President of Sandgate Bayside Chamber of Commerce Bill Gollan considers himself "the lucky guy who oversees the event". He said Jingle All the Bay had only got better since its inception around four years ago.

"Now it's grown into one of the biggest Christmas events in Brisbane, if not the biggest event," he said.

With 2020 offering many obstacles and challenges, the fate of Jingle All the Bay was also hanging in the balance this year, with the decision to go ahead only made recently.

On 6 February we'll present an extraordinary group of artists with Eishan Ensemble.



or almost a decade, northside residents have seen Santa zipping around on a motorbike in the lead up to Christmas. This year, the man in red has promised he's going to deliver more than a friendly wave.

lan Grainger, otherwise known as the Motorbike Santa, is raising funds to distribute gifts to families across Brisbane.

"Since about 2012, I've been riding to my job in the city from Sandgate in my Santa suit every December," Ian said.

"I just started doing it for fun. My workmates realised I was riding dressed in the suit, and as part of my job at PwC is delivering the mail, they wanted all their mail delivered by me dressed as Santa.

"Each year people were ordering more parcels just to have them delivered by Santa."

lan said he had been inspired to go one step further this year.

"I just figured it had been a pretty crappy year for the world, so it might be good to do something nice," he said.

He started a Go Fund Me page to raise funds to buy boxed, non-gender-specific toys under the value of \$10, to be delivered to homes across the city.

"I put in \$200 of my own money and now we're at more than \$2000," Ian said.

"I've had lots of support and my manager at PwC has said they're going to do a national call out."

Laughing, lan said it might "get a bit out of control" but he had an army of "elves" to help out.

"I have a Facebook group of fellow motorbike riders and they've all agreed to get suits and help me if need be," he said.

Ian said he would be choosing homes at random on Christmas Eve to leave gifts at the front door.

"Each gift will have a sticker on it saying, if you don't have kids or you don't need this gift, please donate it to charity or give it to someone with kids," he said.

"There's going to be a QR code on there as well, which will take people to the Go Fund Me page. People can also post their photos to social media with the hashtag #realsantaproject."

Runners Return

andgate Parkrun is back and organisers are expecting more fitness enthusiasts than ever to be pounding the pavement.

Organiser Vanessa Gibson said the weekly event would return starting from 28 November, after stopping earlier this year due to COVID-19.

"We had to pull the pin back in March and that was a quideline from national headquarters," she said.

"We always took a wait-and-see approach, and nationally it's being decided on a state-by-state basis.

"We've missed it so much, our community has missed it – just the opportunity to run or walk with like-minded people again will be great."

Vanessa said they were expecting "big numbers".

"A lot of people may have started exercising during social isolation and now is their chance to come along and check out Parkrun," she said.

"Also of course we have a COVID-safe plan; there will be a QR code for our runners to check in and we're required to provide hand sanitiser for all our volunteers.

"Earlier this year we might have thought those kind of conditions (for participating) were too much for people, but now I think we're all just used to it."

Vanessa said she also wanted other foreshore users to be aware the group was back.

"We will be in Sandgate from Arthur Davis Park to the Pier, in quite large numbers, each Saturday from 7am to 8am," she said.

Foreshore Dog Off-Leash Area Here To Stay

Brisbane City Council has made the foreshore dog off-leash area in Sandgate permanent following a successful trial that brought positive community feedback and positive shorebird monitoring results.

Environment, Parks and Sustainability Chair Fiona Cunningham said Council collaborated with Department of Environment and Science and the University of Queensland (UQ) to undertake the trial.

"Brisbane is a dog-loving city, and just like we love the salt and sand, so do our furry family members who voted with their paws during the trials," Cr Cunningham said.

"These trials were about balancing the needs of recreation and conservation and the UQ research and community feedback shows that we've achieved that balance.

"We are pleased the shorebird monitoring results from UQ showed the trial increased the number of dogs kept on-leash in sensitive areas for migratory shorebirds at Sandgate."


