How Organised Activities Can Benefit Kids For Life

eing part of a local sports club, youth group, dance class or any other type of organised activity group can have far reaching benefits for children and teens that will often stay with them for the rest of their lives. Beyond learning new skills, being part of a shared interest group helps to build confidence, a sense of belonging and positive social skills.

Former police officer and local karate instructor, Sensei John Cahill from JKA Brighton, has seen first-hand the difference that having an involvement in an organised activity can have on youth when it comes to making good decisions in life.

As a police officer for 28 years, John spent the majority of his service interacting with all sectors of society. "I guess I saw a lot of the good and the bad," he said. "My experiences made me realise that young people who were involved in positive organised activities - no matter what they entailed, were less likely to come to the notice of police or authorities. That is not to say that this was the only solution, but it was noticeable."

Practicing karate since the 1970s, and running his own club for more than 20 years now, John hopes that the sport's self confidence building aspect is what will have the most profound effect on his students.

"I've seen many children who initially felt very shy and overwhelmed go on to participate in tournaments and take on leadership roles within their class," he said. "This type of gained confidence can be of tremendous assistance as they face challenges or stressful situations in all aspects of their lives."

Although karate is most commonly known as a form of self defense, the benefits of self confidence, physical fitness, agility and flexibility are all apparent.

"The main hope I have for students, and predominantly junior students, is that they build a confidence that evolves into character building as they progress," he said. "I hope that they first learn to respect themselves and then carry that on to others through kindness, understanding and acceptance."

Organiser Louise Gordon told the Sandgate Guide the community could expect a "mini-Fkka".

"Making it affordable for everyone is really important to us, so it's free to go in," she said. "We're going to have lots of rides, performances, and show bags as well."

For the younger children, the characters from Paw Patrol will be making an appearance, with Street Science also coming along to perform for the whole family.

"People can expect to see lots of displays from community groups and schools, we've got a boxing demonstration and the Brisbane School of Iberian Swordsmanship will be there as well," Louise said.

She added the day had a focus on sustainability.

"We're encouraging everyone to bring their own reusable water bottles, which you will be able to fill up for free," Louise said.

"Brisbane City Council will be there with lots of displays and advice about things like composting, so people will be able to come along and talk to the council staff and get lots of tips."

Crowds of up to 5000 are expected to flock to McPherson Park, with the Lions Club miniature steam train rides a big drawcard.

"There will also be lots of different food options - including gluten free and vegan ice-cream, donuts, Indian food, and those delicious baked potatoes," Louise said.

"A bit of everything, for everyone's taste. And that's really what the whole day is about - we're making sure there's something on offer for everyone, we want the whole community to come along and really enjoy the day.

"Post-Covid, it's so important to get out and support these community events."

LOGIE WIN FOR LOCAL FILMMAKER

feature documentary written and directed by Brighton resident Dean Gibson has won a TV Week Logie Award.

Incarceration Nation took home the Logie for Outstanding Factual or Documentary Program at the awards ceremony at the Gold Coast in June. Dean said he felt shocked when Incarceration Nation was announced as the winner.

"Both me and my producer Helen Morrison never really thought that our film could compete with the calibre of the other finalists," Dean said.

"But during the night and ceremony, I had many people come and compliment the film and had a good feeling. Because our film was late in the ceremony, I spent much of the time talking myself out of the win. When we won, I just felt a level of satisfaction and recognition for all the hard work put in behind the scenes and by the courage of the people and families who shared their story of trauma and pain at the hands of the justice system in Australia."

Dean Gibson is a multi-award winning Aboriginal filmmaker with more than 12 years' experience

in documentary and drama. Incarceration Nation, which took around four years to make, premiered last year on National Indigenous Television Network (NITV).

"It took a lot of research and commitment to dig in when at times it felt just too hard – particularly given the gravity of the content." Dean said.


"It tells the tragic story of incarceration across Australia through the eyes of First Nation Australians, bringing in an historical context leading up to its ongoing impact today through systemic failures. The film is told through a combination of archive footage, graphics, interviews and most importantly – real lived experiences."

The film is currently available to watch for free on SBS On Demand.

"We also encourage groups and companies to create their own screenings for members and staff," Dean said.

"It's an important film to watch. It gives a deeper and more considered context around the impact and collision between First Nation Australians and the justice system. It will hurt and it will create emotions – but for me, the timing of Incarceration Nation is so important as hopefully this nation begins to understand Australia's true back/black story."

