Paul Grabowsky AO. The man and his music. A not to be missed program of superb jazz on November 5. Are you in?

Well, there's so much to say about this music luminary: seven ARIA awards, two Helpmann awards, several APRA and Bell awards, a Deadly award, 20 feature film scores, four operas and various multimedia works, a Professor at Monash University, an Officer of the Order of Australia. And of course there's more!

A chat with the master reveals, Q: What's on your playlist for the Music By The Sea audience?

PG: I'll be playing selections from my album 'Solo' (ABC Jazz), as well as a tribute to the late Uncle Archie Roach.

Q: What's one of the most rewarding experiences of your career?

PG: I have been fortunate to have had many uplifting experiences during my musical life. I

regard my work with Uncle Archie Roach and Auntie Ruby Hunter as particularly special, particularly playing to audiences in remote First Nations communities. Similarly, the work I have done over twenty years with traditional ceremonial musicians from S.E. Arnhem Land has been life changing.

Q. And your thoughts about the role of music on the planet at this time?

PG: It is one of the mysterious qualities of music that it allows each of us to give ourselves over to a personal experience which can transcend and transform, taking us to a place where we are able to locate feelings and responses that are otherwise difficult, if not impossible, to find. Music also brings people together, more important than ever considering the isolation felt by many people during the pandemic.

FINDING THE NEXT MUSICAL SUPERSTAR

he Sandgate Youth Festival is back and is continuing their quest to find the next biggest music star.

Brought together by Councillor Jared Cassidy, the festival is giving young and emerging artists the stage to showcase their talents, all while supporting each other as musicians.

Councillor Cassidy said the festival celebrates diversity while giving young musicians the chance to break into the industry.

"There will be a number of young and emerging artists performing on the day, from acoustic soloists to high energy rock bands, there's definitely something for everyone," Jared said. "With a sizeable cash prize also up for grabs, it's a great opportunity for local musicians to further their career."

Since its inception, Jared has worked with Brendan Hoffmeier from Beat Connection, a local small business who produces the entire event. Their mission is to create an event that is tailored to the younger generation and provides them with opportunities they may not otherwise

"The event encourages young locals to engage

with their community and really put themselves out there," Jared said. "It's also important in its ability to bring people together, regardless of their background.

"Outside of school performances, it's difficult for some of these bands and soloists to get a gig."

As most musicians know, performing for the first time can be daunting, but the Sandgate Youth Festival fosters a supportive environment for young artists.

"For many of these performers, this will be the first time they get to perform on a stage in public," Jared said. "It can be nerve racking, but for some we see them go onto bigger and better things.

"We have uncovered some real hidden gems in the past and expect to do so again this year!"

The festival showcases a wide variety of music and performers from local schools and the community, with past winners packing out venues in Brisbane City.

So, pack a picnic rug, or set up your chairs, and settle in for an evening of tasty food trucks and some of the best local talent around.

he landmark Sandgate Post Office Hotel is currently undergoing an extensive refurbishment and will re-open this month as a craft beer and rotisserie destination.

New lease-owners Ian Van der Woude and Michelle Christoe are bringing their hospitality and entertainment experience to breathe new life into the heritage building.

lan said the \$2 million restoration will celebrate the original design of the local icon.

"We have been working with the relevant State Government department and Council on the design," Ian said.

"The old deck to the south of the building has been repurposed to be a more upmarket restaurant within the hotel. And we've been working with Councillor Jared Cassidy's office to introduce footpath dining with canvas umbrellas, windbreaks and landscaping. The bars and furniture are also being upgraded and replaced."

The revamped space will also incorporate contemporary details with celebrated artist Claire Matthews decorating the interior with street art.

Ian and Michelle currently reside on the Sunshine Coast where they run Malt Shovel Taphouse and live entertainment venue NightQuarter.

lan said he had spent a large part of his life on the northside of Brisbane and saw the Post Office Hotel as a great opportunity when the lease became available. "It marries in well with the other venues we run and our aspiration as a group to grow our portfolio of local venues" he said.

"I come from a long family background in hotels and pubs, including stints at Castlemaine Perkins and Austotel."

The revitalised hotel promises an extensive range of local craft beers and gins as well as delicious cuisine and traditional pub favourites.

"There will be an extensive menu by our executive chef, Matt MacNamara, featuring rotisserie meat and local seafood, including prawns from Shorncliffe," lan said.

The hotel will remain a popular venue for functions, events and entertainment. "Live music will be a feature in the operation of the hotel," lan said. "We will be sourcing local talent and bands from Byron Bay through to the Sunshine Coast."

