A BACKYARD BLITZ FOR ZIGGY

irst time parents Rebecca and Sarsha were overjoyed to welcome their baby boy Ziggy on Christmas Eve last year.

But just a few short months later, the couple were given the devastating news their son had Pearson's Syndrome, an incurable mitochondrial disease.

There are fewer than 100 cases of Pearson's Syndrome worldwide, and it affects the development of the blood-forming cells in bone marrow. Children with the disease face a short life span.

Rebecca said they noticed "little things" about Ziggy were not quite right.

"He was small when he was born, and he never latched properly or breastfed," she said. "And then he would only drink half a bottle of milk. But you know, he seemed to be tracking along ok and the GP wasn't too worried."

However, Rebecca and Sarsha noticed tiny pinprick bruises on Ziggy after being in his baby carrier, a result of his low platelet count. A week in the Queensland Children's Hospital and several tests revealed the results.

"The pathologist actually rang me at midnight, and I thought, that can't be good," Rebecca said.

"They did a bone marrow biopsy, and the doctors were like, 'look, Pearson's Syndrome is the worst outcome, but it's highly unlikely'.

"And then they told us it was Pearson's. I was just floored, it's devastating, and we have been going through like a grief process – I was really in denial for a while."

With Ziggy's severely immunocompromised condition, simply going out can be dangerous.

Friends of the couple stepped in and set up a GoFundMe page, called Ziggy's Backyard Blitz, with the aim of creating a beautiful outdoor space at home for the family.

"With the backyard, this is giving us something physical we can do for him," Rebecca said.

"We're seeing a lot of specialists, but none of them have ever seen a child with this before – they're doing their best but we're aware there's nothing they can really do apart from treat the symptoms as they come up."

Rebecca added the support from the 4017 community had been "almost overwhelming".

"Sarsha and I are not used to being helped, but we've had total strangers taking time away from their jobs and their families to help us, and it's been really amazing," she said.

"We have used some of the GoFundMe money to put a deposit on a playground from Peppertown, which we will be able to change as he gets older. We're doing a raised veggie garden and we'd like some lawn for him to play on.

"We are so lucky to live in Shorncliffe on Sunday Street, near the park and the boardwalk and when we had initially planned to start a family we thought, what better place is there? But with his condition, we can't just go to the park."

Rebecca added they had connected with other families around the world who were also dealing with Pearson's Syndrome.

"That has been so helpful," she said.

"Although it can be a double-edged sword – one family just shared that their child turned seven and started school, which is huge, and then there's other families sharing their child's eulogy."

Flood maps updated

Brisbane City Council has released new flood mapping for the city, which shows the overland water flows responsible for unexpectedly flooding thousands of homes in February this year, including those here on the northside.

Flood levels were surveyed at more than 550 locations and surveyors also recorded debris markings at more than 90 locations.

A new online flood information tool makes it easier for residents to visually understand how flooding may affect a property for building and development and it also includes a new historic flood layer, showing the extent of the February floods with mapping for river and creek flooding.



nemy fire and an explosion buried a young James "Jim" Grebert and his mates while defending their country during World War II. Their worldly possessions were blown meters in the air, and while he survived to tell this tale, there were many young ANZACs who were not as lucky.

Jim is one of the newest, and oldest members, of Sandgate RSL Sub Branch who is hoping to attend Remembrance Day services on November 11 at the memorial on Burnett Place. At nearly 100 years of age, his memories of mates lost too soon, span all the way back to the 1940s with the 58th/59th battalion in Papua New Guinea and Bougainville where he described the conditions as lousy.

"As we were coming down it looked beautiful in the valley but there was grass six foot high, it was stinking hot and a lot of blokes died there," Grebert said. "I've been shot a few times, there was plenty of lead flying around.

"You could hear it, tumbling over and then a rush and they came in. You'd never know when you'd run into them (the enemy), patrols and that. One of the last blokes killed in the war was a good friend of mine. When I went to the memorial in Canberra I found it very upsetting, seeing the names of those I actually saw getting killed."

Recently the nonagenarian moved to Deagon to live with his daughter Susan and granddaughter Helen. Often there are up to five generations under one roof as he has had two children, four grandchildren, six great-grandchildren and six great-great-grandchildren.

In his spare time, Jim has found mateship and support with the team at the Sandgate RSL Sub Branch. Sub Branch secretary Andrew Law said there was a resurgence of members recently.

"On ANZAC Day we had a defence person from almost every war or peace keeping mission since WWII," he said. "More than 100 people have joined, and most of them are younger. It is about camaraderie, care and commemoration, so they know there's a place to go after the ADF.

