Reinvented CIUB ABOON FOR LOCALJOBS

After closing its doors to the public in 2018, the much-loved old Club Sandgate building is now midway through a stunning transformation that will see it brought back to life for 4017 residents.

he venue — which is now owned by Michael Maguire and will be operated by licensee the Kedron-Wavell Services Club — will be nearly unrecognisable in its new skin with considerable renovations transforming it into a modern, family-oriented club.

Kedron-Wavell Services Club general manager Lyndon Broome said the club's renovation was well underway, with plans to open to the public later this year.

"The Sandgate RSL was always on our mind, as we know the value that community clubs can deliver for their people," he said.

"We are completing a full refurbishment of the whole building and everything will be brand new, including the exciting installation of a new lift that will reposition the entry back to the main door.

"The new facility will incorporate two dining areas, one being a family-style bistro and the other being a table service restaurant."

Broome said the local community had been eager to know when the doors to the new venue would

open, with the old Sandgate RSL Club being a favourite with members and the public alike.

"It has been amazing as everyone we talk to either has an amazing story to share about a memory from the club from many years ago or are simply excited to have 'their' Club back in Sandgate," he said.

"Clubs are an important part of the social makeup of any local community, and this club will provide a safe and friendly location for all to meet and feel included."

The punters aren't the only ones who will benefit. The new club will provide a raft of employment opportunities for locals to take advantage of – especially salient at a time of economic uncertainty.

"The club will employ between 40 and 60 staff with most of these being sourced locally. We will also be implementing school-based trainees," he said.

"We love how much the people of Sandgate love Sandgate, and we can't wait to become a part of the fabric of this community once again."



Free Fall sees Oh Bailey rise to the top

ith waves of dreamy synth-pop coated in luscious bass keys and textured, layered vocals, Shorncliffe songstress Jess Elliott — better known by her stage name Oh Bailey — has found her feet in the music world at the strangest of times.

The 22-year-old music student was buoyed when her single Free Fall — a stunning, surreal track that washes and swirls slow-wave synth and keys below Jess's indie-chanteuse vocals — made it to number nine on Triple J's Unearthed charts, and made it all the way to number three on the Unearthed pop charts.

She said it was an incredible way to start her recording career.

"So I released Free Fall to Triple J Unearthed in December 2019, before I had begun working with my now manager Ellie Vane-Tempest," Jess said.

"She really inspired and encouraged me to promote myself, who I am, and my music to the world. And it worked!

"I have been blown away by the support and love for the track. I'm super grateful for that."

While Jess said she was yet to play a show in her native Sandgate community thanks to the coronavirus pandemic, she has kept busy by organising and playing festivals online.

"I'm hoping once venues open up again, that I'll have the opportunity to perform at venues like Mr Henderson or Cardigan Bar," she said.


"While COVID-19 is around, I won't have any shows in venues but I've recently held an online music festival called Cabin Fever with several other artists from JMC Academy [where Jess studies], which was a big success. I'm currently in the planning stage of having a second online festival which you will be able to watch via my Instagram."

When Jess does get the opportunity to get back on stage, you can expect a plethora of smooth, synth-heavy tracks that float close to the feel of her influences.

"I'm influenced by a whole bunch of artists, such as The 1975, The Japanese House and Maggie Rogers, which has steered me into making music in the synth/dream pop genre," she said.

"I love making and listening to music with beautiful synth melodies, unique vocals and guitar, which is something I try to apply to my music when I'm creating."

"In the future we hope to offer model kits build days, back to basics in model building, advanced classes in diorama and scenic work, as well as airbrush and painting tutorials."



New COVID-19 Counselling Line Launched

A new counselling and support phone line is available to help people being adversely impacted by COVID-19 and the community changes introduced to help stop the spread of the virus.

Community organisation SANDBAG, in partnership with the Queensland University of Technology Counselling and Psychology Clinic and supported by the Lord Mayor Charitable Trust, began operating the support line in

Called SANDBAG Connect. counsellors can be reached 1-800-SANDBAG (1800 726 322). The service offers dedicated counselling, support and connection to other resources and is available Tuesday to Friday, 9.30am to 4.30pm, for adults over the age of 18, living in the Brisbane North area.

SANDBAG's counselling services Kvlie manager Heenan said SANDBAG had identified a rise in the number of community members expressing feelings of uncertainty and distress related to COVID-19 and the associated changes around social distancing, employment and caring for children at home full-time.

"This is exacerbated for those with preexisting mental health vulnerabilities experiencing those conflict," Kylie said. "We anticipate even as social distancing measures ease, the social, emotional and economic ramifications will persist and potentially grow in prevalence over the coming year, which requires a supportive response."

