

Viola virtuoso Roger Benedict and renowned classical pianist Simon Tedeschi unite to delight with reimagined masterpieces from Debussy, Ravel, Gershwin and Kosmar, on 4 February.

The concert will feature Vieux's exceptional back catalog and critically acclaimed new album, Les Racines. According to media sources, the album's genre is from the northern West African musical tradition known in the West as 'Desert Blues'.

The album is about roots, tradition, history, peace, unity, family, and opening the heart. Its sound is woven with ancient circular riffs, imploring voices, waves of dreamy, spiraling flute notes, call and response, the weaving spell of hand claps, and undulating tongues.

And speaking of roots, Vieux's run far deeper than most. His father, the late Ali Farka Touré, was acclaimed as one of the finest guitarists Africa has ever produced. Ali was a pioneer in introducing this style to audiences around the world. Vieux says that all music and modernity find their truth in their roots.

"All of these young performers have been training with ROAR Academy – some for many years," Madeline said. "Anthony, Lucas and Makenzi are in the Young Con programme for vocals. All of them have performed lead roles in various productions whether at school or with ROAR Academy. It's so important for young performers to learn and hone their skills in actual performance rather than just the classroom."

Anthony, 17, said he was looking forward to performing the song Love is an Open Door.

"It's such a fun number that sets a false sense of security towards Hans' true intentions," Anthony said. "The thing I love about performing is that I'm able to evoke emotions in the audience that enhances their experience. In the future I hope to make a career of performing in musical theatre professionally and perform at QPAC and all over the world."

Lucas, 16, said it was a great opportunity to perform at the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre.

"What I love about performing is being able to become a completely different person in mind and taking on that role while still adding my own aspects," Lucas said. "I hope that in the future I can continue to perform professionally in musical theatre and bring joy to those who watch. I love seeing people's reactions to the shows I perform in and seeing their excitement watching me perform on stage."

Madeline said ROAR Academy had been lucky to secure one of the first licences for FROZEN Jr in Brisbane."It's a delightful story of the strength of family bonds, of trust and of belief in yourself," she said.

- Infrastructure projects like flood levees, drainage improvements, fire breaks and evacuation centres.
- Initiatives that improve collection and sharing of data, improve land use planning or strengthen community capabilities.



Wafting on the sea air ...

s with everywhere at the time, health in early Sandgate was a matter of luck. Waves of diseases such as dysentery, typhoid, measles and diphtheria came and went with little or nothing able to be done to control or cure them.

Given the state of sanitation and the precarious nature of the water supply, this is not surprising. Until the 1920s, when Sandgate was connected to the Brisbane supply, householders were responsible for providing their own water. Most houses had tanks, some had wells and some water was fetched from the lagoon, perhaps ill-advisedly since, according to the Moreton Mail in 1889, it was "a horrible swamp" containing "about 10 feet of stinking slime".

There was no sewerage; your toilet was an outhouse from which waste, or 'night soil' was removed by sanitary carts (the drivers of which were paid between 21/2 to five pence "per pan") and taken to the council's "manure depot" (possibly explaining the naming of Depot Road), some way west up Cabbage Tree Creek.

Sandgate's public environs were by no means salubrious. In the same 1889 article – a heartfelt plea to the mayor of Sandgate to consider the citizens' health – the Moreton Mail described

areas of the village as being "liberally bestrewed with horses' skulls, cows' heads ... and baleful kitchen refuse", not to mention "the festering remains of fish on the beach and the general want of drainage", all of which caused a terrible stink.

Surprisingly, notwithstanding these rather unsanitary conditions – all apparently a symptom of the council's dereliction - Sandgate developed a reputation as a health resort. Medical professionals in the city believed the place to have therapeutic qualities. Accordingly, the Brisbane Hospital rented premises in Sandgate in 1885 to house convalescents, moving to a permanent facility, Broadhurst in Flinders Parade, in 1901. In 1884, the Lady Musgrave Sanatorium for Sick Children, designed and equipped to "afford the utmost comfort and convenience to the little patients", opened on Allpass Parade. It is to be hoped that the "little patients" were sufficiently shielded from any unpleasant odours drifting up from nearby Shorncliffe beach.

Happily, Sandgate's public services gradually improved – septic tanks replaced sanitary carts, sewerage replaced the septic – and advances in medical knowledge and care meant that health became less a matter of luck than of technology and innovation. In the midst of our good fortune, let's honour the memory of the night soil men and give thanks for the flushing toilet.