"Remembrance Day will be very similar to last year, it will be a ceremony out the front to start at 10:50am and finish at 11am with the playing of the Last Post, and then everyone can go inside for refreshments."

oad trip adventures are what memories are made of and packing the right essential travel items will help ensure your journey is both safe and successful. Whether you're a young family embarking on a summer adventure, or empty nesters jumping in the car without a care in the world, keep these must-haves in mind when preparing for your holiday road trip.

Doing a basic pre-travel health check on your vehicle is always recommended before heading out (to check tyre pressure, fluid levels, lights, etc.), but it's also important to bring essential emergency items with you. 

ONE ACT PLAYS SHOWCASE HOMEGROWN TALENT

ocal talent will be on display when Sandgate Theatre brings five one-act plays to life this month.

Themes of connection, love and murder will be explored when A Collection of Short Plays hits the stage at the Sandgate Town Hall.

Vice president of Sandgate Theatre, Danny Cruise said each of the 20-minute long plays were chosen to showcase Australian writers.

"This show is all about Aussie playwrights, local actors and local directors at the beautiful Sandgate Town Hall," Danny said. "One-acts are great because the audience gets a good variety of entertainment. Audiences can expect a show that is humorous, full of variety and will take you through a gamut of emotions."

The performance begins with Love and Loneliness in a Technological New Age, written by Warren Paul Glover – a story about a man, the love of his life and interference from the outside world.

There will be two works by Central Queensland playwright Jill Curran, including Positions Vacant, which features Wendy Spencer and Elizabeth Womack as Dottie and Eunice, a loveable pair who dream of cruising the Pacific.

Danny said the audience may need tissues for The Anniversary Waltz, a play about loneliness.

"The poignant character of the elderly gentleman is brought to life by well-known actor Toby Chittenden and it is a drama we can all relate to," he said.

Does My Bum Look Big In This? by Ian Westerly focuses on the date night of a married couple.

"To round off the evening we have A Kind of Connection," Danny said. "This play is by local writer Erica Woolgar and is about finding common ground when you think you are so different."

Danny directs the plays alongside fellow Sandgate Theatre members Virginia Gray and Jane-Louise Turner.

He said the set design would be very minimal, using only what is essential to get across the message of each play.

"We use many of the same furniture and props in each play," he said. "We wanted to keep things simple so that we could focus on acting."

Attendees are encouraged to bring a meal and bottle of wine to make their own theatre restaurant experience.

and communication slightly easier. Early travellers still journeyed on horseback or by dray but the road facilitated the use of more sophisticated (and marginally more comfortable) vehicles such as horse-drawn coaches.

The decline of the horse era became inevitable with the advent of the railway. A rail connection between Brisbane and Sandgate was proposed in 1879. Parliament voted the sum of £52,000 for its construction, a route was chosen and

work commenced in 1881. The contractor, Mr Bashford, completed the project ahead of time and under budget - the final cost was less than £39,000 - and the line was opened by the governor in 1882. While the normal running time between Sandgate and the city was 40 minutes, it is noteworthy that the train carrying the governor on that auspicious day took only 27.

Although horse transport was still necessary to get people to and from railway stations, over longer distances it could not compete with the railway for speed, comfort and convenience. Then, with the spread of the motor car in the early 20th century, horses as a primary mode of transport gradually became obsolete. There was a period of co-existence, of course - in the 1920s, the taxi rank at the Sandgate railway station provided the option of horse drawn buggies or motor taxis - but between them, the railway and the car spelt the end of horse transport.

Sometimes, though, when the motorway looks more like a carpark, you, like Richard III, might think: my kingdom for a horse.

A short ride in a fast machine

s you inch your bumper-to-bumper way along the M1, you may wonder if our predecessors in the Sandgate region didn't have it easier.

Perhaps not, however: while they were certainly free of the ordeals that beset the modern motorist, they did have their own tribulations to contend with. Our region in the mid-1800s was not traveller friendly. There were no roads as we know them today, only bush tracks carved through thick scrub and heavy timber. Swamps, mangroves and creeks (according to the Moreton Bay Courier in 1854, "a dreary wasteland of bush") had to be negotiated and the only means of transport were horses, bullock drays, or your own two feet.

The first land sales in Sandgate occurred in 1853 and once the territory skirting Bramble Bay began to attract settlement, a route between there and points south became a necessity. Accordingly, a road between Sandgate and Brisbane was constructed in 1860, making travel

Prand new traffic lights at the intersection of Norris Road and Pritchard Place at Bracken Ridge are now up and running.

