he bigger the truck, the bigger the fun and all the excitement of Monster Truck Mania is about to roll out at the Brisbane Entertainment Centre this June.

After a Covid-related hiatus, a convoy of giantwheeled gargantuans will bring equally massive thrills to a live audience beneath the blazing floodlights of an all-weather arena.

Founder of Spokes Promotions Philip Christensen (the event's organiser) said the Brisbane leg of the 2022 Monster Truck Mania national tour would also feature the premiere of the newest monster truck on the planet.

"The wraps have yet to come off the next generation Devil's Taxi, which is built entirely in Australia and which the owners boast will make all American big trucks obsolete," Phillip said.

The new Devil's Taxi is set to carry on the tradition of the Chevy Silverado monster truck, which held the world record for longest wheelstands up until 2020.

According to Philip, all trucks will be ready for the Brisbane campaign where they will be tested with a series of missions, which will include a hard fought freestyle exhibition and much more.

"Alongside the big trucks, there are zany Junior Trucks, a blazing Jet Car, a wheelstanding Jeep, a

crazy WWII tank with a mind of its own, worldclass backflipping Freestyle Motocrossers and even a laser show," Philip said.

The event is family friendly with the weatherproof venue in Boondall featuring velvet seats, high-tech lighting and giant digital screens to ensure comfort and up close and personal entertainment — including dramatic replays.

"It's all back, bigger and better; with the ground set to certainly pound with the whole monster truck lineup," Philip said.

Sessions are scheduled to suit family members young and old with matinees from 1pm on Saturday 18 June (similarly on Sunday 19 June) and ticket prices start from \$35.

"To make it easier for everyone to attend, we've timed things to avoid the usual family weekend commitments," Phillip said.

new way of caring for others has opened at Sandgate. Nexus Care is a not-for-profit organisation that aims to help those looking for a fresh start.

The charity has been running for 11 years based at Everton Park, and manager Josh Plumb said they were delighted to have opened a second location in Sandgate.

"We're about helping the journey of individuals and families to find a fresh start," he said.

"There are two things we do – firstly, initial relief in the form of nutritious food parcels; and secondly, financial support alongside mentoring, or coaching.

"We have a community-based nutritionist to provide balanced and healthy food parcels – they're good for the budget, good for the family, and you will be able to make complete, healthy meals with them."

Josh added they had funding from the Department of Social Services to offer financial help and advice.

"Longer term, we provide the tools to help people get back on their feet." he said.

"We find that the initial food parcel helps people lift their head beyond the crisis of the day, and then our coaching and mentoring comes in and we tailor our programs there to help people individually.

"We help people get a fresh start, it's a holistic program that restores hope."

In March 2020, Nexus Care experienced a 40 per cent rise in demand for their services, which continued until the end of 2021.

Josh said the past two years had been difficult for many, and Nexus Care were committed to making a difference in Sandgate.

"We had already been working a lot with SANDBAG, complementing some of their services and collaborating with them on others," he said.

"Everton Park will remain our main office, but we realised people had been travelling to us from other areas and that has been steadily increasing. We had already committed to coming to Sandgate before the recent flooding."

Josh added Nexus Care were "starting small" in Sandgate, with walk-ins for food parcels welcome on Thursdays from 11am to 2pm, and financial help available by appointment.



andgate residents are no strangers to living healthy and active lifestyles, and with such a diverse range of fitness options available locally, it's hard to decide where to start. With the exciting recent opening of JTA Training Systems, a Muay Thai gym, right in the heart of Sandgate, there's one more family-friendly option on the table.

Originating in Thailand, Muay Thai is a popular local sport with regular shows and competitions each month. "We use punches, kicks, knees and elbows," owner Jojo Ancajas explained. "Hence why it's called 'The Art of 8 Limbs'."

Jojo fell in love with the sport when he was just a teenager.

"I had just moved to New Zealand from the Philippines and was being bullied at school because of my accent and size," Jojo said.

"Thankfully, I was invited to join a local Muay Thai class by a fellow student who was dealing with some of the same issues. I was hooked immediately."

Jojo draws on his own experience to inspire young kids today to build the confidence needed to overcome adversity. "As a teen, I was invited to compete after only being involved in the sport for one year," Jojo said. "I thought they were crazy putting me up against someone I thought I would have no chance of winning against. However, my trainer believed in me and through determination, discipline, humility, and a willingness to take a chance - I won the fight!"

