

andgate naturopath Sommer Watts and seamstress Jade Ashton have teamed up to help the local community stay safe and look good at the same time.

As the COVID-19 pandemic continues, the local duo has started manufacturing reusable face masks and, according to Sommer, there's plenty of demand.

"Our masks are reusable, they have three layers as advised by the chief health officer and they're fully washable," she said.

"The ear loops are made from soft elastic and they're very comfortable.

"They also have a nose wire, meaning they can be moulded to the shape of your face. The nose wire provides a better fit and also, if you wear glasses, this will stop them fogging up."

Sommer, who runs Health By Design Co, said she approached Jade, owner of She Is Known to Sew, to help with the project, as she knew the quality of Jade's work.

"Jade has worked for Opera Queensland and Queensland Ballet as a seamstress, as well as with fashion designers Sasha Drake and Easton Pearson," she said.

"She has an industrial sewing machine and these masks are commercial quality.

"With everything that's happened in Victoria and then we see what's happening in NSW, this virus is going to be here to stay for a while.

"We want people to want to wear masks for their health and if we can make it a fashion statement, that's great as well.

"The masks are really beautiful. We hand select the fabric ourselves, and there's something for everyone."

Sommer said the masks were "art and medicine coming together in the best way possible".

"The medical advice is, if you can't social distance, wearing a mask is the best way to protect yourself and others – as well as washing your hands," she said.

"Jade and I are just very proud of putting out a quality, Australian-made product."

The masks come in three different sizes – small, medium and large, to suit children, teenagers and adults.



But for Gillian Sheehan, owner of Sandgate's latest store Oak and Ave, that's exactly what happened.

"I'm really known for my timing," she laughed.

Gillian has a background in fashion, and formerly owned a studio in Paddington, where she designed boutique clothes mainly for the Irish market.

After the GFC, she began helping her husband Marty Steel in his building business, offering home styling for his clients.

Keeping it all in the family was top of Gillian's mind when she opened Oak and Ave on 26 March this year.

"We make all the furniture here ourselves," she said.

"My husband is also a portrait artist – he came second place in the last Bald Archies [a national art competition] – and his work is for sale in the shop.

"We stock local as much as we can, or we make it ourselves. Even the candles – I make those. We just had a collaboration with local ceramicist Billie Wood to make a range of mugs and saucers." Oak and Ave also specialises in textiles, with cushions handmade in Marrakesh from vintage rugs.

"No two pieces are the same," Gillian said.

Gillian's fashion designing days are not yet behind her, with plans to launch a clothing collection before the end of the year.

"The clothing collection is taking a little longer – it's something I used to do full time and now I'm working it around the shop, but it will be on the shop floor before Christmas," she said.

"It's a women's wear range, casual but can be dressed up; a range of skirts and dresses, made from natural fibres, with injections of colour."

Gillian said she had been delighted by the welcome the store had received from the community.

"The feedback we're getting is that this is very fresh and new; there's lots of colour here, but it's not overwhelming with clutter and colour," she said.

"I personally like black and white with pops of colour, so the shop is very me."

Oak and Ave is located on Rainbow Street, Shorncliffe, next door to the Wired Owl Café. It is open from Wednesdays to Sundays.



f your dog has had a "ruff" time, help is at hand with natural massage and Bowen therapy. Faye Dabrowski, who moved to Bracken Ridge from Melbourne last year, is offering treatment through her pet practice, Sit Stay Heal.

"Bowen therapy is a gentle touch therapy, it restores connective tissue, reducing pain and releasing pressure in the dog's muscles and nerves," Faye said.

"It's like hitting reset on the body."

An initial session of massage or Bowen therapy for your canine companion takes around an hour, and Faye comes to your door.

"My business is mobile, and we travel all over the northside," she said.

"I look at how the dog walks or sits and their general movement, and then I do a hands-on assessment, focussing on what's tight or tense.

"Mostly the dogs really like it – sometimes younger dogs need to calm down a little bit, but we take plenty of breaks and if a dog wants to walk around, that's fine."

