

across the Federal Electorate of Lilley.

Community groups seeking funding to deliver capital projects that provide social benefits to the wider community are invited to complete and return an SCP Expression of Interest form, which is available through the Lilley electorate office.

Grant amounts range from \$2,500 to \$20,000 and the project must be scheduled to finish by 31 December 2023.

Examples of eligible SCP projects include (but are not limited to) upgrades or fitouts of community centres, sporting facility upgrades or fitouts, kitchen upgrades, purchase of equipment, upgrade of park furniture, community BBQs, bike paths, streetscapes and community gardens.

Round 8 of the Stronger Communities Programme will provide grant funding up to 100 per cent of eligible project costs.

The deadline for expressions of interest is 3 March, 2023 at 5.00pm.

After all Expressions of Interest have been finalised, a community consultation panel will conduct a preliminary assessment of proposals before applicants will be invited to lodge formal applications online.

# CALL FOR COUNCIL TO FUND "THE BASICS"

eagon Ward Councillor Jared Cassidy is calling for a "back to basics" approach from Brisbane City Council in the lead up to this year's Budget.

Cr Cassidy has been conducting a survey asking residents what they would like to see happen in Sandgate, Deagon, and beyond.

"Since the floods in February 2022, drainage has been a major issue that has been raised with me many times," Cr Cassidy said.

"In many cases, there's been a lack of simple repairs and maintenance – small upgrades that could really help our suburbs."

He added footpath restoration and upkeep was also high on residents' wish list.

"People are not asking for big, flashy things – these are the things that people expect councils to do," Cr Cassidy said.

Some of the big-ticket funding items Cr Cassidy will be asking for include the implementation of the O'Callaghan Park masterplan, as well as "long overdue" rehabilitation of the Einbunpin Lagoon.

"The Einbunpin Lagoon upgrade is something we have been talking about for a long time," he said. "The planning for that has been done, it's there ready to go, we just need about \$3 million in funding.

"Also, we'd like to see the O'Callaghan Park masterplan go ahead – there's a weightlifting club there that sends people to the Olympics, there's soccer there, as well as AFL and NRL, and PCYC activities.

"The clubs there do the best they can with what they have, but we have a fully developed plan that has been ready to go for about five years.

"We've been promised a generational legacy for our suburbs from the Brisbane Olympics, and I would hope O'Callaghan Park would be part of that."

Cr Cassidy said he would be making his Budget submissions later this year.

"I think by and large people are happy to pay their rates, as long as they can see they're getting something in return," he said.

## BACK WITH A BANG

elebrating our azure aquatic surroundings has been a tradition on the Peninsula since the first Bluewater Festival in 1997, coinciding with the Gladstone Ports Corporation's Brisbane to Gladstone Yacht Race.

This year's Good Friday event (organised by the Sandgate Bayside Chamber of Commerce) is set to draw over 10,000 spectators and will feature fireworks, live entertainment and many other sights to signal the start of the race — such as a cannon fired at the end of the pier.

Bill Golan, President of the Sandgate Bayside Chamber of Commerce, said he was glad that the organisation was able to present the festival again and was anticipating stronger crowds.

"The festival is bigger and brighter this year and we are very proud to continue the tradition,' Mr Golan said.

According to Kate Bishop, Executive Officer of the Sandgate Bayside Chamber of Commerce, the live entertainment schedule will feature a wide range of performers, from kid's entertainers and local talent to industry favourites and a headline tribute band. The event provides the best absolute waterfront views for the official start of the 75th Brisbane to Gladstone race. Multihull yachts are set to start the race just off the Shorncliffe Pier, with a huge spectator flotilla of Moreton Bay classic cruisers also set to do a procession past the foreshore.

"It's an amazing experience to watch these magnificent boats in action and to witness the fire-cannon start," Ms Bishop said.


Along with an exciting side show alley, a kid's zone and beach side activities, the ferris wheel featured at last year's event will be back this time around.

