your business bank account in the coming weeks and months, you can sleep easy. Follow up on customers who owe you money NOW. Get credit NOW. You don't have to spend it, it's just there for emergencies.

Your business expenses should only have one of two purposes – to get new customers or to keep your existing customers. Reduce your unnecessary expenses, renegotiate rates and terms with suppliers wherever possible.

Keep your cash reserves protected as much as possible. Keep the big purchases for when you accelerate out of this situation.

COMMUNICATION

Communicate well, and often, to staff, customers and your supply chain. Consult with your staff – getting them to participate in a problem will

enhance their ownership of the solution. Be open and honest. Be vulnerable. But also be a leader who will guide everyone out of this situation. If you don't communicate often, you risk stoking the rumour mill, which – just like a virus – spreads rapidly and causes untold damage.

Tell your customers what controls you've put in place. These controls are for their health and safety, as well as for your staff. Get their participation in it – everyone is in this situation together.

CONTINUITY

Look to the future. In particular, how can you accelerate your business once this crisis is over (or beforehand)? What can you plan for, can you produce different goods and services, can you find a new and different niche? Remember that there will be holes in the market for goods that have been exported up until now. Can you produce a similar product locally?

Can you up-skill your workers now? Online courses and training will be a great way of keeping staff busy and doing meaningful work.

Take this time to critically review all your business operations. How can you do things better, more efficiently, smarter? Can you look at investing in technology to streamline processes?

LEST WE FORGET

or the first time since 1919, Anzac Day commemorations have been cancelled. Back then, it was the Spanish Flu which forced people to stay home and in 2020 it's another pandemic that has halted our national day of remembrance.

Due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 virus, all Anzac Day services and marches in Australia have been called off. Due to the ongoing travel ban, services traditionally held around the world, including at Gallipoli and on the Western Front, will also not go ahead.

Federal Minister for Veterans Affairs and Defence Darren Chester said it was a "regrettable decision".

"A lot of our veterans are approaching 95 or 100 years of age and we didn't want to expose them to those conditions," he said.

It's been 105 years since young men from Australia and New Zealand stormed the beaches at Gallipoli, and despite changes to this year's commemorations, their service has not been forgotten.

The national service in Canberra will still go ahead despite being closed to the public and it will still be televised.

An idea that has taken hold on social media has called for Australians to stand at the end of their driveways, or on their balconies or verandahs at 6am on Saturday, 25 April for a minute's silence.

RSL Queensland state president Tony Ferris said his organisation had endorsed this idea. "We agree it's a brilliant way to collectively honour the dedication, commitment and sacrifice of our service people," he said.

Crowds had been growing in recent years at Anzac Day services, with the 9am Sandgate service regularly attracting up to 4000 people.

A post on the Sandgate RSL Sub Branch Facebook page said, "In line with government and the Federal Chief Health Officers' direction, we regret to inform that the traditional Anzac Day Dawn Service and March in Sandgate are cancelled due to the Coronavirus public health emergency.

"The Sandgate RSL Sub Branch is currently working on alternatives for our members and community to commemorate this important day."



"I have studied visual art at the Queensland Technical College – now QUT – and a full-time course at TAFE and other private courses," Jim said.

Jim is the frontman for the Sonics, a local music group who played popular Brisbane venues such as Cloudland in the 1960s. They now play the 'Rock Under the Clock' shows at the Sandgate Town Hall.

He has been interested in art his entire life, after visiting many galleries locally and globally.

"Australian artists that have influenced my work are William Robinson and William Delafield Cook," Jim said.

"My favourite overseas artist would be Monet and his waterlilies paintings."

Jim specialises in painting landscapes he has encountered through his extensive travel in Australia and overseas

"Really it's my first solo exhibition, which will show some of my work from the last few years," he said.

"[The exhibition] will feature my recent series on the High Country, Kosciusko and Tasmania, and my current work on depicting the rainforest.

Jim paints in a studio separate from his house and works there most afternoons accompanied by his favourite music.

He enjoys creating hidden details in his paintings for the viewer to discover.

"I am a representational painter, and love painting highly detailed images, which allow the viewer to discover secret places within the work and then to carry these images with them when they are exploring the natural landscape for themselves," Jim said.





BLUEWATER **FESTIVAL POSTPONED**

he famous Bluewater Festival, one of the brightest jewels in the bayside community's crown, has postponed until later in 2020.