MEETTRIX, **BRISBANE'S FIRST DOLA GUARDIAN**

og owners may have noticed a new canine character standing proudly at the gate to the Dog Off-Leash Area (DOLA) at the Bill Brown Sports Reserve.

Last year, students at Bracken Ridge State School joined together with Brisbane City Council to create a sculpture known as 'Trix', the first quardian dog of a DOLA in Brisbane.

Trix was unveiled in December at an event hosted by Bracken Ridge Ward Councillor Sandy Landers.

"The idea was generated during COVID lockdown when Council saw how much people missed going to their local parks with their dogs," Councillor Landers said.

"Trix is a way for us to celebrate the love we feel for our dogs (and pets in general) and an expression about how we enjoy spending time with them in the park."

The year four students chose the design for Trix with the help of Bracken Ridge State School

"Trix was a combined story that was contributed to by a professional story writer in response to the ideas and suggestions of the parks officers, me and staff," Councillor Landers said. "This was then presented to the students and further ideas added by the students, including Trix - a suitable name, shape and appearance for the dog.

"Dogs are very important to young people and often the source of many life lessons. We wanted to have a dog that was for everyone and not just dog owners so it was important that the story included those positive messages of community, friendship, loyalty and fun."

Councillor Landers said the students were excited to find their contributions and see the final story they helped to write.

"It was really wonderful to share in their joy and a great thrill for us to hear and see their ownership," she said.

"Residents are encouraged to share the story with friends and family and it is a lovely way to get kids involved in storytelling and building on the story."

here's a hidden gem in Sandgate helping our elderly residents, and now it needs your help

Jessie's Place is a not-for-profit gift shop located at Regis Aged Care, staffed by volunteers. Funds raised at the shop go towards brightening the lives of residents, and they're looking for more helpers.

Co-ordinator Graham Fresser said volunteering at the shop was one of the highlights of his week.

"It's such a lovely place, the residents mostly pop in to get their toiletries like soap and what have you," he said.

"Or quite often we'll get new residents who will come in looking for something to brighten up their room."

Each month Jessie's Place gives a card to any resident celebrating their birthday, along with a gift voucher for coffee and raisin toast from the café next door to the shop.

They also provide each campus with a birthday

cake each month when the residents come together to celebrate.

Most of the stock is donated, and other items such as toiletries, biscuits, and lollies, are purchased each week by one of the Jessie's Place volunteers.

"People donate some lovely things, like ceramic coffee mugs, and ladies' perfume – all kinds of things," Graham said.

"The residents like to come in for a chat. I had a gentleman come in this morning and he wanted some batteries. Then not long after he came back and asked if I could put them in his remote control for him, so it's the little interactions like that I enjoy.

"We're the only Regis site in Queensland to have a shop like this, and we've had people come in from other Regis locations and they like what they see – they want to start up little shops like ours at other sites."

Jessie's Place is open to the public, as well as the residents, next to the café which is accessed from the Ward Street entrance. It's open Monday to Friday from 9.30am to 12.30pm.

andgate Hawks Club is turning 80 and to honour the past 80 years, the club is hosting a night of celebration and nostalgia.

The Club was formed in 1943 after Reg Buxton, a native of South Australia, noticed boys kicking a football on Deagon Oval. After meeting a couple of the boys out and about in the community, he was amazed to find out that they played Aussie Rules at school.

From these interactions, Reg encouraged the boys to get a group together, and they eventually started practicing and playing games on the Albury Oval, initially using a girl's netball as the ball.

The year that followed saw the Sandgate team enter in the Brisbane competition which was an under 18 side because the older players were serving in the army.

The boys played the game with mixed jerseys. Some with long sleeves, some with short, some with collars, some without, some were dyed, and some had numbers sewn on the back. It was this competition that kicked off 80 years of community football.

Fast forward to 2022, the club had over 600 registered players ranging from 8 to 60 years of age, and 2023 is looking like it will be an even bigger year.

Des Warnock, President of the Sandgate Australian Football Club said that after 80 years, the club continues to be the heart and soul of the community.

"Due to its longevity, Sandgate Hawks is part of the fabric of the local and AFL community. Whether a fan of AFL or not, most people know of this iconic club or know people who have played here," Des said.

"It's a meeting place for people of all ages with a safe environment where they can not only play footy but learn valuable life lessons and values."

The club's rich history has been captured in a book titled "Hawks History - From Fledgling to Phoenix". The book was written by Janelle Forbes and while the book has sold out, a copy of it can be found at the Sandgate Historical Museum.

