We hope you'll accept our invitation to enjoy an evening of elegant classics in the historic ambience of Sandgate Town Hall on Saturday, June 3. Simply sit back and allow highly accomplished duo, György Déri (cello) and Roger Cui (piano), to transport you into the realms of experience that lovers of the art have enjoyed down through the ages.

Spending time with The Stowaway Collective's Chris Clarkson, Sebastian Flynn, Martin Reece, Christian Rizzalli, and Arash Zanganeh will be like an evening spent with old friends, on July 1.

Sebastian Flynn explains, "The Stowaway Collective have played for Sandgate MBTS before and were very well received as a trio, consisting of Martin and Sebastian with the addition of multiinstrumentalist and singer Christian Rizzalli.

"More recently, the trio drafted in Iranian percussion master Arash Zanganeh, adding incisive rhythms on a range of Middle Eastern hand drums and clay pots etc. The group also recently co-opted a fifth member with Chris Clarkson on Uilleann pipes (Irish bagpipes) and other wind instruments, collectively creating a rich and vibrant 5-piece ensemble with a unique approach both instrumentally and creatively. "As we have already recorded a CD and have some track record as The Stowaways, it seemed best to retain the Stowaway concept to provide a sense of being hidden passengers in the shadows of different cultural traditions.

"So, the most recent incarnation of the Stowaway Collective has been formed with the intention to create and perform completely original music that the group now loosely refer to as 'music from an unknown country'."

And in a salute to the classics Sebastian adds, "The English composer Ralph Vaughan Williams referred to the simple 17th century English folk dance tunes that he was collecting as 'symphonies in miniature', given that they often displayed the same ground plan as a Beethoven symphony in miniature. he local art community will this year celebrate a decade of beautiful Bramble Bay brush strokes as the 10th Annual 4017 Community Exhibition bursts to life at Gallery 4017.

The 4017 Community Exhibition is a competition open to all artists living in the 4017 postcode and to those affiliated with Artrageous Arts.

### Playground Named Uncle Lewis Orcher Place

Iocal playground will be named in honour of Aboriginal Elder, Uncle Lewis Orcher, who lived and worked in the community for more than 60 years. This month, the revamped playground at O'Callaghan Park in Zillmere will be unveiled as Uncle Lewis Orcher Place.

Deagon Ward Councillor Jared Cassidy said Uncle Lewis was a fierce advocate, a compassionate Elder and a real friend to many on the Northside.

"As a long-term Zillmere local and respected community Elder, Uncle Lewis had a strong connection to O'Callaghan Park and the nearby Zillmere PCYC, becoming a vital part of their Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Youth Justice Program," Cr Cassidy said.

Uncle Lewis was a founder of Koobara Kindy, which began in 1974.

Gloria at Koobara Kindy said Uncle Lewis attended meetings with Brisbane City Council about moving the kindergarten from the old church hall to a new, safe site.

"He was a very strong advocate for social justice for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families and kids, especially children, giving them access to an early childhood centre such as Koobara where they are taught by Indigenous educators about their identity and to be proud of who they are," Gloria said.

Uncle Lewis was instrumental in organising the first Northside community NAIDOC celebration at O'Callaghan Park.

"We learnt a lot from him and he was like a library in himself, always speaking words of wisdom," Gloria said. "We still live in his dream of keeping the doors of communication open – to continue his legacy. He was a great mentor."

This change will save patients up to \$180 per year, and will benefit more than 37,707 Lilley residents.

In addition, fortnightly Centrelink payments will increase for 8510 people in Lilley under our package. And 9025 local households will benefit from a 15% boost to the maximum rates of Commonwealth Rent Assistance.

We are also increasing funding by an additional \$54.3 million to critical Australian Apprenticeship supports to improve completion rates, including for 2975 apprentices currently in training in Lilley.

B ig things happen in Minis. The iconic tiny cars are beloved worldwide, and it was no different on May 28 when the Mini Owners Club of Queensland united to hold the London to Brighton Run.

# **SPICY CORN, LENTIL & PUMPKIN CHOWDER**

Serving: 4 people as a main or 6 people as a starter

### **INGREDIENTS:**

1 tbsp olive oil 1 large white onion, finely diced 2 garlic cloves crushed ½ tsp cayenne pepper 200g split lentils 200g pumpkin, roughly diced into 2cm chunks 700ml vegetable stock - reduced salt 1 x 400ml tin coconut milk 1 Scotch Bonnet chilli, halved\* 2 thyme sprigs 1 x 200g tin corn drained freshly ground black pepper

METHOD: Heat the oil in a large saucepan over a medium heat, add the onion and garlic and sweat until softened but not coloured. Add the cayenne pepper and cook for 1 minute, then add the split lentils, squash, stock, milk, chilli and thyme. Bring to a simmer, then reduce the heat to low and cook for 20–25 minutes, until the pumpkin is tender and the lentils are soft, but not mushy. Add the corn, season with pepper and bring the soup back to a simmer.