NEW TRAINING GROUND FOR WHISKEY'S WISH INC

Next month don't be surprised if you're passing by the Sandgate RSL Sub-Branch on Burnett Place and see a flurry of service dog training activity.

The Sandgate RSL Sub-Branch has invited not for profit charity, Whiskey's Wish Inc, to use its grounds for their service dog training.

Whiskey's Wish Inc provides veterans, first responders and correctional officers with customised programs for participants to train their dogs for rehabilitation purposes. The charity, which has been running since 2014, trains dogs to help their owners with mobility issues, post-traumatic stress or mental health disorders, or service-related injuries such as deafness, blindness, brain injuries or social withdrawal.

The organisation hosts training sessions Australiawide but was delighted to have received the invitation from the Sandgate RSL to utilise their grounds as an additional training area.

Whiskey Wish Inc's community engagement officer Simone Fleming said it was a very generous offer, which the local organisation was delighted to be taking up.

"The Sandgate RSL grounds and surrounding areas are perfect for dog training with the location close to Sandgate's shopping area and Einbunpin Lagoon Park. This provides us

with an opportunity to diversify our training for our recipients and provide 'proofing' training for their dogs," she said.

Proofing training ensures dogs can maintain focus on the person they are with, despite any distractions such as noise, crowds or children.

The training of service dogs takes anywhere between 18 months and two years, and Whiskey's Wish Inc works with members and their own dogs. As part of the course, participants are required to complete training logs and are provided with a range of rehabilitation support services.

While there are criteria for the preferred age, weight and size for service dogs, the organisation has trained dogs from a wide variety of breeds to become successful service and rehabilitation companions for their owners.

Whiskey's Wish Inc's once-monthly training sessions at their new Sandgate location are expected to commence mid to late-July, pending COVID-19 restrictions being scaled back.



As the cooler months set in, Council is currently undertaking a brazier and fire pit heating trial. From 1 June to 31 August residents are allowed small outdoor fires for heating purposes in braziers or constructed fire pits off the ground with proper aeration of the

fire. If having a fire during this period, please see my website for guidelines and fact sheets. It's also courteous to talk to your neighbours beforehand. Council will continue to investigate complaints during this period and our 24-hour contact centre remains available on 3403 8888.

Council's Free Native Plants program is again underway, meaning Brisbane ratepayers, Housing Commission and Defence Housing residents are eligible to claim two free native plants (per financial year). To receive a free trees voucher, residents can present a current paid rates notice, or evidence of a recent rental payment for housing commission and defence housing residents, at a Council office, library or Ward Office.

As COVID-19 restrictions have been lifting, many of our Council facilities have reopened or started operating in different capacities. Council's Active and Healthy programs have also resumed with capped numbers and social distancing guidelines in place.

or the first time in its 29-year history, the Einbunpin Festival is going virtual in 2020.

Councillor for Deagon Ward Jared Cassidy said the event has a rich history and is well known in the local community for being a free familyfriendly event. Recent circumstances, however, have meant the festival is not able to go ahead as usual.

"As chairperson of the Einbunpin Festival Committee, I had to make the difficult decision to cancel this year's Einbunpin Festival due to COVID-19 restrictions", Cr Cassidy said.

The festival is one of the biggest fundraising events of the year for many community groups, schools, sporting clubs and local businesses. So rather than cancel the festival entirely, the decision was made to continue in a virtual format.

"I have reached out to stallholders and invited them to contact my office if they are interested in participating and a number of groups have already signed up", Cr Cassidy said.

advertise products they sell or services they offer. This could be in the form of fundraising raffles or online promotions. Some groups are already looking ahead to how they can get involved.

"We love the festival and sharing the community history with the locals — our "show and tell" objects are always popular," Sandgate Museum president Pam Verney said.

"Come and dance with Jazzercise Sandgate — a fun, effective fitness program that fuses dance-based cardio with strength training and stretching for a whole-body workout," Cindy Sherf from Jazzercise Sandgate said.

School children won't miss out either. The Einbunpin Festival colouring in competition will still go ahead. Entries have been delivered to local schools and winners will be announced at the end of the month.

While the virtual event will be a great way to keep the Einbunpin Festival spirit alive, it's only a temporary measure to see through the current restrictions.

"Next year will be our 30th Festival so we're looking forward to celebrating this significant milestone in the traditional fashion," Cr Cassidy said.

The virtual festival will take place throughout July on the Einbunpin Festival Facebook page.

Anita said she is passionate about getting the message of the book out into the world, so she can make women feel better about themselves.


"Every person I've spoken to has said how necessary the message of my book is now," she said.



"My nuclear family [husband Andrew, and four daughters aged four to 20] came to Sandgate in 2012. We moved here from Papua New Guinea because my husband got a regional job as a lawyer in the Pacific, and the regional office was in Brisbane. We chose Sandgate because his mother grew up here and we thought it might be a nice place for our children to grow up.