The club continues to celebrate current and past players. Norm Reidy, a club icon, player, coach, and former President was quoted saying "The friends I made when I first came to play and coach at Sandgate are still the loyal friends I have today. I can only describe the Footy Club as unique - having no like, equal or parallel."

To this day, the club's first grade best and fairest medal still bears his name.



s an original member of the Sandgate Men's Shed, Peter Lumsdale understands the importance of the men's shed movement to the local community.

"However, I am most proud when I see the guys looking out for each other, laughing and joking and developing skills they never believed possible," he said. "The care the guys extend to members who have little time left is extremely touching for me and to witness this makes me feel very proud of what I am a part of."

He also acknowledged the support the shed had received from local businesses and the general community who recognised the value of the shed for their husbands, fathers and sons.

Although Peter will no longer be the shed's secretary, he said he had taken on the new committee portfolio of Members/Management Liaison Officer. He would also like to introduce lead lighting as an activity for shed members.

"However, my main objective is to get into woodworking and tap into the huge amount of skills and talents of the other members and just enjoy what the shed has to offer," he said.

utomated warning signs are being installed at locations frequently impacted by flooding in a bid to prevent motorists entering flooded roads.

Brisbane City Council installed an Automated Flooded Road Warning System (AFRWS) at Bald Hills Creek on Bracken Ridge Road last year, with another sign to be installed this year on Wyampa Road in Bald Hills.

Bracken Ridge Ward Councillor Sandy Landers said the location at Bald Hills Creek was chosen because it was prone to temporary flooding following very heavy rain.

"Fortunately, it is for very short periods of time, but as it is a creek crossing it can rise quickly," Councillor Landers said.

"Wyampa Road crosses the Tinchi Tamba Wetlands and is an access to a boat ramp. Some users may not be local or familiar with this area so it is important to provide this early warning when it floods from time to time."

Council installed the signs following the recordbreaking flood event last February to ensure Brisbane would be better prepared for future events. The Bracken Ridge Road site was one of 12 new signs installed at the end of last year. A further 12 signs are to be installed by mid 2023, including the Wyampa Road site. A further 13 AFRWS had been installed prior to these new additions.

Each solar-powered sign has a 'Road Closed Due to Flooding' message that is LED-backed, making it clearly visible to motorists at night.

Councillor Landers said the automated signs would advise locals as soon as the water rises and the road is closed.

"The signs switch on automatically when an alarm gauge detects a creek or waterway has reached a certain level," she said. "Council is alerted whenever a sign is triggered and a camera allows the area to be monitored remotely."

The signs will allow time for Council officers to respond and install additional temporary detour signage and barriers.

"It can be extremely challenging for officers to manually erect signs during flooding events," Councillor Landers said. "But the installation of 27 new signs since February, in addition to the existing 10, means we can notify residents sooner of danger and improve road safety."

GARDENING WITH SALLY



Organic Gardening in February

Summer typically brings many storms and heavy rain that can leave your garden soggy and over-watered. Plants may be nutrient-stressed or overgrown, and in need of immediate attention.

To replenish your garden, apply natural fertilisers like animal poop, seaweed, or green manure crops to areas where you can dig them into the soil. For ornamentals and pot plants, use liquid natural fertilisers like compost tea, worm castings liquid or good commercial fertilisers. Also look at re-potting those plants that are outgrowing their current containers.

Many plants grow rapidly over summer and may be straggly and overgrown. Most plants respond well to being pruned and will regrow stronger and healthier. Do some research as some plants like a heavy prune while others thrive on a lighter touch. Add the cuttings to your compost.

This is an ideal time to order heirloom seeds or unusual varieties from specialist seed vendors, ready to plant them in autumn.

What to plant now – tomatoes, capsicum, eggplant, sweetcorn, beans, cucumber, zucchini, broccoli, cabbage and cauliflower.



SKETCHING SHORNCLIFFE ONE HOUSE AT A TIME

alling Shorncliffe home for over 23 years, lan Kulpa has become known as the "cliff sketcher", making his name known in the local artists community by sketching local homes in his distinctive style.

Walking around the bayside suburbs, Ian finds inspiration from admiring the unique Australian architecture, especially the old cottages which have been renovated and brought back to life.

Prior to sketching houses in Shorncliffe, Ian was creating commissioned artwork for houses that had more of a technical look, but he wanted to branch out and create sketches that showcased the personality of the home.

"I wanted to develop a sketching style that was loose but interesting and entertaining. I was looking for something that would take my sketching out of being technically correct and more into interesting and unique," Ian said.