**Tip:** For less chilli heat remove the seeds from the chilli before cooking.

To Serve: Spoon soup into bowls and drizzle with a little chilli oil and a sprinkling of flat leaf parsley.

\*Note: The Scotch Bonnet chilli is one of the main ingredients used to flavour the dishes of the Caribbean - it is sweet and very hot. Red chillies can be a substitute for Scotch Bonnet chillies.

istory means change, which means that wherever you live you are surrounded by history. An ordinary suburban street, for instance, now quietly residential, may once have been a bustling thoroughfare hosting shops, businesses or government entities. Such is Kate Street, Shorncliffe.

Once Sandgate's main street, not only was Kate Street busier, it was bigger. Now running west from Rainbow Street to Barton Street, prior to 1913 it included what is now Pier Ave and ended overlooking the sea at Park Parade.

Having first appeared in government gazettes of 1853. Kate Street then featured regularly in real estate advertisements of the 1860s with allotments offered to "Gentlemen and others in guest of a seaside residence". Sandgate's popularity as a seaside resort all but guaranteed the success of these sales, as well as a booming rental market. In 1873, for example, a gentleman (or other) in search of holiday accommodation could avail himself of Bellevue Cottage (six rooms, kitchen and servant's room), to let in Kate Street. More land went on sale in 1879. excitable advertising urging prospective buyers to consider the benefits of Sandgate: "Glorious sea breeze! ... No doctors required! ... Bathing and fishing! ... Splendid garden land!"

In 1882, Kate Street became the centre of municipal government with construction of the first Sandgate town hall. Conveniently located nearby were the Sea View Hotel, also opened in 1882, followed by the Musgrave Hotel, on the corner with Yundah Street, in 1884. Both establishments were especially well located to cater to the seaside-going crowds when the Sandgate railway was extended to Shorncliffe in 1897.

Another Kate Street business was A W Field: "Chemist, Druggist and Surgeon/Dentist ... prescriptions at strictly Brisbane prices ... Teeth carefully extracted". The street also hosted seaside accommodation, including a Mrs Watson offering a "comfortable home for ladies with children, or children without parents." Given the number of reports of arrests for drunkenness in Kate Street peppering the newspapers of the time, it is to be hoped that Mrs Watson's establishment was in "Lower Kate Street" far from the pubs. Mr Field, though, probably did a brisk trade in hangover cures.

Those who thronged Kate Street 130 years ago would not recognise it today, quietly residential, the pubs gone, the holidaymakers no longer surging up the street from the station and the town hall, which burned down in 1910, only a presence in old photos. There is still a glorious sea breeze, though, and splendid garden land.



# **LEONARD SUE-TIN:** A DESCENDANT OF EARLY ENTREPRENEURS

#### eonard Sue-Tin, 94, comes from generations of hardworking business owners.

In fact, the Sue-Tin family have contributed to making the local area the thriving community it is today. And it all began with a dream.

Leonard's grandfather, Matthew Sue-Tin, left his home in China in 1886 with the hope of finding wealth and prosperity during Australia's gold rush. Matthew and his brother, George became successful fruit and vegetable traders, shop owners and furniture manufacturers, eventually passing their legacy onto their children.

Born in 1901, Guy Sue-Tin (Leonard's father) grew fruit and vegetables on land he owned in Manly and Nudgee. From vending with horse and cart to selling at Rocklea Markets, pop-up stalls on Fifth Avenue, Sandgate and privately-owned land in Brighton, the family worked hard picking, washing, peeling and packing produce.

Guy developed his Brighton property into what is now Brighton Shopping Village on Beaconsfield Terrace. He also owned Sue Brothers, a furnituremaking business in Bowen Hills, which later moved to Northgate.

Leonard's uncle, Jim Sue-Tin, purchased land in Boondall for a market garden and fruit and



vegetable shop. In 1962, Jim upgraded the site and established the shopping precinct Sue's Korner, which remains a significant landmark today.

When Guy passed away in 1981, Leonard and his brother, Lionel continued to run Sue Brothers and together with their sister, Corinne, inherited Brighton Shopping Village.

Leonard and his wife, Lorna still own the family home they purchased in Boondall more than 55 years ago – one of the first built in the area – choosing the location to be close to family and Sue's Korner. Today, Lorna, 93, still remembers how people would talk of Sue's Korner, purchasing goods from the original fruit and vegetable shop, delicatessen and Chinese takeaway.

Leonard said he was proud of his Australian Chinese descent, the businesses he managed, and the partnerships developed over time between the generations.

"I loved working and providing for my family – having a family-owned and operated business, offering others equal opportunities in work and life," Leonard said. "Sharing culture, stories and experiences. Serving the local community – a sense of community being a high value of the Chinese culture. Yes, there were challenges but my family saw these as opportunities to open up our minds, embrace the challenges and work harder, together."