Those planning Christmas parties will be pleased to hear the hotel is currently taking bookings for November onwards. Ian said they were also seeking front-of-house, kitchen and bar staff.

"We look forward to reopening the hotel in the new format and welcoming the community," he said.

he 4017 community is pulling out the stops for a scary Halloween this year with a host of things that go bump in the night.

Sandgate residents Lisa Hodgkinson and Blaine Darago are gearing up to frighten the neighbourhood with their annual Sandgate Spooktacular on Monday, 31 October.

Lisa said they were planning a "spooky lane" for everyone to enjoy on Clayton Street (between 8th and 9th Avenues) and Perkins and Murray Streets.

"During COVID we made the decision to limit our display to the front of our house and with the help of our generous neighbours, extending our spooky love throughout our street," she said. "This is something we continued with last year and are planning to do the same again. This also allows opportunities for streets around us to get involved and make it more of a destination."

Lisa and Blaine established the Spooktacular in 2017 and have been building upon it each year since. Last year approximately 2000 people rocked up to visit the hair-raising attractions.

"The community has been great and it has been reflected in the size of the crowds each year," Lisa said. "It brings the whole of the community together. Young, old, doesn't matter - people all scream the same.

"We start to gather our monsters as early as April and the rest of the yard takes shape over a couple of weeks. This year we have a few big additions...I don't want to give too much away."

Wrapped Iollies will be provided by the Sandgate Mums Facebook group. "The treats are paid for by us and our neighbours and it is something we like to do for our community, but these donations

of lollies allow more kids the opportunity to experience trick-or-treating," Lisa said. "Also, if there are any dentists who'd like to sponsor us, we're open to talking."

Trick-or-treaters will also have the opportunity to give back to the community.

"We are accepting gold coins on the day for SANDBAG to support the great work they do," Lisa said. "Also, please don't hit our monsters, they have feelings too."

ocal artist Freya Pinney sees the world differently and she's hoping to help others who also look at life through a distinct lens.

The conceptual artist is neurodiverse, diagnosed with autism and ADHD when in her early 40's. She said her diagnosis finally helped her understand who she was.

"I tend to really squirrel into new ideas, and honestly, art is a beautiful space to work in for someone with autism," Freya said.

"I really excel at whatever is my passion of the moment. It's a feature of autism, to get into the pure passion of an idea - I won't know what time it is or how long I've been working; I'm more aware of it now, but I just get so excited by ideas."

Freya's latest exhibit at Artrageous in Deagon, was titled "Fitting In: Exploring autistic overwhelm and creating an aesthetic for it. A culture where overwhelm can be accepted, explored, and appreciated. Where you can fit in within neurodiverse cultures."

"The gallery space there has such an inclusive feel, even just being there hanging things on the walls, people were coming to talk to me and it's such a lovely, inclusive community," Freya said.

As part of the exhibition, Freya ran an art workshop for other neurodiverse people in the 4017, and she hopes to make it a regular event.

"I'm employed as an art therapist and I work one on one, in aged care and with people who have NDIS packages – I work with people aged 4 to 92," she said.

"I organised a community exhibit with my clients in July this year, and it made me realise the power of the group.

"It's about helping people understand themselves in relation to what's so called 'normal' and the point of (the workshops) is to be radically inclusive."

Freya added there were networks and communities that were safe spaces for neurodiverse people.

"There are places where you do fit in," she said.



This year we have men and women from 14 up to 50 years of age who are mostly stepping into the ring for the very first time," Chris said.

"We want our audience to watch and think – that could be me, I can do that. Our motto is ordinary people – extraordinary event," he said.

"The boxer's walk on songs are a highlight of the event – this is a moment when they really get to express themselves and their witty and humorous bios often leave the crowd in stitches."

Food trucks will be on hand to service general admission and the Sandgate Hawks will be serving drinks from the clubhouse bar. Ringside table packages are fully catered.

The event is backed by Dawn Patrol, which is a cost-free men's social and support network based around weekly training (currently three times a week at local Sandgate Pool) aimed at "busy fathers and blokes between 30 and 65 years of age".

righton local and small business owner, Sue Innes, has raised more than \$13,000 for ovarian cancer research by putting her fabulous frock collection to work.

For over four years, Sue has been participating in Frocktober, Australia's most fashionable monthlong fundraiser.

Sue said this year would mark her return to the Ovarian Cancer Research Foundation (OCRF) campaign, after a two-year hiatus.

"Supporting other women is important to me," she said. "With a family history of female cancers and with so little known about this insidious disease, it's a cause that is close to my heart.