While this type of sport may sound intimidating at first, Jojo assures that it's no more risky than playing AFL or rugby as they involve just as much physical contact.

"Muay Thai also focuses on respect, honour, and loyalty," he said. "You'll also burn a lot of calories as it's quite intense - and it's realistic for self defense should you ever need it."

While the gym has had a great response from the local community so far, Jojo looks forward to welcoming new members of all ages and abilities.

"Guests are welcome to come down to watch and ask questions," he said. "We are there to help, support, and educate others on all that Muay Thai offers."

udiences will be chuffed to bits when a celebration of one of Britain's most popular classical music concerts comes to Sandgate this month.

The South East Queensland Symphonic Winds (SEQSW) are staging a tribute to the Last of the Proms, famously held each year in London's Royal Albert Hall.

Musical director Adam Pittard said the SEQSW were always thinking of new and exciting additions to their regular appearances at Sandgate Town Hall.

"This year we are very pleased to bring such a well-known event to Sandgate," Adam said.

"The Last Night of the Proms has been a mainstay of British culture for almost 130 years, and is still one of the most recognised classical music events in the world today.

"Of course, with 2022 being the Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen, and 5 June falling over the official celebrations, we are thrilled to be an unofficial part of that celebration."

The SEQSW are based at Deagon, with musicians ranging from 15 to 80 years old.

"The SEQSW has existed for almost 40 years, but has called the 4017 home since 2011," Adam said. "We are a 60-piece wind ensemble, and we also have an 18-piece big

band as part of our organisation."

Adam said the Last Night of the Proms historically consisted of a lighter selection of music followed by a set order of patriotic British tunes.

"The event will start with the rousing Overture to Orpheus in the Underworld and will feature music from Grainger, Elgar and Dvorak," he said.

"Traditionally the Last Night of the Proms finishes with a set order of well-known British pieces including Rule Britannia, the Pomp and Circumstance March No. 1 and Hubert Parry's Jerusalem. Parts of the celebration include audience singing participation and lyrics will be provided for the audience to join in."

Attendees are encouraged to dress up and bring along their British flags.

"We will be running a raffle, and we have commissioned a British themed piece of art as first prize," Adam said.

In the United Kingdom, the BBC Proms is an eight-week festival of orchestral concerts, culminating in the Last Night of the Proms.

ANDBAGs annual Tree Planting Ceremony is a key event in the community, supporting victims of family domestic violence.

Taking place on June 8, the ceremony involves planting trees to honour those who have lost their lives to domestic violence and to remember those who have been left behind. Manager of SANDBAGs Domestic Family Violence Counselling Program, Kym de Thierry, said the event is open to all.

"Members of the public, local schools and community centres, groups and other key agencies, are all invited to participate in the tree planting ceremony in memory and support of those who have survived, and those who haven't," Kim said.

"We plant trees as a symbol of those women and children we walk alongside within our counselling service, and of those who have led the way in our journey against domestic and family violence."

"Like the trees we plant, we hope victims and survivors will grow in strength and resilience and in turn, one day offer shelter, support and nourishment to our families, our children and our community as a whole." Kim said.

Following Domestic Violence Prevention month in May, the ceremony includes speeches and provides a space where the community can connect and support each other.

FLOOD RESILIENCE FUND

FROM THE OFFICE OF STIRLING HINCHCLIFFE MP

ember for Sandgate, Stirling
Hinchcliffe MP said he is pleased to
advise registrations of interest for the
\$741million Resilient Homes Fund through
which damaged homes can be raised, repaired
and retrofitted, or voluntarily bought back, are
now open.

"Grants will be available to assist eligible homeowners to repair or retrofit their homes to incorporate flood resilient design and materials." Mr Hinchcliffe said.

"This could include replacement of floor coverings with a water-resistant finish such as tiles or polished concrete and moving power outlets to above recognised flood levels.

"Many local house owners will be glad these grants will also be available to eligible homeowners to raise homes to reduce the impacts of future flood events by lifting living areas and rooms above the defined flood level."

In high-risk situations where repairing, retrofitting or raising are not considered suitable options, a voluntary buy-back of the residence will be considered, said Federal Member for Lilley, Anika Wells MP.


