



# MOZART'S MUSIC GOES THE DISTANCE

n ensemble of emerging professional musicians will be turning the spotlight onto some of Mozart's finest concertos this month.

Five soloists from Cadenza Chamber Players will take centre stage at the Sandgate Town Hall to play A Mozart Concerto Marathon.

Artistic director and chief conductor Lucas D. Lynch said the concert was something he had been wanting to do for years.

"In classical concerts you have one, maximum two, concertos," Lucas said. "I wanted to design this whole concert built on just concertos because they are versatile and unique, and offer so much charm.

"Mozart wrote many concertos for different instruments and they are breathtaking. You just can't go wrong with Mozart."

A Mozart Concerto Marathon will feature four concertos, with solo musicians playing their instruments accompanied by an orchestra. Lucas will perform Mozart's Piano Concerto No.12. A harp and flute concerto will be played by Jaclyn Miles and Jess Hall, with Niamh Bennett set to perform a clarinet concerto. Mozart's Horn

Concerto No.2 will be performed by Daniel Sherson.

"Highlighting these four concertos offers the audience a great insight into this genius composer," Lucas said.

Cadenza Chamber Players are freelance musicians based in South-East Queensland, ranging from five to 30 players, depending on the project.

Lucas said he was passionate about giving members of the ensemble a soloist moment.

"Everyone is equally talented and virtuosic, and I'm vehement to showcase their talent," he said.

"It's important for emerging professional musicians, most who have graduated from tertiary institutions, to have the opportunity to play with an orchestra as a soloist."

The ensemble formed in 2017 and started off playing shows at the Sandgate Town Hall.

"I think we always come back to our roots, and Sandgate is our roots," Lucas said.

"The people are amazing in Sandgate. The venue there is to die for. There's a gorgeous piano and the acoustics are breathtaking. I don't think it could be more exquisite."

Lucas said audience members would leave the show feeling utterly charmed by the music.



# 25 Years and Still Grooving

he New Groove Jazz Ensemble is celebrating 25 years of big band at Sandgate Town Hall this month. The afternoon event will showcase new music in the style of Big Band jazz and will have you boogying the day away.

The ensemble consists of 20 instrumentalists and vocalists ranging in age from early 20s to mid

90s, and has a regular fortnightly concert at the Sandgate Town Hall – a popular Sunday activity for many local fans.

New Groove Jazz Ensemble pianist Sacha Hughes said she had been in the band for five years and was excited for the 25 year celebration.

"It's a really enjoyable afternoon," Sacha said.
"It's live music. It's wonderful to support local
musicians in the area, and it's just a really fun
afternoon.

"We largely centre around jazz, swing, and lots of classic Big Band tunes. Lots of Ella Fitzgerald, Count Basie – all of those kinds of classics.

"We do some modern things as well and are inspired by all of the Michael Bublé and Harry Connick Jr-type charts also."

Sacha said that although COVID had created many challenges for the band last year, it had been very rewarding performing again and having the community support all of the group's latest concerts.

"We have been playing in the local community for a long time and are trying to keep that live music and that Big Band swing-era live for the local community to enjoy," Sacha said.

"Every concert has got new music; we don't play the same chart in a year, so we've got a really high turnover of music with some great songs for people to come and listen to.

"We also have lots of people who like to come and dance at the concert, which we love, so we really encourage people who like to dance to come along."



usiness is positively blooming at Wallflower with the popular local florist opening up a second location. Owner Renae Handy said despite a COVID-related drop in some aspects of their business, the past 12 months had proved to be "pretty busy".

"We do lots of weddings and events, so with that shut-down we took a hit, but we were still so busy sending flowers all over Brisbane," she said.

"People couldn't get out and celebrate with each other, so they were sending flowers as a way of connecting.

"And plants too, with people working from home they wanted to make their home more beautiful and we couldn't keep up with demand for indoor plants."

Wallflower's original shop had become too small, and the business expanded into new premises on Braun Street, Deagon.

"We had really outgrown our little shop in Sandgate, we were bursting at the seams," she said.

"I had a vision in my mind of a big shed, with open beams, although initially I wasn't looking for something quite this big. But I fell in love with it."

The former antique store underwent a huge renovation, removing the ceiling and adding in skylights and air-conditioning, as well as some new walls and a paint job.

"We loved it because it's on the main road, there's heaps of parking out the front and out the back, we have our greenhouse on the side," Renae said. "I really didn't want people to forget the store that had been here, so to keep some of that feeling from the antique store, I kept the floors the same and I have a few of their pieces like lamps and plates around our shop."