We're originally from Papua New Guinea (PNG). Both of us are each half Papua New Guinean and half Australian in heritage. I'm now a dual Australian and PNG citizen — I became an Australian citizen in 2017.

Right now, I'm studying fashion design. I can only manage to do it part-time because I have four girls. One of those girls is 20 years old, and the other three are under 12, so it's pretty busy.


I've always wanted to do it [fashion design], but I've probably never had the confidence to do it before this. One of the things that gave me that confidence was watching my children grow into women, and trying to develop their confidence, shows me the need to do that myself.

I want to work with artisans to bring bilums [a PNG bag with a unique weave] to the world in a fashionable way, but also an ethical way, that doesn't exploit the artisans who make them. The bilum is quite an incredible artefact.

There are so many things to love about Sandgate. In the short time we've been here, we've made the kind of friends that you have for life. I think part of the reason is because generally, Sandgate is such a beautiful place that it attracts a certain type of person. There is a community feel in Sandgate that you don't get in every suburb.

I love living walking distance from the beach—that's one of the best things about it. I think the other thing about living here, for me personally, is that because I'm interested in art and design, living in a place where we have just so much natural beauty, I can go out any day of the week and find something beautiful to focus on, in terms of design. It's so abundant. It's an artist's paradise really."

tirling Hinchliffe MP, Councillor Jared Cassidy and Anika Wells MP recently hosted a virtual mobile office to answer questions from locals regarding COVID-19 and how it's affecting them. The trio went live on Facebook to answer questions from 4017 residents.

Q: Why did the local government elections in March go ahead, and will the state election be going ahead?

STIRLING: The decision to have the local government elections go ahead in March was made on advice of the Chief Health Officer, Dr Jeannette Young, and was very much based upon one, the need to have continuity in local government in responding to the pandemic, but also having taken into account the measures put in place to ensure the election could be conducted in such a way which didn't result in a spike in COVID-19 cases.

I'm pleased to say the period beyond the election (the pre-polling period and election day itself) there was no evidence of a spike as a consequence of the election being held.

The other issue which had been raised online was how things are going to work for a state election coming up later in the year. What I can say is all avenues and all opinions are being considered and looked at.

In fact, the government's advice is a full postal vote is possible if it is determined as the right way forward. That's a decision which has to ultimately be made on the basis of the public health advice at the time.

Q: What is going to happen when JobSeeker stops?

ANIKA: You should know as your local member I have called for the rate of Newstart to be raised. in Parliament back in February. We have been a #raisetherate campaign since then. My view is the Newstart rate of about \$40 a day wasn't enough, and we shouldn't go back to that

figure. Where we land between that figure and the current figure is yet to be seen because at the moment there are too many unknowns. The government itself doesn't seem to have settled its position yet. If you or someone you know experience hardship while being on Newstart, please get in touch with my office.

Q: How has COVID-19 affected the Council?

JARED: A lot of Council's facilities and services have been affected of course. Facilities like our pools, gyms, outdoor exercise equipment whether they be basketball courts, netball courts, hit up walls or playgrounds were all closed based on the health advice. Also, a lot of the face-toface interactions you normally have with Council whether it's regional business centres, our libraries, city hall, are closed to the public at the

Dumps are open and tip vouchers are still available from my office if you didn't receive them in your rates notice. Just phone or email ahead and we will arrange that for you.

I have been getting a lot of guestions about kerbside collections. The advice from Council is they have been postponed from 3 April until further notice.

Another one which has been coming up a bit is the Council's Immunisation Clinic. The question I had is, "Is my elderly mother eligible for a free flu vaccine through the Council's Immunisation Clinic?".

If you are in the following eligible groups: children aged 6 months - 4 years old, pregnant women at any stage of pregnancy, all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People aged 6 months and over, all adults aged 65 years and over, and any individual aged over 6 months with a disposition towards severe influenza.

Q: How have school kids been impacted?

STIRLING: This is something I have been speaking to a lot of people about. I took the opportunity to speak to as many of our local principals as possible and they have given me really good feedback. It was a difficult time, no question. I had experiences of it with my own year 9 at home but it was a learning process for everyone involved. At-home learning was the best option to limit community transmission at the time (nearly all students are back).

Q: Will roads be adapted for roads and pedestrians to accommodate social distancing?

JARED: Some cities around the world have adapted to our new normal very quickly. COVID-19 aside, this is an interesting discussion about how we use road space and public space. This really could be a catalyst about how we think about planning our open spaces in future planning. What we have seen about all the battles to maintain public green spaces over the last 30 years has been particularly worth it at the moment. It is certainly worth adapting how we use public spaces coming out of COVID-19.

Q: How many COVID-19 cases have there been in 4017?