"Voluntary home buy-backs will be on a case-by-case basis and will consider a range of factors including the frequency of flooding, severity of flooding, structural safety of the property, future flood risk and broader social impacts," Ms Wells said.

"This is the largest home resilience program of its kind ever to be delivered in Australia."

Councillor for Deagon Ward, Jared Cassidy remarked that the register of interest is the first important step in helping flood-affected Queenslanders make their homes more resilient following the 2021-22 disaster season.

"Together with information and flood modelling from local councils, and damage impact assessment data from the Queensland Fire and Emergency Service, this register of interest will help the Queensland Government in understanding how many properties require assistance, the scope of assistance requested, and also inform detailed rollout plans." Mr Cassidy said.

he Einbunpin Festival has been bringing the Sandgate community together since 1992. This year marks 30 years of the festival and previous Deagon Ward Councillors Denise Herbert and Victoria Newton are celebrating with current Councillor Jared Cassidy by reflecting on the history of this much-loved event.

When Denise was elected in 1991, she was approached by locals wanting another festival after the Back to Sandgate Festival folded.

"I called a public meeting at the Sandgate Town Hall to explore if there was support and if so, what kind of a festival should evolve." Denise said.

"The meeting was very well attended and there was strong support for a community-based festival showcasing local groups, schools and talent. A committee was formed and the Einbunpin Festival was launched."

Victoria took over as Councillor and festival chairperson in 2000.

"Building on the work of Denise and the Einbunpin Festival community, we grew from a one stage festival to one with multiple performance spaces for local musicians and performers, turned the bridge from the lagoon into a community art gallery, hatching the Bunpin as a 3D mascot, and creating a digital presence through the

website and social media to help keep locals in the loop and involved." Victoria said.

Jared said this would be his sixth year as festival chairperson.

"I think people have come to see the Einbunpin Festival as a natural part of the community -- having lasted this long, it's part of the fabric," Jared said.

"However, it takes a lot of organising and volunteer hours and community sponsors to pull it off. I know each of the stall holders and performers have to spend a lot of time preparing too, but I would love to see more community involvement in the festival's organisation.

"Some of my happiest memories as a kid growing up locally were attending the festival, and I can tell you I never imagined I would be organising it one day! You get to see the very best of the whole community all in one place helping out at a festival like ours."

Denise said she would like to pay credit to the committees over the years.

"They have been hard working and have remained loyal to the original set of ideals – a true community event," she said.

Denise and Victoria will join Jared as special guests at the official opening of this year's festival.





id you know that the school-yard game of Tug-O-War has become a national sport?

Requiring stability, strength, stamina and endurance, the game has become very competitive, with the 2022 Nationals being held this August at the Backyard Bonanza in Bracken Ridge. And it's got a lot to do with the Brisbane Bulldogs Tug-O-War founder and team coach, Graham Egan.

"Tug-O-War was a regular pastime and exercise drill when I was in the army. I was first introduced to Tug-O-War when I was stationed in Malaysia in 1968. When I got out of the army, I needed something to keep me fit, so I decided to use Tug-O-War as part of my fitness regime." Graham said.

More than 50 years later, the 74 year old Vietnam veteran is still using TOW to keep fit, starting the Brisbane Bulldogs team back in 2002. They are set to compete at the 2022 Australian National Tug-O-War Championships, and hope to take several teams to the competition.

"There are six people to a team, which are made up of up to eight weight divisions and a mixed division, to foster more involvement of women. Back in the 90's we had all female teams. So now we are hoping more females will give the sport a go," he said.

Graham went on to add that a great way to encourage kids to try out for TOW, is to come and watch the Army Cadets who, along with several Queensland based army teams, will be holding their own competitions over the weekend.

Graham added the highlights of TOW is the challenge of getting six grown men together and forcing them in a direction they don't want to go.

"It's almost like, in the good old days, the best way to fix a broken down car was getting everyone together to get the car going. Everyone would push and pull and work as a team to get the car running again.

"It's that main ingredient of working as a team, if you don't, you lose."

The Brisbane Bulldogs are currently recruiting new team members. "Come down for a chat and have a training session. We are looking for fitness buffs, tradies, gym-goers etc to come and try out. We would love to add more teams to our squad for Nationals."