Mr Golan said the Skywheel was a spectacular attraction which was set to operate in daytime and nighttime hours and would be open all Easter weekend.

"The Skywheel will be perched high on the cliffs of Upper Moora Park, offering magnificent views of the mountains right through to the ocean. As it towers over the whole of Shorncliffe, it's an iconic fixture over that weekend. Mr Golan said.

ne of Shorncliffe's own gals recently took her passion for boot scootin' into country towns around Australia and along the way made a lot of people (including herself) very happy.

Claire Harris and her best mate Kate Strong (from Rockhampton), set off in March 2022 for the nine month, almost 50,000 km, road trip under the banner 'Hoedowns For Country Towns'.

"Our three main goals were to share the love of line dancing, bring communities together, and to raise money for rural charities – and we're proud to say we achieved all three," said Claire.

We raised \$38,250 in total; including \$6800 for Aussie Helpers (Qld), \$9300 for Blue Tree Project (WA) and \$12,600 for Rural Alive and Well (Tas)".

'Hoedowns' was a serious financial risk for the girls who had met at a line dancing class in Toowoomba in mid-2018. They were determined to quit their jobs to live their shared dream to travel the whole nation with their country tunes and trusty (and often dusty) boots.

"Our biggest crowd was Westbury, Tasmania with 104 people, and our smallest was Rosebery, Tasmania with just one person showing up!" Said Claire. "Across 75 hoedowns, our average attendance was about 30 to 40 people."

Apart from an extensive social media following via Facebook and Instagram, the girls appeared on 'The Project' (10 Network) the Channel 7 Morning Show and were followed around by an ABC video crew for a week who were shooting for a special edition of 'Backroads' which will screen in mid-2023.


Since the conclusion of the tour last December Kate has returned to Rockhampton and Claire and her partner have headed off to Adelaide for a few years to continue her career as a journalist and events manager. But she does so with the solid promise of later heading back to Queensland "for good".

# **DEVASTATION IN DEAGON:**12 MONTHS ON

n February 27, 2022, a devastating deluge of rain forever changed the lives of many individuals and communities across Brisbane. Twelve months on, two Deagon residents reflect on that day and how they're still dealing with the aftermath.

As the water levels rose that fateful Sunday, Mick, who was renting in Deagon at the time, watched it all unfold faster than he could ever have imagined. "We initially noticed a stream of water flowing down the road," he said, "but within no time, it turned into a torrent with rubbish, branches, and bins rushing down the street. I watched the water rise in my yard and then rush under the door into the house. Within ten minutes it was up to my knees."

Nearby, another Deagon resident, Jaclyn, heard unusual noises coming from outside. "It was garbage bins floating down the street and banging into cars," she said. "It wasn't long after that we noticed that the lower level of our house was flooding."

While Jaclyn managed to turn the power off and shelter upstairs with her family, Mick fled his home and headed for higher ground. "I was able to grab a bag and make a dash for my car," he said. "The biggest challenge was figuring out where to go as most of the roads were cut off by floods. Reality soon set in that I was going to have to spend a cold, wet night in my car."

As the events of that Sunday continued to unfold, someone ended up knocking on the window of Mick's car and offered him a place to stay for the night. "I was able to have a warm shower and a home cooked meal," said Mick. "I will be forever grateful to Tim and his partner for the assistance they gave me."

Immediately following the flood, Jaclyn's family moved out of their home to allow it to dry and to get through all of the clean up. "That was a very hard time with kids and pets," she said. "We were really lucky to have fabulous friends help us get through it. However, the most frustrating part is that our home has still not been repaired. The delay is builders who never get back to us. After a full year, we really just want to be able to live in our home properly again."

Facing feelings of overwhelming devastation and loss, Mick also had to move out of his home, however, for him, it was permanent. "The damage was just as bad as expected," he said. "I lost so many belongings - including irreplaceable items from travels around the globe. Mentally it's still a struggle. I lost a great home and a wonderful community."