Massage – known as myotherapy – and Bowen therapy can help dogs recover from injury, improve chronic and skin conditions, reduce inflammation and improve circulation.

"I think it's really good for their mental health as well," Faye said.

"It's especially great for senior dogs, it can really help your dog regain a lot of movement and feel so much better."

She said some vets even recommended Bowen therapy.

"It's a natural therapy option; it's very gentle and unobtrusive and more vets are starting to learn about it and recommend it," Faye said.

"I'm planning some public demonstrations of Bowen therapy to help pet owners become more aware of it.

"And it's not just the therapy itself – I can help people be more aware of how their dog moves and what they can do in the home to help them; for example not too much rough play and not over-walking them, particularly since we've all been at home so much this year."

A WORD FROM OUR REPRESENTATIVES

We've hit the ground running after the Council budget was handed down in June, identifying local projects to invest in to create jobs and investment in our community.

Some of these job-creating projects commencing this financial year include

park upgrades, new footpaths, and investments in community clubs. Projects like new lighting and upgraded paths in the Sandgate Memorial Park will be complete by November. New shade shelters and tree plantings at the Deagon Skatepark, and lighting of the new Decker Park basketball court will also commence soon.

Works on the Brighton Foreshore path will continue, replacing more of the narrow and dangerous paths and a concept plan for a new carpark and access to the Curlew Park canoe ramp will also be started.

Care Kits for Kids distributes free care kits through Police Child Protection Units and Child Safety, Domestic Violence and Foster/Kinship Care agencies to well over 10,200 Queensland children. Due to year-round demand, care kits are currently expanding drop-off to more locations around Brisbane. My office is now a drop-off point; you can donate between 8.30am and 4.30pm Monday to Friday.

We are only a few months into the new financial year and there are ten smoother streets in the Bracken Ridge Ward after being resurfaced. Bracken Ridge State High School students have a safer crossing point on Barfoot Street and St

Joseph's Catholic Primary School, Bracken Ridge have secured funding for the Active School Travel Program that encourages students and their families to walk, ride, or scoot to school.

In partnering with the Federal Government, some of the Bracken Ridge Ward's major congestion

Queensland's state schools are set for an upgrade after the State Government announced \$220 million to refurbish education facilities, a works program set to create hundreds of jobs for tradespeople across the state. The funding

is on top of more than a billion dollars already announced for new schools and new classrooms, creating even more jobs across the state in 2020.

So how does this affect people here in Sandgate? The Sandgate Electorate's nine public schools will see \$1.5 million in additional funding for minor works and maintenance.

Bracken Ridge State High School will receive \$300,000 for a new kitchen to meet growing demands. Nashville State School will be given \$150,000 to refurbish classrooms including new lights, fans, carpet, repaint, and joinery. Sandgate State School will have all classrooms refurbished at a cost of \$200,000.

A new safe and modern outdoor learning area will be constructed at Shorncliffe State School. These works include new surfaces, astro-turf, handball courts, new seating, and a revamped ANZAC garden, at a cost of \$150,000

The remaining \$738,000 will be shared amongst all schools for general maintenance and minor works.

hotspots are set to be upgraded, including the Barbour and Norris Roads roundabout in Bracken Ridge. Hoyland Street, Bracken Ridge has received \$5.4 million to duplicate lanes in both directions, and \$2.2 million has been secured to kick-start significant upgrades to Beams Road, Carseldine.

Over the coming months (subject to COVID-19 restrictions) I will also be hosting community consultation events and surveys for a major playground upgrade in Gus Davies Park, Bald Hills; a learn-to-ride track in Len Trezona Park, Zillmere; and new facilities for Daintree Place Park, Fitzgibbon. 

his year's event will be held over two days and will be outdoor picnic-style in the expansive land surrounding the church — a slight difference to previous years — to accommodate for the current social distancing rules.

According to festival organiser Costa Stratikopoulos, the event promises to be as exciting as ever.