"One new thing we're doing is to pair up a member of our senior women's team with each girls-only team so that they can be role models for the younger players," Dave said. "We also held a very fun and successful Female Football Night earlier this season with special training sessions, events and a game featuring our senior women's team."





Grace was born in 1930 at Ipswich, where her family lived until they moved, in 1936, to Brighton, thus beginning her lifelong association with and interest in this area. She attended Sandgate State School but left school in Grade 7 and went to work. She married Herbert Beecher in 1956 at the Bald Hills Methodist Church.

Grace's interest in historical research was piqued when she and two nieces decided to research their family's history. As her interest and expertise in local history grew, the State Library, the State Archives, the John Oxley Library and a number of historical cemeteries became her regular haunts.

The Sandgate Historical Museum was lucky enough to attract Grace and Herbert as members in 1986, at which time she began to deploy her research skills in the service of the museum. At that time, the museum had few photos, a situation she set about remedying by appealing, through the local paper, for people to send in their historical photos. She copied the pictures for both the museum's files and the John Oxley Library. Her research efforts were not confined to Sandgate. She also worked on behalf of many other historical organisations including the Windsor, Enoggera and Nundah historical societies and the Nundah and Bald Hills cemeteries.

It was not only the museum that benefited from Grace's researches: she published



articles of historical interest in the Bayside Star, provided unstinting assistance to families wishing to research their history, and delivered informative talks to many schools and other organisations. A search for Grace Beecher in the State Library catalogue reveals the extent of her impressive oeuvre.


Mrs Barbara Bow, who has volunteered at the museum since 1996, says of Grace, "[She] had a fantastic memory for dates and family relationships" and that she "could help anyone with research". Not the least amazing thing about Grace is that she never learned to drive, so all her journeys to libraries, cemeteries, archives and to talk to people about local history were undertaken by public transport.

The Sandgate Museum, in appreciation of the enormous amount of work Grace did on its behalf, has documented and catalogued the presentations she made over the years and the many articles and items that she wrote. The museum hopes to collate and publish its Grace Beecher Collection in the future.

andgate High School students, along with students from Aspley State High School and Bracken Ridge State High School are dipping their toes in the international film space, collaborating with Womenspace to say lights, camera, action.

Stuffit Film Festival is a competition that originated in Nambour and now has international input. The competition is aimed at high school students who are required to make a film of up to 15 minutes with all the work being done by the students.

A group of high school students have been meeting at Womenspace Sandgate and in just 10 afternoons, have made a film to submit to the competition.

Secretary of Womenspace, Ann Ingamells, said the project has fostered relationships and has allowed the young women to collaborate on a creative level.

"When they began, they were new to Womenspace and did not know each other. So they have been developing relationships as they go, and working on the film together," Ann said.

"The final product is a film about making a film. It shows how they ensured they all had a part, what they did and learned along the way, and the kinds of interests that the girls making the film have. It is quirky, creative and fun."

Bree-Ella Davidson, from Aspley State High School, is one of the young women who has been participating in getting the film ready for the competition.

"The film is like a documentary, a look behind the scenes of what we do at the Centre. For me it has been a great experience, I've made new friends and it's helped me to socialise more," said Bree-Flla.

"I study drama so I'm into the whole acting thing, so that has helped as well."

This project has offered an opportunity for women of an older generation and younger women to meet at and learn from each other and work collaboratively to see the development of the film from conception through to the final entry into the Film Festival.

The Young Women's Project at Womenspace happens with the support of a grant from the Brisbane City Council Lord Mayor's Fund. The local community will be able to see the film at the Womenspace Anniversary celebrations on the weekend on 24 and 25 September with the winner being announced in October.

ave you signed up for Council's free early warning alerts yet? The alert service provides advanced warning for severe weather or other public safety events. This helps prepare and protect people and property. The service issues alerts

only if the Bureau of Meteorology (BoM) issues a severe weather warning for the Brisbane Local Government area.

You will receive alerts for potentially dangerous weather events, such as hail and severe

thunderstorms, destructive winds and cyclones, floods from a number of different sources including creek, river and king tides, public safety alerts. Severe weather alerts are sent after BoM has issued a severe weather warning that includes the Brisbane area. Some storm activity, including strong winds, thunder, lightning and rain may not reach BoM's triggers. Warning alerts are not distributed in this case. Residents whose registered address is within the BoM warning area, will receive early warning alerts. Creek flooding alerts are offered for specific properties that may be affected by creek flooding in certain suburbs.

You can register online at ewa.brisbane.qld.gov.au/ for free early warning alerts or contact Council on 3403 8888. You can also download the Weatherzone app to your mobile device and register through the Council tab.