"Since the coronavirus pandemic, visitation to our city's parks and reserves has significantly increased due to people preferring to stay close to home while enjoying the outdoors.

"We will continue to identify suitable locations for residents and their fur babies to run free and socialise with other dogs."

Council will install new signage at the area to educate residents about shorebird protection and will continue to monitor the location for compliance.

CENTENARY CELEBRATIONS ON PAR WITH THE BEST

lub captain Allan Head said the original clubhouse was a canvas marquee. "One of the events we're going to have will be an afternoon cocktail party in a marquee, after a game of golf in the morning," he said. "We might even dress up in period costume as well."

The club was formed in 1921 when nine golf enthusiasts began converting 57 acres of mangrove swamp into a golf course.

This required soil and fill – at one shilling a dray load – to reclaim enough land from Cabbage Tree Creek and establish six of the nine holes that exist today. Ongoing tidal issues meant floodgates were installed before the addition of another three holes.

Today, the club has more than 200 members, with six social clubs and members of the public also using the course.

"In January, we're going to have a tree planting to mark the occasion, probably near the clubhouse, and we hope our three living life members will be involved in that as well." Allan said.

"We will have merchandise for people to purchase throughout the year, including shirts with a new logo, incorporating the 100 years celebration."

The club's most successful player was Ian Davis, who in 1970 was the club's junior champion. He then went on to become the Australian Schoolboys Champion and played professionally on the national circuit.

Allan said golf was a game anyone could enjoy. "It's a challenge to improve yourself and achieve your own goals," he said. "And of course it's a social game, and we enjoy each other's company and each other's game.

"We're very proud of reaching 100 years. We're thankful for all the golfers who went before us and we're constantly improving the course and we hope to present it as best we can for anyone coming to Sandgate in 2021."



"It just felt awesome to win, I was super excited," Finn said. "The adrenaline of the sport is amazing; I really love it."

Finn started kitesurfing at age seven with his dad. Now aged 15, he is sponsored by Sandgate's Surf Connect and is a member of the Reedin

Finn Cross, winner of the Brissie Big Air 2020 Junior division.

Kites Australia Team. He practises each day, if the weather allows.

Surf Connect owner Padi Kotwall said he was enormously proud of Finn. "Kitesurfing is a highrisk, extreme sport, so supporting everyone in this community is my number one aim," Padi said.

"We're very fortunate here in the Sandgate community; we've always had great support. The reward to see Finn win was indescribable. We've had some other junior champions here as well, and they are now mentors to Finn and our other juniors."

Kitesurfing will officially become an Olympic sport at the Paris 2024 games and Padi said Finn should definitely "put that on his agenda".

For Finn, it would be a dream come true. "That would be awesome, to get that far and win an Olympic medal," Finn said. "If I put in the work, I'm sure I can.

"It's such a great kitesurfing community here in Sandgate and I'm very grateful to Padi."

Finn is now aiming for the Freestyle Competition held on the Sunshine Coast in January.

has brought, it's no doubt that Christmas may look a little different this year for many families. However, that doesn't mean that the festive season can't still feel merry and bright. Regardless of your budget this year, DIY holiday decor is a great way to exercise some creativity and put less stress on your finances.

For simple, elegant holiday decor, start by looking at what you already have around your home and garden. Whether you love classic reds and greens, subdued earth tones, elegant golds, or cool coastal blues and silvers, achieving your desired holiday decor style doesn't have to be complicated or expensive.

An easy way to gather decor inspiration is by taking a stroll through your own back yard. As rosemary is found in many local gardens, it's the perfect staple for all of your holiday DIY projects - and it smells divine too. Create a gorgeous Christmas wreath by manipulating a few rosemary stems into a circle and binding the ends together with a piece of string or twine. For a pop of colour, add in natives such as kangaroo paw, banksia, waratah, or wattle, for a beautiful array of holiday cheer.