The Backyard Bonanza is hoping to attract up to 10,000 visitors this year, with 2022 the first time Tug-O-War has been included, and according to Graham is "the most important attraction of the weekend."

ocal kids have been busy making the most of some exciting upgrades to the play equipment at Arthur Davis Park.

The popular playground on the foreshore at Flinders Parade underwent a full refurbishment earlier this year thanks to funding from Brisbane City Council.

Deagon Ward Councillor Jared Cassidy said the fences were down and the playground was now open for all to enjoy.

"Many of our playgrounds are getting to the end of their usable life, so I have been pushing for replacements like these to be prioritised for the last few years," Jared said.

"The playground equipment had been there for a long time and while some of it was still serviceable, many components had reached the end of their usable life. I was pleased to see some of them recycled and retained in the new playground. The pirate ship and the all-abilities carousel were retained."

Jared did an online survey last year to collect views about what the community liked most about the playground and what people wanted to see improved. He said he provided the feedback to the Council's Parks team.

"The feedback I received was very positive and

we were able to incorporate some of these ideas into the new playground," he said. "There is a good variety of equipment for kids of different ages now, which was important to people, as was incorporating the natural environment into the playground.

"Playing amongst the trees is pretty special. I've visited a few times, including with my nephews and their two favourite parts were the slides and the climbing wall. The addition of the sandstone blocks and timber also allows for nature-based play and also doubles up as more seating for mums and dads."

Children have three new slides to play on, including a 1.2 metre double slide, as well as a spiderweb and inclined pommel walk.

Nearby Peebo and Dagwood Place has also received an important upgrade following community requests for more shade.

"We have arranged for some shade sails to be installed which will make this special playground sun safe all year round now," Jared said.

f all the cool local activities that Brisbane has to offer, whale watching definitely tops the list. For the last 25 years, Captain Kerry Lopez, of Brisbane Whale Watching, has been giving guests the thrilling opportunity to see our local humpback whales up close in their natural habitat - right here in Moreton Bav.

Brisbane Whale Watching kicks off their 2022 season on June 11th and Kerry guarantees sightings right through until the end of October.

"We're excited to be celebrating our 26th year of doing the tours," she said. "Most people are quite surprised to learn that we have such a great environmental treasure with so many whales right here in Moreton Bay Marine Park."

Kerry explained that thankfully the whale population in Moreton Bay has grown over the last few decades as people have learned how best to care for the whales and respect their needs.

"Moreton Bay seems to have become a favourite nursery area for them," Kerry said. "When I first started doing the tours, it could take more than an hour just to find one or two pods at the height of the season - now guests might be lucky enough to see 30 whales on a single trip!"



For Kerry, her favourite part of the job is seeing the reactions on guests' faces when they sight a whale for the first time. "The whales are just so playful, resilient and curious," she said. "I've seen 90-year-olds through to young children with tears in their eyes, in absolute awe at these amazing animals. When they see a 45-tonne humpback rise from the depths right in front of their eyes, it's quite an experience."

After spending so many years observing the whales, Kerry is more committed than ever to continue to create passenger awareness with regards to these beautiful mammals.

"The whales are just so intelligent," she said. "My onboard commentary focuses on the whales, their habitat, and how we can all help their population grow by keeping our oceans clean and free from any pollutants."

The Atkin Monument a good man remembered

ehind St Margaret's Anglican Church is a quiet spot that both conjures an earlier time in the settlement of Sandgate and invites contemplation of a life well lived. There, in the shade of a neighbouring camphor laurel tree, is a monument to a man who, although short-lived and now not well known to many people, contributed much to the early life of our state.

That man is Robert Travers Atkin, a journalist, member of the Queensland parliament and champion of democracy and social reform at a time when neither was universally approved nor accessible. Born in Ireland in 1841, Robert arrived, with his wife, in Queensland in 1864. After farming near Clermont, they relocated to Brisbane where Robert went into journalism, becoming editor and later proprietor of several publications.

In 1870, he was elected to the Queensland parliament and held his seat until 1872, when he resigned because of worsening health. Through his journalism he advocated for a more fair and equal society, promoted new industries and argued against injustices like the trafficking of South Sea Island people to work on sugar plantations.