20 YEARS SINCE SANDGATE BOARDING HOUSE FIRE

his month will mark the twenty year anniversary of a fatal boarding house fire in Sandgate.

No cause has ever been established for the fire which destroyed the Seabreeze Lodge on Sunday, 18 August, 2002, killing three occupants.

At approximately 11:30pm, two couples travelling in a car noticed a fire at the large timber dwelling on 30 Second Avenue. They contacted emergency services before attempting to douse the flames with a hose and calling for residents to get out of the house.

A fire truck from Sandgate Station responded within four minutes of the call, but by then the structure was almost completely engulfed by flames and there was no opportunity to enter the building to find or rescue anyone trapped inside.

It was later determined that the fire started beneath the main floor at the front of the house, spreading to and destroying the adjoining premises, which was also used as a boarding house.

At the time, news reports said police described the fire as "suspicious", however to date no one has been charged in relation

to the fire or the deaths of the three men killed in the fire – the caretaker, 58, and two residents, aged 21 and 71.

An inquest into the deaths was conducted in 2005 but no cause of the fire could be established by the police, the fire service or the inquest.

The coroner's findings noted the possibility that the fire was ignited by an electrical or gas source, but no proof of either could be found.

The inquest was also unable to rule out the possibility that an unknown person started the fire underneath the premises.

In 2005, the owner of the boarding house pleaded guilty to charges relating to the fire, including failing to provide a fire escape plan and other adequate safety measures.

Senior Sergeant Jon Kent, the officer in charge at Sandgate Station, said the Queensland Police Service was committed to the continuing investigation relating to the boarding house fire.

"There remains a \$250,000 reward for information identifying the offender/s for this matter and I urge any person with information to contact Policelink 131 444 or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000," Senior Sergeant Kent said.



Your Organic Garden in August

WITH SALLY EBERHARDT

f you have limited space or aren't sure how to start growing your organic garden, a container garden may be the perfect solution. Pots, planters and even hanging baskets can grow your own delicious, healthy, organic

food. And with the price of lettuce nowadays, you could save a fortune!

Container gardens are no-dig, use little water and are easy to shift to find the right position. All you need is a large pot, some organic potting mix and your seeds or seedlings.

Plant seeds or seedlings according to directions on the packet or punnet. Potting mix provides ideal conditions for seed germination so spread seeds out. Don't plant seedlings too close together – think about how big each plant will grow and leave space to reach its potential. Tomatoes only need one strong plant per pot, beans and peas only two to three plants per pot.

Mulch seedlings immediately but let seeds sprout first. Fertilize your plants every 1-2 weeks with organic liquid fertilizer. Mix fertiliser and water in a watering can and drench foliage as well as the soil.

What to plant now - strawberries (from runners), tomatoes, capsicums, beans, pumpkin, cucumber, zucchinis, lettuce, eggplant, okra, rosella, cabbage, silverbeet, corn.

Growing up in Melbourne, George is a proud AFL supporter and loves playing as part of the Sandgate Hawks.


"I love the community spirit around the Club, its members, and also keeping fit as part of a team," George said.

ou're Dead to Me is the brainchild of Greg Jenner - public historian, author and Chief Nerd on the excellent BBC series 'Horrible Histories'. He's been helping the young and old alike get their heads around history for years and now he's set his sights on slightly more grown up topics from the past.

Each podcast focuses on an historical character such as Captain Cook (not actually a captain – look I learnt something!) or topics like the history of ice-cream, which is way more deadly than you'd think.

Like most great podcasts he doesn't fly solo, recruiting a knowledgeable expert on each topic and a (not so expert) comedian. These are the two key factors that really help YDTM stand out. Greg has selected fascinating and funny guests that work well together. With the comedian on a mission to fill in the blanks from their historical knowledge, similar to that kid in class who would ask the questions you were too scared to.



"It's fun, romantic and has the most beautiful story of how she ran away with the circus, married a Perry and how her hometown is recognising the importance today," Gretchen said.

As part of the festivities, a Circus Carnival Cabaret will be held on Saturday, 20 August at the Woolshed Baa and Grill in Blackall. The event will include a meal, drinks and entertainment from actor and former Broadway dancer, Matt Young.

"Matt has recently made Blackall his home," Gretchen said. "He is a big-time performer who has travelled the world and he will be our MC for most of our major events."

Local streets will be decorated in a circus theme with painted animals and bunting made by community members.

"It's the first circus carnival and the start of many we believe," Gretchen said.

isadvantaged learner drivers are being given the opportunity to complete their mandatory logbook hours with the support of a volunteer driver mentor program.