Through it all, both Mick and Jaclyn have an immense amount of gratitude. "Jared Cassidy and his team were super helpful," Mick said, "and many of the football players I helped coach also stepped up. Just having others there to talk with really lifted my spirits in the days immediately following the flood."

Jaclyn also has much to be grateful for. "I know there are so many other people out there still dealing with this too and we all just want to put this behind us," she said. "Our family lost a lot that night but no one was hurt - and for that we are very thankful."





onstruction is currently underway at the Zillmere Library. ## SAVOURY PORK CHOPS

#### **METHOD**

- 4 pork chops (or adjust the recipe allowing a chop per person). Saute in a small amount of olive oil to seal. Place in single layer in a lidded casserole dish.
- Slice a medium red capsicum, 8-12 cup mushrooms and a medium brown onion.
- Saute the onion and capsicum until they start to soften then add mushrooms and continue to cook for another minute so they maintain slight firmness.
- Add curry powder. If you like a spicy dish ½ tablespoon but experiment according to taste. For a family meal or a meal where you don't want too much "heat" about ¼ tablespoon
- Add one teaspoon of mustard powder.
- Combine with vegetables allowing the spices to become aromatic
- Sprinkle in 4 tablespoons of plain flour, combine.
- Gradually add 400mls hot vegetable stock stirring constantly to give a thick sauce.
- Mix in 2 tablespoons of tomato puree and a tablespoon of Worcestershire sauce.
- Pour savoury vegetable sauce over chops.
- Cover the casserole dish and bake in the oven at 180 degrees celsius for 50 minutes if the chops are thin, up to an hour if thick.
- Serve with rice and steamed green beans, wilted baby spinach or another green vegetable of choice.

he much anticipated makeover of Sue's Korner is now underway thanks to Brisbane City Council's Village Precinct Projects initiative.

Work commenced at the shopping strip on the Sandgate and Beams/Stanworth Roads intersection last month, with improvements including a footpath upgrade, improved pedestrian access, street greening, new unique seating, street furniture and creative features to improve the appearance of the precinct.

Deagon Ward Councillor Jared Cassidy said it was great to see the project come to life in the heart of Boondall.

"Since the Village Precincts Projects first began I've been advocating for Sue's Korner to be prioritised," Cr Cassidy said.

"Sue's Korner has long held a special place in Boondall having first opened in the 1950's. Named after local Jimmy Sue-Tin, who originally built and owned the complex, the Korner has been a Boondall icon for decades. Some of the Sue-Tin family still live in Boondall."

Council has invested up to \$1 million in the upgrade, which will involve tree planting, new garden beds and creative elements like decorative balustrade panels that celebrate the local character and natural environment.

The improvements were informed by community feedback, which supported accessibility

upgrades like improved pedestrian access and safety.

Cr Cassidy said many of the footpath and access points in and around the community hub were dangerous and unusable, especially for elderly community members.

"In addition to the accessibility upgrades, I'm happy to see the project include extensive planting works. This will make a huge difference, providing more shade for users and bringing a different look to the space," he said.

"Temperatures in and around the shops have always been an issue and I think many locals will notice a big difference with some greenspace and shade."

Cr Cassidy said while the business owners had done a lot to lift the look and feel of their properties, the public spaces hadn't been kept up.

"I'm really looking forward to seeing this project wrap up and have a positive effect on both the local businesses and their customers," Cr Cassidy said. "It's great to secure some real investment and action in Boondall."

The project is due to be completed by mid-2023.

he Sandgate Northpoint Anglican Church has held a monthly street stall in Sandgate for many years, but now the parish has a more permanent spot to interact with the community, while also raising money for the church and local charities.

St Peter's Thrift Shop opened in Brighton last month and will be selling a range of affordable goods each Friday between 8am and 4pm.