The lights were switched on last month, marking the completion of the second stage of Brisbane City Council's Norris Road intersection upgrade works.

Bracken Ridge Ward Councillor Sandy Landers said the second stage upgrades would improve traffic flow and travel time reliability, as well as safety and connectivity for access to Norris Road State School, Bracken Ridge TAFE and local bus stops.

"The lights are intelligent lights and will only operate on demand, so this will help clear congestion quickly at peak times," Cr Landers said.

"The signalised crossing will ensure a safer crossing for children and residents at all times of the day or night."

Cr Landers was joined by Norris Road State School principal Mel Burke to switch on the lights on 7 October, celebrating the completion of the upgrades.

In addition to the installation of the new traffic lights, other upgrade works included relocating

the bus stop near Greenore Street to a new indented bus stop outside Norris Road State School, constructing new turning pockets, installing an advanced traffic signal warning sign, and upgrading the eastern footpath to a shared path between Bracken Ridge TAFE and Wirupa Street.

"The Norris Road corridor has increased in volume and the traffic will flow better with turning lanes and a bus bay," Cr Landers said. "The new 2.5 metre wide shared path will also make it easier and safer for all active travellers."

The second stage upgrades were funded by the Australian Government as part of the Urban Congestion Fund and delivered by Council under the Better Roads for Brisbane program. The project forms part of a \$5 million commitment to deliver improvements for all road users along the Norris Road corridor.

The first stage of the project involved upgrading Norris Road between Telegraph Road and Bracken Ridge Road and was completed last year. The works included replacing the roundabout at the Norris Road and Barbour Road intersection with traffic lights and controlled pedestrian crossing facilities.

"The community feedback has been particularly positive and residents are finding their commute quicker and safer," Cr Landers said.

Helping flooded gardens grow again

s we head into another La Nina summer, gardeners of the 4017 might be wondering how to help their precious plants recover and thrive in these difficult conditions.

The Kempster Street Gumbuya Garden group is hosting a talk by award-winning horticulturalist and ecologist, Kate Wall, on flood recovery gardening.

Kate said recovering a garden after flooding was often not as easy as it seemed on the surface.

"Many of our favourite plants do not survive flooding but replanting them comes with challenges," she said.

"Flooding causes severe soil damage which can

make the work of replanting backbreaking and leave new plants struggling.

"This talk will cover how best to respond to the garden in the aftermath of flooding and severe waterlogging.

"Whether the wet weather event was last week or last year – or earlier this year for most of us – there are things we can do to help our gardens thrive again."

One of Kate's top tips was to apply 'garden mate', a rock mineral product enhanced with live microbes.

"This will help bring life back into your soil and open compaction," she said.

"If you do nothing else, mulch your garden. Organic mulch will help bring life back too, but it's much faster if you can do both."

he bright white shade umbrellas are installed. The painters' scaffolding is down and the new exterior paintwork is revealed. We've all been watching the signs of the revitalisation project of Sandgate's well-loved, heritage-listed building, and the creation of Kindy Cottage.

Sitting at the corner of Flinders Parade and Cliff Street since 1887, more of this former church is being revealed as this 12-month, heritage-sensitive refresh project completes.

And the milestone? The totally new library for the children-complete with a stunning chandelier.

"This library is a brilliant space to nurture a life-long love of learning." said Megan Jackat, Centre Co-Manager.

"And it was one of many Monday surprises we had, as the team of tradies worked only on weekends so the children were not disturbed," she said.

"But this discovery was the biggest - an old storeroom transformed into a magical spacecomplete with cosy carpet, beanbags and that chandelier that sparkles with morning sunlight," said Julie Hadley-Thomas, Centre Co-Manager.

Sandgate Historical Society President Pam Verney toured this former church to get to know more about Kindy Cottage.

"This was the home of the Baptist community, devoted to their faith and active in their community," said Pam.

"The heritage listing confirms what many experience on a personal level-that the importance of the building lies not only in terms of architecture and history, but also as a visual symbol and a much-loved, living community link," said Pam. "Today it is cared for by another generation."

This is a community hub to be enjoyed for the long term by not only the children and families of Kindy Cottage, but everyone who passes by.

NEW RIDE FOR WILLIAM THANKS TO COMMUNITY GENEROSITY

he 4017 community has helped a Bracken Ridge family raise more than \$30,000 for a new wheelchair accessible vehicle for their son, William.

James and Angela Alley started a Go Fund Me page for their 11-year-old son, who has Duchenne muscular dystrophy (DMD), a genetic disorder characterised by progressive muscle

James said William had been finding it difficult to climb into their current vehicle and that it could not accommodate his new power chair.