Of course, it wouldn't feel like Christmas without a tree, so if you're on the hunt for a

new one this holiday season, consider using a native pot plant that can serve double duty and be transferred to your garden after the holidays. When it comes to Christmas lunch, it's surprisingly easy to create a beautiful, simple tablescape on a tight budget. For a coastal Christmas theme, fill some of the jars with shells or white pebbles, and sprinkle light blue and silver Christmas baubles throughout the table. For a more traditional feel, fill jars with short stems of any red and green foliage, or berries that you have growing in your yard.

With a little thought and effort, you can create one-of-a-kind, homemade holiday decor that's stress-free, financially friendly, and looks fa-la-la fabulous.

Sandgate florist will host floral design and flower arranging workshops in this month.

Wallflower owner and head florist Renae Handy said the workshops would run for about two hours and more dates may be added depending on demand.

The types of workshops offered during December are dried wreath, fresh wreath, dried arrangement and table centrepiece workshops – in time for Christmas and New Year celebrations. Attendees can rest assured the workshops will be run in accordance with COVID-safe guidelines.

Renae said dried flowers had "taken off" this year. "Dried flowers are our biggest sellers right now but we love mixing dried and fresh flowers together," she said. "That way you get the smell of fresh and the longevity of dried."

Wallflower started in the basement of Renae's parents' house in 2012, and the Sandgate store opened in October 2015. The business now employs six staff including three trained florists.

All creations aim to be "different", "creative" and "unique", and include a variety of nature - not only what is commercially available.

"We showcase nature at weddings and events in hanging chandeliers, arbours, floral walls, hanging florals and floral cylinders," Renae said. "But we also take the tiny, delicate flowers, dehydrate them and turn them into an art piece."

COVID-19 led to the 2021 postponement of many scheduled events and weddings but Wallflower, voted third best florist in The Courier Mail's 2019 Brisbane's Top 10 Florists, met the challenge with a "flower drive-thru" which proved a "massive hit".


Renae said sales increased during lockdown as those unable to join loved ones in celebration or grieving sent flowers "more than ever" to connect and "express love and care".

"[Flowers] bring impact," she said. "They create a vibe. They bring joy and colour, which help create memories.

"They calm the mind and bring a stillness and peacefulness to a room."





ost people starting out fishing in our local area will head to the beach, our famous jetties, the Hornibrook Bridge or the Pine River. The most common catches will be bream, whiting, snapper, flathead and smaller species such as garfish and pike. Of these, whiting would be my favourite to eat, although flathead comes very close second.

To catch flathead, a 6-7 foot light rod with 12-15lb line will suffice. You can even buy little tackle boxes with the right size hooks and sinkers for the species you want to target. Baits can vary but the old staples like prawns and beach or blood worms work, as well as small pilchards and live baits or lures. Our local tackle shops are the best place for a bit more advice and the fishing gear that will fit your budget.

Late afternoon and early morning are prime times and even night fishing places like Sandgate and Brighton waterfronts or Suttons Beach on high tide under the lights produce some great fish.

The fish species you will encounter in these areas have size and possession limits, so without listing them all, I would recommend using the search function or download a fishing app on your phone. Even I confess to using these sometimes, as it is the most upto-date way of ensuring you are not breaking the law.

There are a lot of flathead around at the moment so it pays to go for a walk at low tide and look for the lays or impressions they leave in the sand when waiting for food to pass by, then come back at high tide and have a go at catching them. A tip: the lays are the same shape as the fish.

Tight lines!





Lets bring a bit of Christmas cheer to someone's life from the team at 2nd Avenue Realty

ustralia is home to about 90 species of mistletoe – not the kind that is part of the European Christmas tradition (although Aussies have been known to improvise), but our very own distinctive and equally attractive ones.

Unusual and often misunderstood plants, Australian mistletoes come in many shapes and sizes. Flowering results in a dramatic show of yellow, orange or red. They are semi-parasitic, growing on the branches of natives such as eucalypts, casuarinas, and callistemons, relying on their host for water and support.