"Ovarian cancer is the deadliest gynaecological cancer there is. This is largely due to the fact there is no early diagnostic test - no, it's not detected by a Pap smear – and because it also has very vague symptoms, which can easily be attributed to other health issues and ageing. Shockingly, one woman dies every eight hours from ovarian cancer in Australia."

The campaign encourages anyone, anywhere to channel their creative flair through their favourite frocks for a day, a week, or the whole month of October to shine a light on ovarian cancer.

Sue, who is the owner and operator of local interior design studio, i 4 Design and Style, said she had always been drawn to colour.

"My wardrobe is bursting with bright colours and bold patterns," she said. "Quirky accessories, particularly brooches, are a signature part of my style and fabulous frocks are my quilty pleasure."

Sue has fundraised for Frocktober solo, as a duo, and in a team of 10 women known as The Frocking ROckstars. The team raised \$18,000 in 2019, making them the highest fundraising team in Australia that year.

The fundraising team connected with each other through a Facebook group for the Brisbanebased accessory brand, Ruby Olive. This year under the name Dame fROckstars, they have secured the backing of the brand, who have elected OCRF as their October charity to coincide with Frocktober.

"Frocking up sounds pretty frivolous in contrast to ovarian cancer," Sue said. "But the OCRF's 2022 campaign slogan states 'Life's too short to be boring', and there is definitely some fun to be had while raising awareness and funds for this incredibly important cause."

atch the best figure skaters in the state and country and cheer on local talent as they showcase their skills at two major ice-skating events.

Iceworld Boondall will host the Queensland Figure Skating Championships this month and the Australian Figure Skating Championships (AFSC) in November and December.

Sports and business development manager for Ice Skating Queensland (ISQ) and Iceworld, Andrew Leventis said holding the AFSC took on special meaning as it was cancelled the previous two years due to Covid.

"It is fantastic to see Iceworld Boondall hosting the AFSC this year," Andrew said. "It is an Olympicsized and spacious ice rink with substantial spectator seating available – perfect to showcase top level figure skating."

Three-time national champions, the Nova team, will compete in the senior synchronised division at the state championships.

Nova team manager Bev Donaghey said the team's goal was to have two great skates and be nominated by ISQ to represent the state at the national championships. "The team is also working very hard to gain a nomination to compete at the 2023 World Synchronised Skating Championships or an ISU international competition," Bev said.

The team is coached by Boondall Synchronised Ice-Skating Club's director of coaching, Natalie Hughes and consists of 19 females and 2 males between 15 and 37 years old. In 2020, they represented Australia at the French Cup and at the Trophy D'ecosse in Scotland where they came home with the gold medal in the senior division.

"It was an honour for the team to be able to stand on the podium, singing the national anthem and representing Australia," Bev said. "Due to Covid, this was the last time that Nova competed internationally for the past two years."

Taigum resident and figure skater Darian Kaptich is a 2020 Australian national bronze medallist and three-time junior national champion who will compete in the senior men's division at the state championships.

"My biggest achievement so far is either landing a triple axel or getting my Four Continents scores, which allows me to go to a big, worldwide championship," Darian said. "In figure skating, my dream at the end of the day is to go to the Olympics and then become a successful coach after I'm done competing."

The public will be able to watch both the state and national championships at Iceworld Boondall for free.



Juiced TV is a show made by kids in hospital, for kids in hospital and last month they filmed at Sailability Shorncliffe.

Production and operations manager Elin Reeves said Juiced TV created and filmed meaningful experiences for patients inside and outside of hospital walls.

"With the support of local activity providers like Sailability Shomcliffe, we create happy shoot days out for families from our hospital community who can relive and share the memory when the episode airs on the Juiced TV channel," Elin said.

"Our crew at Juiced TV were introduced to the Sailability Shomcliffe team by the Mount Pleasant Masonic Lodge, who shared news of the accessible Grumpy Walker pontoon boat recently funded by the Mason Lodge's Hand-Heart-Pocket scheme.

"With the availability of accessible, wheelchair-friendly sailing boats, our team at Juiced TV saw an incredible opportunity to collaborate with Sailability Shorncliffe, to provide a sailing experience for children from our hospital community." Sailability Shorncliffe is located at the Queensland Cruising Yacht Club on Sinbad Street. The club consists of a group of volunteers, many aged between 70 and 80 years old, who take people with disabilities sailing on small boats in protected waters.

President and volunteer Ted Balneaves said Juiced TV would highlight the positive influences the club had on its clients.

"Over the years, we have often seen the way that being on or close to the natural environment of water has a therapeutic effect," he said.