Sandgate Northpoint priest in charge Mike Donaldson said that during COVID they had made a number of changes to the parish, including the end of Sunday worship at St Peter's.

"It was from this that the idea of a permanent thrift shop grew," Mike said. "We saw it as a way to offer much more stock and connect with the community in a new way."

The thrift shop sells a wide variety of items including clothing, books, toys, plants, household items and jewellery.

"Also, on the first Friday of the month we will offer home cooking," Mike said. "It is recommended that people get in early as it sells out very quickly."

Proceeds from the thrift shop will benefit the work of the church, as well as going towards those in need.

"For many years, the Anglican church has given financial support to local groups such as



SANDBAG and Sailability, along with Cancer Council and School Chaplaincy," Mike said. "This support will continue with the thrift shop with a monthly donation of \$400 to various charities identified by the Parish Council."

Those wishing to donate items can drop them at the shop on Fridays between 7:30am and 4:00pm. Items must be in good condition, clean and not broken. The parish has a limited capacity to collect larger items like furniture. Electrical items can be accepted and will be tested before being put on sale.

Mike said the opening day in February had been a great success and he thanked the community for their support.

"We had big crowds in the morning and afternoon and a steady flow of patrons during the day," he said. "I hope this will be the promise of good things to come."

The shop is easily accessible with the 310 bus from Sandgate stopping nearby.

Tehya 'Tey' Lumsdon has Autism Spectrum Disorder, Sensory Processing Disorder and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder and although she has tried her hand at many different activities, it was a passion for making beauty products that sparked the idea for her business, Tey's Cosmetics.

Her mother, Amina Lumsdon said Tey had faced many difficulties with kid's activities and programs because of her neurodiversity, which sometimes resulted in her being excluded.

Tey added, "I saw a lip balm photo and said to my mummy, 'hey, I want to make lippies and sell them to people."

Tey's Cosmetics was launched in December last year and involves Tey hand pouring lip balms using Australian beeswax, shea butter, coconut oil and Vitamin E oil.

Amina said Tey had always been able to engage well in activities that allowed her to safely sensory seek and explore.

Mary said they had a running joke where Lenny liked to introduce Lorna as his wife, and Mary as his girlfriend.

## **Keeping Our Cyclists Safe**

he 4017 area has many popular cycling routes for riding enthusiasts like Brighton resident Lance Chamberlain and his friend Glen Baxter to enjoy.

However, the pair have reported many dangerous passes in the area, which they find particularly unsettling because Glen is legally blind, with only contrasting definitions (different shades of grey) by way of sight.

Glen rides on a tandem bike with Lance, who acts as the pilot up front. Lance said that unfortunately, they experienced at least one or two very close passes each week.

"For me piloting for Glen, it is really frightening to have someone pass so close, because if I need to react or not to keep both of us safe it could very easily end up with both of us being killed," Lance said. "If Glen is spooked by a pass and reacts the wrong way, we could very easily be knocked off and not necessarily from a direct hit but because of reacting to the pass."

Lance is an accredited AusCycling road and track coach and ride leader, who rides with cameras fitted at the front and rear of his bike. When riding with Glen, he uses a Garmin Varia radar to alert him to vehicles approaching from behind.

They usually ride together three times each week.

"Our early morning go-to ride before work is a 35 kilometre ride from Carseldine to the Deviation cycle path via Bracken Ridge Road down to the Ted Smout Bridge and then back along the Sandgate foreshore, Shorncliffe and returning via Telegraph Road," Lance said.

Glen added that some of the close calls made the hairs on the back of his neck stand up.

"It is like crossing an intersection in a motor car and someone runs the red light – you nearly have a heart attack and your life flashes in front of your eyes when you realise just how close the catastrophe was and the result that could have been," he said.

"Like all motorists, cyclists have a family and loved ones to get home to. Both Lance and I have partners and children. A bit of courtesy and patience goes a long way. Let's all get along so we can get home safely."