Remarkably, they appear to mimic the growth form of the tree they are living on, often producing foliage practically identical to their host, making them hard to see. This resemblance is believed to be a product of evolution.

One species that grows on casuarinas, forming long needle-like leaves, can be seen easily in Tinchi Tamba Reserve. Brighton Wetlands has some beautiful specimens too, growing on eucalypts. Sometimes, it is their tubular orange flowers fallen to the ground that will alert you to their presence.

Parasitic plants and animals have famously bad reputations, yet they form an important part of the ecosystems in which they live. Mistletoes provide a valuable source of food with their nectar-filled flowers and fleshy berries. Possums, insects, and birds feed on them and find shelter within their dense foliage. Aware of their importance, the local bushcare group has started to plant some in the casuarinas in Curlew Park

One tiny bird, amongst Australia's smallest, has developed a strong relationship with them. The Australian mistletoebird feeds almost exclusively on the little berries, acting as one of the main distributors of the seeds. It takes less than 30 minutes for a seed to pass through its short digestive system, to be then excreted in a sticky mound on the branch of a tree, ready for the next generation of mistletoes to grow.

The mistletoebird is not so easy to see. Small and fast, a sighting may require some patience. It is only the male that has a red chest; females are dullish grey, making identification tricky.

School holidays are approaching, so make a point of getting out into nature with the kids and marvel at all the intricate relationships.

Take on everything your eyes face today.

THE NEXT FOUR YEARS: Q & A WITH STIRLING HINCHLIFFE MP

Congratulations on being re-elected. Did you have much time for celebrations?

I want to thank the people of Sandgate for their emphatic support on 31 October. I commit to working hard every day to keep you and your family safe as we continue to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic. My main priorities will be:

- · Building the Beams Road Overpass;
- \cdot Expanding the Park 'n' Ride at Carseldine Station;
- · Delivering a Sandgate District State High School performing arts hall;
- · Hiring more frontline health workers to keep our community safe;
- · Securing free TAFE for under 25s;
- · Rebuilding our state's manufacturing industry.

You have announced that Labor will be delivering improvements to local schools. What are the timeframes on these and what will this mean for the community?

The performing arts hall at Sandgate State High and Outside Hours School Care (OHSC) at Bracken Ridge, Sandgate, and Shorncliffe State Schools were election commitments, and funding will be appropriated in the Budget. Coercive control is an important issue, and happens where an abuser uses a long-term pattern of domination designed to reduce the agency of their victim.

governments have successfully legislated against coercive control and where they have, conviction rates are extremely low. This process will be done in partnership with the domestic violence and legal experts, and will include training for first responders and service providers, a community awareness campaign, and a consultation process.

The Palaszczuk Labor Government will also work with Share the Dignity (a national charity, which is based here in Sandgate) to provide vending machines with free tampons and pads at 120 schools across the state. All Queensland schools, including independent and Catholic schools, can register to be part of the program, with schools most in need given priority.

We all know sanitary products aren't luxury items - they're a necessity. This will give students the dignity they deserve, and help them feel more confident and stress-free during their time at school.

Christmas is coming. Are you going to enjoy some time with your family? Do you have a message for the Sandgate community?

With the Budget being handed down in early December and Parliamentary Estimates to follow in the two weeks after, myself and the Government will be working right up to Christmas. Following those long and important weeks, it will be even more enjoyable to spend time with my wife and children.

Jon has seen a wide range of people keen to enrol in Gin School.

"I think the recent uptake in arts and crafts has now extended to activities like this, with people from all walks of life embracing activities including baking, preserving, renovating, and of course, distilling," he said. "With the help of our gin coaches anybody can master the art and with over a trillion combinations with the botanicals we have on hand, you will certainly have something unique."

There are also other distilleries around South-East Queensland that offer a great place to visit and sample some great gin, vodka, and rum, all made right here.