The Sandgate and Districts Chamber of Commerce reluctantly announced the postponement from its iconic Good Friday slot to an undecided date in September, in light of the rapid spread of COVID-19 worldwide.

Chamber of Commerce president Bill Gollan said the association was working with the organisers of the also cancelled 2020 Brisbane to Gladstone Yacht Race, an event that usually runs alongside the Bluewater Festival, to secure a date.

"As a Chamber of Commerce, we're very mindful of the fact that the festival is not just a community event, but it's about supporting small businesses and family businesses," Bill said. "We need to do something for them.

"From the people who run the stalls, the rides, the food trucks, even the people who clean the toilets - they're all small businesses. The artists, the entertainers they're all people who work for themselves."

Bill said he urged people in the meantime to continue to support their local businesses wherever possible in the current extremely challenging economic climate.

"Support your local small business; buy local," he said. "That's something we can do as a community to help each other."

The Shorncliffe escarpment is an outstanding natural feature.

t is the only elevated area in all of north Brisbane that provides views of Moreton Bay. Fringed by Lovers Walk at the bottom and heritage homes around the top, it offers one of the loveliest walks in our city.

Keep Sandgate Beautiful Association (KSBA) is planning a public forum on the Shorncliffe escarpment in the Sandgate Town Hall. A date and time will be advertised once public gathering restrictions are lifted.

Discussion will revolve around Brisbane City Council's development of a management plan for the escarpment. Council will soon release their draft management plan summary for public comment.


"What we have learnt from the Sandgate Neighbourhood Plan, currently underway, is that Council has a well-structured process for public consultation," said KSBA president Linda McMahon. Unfortunately, with that project, the community was not well prepared and many found the early stage of the process frustrating or unsatisfactory. There is nothing necessarily wrong with the process, just that the community needs to be better organised in order to mesh well with the council side of it."

Council met with members of the public and sought written submissions on the escarpment in mid-2019. "KSBA made a major submission and will be using that as the springboard for a discussion on the escarpment," Linda said.

Speakers will include president of the Sandgate Chamber of Commerce Bill Gollan and the local councillor, and will be followed by a panel discussion. The objective is to allow everyone to be better prepared to respond to the next stage of consultation when council's draft is released.

ince its arrival on Sandgate's high street a few short years ago, Viet Street Eat has become a class local favourite for bayside foodies. Curiosity piqued diners' interest as soon as the bold signage for the restaurant went up in September 2016. Owner Jennifer Chang said there had been a steady flow of locals ever since who consider the deliciously fresh Vietnamese cuisine a weekly tradition.

"The feedback over the years has been overwhelmingly positive, and it's been really supportive from the Sandgate community," Jennifer said.

That strong support from Sandgate diners has seen the restaurant give back to the community in its own way.

"We offer a destination to keep people eating local, and we send our scraps to Green P Farm for compost and our bottles and cans to raise money for their efforts," Jennifer said.

"We also cater for Sandbag twice a year. We buy bread from the local bakery, prawns from Lucinda Bay and vegetables from Lawnton. We also hire local as well."

It's that firm focus on local tastes, local produce and helping the community that has helped set up a strong base of customers that come for the food, but stay for the service.

"Hopefully people find it relaxed and friendly, and they also have a little music and our street art to admire," Jennifer said.

"We serve generous, tasty meals and there's no rush to finish. We are also the only Vietnamese in Sandgate, and we are MSG-free and offer vegan, dairy-free, gluten-free and nut-free dishes.


"We are also hoping to branch out a little into some side products – different specials not on the regular menu like Laksa and house-made curry puffs."

lmost 100 years ago, a grand new billiard saloon was opened in Rainbow Street. Sandgate. Today, decades of lying under thick layers of paint and housing numerous tenants, the charming art nouveau building is set to become a new landmark, with a recent refurbishment bringing it spectacularly back to life.

Under the careful watch of new owner Ricky Ricardo, the building near the Sandgate train station has been restored as closely as possible to its original design and character - with a few necessary modern twists, including a private walled outdoor courtyard space.

Sandblasting the bright blue paint, which covered the entire building, revealed the original red bricks. One of the most impressive features was also discovered - the art nouveau reddish-brown tiles and floral feature tiles on the shopfront.

It's been a labour of love for Ricky, a former fashion agent with a passion for old architecture, who describes Sandgate as "the most beautiful suburb in Brisbane".