"For William, having a wheelchair accessible van is essential to get to school, social and community events, regular hospital appointments and out and about doing the things he loves," James said. "At the moment, walking has become very difficult and climbing in and out of a regular vehicle is sometimes impossible on bad days."

The family plans to purchase a used vehicle that has already been modified, which could cost up to \$40.000.

James said the family had been humbled by the generosity of the community, including an anonymous donation of \$11,000. "One lovely surprise was having an 11-year-old friend of William's offer to donate \$20 of his own money," he said.

"A lot of donations came through my good friends and training partners at Ako Martial Arts in Sandgate. Many more came from local families in William's school. Some of the local church communities have also been very supportive."

James' friend, Rob Vernon from Ideal Solar gave the Alley family new solar panels after seeing a Facebook post.

"I have kids and am fully aware of the cost of living, plus in 4017 it's all about community and helping each other," Rob said.

He said the solar panels would save the family around \$3000 a year, leaving plenty of money for the new vehicle.

"The gift from Ideal Solar means a huge reduction in bills and therefore a huge reduction in stress," James said. "We couldn't be happier to receive such a generous donation."

James said William was excited about the new vehicle.

"He is an absolute car nut, so we would prefer a kombi van, but anything car-related gets him excited," he said. "He wants to customise it, lowering it and getting me to spray paint some flames up the side. But I don't think his mum likes that idea."

Organic Gardening in November

WITH **SALLY EBERHARDT**

ith the temperature and humidity rising, now is the time to take care of garden and outdoors maintenance before summer sends us scampering for cool and shade.

Over Christmas many of us want to

simply enjoy our gardens and relax, giving even more incentive to have a good tidy up now.

Storm season is approaching so secure any garden structures that could blow about, and remove threatening tree branches. Fix sagging gutters or tarps or anything that could form water pools for mosquitoes to breed in. Being attacked by hordes of mossies can ruin a good BBO

Ensure your gardens are well-drained and mulched. Keep your plants strong and healthy so they have resistance to the mould, rust, mildew, and insects that increase in the heat.

Some plants like it hot! Plant hardy, heat-loving plants now to make life easier in summer. Two species from the Hibiscus family to consider are okra, a delicious green vegetable, and rosella, a spectacular red Australian native with an edible calyx for making jam and cordial.

What to plant now – Capsicum, eggplant, chillies, sweetcorn, snake beans and heat-tolerant varieties of tomato and lettuce. Sow melon, cucumber and pumpkin into mulched areas for easy-care vegetable production.

"The Strong and Resilient Communities (SARC), Inclusive Communities grant program is open for new applications until November 3, 2022," Ms Wells said.

"I would strongly urge eligible organisations in my electorate of Lilley to apply for funding, which can support one-off projects for up to two years."

The grants will support the social and economic participation of vulnerable and disadvantaged people in their communities via:

- the development of young people aged 12 to 18 years who are, or are at risk of, being disengaged, marginalised and having limited engagement with education/training
- people with disabilities and/or mental health issues
- vulnerable women who experience, or are at risk of, isolation or discrimination
- people who are unemployed
- to address individual barriers to social and economic participation and employment

LOCAL FISHING SPOT -BULLOCKY'S REST

North Pine Dam/Lake Samsonvale

his time of year it is a beautiful spot for fishing, walking the trails, free BBQs, photography, checking out the turtles, lungfish, lizards, a bit of bird watching and all less than 30 min from Sandgate/Redcliffe. In the evenings it is not uncommon to see quite a few people here taking photographs of the sunset across the water to the mountains.

Undoubtedly one of the best freshwater fisheries in South East Queensland I have caught many fish here both from the bank and in a boat. Australian Bass, Yellowbelly, Redclaw Crayfish, Mary River Cod, Tilapia, Catfish, Lungfish, Garfish and more species are available here as well as Rainbowfish for your pond or aquarium.

My favourite fishing method here is garden worms or live shrimp suspended a few feet under a float. This is a great way to fish especially with kids as it is very visual. Lures also work well for me especially just before sunrise and just after sunset.

Adults please make sure you have a SIPS permit when fishing as this is required by law and pays for the stocking program easily obtainable from the Queensland Fisheries website and most fishing tackle shops. It's really not that expensive either considering all the areas you can fish with it in Queensland and the fish you can catch.

SEQ Water now allows paddle craft only access on the dam from Forgan's Cove. There are a number of permits also allowed for electric powered boats and kayaks on a private area upstream with some still available, contact PRFMA for more information. (Pine Rivers Fish Management Association)