An array of Greek cuisine – arguably the biggest crowd-pleaser – will again be on offer, although this year, it will be packaged in unique 'showbags', to reduce handling and contact. The famous Greek honey puffs and many other sweet treats will be in plentiful supply, as will quintessential Greek delicacies including lamb on the spit. There will also be stalls and music.

"It's about the experience of being Greek, and enjoying the food and the environment and the culture," Costa said.

"The smells, the environment, the cooking of the lamb and the roasts, the charcoal, the lambs on the spit – it's all about the food and just enjoying

the outdoors, and some music. We're looking forward to it."

One of the stalls will offer Greek religious icons and other religious artefacts such as rosary beads, and incense, all sourced from holy places in Greece. Guided tours of the church itself – a stunning Byzantine-style building completed in 1995 to service the northside's growing Greek community – will also be conducted throughout the day.

"We looked at the wonderful space and the land we have there, and we thought what better way to take people's mind off the current situation than to celebrate our multiculturalism," Costa said.

"I think it's an opportunity for people to get together in an outdoor environment and enjoy each other's company, and just take our minds off the hardship of 2020."



TENET

magine David Lynch making a Bond movie – then you'd have Tenet. To explain the plot of this film any other way would take more than my 300 word allocation (even if I did understand it all). That being said, this is a great film with director Christopher Nolan's signature all over it; a genre-twisting story, an incredible score, next-level practical effects and most of all, exposition fired in your face like a machine gun.

From start to finish you'll be caught up in a world that you kind of recognise but may struggle to understand, giving you a feeling of unease as you try to decipher the torrent of dialogue, and that's before we even start talking about the use of 'time inversion' and 'entropy'.

There's a lot to process, and just when you think you're grasping something, a whole new plot device or random character is introduced. What this film does expertly is reward those who are willing to pay attention. If you can put in the effort, follow along and learn the rules (and maybe have a degree in physics), you'll be gifted with a mind-altering experience.

In true Nolan style there's plenty of 'score porn', with Nolan replacing his go-to composer Hans Zimmer with the equally outstanding Ludwig Göransson, although coupled with the thumping sound design, this can make the already tricky dialogue hard to hear.


Another of the director's favourites, Michael Caine, does make the cut, but only in a cameo. Relative newcomer John David Washington is great, however he does occasionally look like he was trying to understand the script. I don't blame him. The rest of the cast are good; Robert Pattinson brought a surprising endearing quality, but I found it hard to warm to Elizabeth Debicki.

Despite this being a very complex movie, I thoroughly enjoyed it, walking out of the cinema wanting to pull apart and piece back together so many elements of the story and its execution. I recommend watching it at the cinema. Take your mates so you can spend hours dissecting it afterwards.

"People flock down there in droves to enjoy the natural beauty of Sandgate waterfront. Being on the main tourist drive, people need a great place to unwind and take it all in.



MUSIC SPOTLIGHT

FRIKKER'S Folk Tales

If ever there was a time to listen to an experienced storyteller, it's now. Brighton singer-songwriter Frank Frikker fits that bill perfectly - and he has more than a few tales to tell.

he accomplished folk musician — who moved to the region two and a half years ago from Port Douglas in north Queensland — found himself without a stage on which to play this year, thanks to the coronavirus pandemic. So he went about crafting and recording his new album.

"I finished writing new songs this year. The amount of 13 songs developed over the last years," he said.

"After having finished my previous CD, Yarmouk in 2017 I thought: 'This is it. No more songwriting.' But my brain just doesn't stop. Text lines and music fragments pop up in my head until I sit down."

Frikker's prodigious output is good news for music lovers. His music swings between bohemian poetry that sways like the tides, through to beatnik anthems with character narratives that move like a good page-turner.

With influences that range from working-class folk heroes like John Prine through to the likes of the legendary Bob Dylan and James Taylor, it all adds up to a deeply unique storytelling talent.

It's made all the more exciting by his musical partnership with experienced producer Nigel Pegrum, whose musical pedigree is long and distinguished.