The new shop has everything locals know and love about Wallflower – plants and flowers, as well as gifts and candles made by Brisbane artists – just on a bigger scale.

Renae added she had been "feeling the love" from the 4017 community. "So many people have come in and said thank you for making Deagon a more exciting suburb and that just makes me so happy," she said.

"If there's anything I'm passionate about, it's the Sandgate and bayside community; I could talk about it all day."

Wallflower's new location will become the main store, while the original shop will remain – for now – as a "mini version" of Renae's vision.



Put your glad rags on and get ready to rock – 4017's iconic Rock Under the Clock is back, bigger and better than ever.

fter 'rockdown' in 2020, this key event on the region's rock'n'roll calendar has a new venue for 2021 – The Sandgate Bowls Club – moving from its original home at the Sandgate Town Hall because of attendance restrictions.

While the venue may have changed, the tunes certainly have not. Renowned rock'n'roll band The Sonics, led by vocalist Jim Hansen, will entertain the crowd with late 1950s and 1960s music from Australia, the USA, and the UK.



"The emphasis on this particular event is rock'n'roll revival," said Sonics guitarist Rod Kippen, who said the music appealed to a wide group of people.

We do get a lot of younger people that like rock'n'roll dancing, and the older generation just want to relive this nostalgic time," he said.

The Sonics originated back in 1961, when four Sandgate teenagers from the same class at Sandgate High School got together. They adopted the Sandgate Town Hall as their preferred venue, playing at dances under the banner Rock Under the Clock.

Sixty years later, The Sonics are still going strong with those four original band members - Rod Kippen (guitar), Garry McDonald (guitar), Bob Blight (bass guitar), and Robin Werda (drums) - now joined by vocalist Jim Hansen, songstress Nicky Steel, and Annette Smith on keyboard.

The band reincarnated the Rock Under the Clock theme - named in reverence to the first rock'n'roll record, The Comets' Rock Around The Clock – in 2014, with two events held every year since then (except in 2020) at the town hall.

As has been the case in previous years, all proceeds from the night will go to the Sandgate PCYC's youth development programs. The event has raised more than \$80,000 in the last seven years.

Rod said the new venue promised to be the perfect alternative to host this year's event, which draws a crowd from across the southeast.

"The bowls club is bigger than the town hall so we can have more people attend," he said. "We're able to observe social distancing at the same time and put in place all of the necessary COVID protocols."

There will be a supper service, a fully licensed bar, and coffee and tea available. Bookings are essential. For more information and to purchase your ticket, visit www.trybooking. com/729079

📉 luenose Betty will offer an upmarket yet casual dining experience with a full bar offering craft beers, wine, and cocktails. The bar will be replacing Sam's Wine Bar and will have a beer garden and a relaxed atmosphere, so patrons can chill out and forget their worries after a hard

Bluenose Betty manager Ryan Northey is no amateur in the bar and restaurant business he runs four of his father's venues that are in Teneriffe and Coffs Harbour.

"Bluenose Betty is a nice, relaxed, social bar and restaurant lounge," Ryan said. "It will have a very relaxed kind of atmosphere.

"You can come as whoever you are - if you feel like wearing a T-shirt and a pair of shorts, that's fine, but if you want to dress up, that works too.

"We have a beer garden out the back, and our food is a very social experience - it's not pub grub, not fine dining, and not finicky tapas it's share-style comfort food that's done well."

Ryan said once open, the venue would plan to have regular live music to add to the comfortable and stress-free vibe it aims to

"We love being part of a community and Sandgate has always been a place that appealed to me," Ryan said. "I love the fact that it's close to the water, it's away from the central Brisbane proper, and is its own community that draws in others around it.

We were out here over weekends and spotted this building and knew this is what we were after. We had to take advantage of this beautiful building - it's a really beautiful, old historic building that the owner's done a beautiful job renovating. It just needs the place to come alive and have a soul put back into it."

Ryan said Bluenose Betty would be very similar to the Teneriffe restaurant and bar. Streetcorner Jimmy, and was excited to bring something different to the area.

"I don't see Bluenose Betty as competition in the community," Ryan said. "I see it as something that will completely complement what's already here. There are some great little craft beer bars if you like, which have that great little personality to them, and then you have got the pubs.

"We kind of feel like we fit the middle ground between them all - just a nice and relaxed, upmarket bar."

The Noah musical focuses on climate change and is set in drought-stricken rural Australia with strong messages for the audience about looking after our country.