Robert lived for a while in Hamilton but later moved to Sandgate. He liked to sit on the little hill where his monument now stands and look out over the new settlement towards Moreton Bay. He died in Sandgate on 25 May 1872, aged just 31, and was buried there, in his favourite spot. Later that year his friends in the Hibernian Society erected a monument over his grave.

Robert left £50 in his will towards the construction of a church nearby. The foundation stone of the original St Margaret's (now the old rectory) was one left over after completion of the monument.

Also buried and memorialised there is Robert's sister, Grace, who worked as a governess, started a girls school at Hamilton and assisted in establishing the first girls grammar school in Australia. She died on 26 Jan 1876 at age 32. Perhaps, as an educationist, she rests peacefully within earshot of the children playing at the Sandgate school.

The monument gradually fell into disrepair. It has undergone several restorations, first in 1937, paid for by Robert's son Lord Atkin of Aberdovey, a renowned British jurist. A further restoration was undertaken in 1992, largely paid for with funds raised by Lord Atkin's great grandchildren. The monument as it is today is the result of a further refurbishment, begun in 2016. A ceremony to commemorate the Atkin family and dedicate the restored monument took place on May 29, attended by the Honourable Susan Kiefel AC, Chief Justice of Australia. A fitting memorial indeed to a good man.

Join the walk to fight Mito

Whether you walk, jog or run, every step of the Bloody Long Walk will raise money towards a cure for mitochondrial disease.

Around 1300 people are expected to participate in the Mito Foundation's annual fundraising event, walking 35 kilometres from Sandgate to the finish line at Kangaroo Point Cliffs Park.

Mito Foundation chief executive officer, Sean Murray said the walk was part of a nationwide initiative that supported families affected by mitochondrial disease (mito).

"So far, the response has been unbelievable for our Brisbane event, which is one of the ten

Bloody Long Walks taking place across Australia this year," Sean said.

"The truth is every week in Australia one child will develop a life-threatening form of mito – that's 50 Aussie kids a year. Yet most people have no idea that the disease exists."

> Mito is a genetic disorder with no cure and few effective treatments.

"All money raised will help ramp up our support services for mito families, while funding vital research into prevention, treatments and cures," Sean said.

As well as this, the Queensland Government is investing nearly \$190 million in partnership with Telstra to secure better, faster internet for all Queensland State Schools. This game changing investment will boost the average bandwidth per student in two phases to one megabit per second in 2023 (40 times faster than current speeds), and five Mbps in 2026 (200 times faster)!

At our local state schools in Sandgate, internet speed per student is planned to increase from the current combined bandwidth of 360 Mbps to 24,750 Mbps by 2026. This is great news for local families and students!

STUDENTS HONOUR SANDGATE'S FALLEN SOLDIERS

ocal students have taken part in a special project to pay tribute to Sandgate's soldiers who lost their lives in the First World War.

Bracken Ridge State High School students honoured fallen soldiers at their Anzac Day commemorative service in April, wearing badges with the names and services details of veterans with connections to Sandgate.

Principal Regina Garrick said the students were very proud to wear the badges at the school ceremony.

"Perhaps you could say that it has made it more 'real' for the students through the connection with soldiers from the Sandgate district," Regina said. "The information shared about the service details for each soldier helped students realise the impact of war and the importance of not forgetting our fallen soldiers."

At the ceremony, the badges were presented to the students by representatives of the Sandgate RSL Sub Branch, including Doug Cooney from the Australian Defence Force and army veteran Doug Warden. The students collected the badges as the names of the fallen were called out and war grave

information was shared on a PowerPoint.

Photos of the final resting places of the soldiers were provided by Sub Branch committee member Jim Lakey, who visited their overseas graves a few years ago. Jim gave the information to the school ceremony's event coordinator, Vicki Sinclair.

"I took down the names of the fallen soldiers from the Sandgate Memorial," Jim said. "I made a point to visit all the graves and took pictures. I got those pictures to Vicki and a map of where they are in France and Belgium."

War memorials and honour rolls in the Sandgate area commemorate a total of 52 soldiers who died in World War I.

Regina said the students had commented to her after the service that it was really sad because some of the soldiers were so young.

"I have every confidence in our young people that they won't forget our fallen soldiers," she said.

"Keeping alive the names of those fallen soldiers will ensure an ongoing connectedness to our community, but more importantly will act as a reminder that the actions of our fallen soldiers continue to impact on our lives moving forward."

ueensland's coldest town, Stanthorpe, set in the heart of the granite belt region, is home to the Queensland College of Wine and Tourism.