PCYC Zillmere and PCYC Sandgate are providers of the Braking the Cycle (BTC) program, where young people without access to a supervisor or registered vehicle can prepare for their provisional licence by driving with trained mentors.

BTC coordinator for PCYC Zillmere and PCYC Sandgate, Mandy Cotterill, said many young people could not afford driving lessons with an instructor, which could cost thousands of dollars.

"They are also unable to regularly access a vehicle or supervisor to help get the 100 hours needed before they can go for their open licence," Mandy said. "Therefore obtaining a driving licence for many young people was something that was impossible.

"This program enables young people to develop a core life and employment skill that supports further opportunities in the workplace, training and education environments. Young people are empowered to break the cycle of disadvantage, unemployment, and anti-social behaviour thereby reducing crime and traffic incidents."

BTC was developed in 2012 by PCYC Ipswich and PCYC Logan in response to a study that identified

180,000 young people were unable to reach the 100 hours of certified supervised driving experience required to apply for their provisional licence.

The program gives participants the chance to drive vehicles provided by the PCYC and pairs them with mentors who offer encouragement and promote road safety.

"The program coordinator will match a mentor with a young person depending on level of skill and experience and consider if there are any mentor/ participant preferences," Mandy said.

The program has proven a great success with 48 participants engaged at PCYC Zillmere in the last 12 months, and 22 graduating.

"We have helped many young people find employment in trade positions that require a licence as well as increasing the employment opportunities for many others," Mandy said.

"We have graduates with young families who are now able to drive their children to day care, school, and doctors and hospital appointments. We have a partnership with Domino's Pizza who have helped BTC financially and provided an employment path for our participants and graduates."

Simple Basil Pesto (with hidden spinach!)

f you're trying to kick the flu this winter season, then hiding leafy greens in your food can go a long way. This basil pesto is quick and easy, and no one will know that you have hidden a whole bag of spinach in it. The real beauty of this is that you can add it to almost any mid-week meal for an extra hit of vitamins.

You can also use it on the base of a pizza for a delicious chicken pesto pizza, serve it on grilled fish for a low carb meal or serve it as a dip with warm crusty bread. If you aren't planning to use all of it, you can freeze it in portions so on those busy, cold nights, simply defrost and stir through some piping hot spaghetti and you have a quick and delicious mid-week meal.

Simple Basil Pesto with Spinach

INGREDIENTS

- · 2 bunches fresh basil leaves (about 2 cups)
- · 120g baby spinach
- · 1 clove garlic, minced
- · ½ cup freshly grated
 Romano or Parmesan cheese
- · 34 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 1/2 cup pine nuts (budget friendly options would be chopped walnuts or blanched almonds)
- · Juice of half a lemon
- · Salt and pepper to taste

Place the basil, spinach and garlic in a food processor and pulse several times.

Add the cheese of your choice and pulse several times more. At this stage you will need to scrape down the sides of the food processor with a rubber spatula.

While your food processor is running, slowly add the olive oil. Make sure you add the oil in a steady stream as this will help it emulsify and keep the oil from separating. You will need to keep scraping down the sides during this stage.



Once you have achieved the desired texture (you might choose to use less oil), taste the pesto and add salt, pepper to your liking. You may need to add some lemon juice if your pesto needs acid to cut through the rich oil so add a little bit at a time and taste as you go.

Store pesto in a jar or airtight container. Freeze in portions.

Note: If you like your pesto smooth, add the pine nuts with the garlic. If you like chunky pesto (pictured), add them after you have blended in the oil and pulse until you have achieved your desired texture.

hen people mention Tailor the first thing that usually comes to mind is beach fishing Fraser Island (K'gari). This time of year though quite good numbers are caught around Redcliffe, Shorncliffe and from our local fishing platforms and jetties. It has been a really good season so far this year too.

TIME M 25 0246 0.60

A fast growing fish with a 35cm size limit, most fish locally are 30-50cm but they do grow in excess of a metre long. Being pack hunters, schooling up and eating just about anything that moves, most anglers nearly always catch a few at a time. They are a great sportsfish that will take lures and live baits but with their razor sharp teeth will also easily bite through most lines. Care must also be taken as the larger fish can do major damage to fingers.

A great tasting species that is best dispatched, bled and iced immediately. My favourite cooking method is just filleted, rolled in flour and fried on a BBQ or hotplate. They are also one of my favourite fish to do in a smoker as their flesh is moist and oily. Due to the abundance of them around at the moment they're also a great buy at your local seafood market.