In Queensland, you must leave at least one metre when passing a bicycle or personal mobility device in a 60km/hr or less zone and at least one and a half metres in a speed zone over 60km/hr.

## Organic Gardening in March

hile the beginning of March can still be very hot, as we head towards Easter temperatures cool to perfect outdoor weather.

Shake off the summer lethargy and get to all those gardening jobs you have been putting off. Those weeds aren't going to pull themselves! It's time for a good old-fashioned tidy up with removal of dead and unwanted plants, tending of garden beds and checking the condition of your soil.

Healthy soil breaks up easily and is teeming with life, some microbial and some visible such as worms and bugs. If your soil is compacted or leached, add some organic matter eg organic mulch or garden mix, and organic fertilizer. These will improve the structure of the soil, drainage, and the amount of nutrition available to your plants. Healthy soil yields healthy plants.

This is the ideal time to plant a cornucopia of vegetables along with some strawberry runners or plants. Your hard work will pay off with a bountiful harvest during the cooler months. Few things are more delightful than growing, picking, and eating your own fresh produce.

What to plant now -tomatoes, capsicum, eggplant, lettuce, carrot, beetroot, silverbeet, beans, peas, zucchini, broccoli, cabbage, garlic, onion and cauliflower.



### It's a fair cop

rime is rarely stationary. It is either on the increase or the reverse" So opined the Brisbane Courier in 1866, from which we may deduce that little has changed in the past 150-odd years. Let's see what sorts of wrongdoing engaged the police in early Sandgate.

There was the matter of the 11 sailors who, in 1866, deserted from the steamer Legion of Honour. Having landed a stolen boat at Sandgate, these miscreants, in passing the lock-up, alerted Sergeant Brady to their presence. Brady, with Constable McClusky, pursued the fleeing deserters and caught up with them near the German Station (now Nundah) where "the formal arrest of the lot was easily enough managed". Difficulties ensued, however, thanks to the prisoners evading their captors whenever they came to a pub and "taking in a supply of grog." Undaunted, Brady and McClusky eventually succeeded in getting the, by then, inebriated seamen to Brisbane to face court.

Less successful for the Sandgate constabulary was the case of the murder, in April 1890, of Germain Dubrocca, "a French recluse of industrious habits and inoffensive disposition". He was found, with fatal head injuries, at his camp "in the Brighton Paddock". Later in the


month, the police arrested one John Rigney on suspicion of the crime, only to have him released in May, "without a stain on his character". Embarrassingly, the magistrate castigated the police for keeping Rigney in the lockup "as it was known all along that the police had practically no evidence against him". The real perpetrator was never found.

Petty crime abounded. In 1894, Arthur Shenton, "the one-legged thief", came to Sandgate by train with the intention of begging. He solicited funds from one Thomas Harris of Deagon. When Harris refused, Shenton went to his house and stole a watch and chain. Shenton then had the misfortune to "fall into the loving arms of Constable Forrest" and was put in the lock-up. Despite Shenton's defence that he was only seeking funds to purchase a wooden leg, he was fined 20 shillings.

A case from 1889 reminds us that, in some respects, policing never changes. The Sandgate Police Court was told that the wife of Otto Ohlbrecht was forced to seek protection when he threatened to cut her throat. Police reported to the court that Otto "had been in the habit of mistreating [her] when under the influence of liquor". In policing, as in most things, everything old is new again.

or many, the dream of competing at an international level in sailing might seem impossible, but for local brothers, James and Joshua Dale, that dream has come true.

The brothers recently competed in the 2023 Musto Optimist National Championships in Sydney, resulting in James being selected to be part of the Australian Optimist Sailing Team, and Josh selected to be part of the Australian Junior Development Squad.

Both brothers will have the opportunity to sail at an international level and are trying to raise funds to make that dream happen.

Learning to sail at Humpybong Sailing Club and the Royal Queensland Yacht Squadron,

James, 13, said he is excited to have the opportunity to represent Australia.