"After having recorded my first two CDs in a less professional and sophisticated environment, muso friends of mine told me that I should invest in getting my music properly recorded and produced, and recommended I get in touch with Nigel," he said.

"He is a fabulous, funny and very experienced person. It was only through the process of making Yarmouk that I learned about Nigel's background and history. Man, am I lucky to work with such a guy. Since then we became friends and therefore there was no other way than to work with him again on the new album."

While gigs aren't on the cards right now, Frikker - who has played at Mr Henderson, the Cardigan Bar and numerous other local venues - does intend to launch his new album this year.

"Due to corona, all gigs have been cancelled. I intend to launch my new CD still this year though, maybe at Sandbag Community Centre," he said.

Comfortable on the water since she was five years old, Allana was born into a family paddling business and has developed a life-long love for the sport. As a longtime 4017 resident, Allana has strong ties to the Sandgate community and has been sharing her passion and knowledge with local residents for the past 15 years.

"I initially started as a canoe and kayak instructor and have since become a coach and an assessor (training other teachers)," Allana said. "I also have my own paddling education business, All About Paddling."

With an innate passion for what she does, Allana loves introducing others to the numerous benefits of paddling sports. Aside from improving fitness levels, paddling can have a profound positive effect on mental health.

"Paddling allows people to connect with nature, and can build confidence through developing leadership, planning and decision-making skills," Allana said. "It's also the perfect way to keep fit and make new friends while social distancing."

"I've lived in 4017 for about 10 years. I was born in Wanganui, a small town in New Zealand. We [with husband Ray Kelland] relocated from Wellington, New Zealand about 10 years ago to join family that lived on the Sunshine Coast. We rented in Sandgate for a year, and then bought at Bracken Ridge eight years ago.

We just really fell in love with the area; the coastal feel, the lovely community, and the lifestyle, I guess. I started up my business, Ruby Divine, nearly 10 years ago. It's a specialist eyelash extension and brow studio.

It started as a little home-based business, to work around the family. I came from a career in operations management in hospitality, and music promotion, and then started this. Here I am 10 years later.

It works really well [having the salon at home]. It means you can give people really flexible appointment times. People seem to really enjoy that home-based feel. A lot of my clients have been coming for seven, eight, and nine years, so they've really become like friends.

[In 2019] we decided that we would do something different and take the kids [now aged 11 and 4] out of school, and head off around Australia in a caravan. That's what we did for 10 months. Then, at the end of that, we took the kids backpacking through South-East Asia for two and a half months. They were [aged] three and 10. We were homeschooling – well, attempting to.

We refer to that as our gap year. We had lots of unexpected things happen; I took a waitressing job in Darwin, and Ray started working on caravans at one point. It was a lot of 'throw all the balls in the air and see how they fall'. We've done some pretty intrepid travel with the kids over the years, and I guess it was the ultimate extension of that. It was really cool.

Coming back to 4017 was like a warm hug – seeing our friends. But it did take a bit of adjusting. Opening the business up again was great, and I had a lot of old clients coming straight back. Then of course we had COVID, so it was a bit bumpy.

Our new passion is renovating vintage caravans. We've got a little vintage van that we're doing up; that's going to be our 'holiday machine'."

The letter features Brisbane City Council colours and letterhead and reads, in part, "It is with joy that we inform you of your successful qualifications for the newly-introduced COVID-19 grant which allows people ... who have lost income due to the COVID-19 outbreak to receive a one-off grant ..."

Deagon Ward Councillor Jared Cassidy said he

urged anyone who received the letter to report the scam to council and the police.

"Do not call the number (in the letter)," he said. "Stay wary and check in on those who may be vulnerable.

"The person behind this scam should be ashamed and I hope they face the full force of the law."

PARK UPGRADES AREN'T RUBBISH

Deagon Ward Councillor Jared Cassidy has announced some upgrades to Frank Doyle Park in Allpass Parade.

In an effort to combat littering in the area, funding has been secured to upgrade all the bins in the area, helping to protect our waterways.