STIRLING: We get the details for the Metro-North Area but not for our local area and we do not have those details. Metro-North is the largest health and hospital service area in the state in terms of population. No concerns about hot spots in our local area.

Q: Financial hardship?

(See Anika's comments on JobSeeker and Newstart for Federal Assistance).

JARED: Council rates for the first quarter have been delivered. If you are facing financial difficulty and need assistance with your rates, get in contact with my office or directly with Council. There are a number of things including payment plans and deferred payments for up to 9 months and interest won't be applied from April to those deferrals. Any rate recovery currently going on or otherwise has ceased.

STIRLING: One of the other things which doesn't go away is your utilities bill. The Queensland Government is providing a \$200 rebate on everyone's household electricity bill. In order to be compensated for electricity and watering costs. Electricity bills are the most effective way of delivering this rebate.

Q: Support for mental health services?

ANIKA: Beyond Blue has experienced a 40% spike in requests and Lifeline was saying they have had more requests in the first month of the pandemic than across the calendar year. So, we did have a win where we got Telehealth put on as a Medicare item so you can now access a telephone appointment with your GP.

ne of the better tasting fish we pull out of Moreton Bay is the Longtail Tuna, formally known as Northern Bluefin Tuna.

Caught from between northern NSW right around the top of Australia to WA, these fish are great speedsters when hooked, and never give up fighting all the way to the boat. They have been responsible for many sore arms and backs after a drawn-out fight.

Growing to just over one meter and up to 25kg, we rarely take more than one fish home to eat. Most fish we catch are a bit over 10kg.

They can be caught by trolling lures or sight casting. My preferred method is live bait on the surface or just below. They are very frustrating to chase around when they are surface feeding, trying to get close enough to throw lures at them without spooking them. This is why I prefer the method of live baiting around the

general area where I have seen them, or where I have seen birds working and drifting into them.



A few weeks ago, News Corp announced up to 76 newspapers run by the company would be switching to digital-only editions, with 14 including the Chronicle/Star, newspapers, disappearing altogether.

Executive chairman Michael Miller was quoted as saying that News Corp's city-based papers would now "double down" on their state focus, with increased regional content.

The Bayside Star was first published in 1987 and the Northside Chronicle was first published in 1985. The two papers were combined into one edition in recent years.



Make sure you take advantage of all the COVID-19 stimulus measures.



I suggest talking to your accountant about your tax position, wealth position, and estate planning as you head into the next financial year.





HISTORY



Our Very Own Bushranger!

he Wild Scotsman (or Scotchman), last seen in Bracken Ridge. James Alpin McPherson was a legend and anti-hero in the 19th century.

Born in Inverness, Scotland in 1842, his family sailed for Australia and arrived at Moreton Bay in January 1855. His father, John, bought 93 acres in Bracken Ridge in 1862, producing potatoes and maize, and raising cattle.

James went to school in Ipswich. Talented in languages, he was known to be a very entertaining speaker. After a stint at trade school, he ran away in 1863, getting work at various stations. As with, it seems, everything he did, he became an accomplished horseman and an accurate shot.

In March 1864, he took up with two other robbers to hold up a public house near Bowen. They escaped with three cabbage-tree hats, two pairs of pants, a pair of boots, a gun, a Crimean shirt, a bottle of whiskey and 14 lbs of flour.

The government put a 50-pound price on his head.

James headed to NSW, hoping to take up with infamous bushrangers Ben Hall, Frank Gardiner, John Gilbert and John Dunn. It is alleged that he committed several robberies on the way. He used several aliases and newspapers reported him as John Bruce, Mar, Kerr and Scottie.

He was eventually apprehended for the Bowen heist, but escaped, stole a horse and continued his nefarious activities, mainly holding up stagecoaches. He must have had a sense of humour, because he sent 1700 pounds worth of cheques and money orders to the governor of Queensland, Sir George Bowen, saying in his letter that he had no need of them. The reward for his arrest went up to 250 pounds.

Eventually recaptured in 1866 by local citizens at Gin Gin, the court found him not guilty of the hold up of the pub, as the police officer involved, Sir Frederick Pottinger, had died before he could give evidence. But he was then taken to Maryborough to face charges of robbing the mails. He was found guilty and sentenced to 25 years at St Helena Island in Moreton Bay.

While on St Helena he was shot in the wrist while trying to escape with six others. There he remained until his sentence was remitted in December 1874. At the instigation of the Rev. B.G. Wilson, a group of citizens raised a petition for clemency to release him.

James eventually married, had six children with his wife, Elizabeth, and died falling off a horse in August 1895.

Each year, on the third weekend of March, Gin Gin holds a "Wild Scotsman Festival" to commemorate McPherson's capture by the locals in 1866.