Supplying historical detail to the project was Sandgate Historical Society and Museum president Pam Verney, whose grandfather Charlie Verney built the building in 1922. Pam, who describes the restoration as "very exciting", grew up in the house across the road (now the bait and tackle shop) and her father was one of the managers at the billiard hall.

"It was very much a men's place," Pam said.

"In the front part of the billiard room there was a milk bar. So at interval from the picture theatre across the road, the clients would come across and buy milkshakes and whatnot. I used to go and serve in the café."

While Ricky said he was "slightly crazy" to have taken on such an intricate project, he said he hoped the interest it created would spark others to undertake similar projects and draw more people to the area.

He said while the 'new' venue would lend itself perfectly to a boutique wine bar or microbrewery, the future tenants were unknown as yet.

"I don't want to say what it will end up [as], because I don't know," he said.

"As long as it is someone who appreciates it."

Sandgate Scout Hall: Where Community is Recognised

he Sandgate Scout Hall turns 93 this year - and its long history is testament to the value of community spirit. Since opening on 19 September 1927, the Sandgate Scout Hall has become a regular meeting place for community groups and families.

Sandgate Scout Hall coordinator Kylie Bevan said that the hall had regular group bookings that helped bring a sense of community to the Sandgate area.

"We currently have regular bookings by the Christian Church of Samoa, North Brisbane Irish Set Dancing, Toshi Boei Karate-Do, and COMBI Enterprises," Kylie said.

The groups are booked across the week, keeping the hall busy and the people energetic in this little corner of Sandgate. From dance movement therapy to Irish set dancing and street smart martial arts, the Sandgate Scout Hall has helped to provide a safe space for activities since its opening day.

Before a deal was made in 1926, the School of Arts was booked each Friday night for those who participated in the boy scouts, as they waited for the hall to be built. Constructed in 1927 for just \$800, the scout hall was moved in the early 1950s, as an extension was to be added.

Sandgate Hall historian, Lloyd Atkins, said these renovations were mostly volunteer work. "All of the work was mainly done by volunteer labour, primarily the Rover Crew at the time," he said.

Other reconstructions were made to the hall by the Brisbane City Council, so it could become a more inclusive structure."[The improvements] involved the construction of the ramp at the side door, and the assembly of the upstairs toilet," Lloyd said.

Not only has the Sandgate Scout Hall been used for group activities, but in more recent times, as a temporary meeting place for the Town Hall embassy.

The Sandgate Scout Hall is available for regular hire for families and groups for \$22 per hour, or \$55 per three-hour

my gratitude and love for the overwhelming response," she said. "From people offering their own stock from their pantries, to people buying me products when they did their shopping. The local community has rallied together to help a small local business in need. From my family to yours, thank you from the bottom of my heart."

SOMETHING FISHY AT DOWSE LAGOON

Some weeks ago local residents noticed that hundreds of eels and fish had died in Dowse Lagoon. Concerned residents were worried about the smell and the impacts on the environment.

Deagon Ward Councillor Jared Cassidy took those concerns to council.

"I was told by council that it was more than likely related to the large inflow of water after the recent rains, covering vegetation and causing it to rot, causing the smell and the lack of oxygen in the water for the fish," he said.

"Council's Field Services Environmental Officer has attended and field analysis has indicated that the 'dissolved oxygen' levels are not sufficient to sustain fish species," Jared said.

"Additional water samples are planned by the Field Services Environmental Officer and the State Government Environmental Agency has been notified of the incident.

"I will continue to keep you posted."

NEW PARENTING GROUP

A new parenting group called, It Takes a Village -Holistic Parents Community Brisbane, has started up in the 4017.

Led by local naturopath Cherie Gorringe, the group has a Facebook page and also meets regularly to discuss parenting issues and help young parents.

The club's head trainer Andrew Robertson said he wanted everyone to just pay as they go.

We had a family come along and watch for about fifteen or twenty minutes, liked what they saw and came back and joined in with that first lesson being free," Andrew said.

The club has an increasing participation and there's currently one amateur Muay Thai kickboxer, John Campbell, training at the club.

In Muay Thai, they have what is called clinching. This is where they can grasp their opponent, throw elbows and knee them as often as they want. Whereas K1 kickboxing they can grasp, knee and elbow once or twice before being separated.