Noah cast member Chrissie O'Dea is excited to be playing God in the musical and said the modern take would appeal to a wide audience.

"Noah touches on global warming and God comes down to speak to Noah – who owns the local pub in the local town – and tells him it's going to flood," Chrissie said. "And he needs to build a boat. The town's got to try to convince God that they are worth saving.

"It's a slight twist to the usual Noah, and having a female God is very powerful. The fact that it's set in a Queensland country community in drought, I think it's very topical as well.

"I think it's really exciting that it's been written by local Phil Halpin. He has done an amazing job writing not only the story but also the music. I am so proud of what he has achieved because it's fantastic."

The musical will run for 90 minutes without an intermission. Chrissie said the production had 12 lead characters, 15-20 chorus members and five band members.

"JAFA is a community theatre group that was originally attached to the St. Joseph's Catholic Church at Bracken Ridge, and has been going for about 20 years now," Chrissie said. "We do a production every other year, usually, and are very community focused. We often involve the school community and many of the older people within the area."

Chrissie said it was great to be a part of JAFA and she was looking forward to welcoming the audience to the show on opening night.

"It's not really the story of Noah at all," Chrissie said. "The basics are there with the ark and the animals, but other than that it's totally a modern take that will surprise the audience."



andgate's favourite clowning duo Peebo and Dagwood hold a special place in the hearts of many in the community, and now the pair will have a piece of the 4017 named after them.

Council's new playground on the Sandgate foreshore, at the end of Fifth Avenue, will officially be named Peebo and Dagwood Place, after Peter 'Peebo' and David 'Dagwood' Bissell.

It's been just over 12 months since Peebo's death, and according to Deagon Ward councillor Jared Cassidy, there couldn't be a more fitting tribute.

"Originally after Peter passed, there were quite a few people who wanted to erect a statue and I was on board with that," Jared said.

"But during COVID, that plan was put on hold and then David came to me and said he had seen the new playground being built and maybe it could be named after him and his brother – I thought it was a brilliant idea."

Jared launched an online petition, which gathered 2200 signatures in just one week, of which about 1000 came from outside Brisbane city.

"There were people from the Gold Coast who signed the petition because they remembered

the clowns visiting their children in hospital," he said. "I think this just shows how broad their reach was."

According to Jared, Peebo's daughter Millie was particularly excited about the playground being named after her dad and uncle.

"David said she was happy to be able to have somewhere to go to sit and remember her dad, and it will be a place filled with laughter and happy families, which is what Peebo and Dagwood were all about," Jared said.

"I've been in this job for six years and I've seen a lot of positive things happen in this community, but nothing has unified people like this playground naming.

"After such a tough year last year, to have something so positive is really quite nourishing for all of us."

A statement posted on the official Peebo and Dagwood Facebook page said the announcement about the playground naming was "exciting news". Dagwood also announced that his niece, Millie, would be clowning around with him in an official capacity at the Lilley Welcoming the Babies event.

The playground will have an official opening on a date yet to be set.



The Powering Communities Program is now open to expressions of interest from not-for-profit community organisations across the federal electorate of Lilley.

Grants of between \$5000 and \$12.000 are available

for projects that improve energy efficiency practices and technologies and reduce power bills.

Examples of eligible projects include the purchase and installation of rooftop solar PV systems, the purchase and installation of batteries to connect to a new or existing PV system, replacement of air conditioners, installation of solar hot water. upgrade lighting, purchase of induction cooktops or new refrigeration equipment.

The Powering Communities Program will provide grant funding up to 100 per cent of eligible project costs.

Please note that educational facilities and related entities such as P&C Associations are not eligible to apply for this grants program.

The deadline for expressions of interest is Friday, 18 June, at 5pm.

After all expressions of interest have been finalised, the Lilley community consultation panel will nominate a priority list of eligible organisations.

A suggestion might be to look at how you use your security in your home.



over your surroundings with power and control, instead of after the robbery when you are feeling powerless in this same situation.

Think about your home design; if you are out the back, is there clear vision to see the front door? Best practice recommends that security doors get key locked at all times, even while you are at home.

Senior Constable Christensen said, "Put the key somewhere away from the obvious places for anyone to find, and in a place handy for all the family to become aware of so there is no disruption to the safe practices that you are keeping."



estoration works have been undertaken to update the John Oxley Memorial at Shorncliffe, with further upgrade works expected to provide shade for visitors as well as information about the history of the area.