The project will consist of nine new recycling units and 10 new general waste units - that's an increase of 1680 litres of waste volume.

The upgraded bins will be the same as the 240 litre bins currently seen on Lovers Walk.

While the project is being carried out, wheelie bins will be in the area as a temporary measure.

SCHOOL FUNDS **GO TO HEAD OF THE CLASS**

Four local schools have secured State Government funding to help them bounce back from the COVID-19 pandemic.

THE SPANISH FLU OF 1919 From Sandgate's Perspective

"History doesn't repeat itself, but it often rhymes."

This phrase, credited to Mark Twain, rings true now with comparisons being made between the Spanish Flu of 1918/1919 and the current COVID-19 pandemic – especially concerning official responses and the overall severity of the event.

HISTORY

In Australia in 1919, tough government decisions had to be made and put into action. Many of the same debates took place over the wearing of masks, border closures and the shutting down of schools and other large public gatherings.

The arrival of the Spanish Flu into Australia was linked to soldiers returning from World War I. Southern states were affected first, Queensland later. Quarantining of ships at Lytton, and border restrictions at Coolangatta and Wallangarra mitigated the spread north.

On 31 January 1919, the Daily Telegraph ran a story with the headline – SANDGATE PREPARED, SAFEGUARDS AGAINST PANDEMIC....

"Sandgate is prepared for an outbreak of the influenza scourge," the story said. "The Health

Inspector stated that he did not think there was a healthier town in Queensland. Sandgate was not a likely place for an outbreak, as the strong winds tend to dispel diseases rather than encourage them."

In February, an inoculation depot was set up in the Sandgate Town Hall. Inoculations used in that era could only combat secondary bacterial infections, as vaccinations for viruses were not yet known about. One main difference between the two pandemics is our improved understanding of virology.

By May, the Sandgate Women's Emergency Corps volunteers were assisting those who became unwell, rallying to provide nursing and the delivery of meals. The Sandgate State School ran a creche to care for the children of sick parents. Skills learned through service during the war years were transferable to this new threat.

At its end, more than 300 people had died from the Spanish Flu in Brisbane; Australia-wide the death toll was 15,000.

While we are yet to know the trajectory of COVID-19 and its full impact, we are indeed lucky for our bayside location – not only for those healthy sea breezes, but for the access to the foreshore and places in nature, and a strong community with a history of coming together in hard times.

MANNA FROM HEAVEN: A PLACE FOR THOSE IN NEED

n the heart of Sandgate, not-for-profit organisation Manna From Heaven has been providing opportunities, support and food for people in need for over 11 years. The outreach creates a safe zone for people to connect and develop relationships that they may not have in their everyday lives.

Manna From Heaven director Ema Pisia and her husband Kiri provide fresh, healthy, cooked meals for the community on the second and fourth Friday of each month from the Sandgate Community Centre and even send people home with bags of fruit and vegetables donated by OzHarvest. She said that the health of people in need was very important to them, and any leftover meals were donated to hostels in Shorncliffe.

"We don't turn anyone away," Ema said. "We cater for people that have been affected by mental health, refugees, aged pensioners, single mums, and people that do not have accommodation. We want the people that come to us to not only have a meal, but to feel loved and cared for."

They also offer in-home assistance when people are sick and have even helped with funeral arrangements - creating a beautiful send-off for those who have no family.

Ema said they have many connections with other organisations and often work together to find accommodation and services to aid people in need. She said that with the help of Homeless Connect, they rescued a man sleeping in a Sandgate Park. He stayed with her for two weeks, was given a haircut, food and new clothes before they found him a home.

"We found him a brand-new caravan park unit and he was so happy," she said. "Our heart for doing this is showing care, generosity and loving people; giving them the help when they have no one to go to."

Manna from Heaven has a great team of volunteers and sponsors, including Bracken Ridge McDonald's owner Rod Chapello, who always provides meals if Ema cannot cook for a night. However, they are looking for some extra help for the rest of the year.

"It's such a privilege and a blessing to be able to do this for our people," Ema said.