Andrew's equipped with ten years professional fighting experience, three of those years fighting in Thailand under the fight name 'Spinning Dragon'. He had several bouts televised over there, and also won World Championship silver medal before retiring in November last year.

But these credentials are not what sets this club out from the others. Andrew has a vision of one day having his own premises, where he could make a difference mentoring the area's youth.

Andrew said once he retired from fighting it was his burning desire to pass on his knowledge to other people.

"In the future, I hope to work with troubled youth and the reason why is, I was heading in the wrong direction when I was younger, but was able to get into martial arts and find my way out."

"At the moment I work with Amayda, which runs anti-bullying through the schools systems in which I'm currently a mentor, where I also get through them Government approved training," Andrew said.

The club runs classes for males and females, aged eight to adult every Monday, Thursday and Friday at Bracken Ridge Community Hall. There's circuit fitness training for early arrivals from 5pm and then into the skills sets from 5.30pm.

ome of the biggest names in music around the world started out busking; think of current Australian global superstar Toni Watson (a.k.a. 'Tones and I'), Tracy Chapman and even Ed Sheeran.

In fact, busking could be viewed as one of the purest forms of art. It's direct, personal, creative and expressive. Street performers have been a part of human society for millennia, making us laugh, cry, smile or sing along; and their value as a proving ground for aspiring musicians is huge.

Nathan Edgell is one of the founding members of the planning team that organises the Toowoomba Busking Festival, which usually happens in April and is now in its third year. "The festival gets better each year," said Nathan. "Last year we had over 80 different performers; some were locals and others travelled from all over Queensland, as well as from interstate to be a part of it.

"We see part of our role as championing artists in the town; doing our bit to support our growing artistic, musical and creative scene," Nathan said. But it's not just Toowoomba. Buskers are dotted around streets and shopping areas in every city and most towns, and provide great value entertainment to enhance any otherwise mundane day.

Currently there are at least eight busking festivals held every year in Australia and New Zealand, including the Belgrave Buskers Festival in Victoria, the Busker National Folk Festival in Canberra and the World Busker Festival in Christchurch.

Nathan attributes the success of the Toowoomba Busking Festival to a few things. "Everybody loves to see great entertainment, whether it's on the street or in a venue. We aim to provide an environment for buskers where it's more about enjoying the performance than winning any prize, so everybody wins."

The superstars and singers that we love all started out somewhere, so the next time you are out and about, seek out the areas where street performers play and enjoy some (almost) free entertainment. Remember, just a few dollars from your pocket encourages a beautiful tradition of public performance.





CENTROPUS PHASIANINUS

Some birds capture our attention on account of their colourful plumage, graceful forms, enchanting voices, or agility in the air. But Pheasant Coucals are just plain strange. Although only the size of a small chicken, their prehistoric appearance and unusual habits certainly inspire curiosity.

ven their voice is peculiar. In summer ■ you may hear a low deep "boop boop ■ boop" call, while in winter they make sharp hissing sounds.

Primarily ground dwelling birds, their lack of grace in the air is to be expected. Their manner of walking is quite reptilian, with movements more like a fat lizard than a bird. Clumsiness in flight and a seeming lack of concern with being observed, makes you question how they became an evolutionary success; they appear to be such easy prey.

They are undoubtedly survivors though, distributed widely over northern Australia and preferring habitats with dense lower vegetation. In Queensland, they have found sugar cane fields to make ideal homes, with rich supplies of insects and amphibians, and good shelter for nest-building.

The cuckoo family, to which they belong, are well known for the practice of laying eggs in the nests of other bird species. This behaviour is called brood parasitism, and offers massive time

and energy saving benefits. Pheasant Coucals however, are the only cuckoos in Australia who care for their own young.

A loose bowl-shaped nest is made of leaves, twigs, and grasses. The highest reaching pieces are sometimes pulled together to form a canopy, reminiscent of the constructions made by Satin Bowerbirds.

The chicks, once fledged, are among the strangest young birds you are likely to seestumpy, with a big head and beak, and covered in short coarse black feathers, with long white wispy strands protruding from their crown.

Pheasant Coucals can still be spotted (or heard) regularly in our suburbs, particularly where there are patches of shrubby undergrowth and long grass. In Sandgate, they are often seen around Dowse Lagoon and Peace Park.

Spring and summer sees them sporting their breeding plumage of mainly black feathers. They are on the move and more likely to be seen passing through backyards. Enjoy your encounters and marvel at one of nature's true oddities.