In conjunction with the USQ, the College of Wine and Tourism, and the almost freezing winter temperatures provides the perfect climate for growing grapes.

OCWT CEO Peter O'Reilly, said that since the college was established in 2007 their operations train across three sectors, including the Schools program, VET sector and tertiary education.

"The college evolved out of Stanthorpe highschool and the local wine industry coming together about 20 years ago, and we are now the host body for about 70 schools around the state, and training for anyone interested in the wine and tourism industry in Queensland.

"We also have a number of courses and short programs which bring people into the region, such as our one day pruning school, or winemaker for a weekend course," he said.

Mr O'Reilly said the key message about the college is their focus on training in a commercial environment. The college boasts a research vineyard with 96 varieties, plus commercial vineyard, winery, laboratory, and award winning commercial restaurant and function centre.

"The Varias Function Centre is of an incredibly high standard, catering for weddings, corporate

and special events. Not only that, but the granite belt region is such a wonderful destination for local produce.

"The jams, preserves, chutneys, vinegars, verjus etc from this area are just amazing. We have Australia's number one vinegar factory right here and we export all over the world.

Anything that's got a Maggie Beer label on it comes out of a shed in Stanthorpe," he said.

With most of SEQ, including Stanthorpe, having a boom in local tourism during Covid, Mr O'Reilly said he doesn't think that will scale back.

"We are seeing a level of sophistication in the tourism offered here that just wasn't in place years ago."

The College continues to thrive with commercial training across the hospitality industry and plans to keep producing not just award winning wines, but excellent industry leaders.

"We always say you can learn to cook in the hospitality kitchens at the school, but readiness to work in the industry comes from when you can stand in front of a group of people paying for lunch and you've got to perform. You've made a mess of a steak, you're under pressure, and you have the chef yelling in your ear, that's when you know you're ready."

MOVIE REVIEW - TOP GUN: MAVERICK

his film should not have been this amazing! On paper, it's a sequel to a much beloved movie made over 30 years ago, there's no way it could be any good? In reality, it was one of the truest sequels I've ever seen (especially for one made so long after the original). The filmmakers have managed to not only create a great movie in its own right but deliver a true love letter to its predecessor – not an easy feat. It's unashamed of the clear parallels it makes to Top Gun, using similar plot points and scenes not to mention a medley of the original soundtrack - while also deliberately subverting expectations.

So Mayerick is back, still in the same rank, still pushing the envelope and sticking it to the man. Until he's recruited to teach the young guns how to survive an almost suicidal mission into enemy territory. The story expands the lore of Top Gun, bolstering minor characters from the first film making it feel more like part of a saga than a direct seguel.

Tom Cruise personifies cool, giving the new kids on the block (both the actors and their characters) their moments in the sun, even letting the laughs be at his expense. Which is amongst the many surprises that this film has to offer, it's effortlessly funny which helps relieve some of the more tense scenes, of which there are plenty. The stakes feel real, you want all of these characters to return home - even when they're only working through their training. This is owed in part to the incredibly authentic action scenes, opting for real planes over CGI. Don't think that this is just a popcorn flick, there's the subtlety and nuance of an indie drama, implying key moments with words unspoken, rather than spelling out the inevitable dialogue.

I felt like I was a kid again, walking out of the movie babbling about the cool action scenes and funny moments, instantly ready for a return flight. Bring your family and experience Top Gun: Maverick how it was intended - on the big screen. In cinemas May 26.




Scribbled Rabbitfish

he Scribbled Rabbitfish Siganus fuscescens is locally known as a 'Happy Moment'. Typically, Australian lingo dictates that the exact opposite is what you will get if you are stung by one of these fish. The venom is not as toxic as Stonefish or Scorpion Fish and won't kill you but the pain is quite severe even for many hours afterwards. At the time of writing this, first aid is to place the affected area in water as hot as you can tolerate for 30 min or until pain subsides.

They are very common in Moreton Bay, frequently found and caught around Shorncliffe Pier and Woody Point Jetty. Reaching about 40cm in length they are actually quite good eating. They also have no size or bag limit. Not your typical live bait species but I have been known to use them occasionally and a few times have caught large Estuary Cod with them.