"I am very proud to have made it into the Australian Optimist Sailing Team, and am excited at the prospect of competing in Abu Dhabi at the Asian and Oceanian Optimist Championships in October," James said. "My aim is to train as hard as I can between now and then to secure a top 10 position."

At just 11 years of age, Josh will be heading to Singapore where he will use the challenging weather conditions to his advantage.

"I am so excited to have the opportunity to sail in Singapore with the Australian Optimist Junior Development Squad (AODS). Singapore is known for light and shifty wind conditions which suit me as I am one of the smaller and lighter sailors."

As well as being champion sailors, the pair have started their own business to help cover the costs of sailing internationally.

"We wanted to find a way to help with the costs of sailing. We had some old ropes laying around, and decided to see if we could make bracelets," Josh said. "I then had the idea to contact some of the big famous boats in the Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race and see if they would donate some ropes. I was amazed when our first reply was from Blackjack, one of the most famous boats!"

Get Salty, Stay Cool is due to launch in March, with 10% of the profits going towards Moreton Bay based organisation, EcoMarines, which educates kids about marine conservation.

## IMAGINE 'HONEY I SHRUNK THE KIDS' BUTTIMES A TRILLION

hen an experiment doesn't go to plan, the entire 'Ant-Fam' is shrunk down so small that they're transported to "The Quantum Realm, a reality where all concepts of time and space become irrelevant as they shrink for all eternity". However, don't get too hung up on the premise, they're basically stuck in a different dimension and have to escape before a time travelling conquerer destroys them and alternate timelines across the universe.

This is the start of a new phase for Marvel and it takes quite a novel approach, setting pretty much the entire film in 'The Quantum Realm'. I was fully immersed in this colourful world of strange creatures and unknown possibilities, introducing new characters who are fun with not much time wasted on giving them intricate backstories. Instead, they are provided with little quirks and foibles to make them more endearing when they take on the bad quys.

Paul Rudd and Evangeline Lilly are great as the titular Antman and Wasp, being their typical lovable selves, not really pushing any emotional range or busting their acting chops. But for me it's the other female leads, Michelle Pfeiffer and Kathryn Newton who are more interesting to watch. They have a bigger role to play and are given some of the better lines and action sequences to play with.

Jonathan Majors is the villain of the piece as Kang, bringing a great subtlety to his bad guy role, with restraint that isn't often seen in action movies. Although sometimes he plays it so cool, you almost wish he would come out on top.

Like the majority of Marvel movies it's pretty special effects heavy but it's done in a way that really adds to the world building. You don't need to have to have seen the previous Ant-Man films but it will make the story that much richer. Overall, this is a fun family film about interdimensional time travel that should keep both kids and big kids entertained. Make sure to stay around for the two extra end credit scenes.



Here's a common question from a new patient: I was given two hearing aids from another place. I am not hearing well. What can you do to help me? Every case is different. However, generally these are the steps I follow:

- 1. An Otoscopy is done to confirm if earwax is obstructing the earcanal. If it is the case, Earwax Microsuction can remove the blockage and the hearing should improve.
- 2. Replace the hearing aid earwax filter (a monthly procedure). Deep cleaning the microphone and speaker unit can also make a significant impact to the sound quality.
- 3. Perform a hearing test. Accurate test results are crucial to determine if the hearing aid output is sufficient for the level of hearing loss.
- 4. Login the hearing aid computer system and check the default factory settings. Real-ear measurement tests often reveal a significant discrepancy on acoustic performance. It's best to avoid factory settings. Using the best practice approach, I perform my own testing, fine-tuning the hearing aid settings until the hearing aid output and frequency response match to the degree of hearing loss.

Including history taking and discussing further improvements, the whole process may take up to 45 - 60 mins. As an audiologist, it is very important to invest quality time to get the hearing aids programmed properly. By doing this, it benefits our clients every single minute the hearing aids are worn. It is definitely well worth it.