"I believe that the houses people live in are usually something more than just a house. They are someone's home. They are places where people have celebrated their lives, lived out tragedies, witnessed world and personal events, but above all, they are home to someone."

Being creative is in lan's blood. His mother was a seamstress, and his father made furniture. Growing up around creativity is what influenced lan to find his own form of art.

"What kid didn't draw at school. Like most though, I got caught up in life and work and didn't return to being an artist till I retired from Public Service some 15 years ago."

When asked how he would describe his style, lan said that each of his sketches have their own personality which enhances the beauty of each house.

"I could describe my sketches like comparing an old photograph to one taken yesterday on your phone. Sometimes when I look at one of my sketches it looks as though the house is "alive" so I guess I feel that my houses have personalities, even feelings," lan said.

"Every house is someone's home and I'm conscious of that whenever I do a sketch. I purposely don't favour iconic houses or streets because to me, it's not who lives in the place or even what street it is in, it's about giving an inanimate building personality."

While it is the houses that bring him inspiration, lan said that the sketches wouldn't happen without the support of his friends and family.



JUMP ON BOARD NOOSA'S FESTIVAL OF SURFING

on't miss the opportunity to watch hundreds of competitive surfers from around the globe catch Noosa's worldfamous surf breaks.

Experience an amazing line-up of surf, art, music and culture at the 32nd Noosa Festival of Surfing, which kicks off this year between 3 and 12 March.

Festival director Josh Allen said the event was a chance for people who aren't in the surf community to feel like a surfer for two weeks.

"This year we've got a return of the World Surf League and will be running a qualifying event, which will give people in the Australasia region a chance to qualify for the world tour," he said. "We are expecting 40 to 50 male competitors and 20 to 30 female competitors – the best longboarders in the country."

A new high performance longboard tour event will see competitors being judged for performing manoeuvres in the critical section of the wave.

"It's a step towards the festival evolving and becoming more opportunistic for high level surfing athletes to progress their careers," Josh said. "Also, the fact that it has been around for three decades and it's quite a prestigious event and looked at in high regard by the longboard community." The ten-day festival is also renowned for its celebration of surf and beach culture.

"There's a beach bar that attracts people from all over Queensland and Australia," Josh said. "You can have a nice beach day on the sand, go for a swim and enjoy a drink or two and a meal in the beach bar, and it's styled like a luxe Bali beach club with affordable pricing."

There will be free events including panel discussions with professional and ex-professional surfers, displays of surf art and a showcase of digitally restored old surf films.

Josh said people wanting to see the worldfamous Surfing Dog Championships on Saturday, 4 March at 3pm should arrive early.

"Usually we have around 7000 to 10,000 spectators," he said. "They line the beach, they line the rocks – it is a very big, global event."

"I'd like to thank the Noosa Malibu Club and World Surfaris. Without them, this festival wouldn't be what it is."

CONSULTATION SCHEDULED FOR

NEW BRIGHTON FORESHORE PLAN

risbane City Council has committed to the development of a new concept plan for the Brighton Foreshore, with consultation due to commence early this year.

The announcement comes in response to an online petition by Deagon Ward Councillor Jared Cassidy, calling for Council to fund a comprehensive upgrade of the Brighton Foreshore.

Councillor Cassidy said he had been campaigning alongside locals for the upgrade since he had been elected.

"I've been determined to see this project come to life and after years of work I'm excited to see it take shape," he said.

"As one of the best places in Brisbane to access and enjoy Moreton Bay, the Brighton foreshore has been left behind when compared to Shorncliffe, Sandgate and Wynnum. With patches of unsafe footpath and complete lack of appropriate amenities, the stretch has been neglected for too long.

"The response to my recent petition showed just how important this project is to locals and visitors alike."

The petition closed last May with more than 550 signatures.

Last year, the local Federal member Anika Wells MP announced she would support the delivery of the plan to the value of \$5 million.

"This outcome is a real result of the hard work put in by our community campaign, petitions and local advocacy," Councillor Cassidy said. I want to thank all of our petitioners, the many locals that contacted me about the stretch and of course Anika Wells MP for her vital contribution. It's a real win for our community off the back of a sustained, grass roots campaign for essential local infrastructure."

Council said the new concept plan would consider elements of the parkland including pathways, greenspace, shade trees, lighting, picnic facilities, amenities and park furniture.

Councillor Cassidy said he was happy to hear Council would be progressing community consultation.

"I have been advised that community consultation will roll out in the next few months and encourage locals to really take the opportunity to be heard," he said. "There will be newsletters, a web page and public sessions. The more effective this consultation is, the better the outcome for all involved."