He said the children who attended on the day were able to be distracted from the ongoing treatments they experienced.

"The experiences of the day will give them new things to talk about and the opportunity to share their outing with family, friends, school friends as well as other patients," he said. "Parents will enjoy being able to share with their children the joy of experiencing a new adventure. The benefits will flow on long after the day has come to a close."

pring weather brings on lots of plant growth! Your plants will be thirsty and hungry so feed and water them now to keep them thriving!

Fertilising your plants goes hand in hand with watering them. Commercial fertilisers (even organic ones) can burn plant roots if not watered in properly, and most fertilisers rely on water for activation and distribution anyway. While we hope for lovely spring rain, it's important to keep water up to your plants if there isn't adequate rainfall.

Soil microorganisms are also activated by the warmer weather. These amazing microbes help the nutrients in the soil become available to plants and are vital to the abundant growth

of beautiful foliage, flowers and fruit. Step up your microbe health and population with a soil conditioner e.g. EarthFood.

Pests and diseases increase with heat too. The best way to combat them is with strong healthy plants!

Now is a good time to mulch if you haven't already. With summer approaching, it is important to protect soil, microbes and plant roots. Mulching also helps reduce the amount of watering needed.

What to plant now - tomatoes, eggplant, capsicums, cucumbers, pumpkins, watermelons, rockmelons, lettuce, radishes, silverbeet, beans, rosella, okra, and sweetcorn.

indfulness meditation is a great way to find calm and improve your mental health, and according to local integrative health coach, Rachel Therese, anyone can do it.

Speaking to the Sandgate Guide as part of Mental Health Week, Rachel said mindfulness meditation had a profound impact on her life.

"I did an introductory meditation course about 15 years ago to help me cope with anxiety and that's a course I now teach," she said.

"Mindfulness has become a bit of a buzzword but there is a lot of science and research behind it. Science is seeing significant changes in the brain during mindfulness meditation.

"It's quite incredible, and it goes to show our brains are malleable. Meditation can be a huge tool in your mental health toolbox.

"It's not something you would use to replace medication or counselling, but it's something else you can use in addition to those things."

Rachel added most people tell her they can't meditate, as they can't "switch off their brain".

"Mindfulness meditation is not about switching off, it's about being present and aware," she said. "And it does take practice; it's like going to the gym – you need to build up those muscles and with mindful meditation, you can build your neural pathways.

"You don't have to sit for an hour. If you've got 10 minutes, you can meditate."

Queensland Mental Health Week runs from October 8 to 16, and this year's theme is "Awareness, Belonging, Connection".

Run by the Queensland Mental Health Commission, mental health week aims to encourage all of us to think about our mental health and wellbeing, regardless of whether we may have a lived experience of mental illness or not, and to encourage "help seeking behaviours, when needed".


Rachel said she was quite open about her own difficulties with mental health. "I think the stigma surrounding mental health is unfortunately still there," she said.

"But mindfulness meditation can help bring about significant change. It's all about bringing your awareness into one moment and giving yourself space before reacting."

Rachel is offering some free mindfulness sessions as part of Mental Health Week.

Hearing Aid Challenge: Meniere's Disease

The classic symptoms of Meniere's disease include ear fullness sensation, dizziness, tinnitus and low frequency hearing loss. In Hearing Science, Meniere's disease sufferers are often characterised with fluctuating hearing, tinnitus with low frequency "roaring" sounds and hypersensitive to certain sounds. The initial hearing loss affects the low frequency region, but eventually progresses reducing hearing loss across all frequencies. In addition, for many people the hearing loss affects only one ear causing hearing asymmetry. Mild to moderate hearing distortion is also quite common. Anxiety and fear surrounding the tinnitus and vertigo may be experienced.

Regular hearing assessment and proper communication between you, your audiologist, your GP and ENT specialist can help you resolve emotional issues. An experienced audiologist can help you identify the situation. Jason's Quality Meats will now progress to the Queensland State Finals of the Australian Meat Industry Council (AMIC) competition this month.

The Queens Parade butcher competed in the Brisbane North East/North West heat, which Jason said had the most amount of entries.

"I was pretty proud when I realised who I was up against and the numbers." Jason said. "My sisters came out with me for the announcement and the first name that got called out was mine and then mine again. The fact that we got four, we did really well."

The business took out first place in the Australian Lamb category for their lamb, rosemary and mint sausage. They also won second place prizes in the Traditional Australian Beef Sausage category for their Australian country beef sausage, the Traditional Australian Pork Sausage category

for their Australia country pork sausage and the Gourmet category for their sweet orange beef sausages.