The memorial was installed by Council at the top of Allpass Parade in 2003 following a proposal made by Keep Sandgate Beautiful Association (KSBA) to commemorate Oxley's stopover at the location on his way to the Brisbane River.

Refurbishment of the memorial began in February 2021, and included cleaning the sandstone walls and access paths, constructing new gardens, replacing seating, and updating the book, which contains an excerpt from Oxley's diary about his arrival in Shorncliffe.

Councillor Jared Cassidy said he had been working with KSBA for a number of years now on this project.

"Ultimately, what we would like to see is a much more interesting and informative memorial that teaches people both about John Oxley and his journey around Brisbane and Moreton Bay, but also our Aboriginal history before settlement," Jared said.

In 1823, Governor Brisbane gave instructions to the Surveyor General, John Oxley, to assess what is now known as Bowen, Gladstone, and Moreton Bay as potential locations for a new convict settlement.

While in Quandamooka (Moreton Bay), Oxley came across three ticket-of-leave convicts, Thomas Pamphlett, John Finnegan, and Richard Parsons, who had become shipwrecked on Mulgumpin (Moreton Island).

These men would likely to have perished had they not been cared for by the Quandamooka people, who gave them food, shelter, and medical treatment for many months.

Pamphlett and Finnegan showed Oxley how to find Maiwar (the Brisbane River). Part of Oxley's journey involved camping overnight at what is now Cabbage Tree Creek at Shorncliffe, near to where the memorial is situated.

Jared said the next stages of the upgrade would include more shade, seating, and interpretative storyboards telling the history of the local area.

"I think with these improvements and upgrades this whole area will become a great space for local schools, community groups, and locals to enjoy and learn a bit about where we live," Jared said.

"Funding for the next stages will be sought in the coming financial year."





ouncil is encouraging locals to have their say on the draft Sandgate District Neighbourhood Plan and help shape the future of the growing bayside precinct.

City Planning chair Krista Adams said the draft Sandgate District Neighbourhood Plan had been informed by intensive community consultation, including nearly 700 responses.

"The north-eastern bayside community has been incredibly passionate about protecting the character and heritage of their neighbourhood," Krista said. "The changes we've made in the latest draft plan reflect this and will ensure any new development retains the current look and feel of the area."

"Changes to the plan show we're listening to the community and following State Government review, including reducing the maximum building height from six to four storeys in the Sandgate Centre, except for the Lagoon Street sub-precinct which allows for a maximum building height of five storeys.

"Low-impact industry zoning around Connaught Street will be retained to support local employment and drive business opportunities, and the community has told us they do not want developments of up to three storeys around the Deagon train station, which will no longer be included in the plan.

"We're also strengthening character and heritage measures in the area, with proposals to protect heritage, pre-1911 buildings, character properties, and streetscapes in Sandgate, Shorncliffe and Deagon."

Feedback on the draft plan is now open until midnight on Monday, 21 June, 2021 and will help inform the final Sandgate District Neighbourhood Plan.



eil MacKenzie has been sharing his passion for locomotives with the Bracken Ridge community for decades.

Neil, who turns 95 this year, was instrumental in the design and construction of the train track in McPherson Park, and contributed several of his own handmade trains to the Bracken Ridge Central Lions Club Train Days.

A retired mechanical draftsman, Neil said he had been building trains for years, including one-eighth-sized steam locomotives, which worked just like real steam locomotives.

"You put coal into the fire box, which heats up the water in the boilers to create steam, which then powers the pistons and tows the wagons around the track," Neil said.

Bracken Ridge Central Lions Club member and former club president Neil O'Sullivan said Neil MacKenzie provided his expertise in the laying of the five inch, 800-metre track when it was established in 1995.

"He had the plan for where the track went and was instrumental in getting the bends and turns right," Mr O'Sullivan said. "He fabricated the points to direct the trains into stations and laybys. He also organised the trains and manpower to run the trains on the day."

A self-confessed 'train-nut', Neil MacKenzie credits his achievements to concentration.

"If you concentrate and stay with the job, you get an internal reward," he said. "When you finally pull the regulator and the thing moves, there's your reward. It's inside. No money. It's an inside achievement."

Neil now resides in a nursing home in Clontarf, but attended almost every train day up until the beginning of 2020. As one of the founders of the railway, the MacKenzie Line is named in Neil's honour.

This year sees the Lions Club celebrating 25 years of train days, a monthly event which has raised thousands of dollars for charities and provided entertainment to generations of children.

Mr O'Sullivan said the train days would not have been possible without the contribution of Neil MacKenzie.

"I can honestly say that if it wasn't for the efforts of Neil MacKenzie, the train days would never have eventuated."

And what does Neil MacKenzie enjoy most about the train days?

"Meeting fellow train-nuts like me."

### GRANTS: THE FREE MONEY YOU NEED

### Grants – what are they and why would I need one?

ell, if you're in business, have a notfor-profit or a community group, then this is money that you can access and is available to those who meet the criteria. Grants aren't loans, and as long as you spend them on what you document in the application and acquit them by the deadline, the money is all yours. Sometimes matching the funding is required and the percentage is different depending on the funding.

According to marketing and communications expert Robyn Baker, there are "billions of dollars" in grants in Australia. "We are seeing a huge injection of funding to assist everyone right from the smallest of charities to the largest of corporation," Robyn said.

Funding grants are available for things such as energy needs, equipment upgrades, manufacturing, tourism, events, innovation, mental health, websites, marketing, and even employment. Small community and sporting groups access funding for field improvements, facilities, and equipment such as lighting and kitchen fit-outs.

Savvy business owners have known about this and accessed grants for a very long time.

Many in business would have heard about and possibly received funding from the State Government's Adaption Grant last year to assist them to stay open and operating. As part of the recovery bounce-back there have been further grants of this type, such as the \$50,000 business growth grant that opened in May. There is more to come here from State Government in the form of \$5,000 for basic needs for small businesses that opens 31 May, and \$15,000 for boosting businesses that opens in July. These are to assist the smaller businesses who might have missed out or just need a small amount to change up their way of business and re-engage customers through things such as websites and marketing.

All levels of government, along with philanthropic organisations offer funding. One such exciting grant, backed by SpaceX, Cisco and NetVault, is the Project Halo grant that will award one lucky Australian regional school a \$100,000 Information Technology internet package.

"The funding is there, you just have to apply," Robyn said.





n 7 April, 1852, the barque Thomas King was shipwrecked in the Torres Strait. Strangely, this led to the establishment of Sandgate, 1500 miles away.

The survivors – Captain Walker, the only passenger; Dr Hyslop, the second mate; and three seamen – made their way down the coast in a small boat, which they abandoned near Wide Bay and continued on foot. Along the way, they were attacked by Aborigines. Only two of the men, Captain Walker and Seaman Sherry, made it to Cabbage Tree Creek, where they hid in the marshes until they could get to the Moreton Bay settlement. Had they been able to get assistance, the others would probably have survived.

They lobbied and in 1853, Sandgate was declared a village. At that time, it was still part of New South Wales, until separation in 1859.

The first land sold in November 1853. Among the first to purchase land in the district was John Dowse. Unfortunately, an attack on him by an indigenous group put a stop to further land sales on the sea front until 1858. In 1861, a bridge was built over Cabbage Tree Creek, making travel between Sandgate and Brisbane possible.

The settlement grew rapidly and on 29 April, 1880, Sandgate was declared a town. Until then,

it had been part of the Nundah Shire. In 1882, the railway opened other travel possibilities between the township and Roma Street in the city. Land for a school was put aside in 1871, but the school was not opened until 1874. Classes began the year before in the Baptist chapel.

By 1906, Sandgate was a bustling township. Many visitors came to fish, go boating, or listen to the town band playing in the kiosk in Moora Park. Holiday makers came in droves and Sandgate quickly developed a reputation as a wonderful seaside resort. The town boasted a town hall, imposing post and telegraph office (which today is the Post Office Hotel), library, school for the arts, courthouse, and two convalescent homes.

Electricity took over from gas for lighting the town in 1924. At that time, there were over 7000 people living in the town.

At the beginning of WW2, a Sandgate RAAF station was established and accepted recruits and provided basic training such as marching, bayonet and rifle drill, plus aircraft identification. A rifle range and an observation post were placed on a nearby farm.

And so this glorious history grew from an inglorious shipwreck.

### HOUSE PRICES SOARING IN SANDGATE

he demand for property in the 4017 suburbs is reaching new heights as locals compete with an increasing number of people from interstate who wish to call the area home.

With 30,000 people moving to Queensland from interstate in 2020, the 4017 area has seen a housing boom and a jump in median house prices. The biggest rise has been in Sandgate, which recorded a 16.58 per cent median increase between April 2020 and March 2021, according to realestate.com.au.

Aarthi, who has been the owner of Sandgate Real Estate for 15 years, said that people had been investing more money into property.

"I think the lack of travel has made people invest in their homes and want to move into bigger homes," Aarthi said. "Also, interest rates being so low is giving buyers more confidence. "We have got a lot of interstate buyers that can't go anywhere and Queensland is the mecca of where to be. The 4017 area has everything. It's close to the city, close to the foreshore, there's more and more restaurants and shops opening up. We have got a really good, close-knit community. We are definitely becoming seen as a cool, coastal town."

With plenty of appeal for buyers in suburbs like Sandgate, Brighton, Shorncliffe, Deagon, and Bracken Ridge, properties are selling fast. Aarthi said Shorncliffe listings in particular were going very quickly.

"Shorncliffe is such a tightly held market. Nothing ever comes up, so when it does, it gets snapped up," she said. "Brighton, Deagon, and Bracken Ridge are definitely more affordable, so I find the listings are evenly spread.

"I am fortunate enough that I get a good rollaround of listings, but I do know that they are selling so quickly that there is a shortage of listings. I've definitely got more buyers than listings at the moment."

So what can buyers do to secure their dream home in this booming property market? Aarthi said it was important to be prepared.

"For buyers, have your finances in order and know what you can go to, especially in an auction. Have auction terms ready to go, otherwise you will miss out every time."

### **FISH OF THE MONTH**

**Sandcrab** Portunus armatus

andcrabs, blue swimmers, flower crab—whatever you call them they taste great, and although at this time of year they are slowing down, the recent rain should keep them around a little bit longer.

Chicken frames are the best for bait if checking your pots regularly, but I like fish frames if soaking them overnight.

A quick rundown of gear lets you legally use four crab pots per person, making sure they are labeled and marked correctly according to current Queensland Fisheries rules. Some good deals at our local tackle shops can be had by buying four crab pots at a time, with rope and floats.

Unfortunately, in this day and age due to people stealing crabs and pots, my preferred method

is to check my pots every hour or so and move them if not catching anything, making sure I keep them in sight at all times. You would be surprised how brazen some people are.

Blue swimmer crabs must be a minimum of 11.5 cm and only males can be kept. They make a mean Thai chilli stir-fry!

f you're looking for some traditional bush camping, adventure seeking, or a caravanners retreat, there are not too many places that can offer all the above in one location.

From backpacker bunkers, rustic self-contained cabins, bush tent and camper sites, and loads of fun and free farm activities, Bestbrook Farmstay and Mountain Resort caters for everyone.

Owner Ray Vincent said one of the most unique things about the resort was actually the horses. "We are one of the last working farms that has horses," he said. "When I was growing up there was a riding school on every corner, but now they are very rare."

Horses feature in the jam-packed daily program at the farm, including pony rides and lessons for the kids, and one to two-hour trail rides for the older riders. Two of Ray's daughters compete in polo events and can often be seen practising with their horses out in the paddocks.

Just 90 minutes from Brisbane, Bestbrook Farmstay is nestled in the picturesque Great Dividing Range and has been offering up traditional country hospitality since 2004. Ray said he came to the 500-acre farm to retire, but for the last 18 years he has never worked so hard in his life.

"It is no longer a working farm for profit, but indeed a working farm in that we do have cattle that we milk daily, and animals that we feed and care for," he said.

A father of seven, the self-proclaimed primary producer said the whole family was involved in running the farm, which has 142-beds, plus a restaurant and function centre in addition to the sprawling accommodation.

Ray said the most rewarding aspect of working the farm was when school children came for camps and trips. "When we ask the kids where milk comes from and they reply 'Coles aisle 5', we get great enjoyment physically showing them that milk comes from a cow," he said.

"Guests start their day with animal feeding, then pony rides and trails, followed by billy tea and damper in the stables, then we pop them onto the wagon for a ride, and stop to learn whip cracking and boomerang throwing. Then we end the day with drinks on the verandah."

Being open seven days a week, there's no rest for the wicked," Ray said.

Bestbrook Farmstay suits holiday makers, campers, and families, and aside from the village bunkhouse, there are also facilities to accommodate weddings, special events, and school camps. You can dine in at the on-site restaurant and have a beer at Ray's Bar, and if you're lucky, get a tour of Ray's Secret Treasures, an eclectic mix of farm relics and memorabilia.

With the cooler months approaching, the idea of sitting around the camp fire and listening to stories are memories to be made that will last a lifetime. Ray said that he and wife Elise really wanted to provide guests with memories that will last long after they have gone home. "We want everyone who comes here to have fun and feel part of the family," he said.