Leonard is the only living of his siblings. He and Lorna share six grandchildren, eight great-grandchildren and eight great-great grandchildren. Leonard finished by saying his family appreciated the community wanting to keep the 'Sues Korner' name (with a K); even with the shopping village revamp. It means a lot to them.

## Raising Awareness for MND with Sandgate Local Leanne Sklavenitis

his June marks MND Queensland's 40th anniversary of helping to support the thousands of Queenslanders who have been impacted by Motor Neuron Disease (MND). Approximately 140,000 new cases of MND are diagnosed globally each year and the chance of developing the condition is roughly 1 in 300.

Also known as Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS), MND is a rare condition that progressively damages neurons which control the muscles we use to move, speak, breathe, and swallow. As MND tends to progress quite rapidly, patients are generally given a life expectancy of only 2-5 years from the onset of symptoms.

Sandgate local, Leanne Sklavenitis, knows all too well how crushing an MND diagnosis can be. "It all started In 2016 when I had a clumsy fall and landed hard on my knee," she said. "Over the next 18 months, I experienced a range of other symptoms and just knew that something wasn't right." After a number of MRIs and a whole slew of other tests, as well as consultations with three different neurologists, Leanne was finally told the words she never wanted to hear.

"An MND diagnosis is a pretty hard thing to swallow," she said. "Being told at the age of 53 that I likely only had a few years to live was really tough." However, nearly six years after her diagnosis, Leanne is continuing to smash the stereotypical MND prognosis.

On Friday, June 23rd, as part of MND awareness month, MND Queensland will be bringing back their Story Bridge Climb to raise funds for this important cause. "The bridge will be lit up in blue as a tribute to those who have passed," Leanne said, "and I'm excited to be taking part in the event as a special guest speaker." Although MND has taken away Leanne's ability to speak in the traditional sense, she continues to make sure her story is heard through the help of eye gaze technology and Al voice output.

Since her diagnosis, Leanne has maintained her optimistic outlook and has been doing her part to hopefully one day find a cure. "I've been involved in research studies since very early on in my journey," she said. "I am really looking forward to continuing my visits to MND labs and advocating for funding to find a cure - it will happen!"

# Organic Gardening in June

Use clean and dry combustible material so you don't smoke out your neighbours.

Now is also an opportune time for planning. Cosy up with your hot beverage of choice and scroll the Internet for fabulous garden ideas. Pinterest has beautiful pictures and YouTube will show you how to DIY.

What to plant now – beetroot, silverbeet, cabbages, broccoli, onion family, peas, lettuce, carrots and spinach.

"Or we could knock on people's doors."

Ideas started bouncing off each other like balloons. The teacher sat back in her chair, pleasantly surprised. 'Okay, so when are you going to start?"

Now.

The room dispersed, and with the instructions of Llewie and Gemma, the other student council members started making posters, writing a Facebook post for the school, and started arranging times when people can donate and where to.

After only a day's worth of organisation, the students started going around to the staff at their school, their peers, and the communities' houses asking for donations. Many people were more than happy to spare an old jumper or a few cans of beans. Over two weeks, the kids received over \$2,500 worth of food items, clothing, blankets, toiletries, and cash donations. At the end of these two weeks, the students worked with their school to organise a truck to go around Brisbane and hand out the donations, which had been organised and cleaned by the students.

The week following the big handout, the students were shocked to see that they were in the local newspaper, and underneath their picture, many "Thank yous" had been left by the receivers of their donations. None of the kids involved had been homeless before, but they knew that it was something very unfortunate to be put through. Even though \$2,500 is not a lot, and is not going to stop people being homeless, over the course of the two weeks, together, they have still made a difference.

# WALK WITH THE 'ROOS' AT TINCHI TAMBA

#### I nly in Australia' do majestic kangaroos grace us with their presence at our very doorsteps.

Sandgate residents are fortunate to have Eastern Grey Kangaroos living at theirs, specifically in Tinchi Tamba Wetland Reserve. These kangaroos first migrated to Tinchi Tamba years ago when their natural habitat was compromised by urban development and even most recently, the 2022 floods have left them struggling.

Under normal living conditions, kangaroos are an integral part of Australia's survival. For example, they consume enough plant life which aids in the reduction of enough vegetation that lowers risks associated with bushfire hazards. They forage, spread seeds, fertilise areas including nutrient deficient soils, and more.

Keep Sandgate Beautiful Association Inc (KSBA) was formed in 1971 to encourage community awareness and education of its incredible landscapes and the wildlife which call it home.

"KSBA has held Roo Walks through Tinchi Tamba over a number of years," said Jenny Carey, President of KSBA. " But this is the first time we're having an expert in kangaroos join us on the walk, so we're very fortunate." Dr Beth Brunton, Ecologist, working at the University of the Sunshine Coast, has a broad range of research interests and at the heart of it is kangaroos.

"My current research focuses on the human impacts on wildlife, with a focus on Eastern Grey Kangaroos in urban environments," said Dr Brunton. "I'm passionate about applied research and inspiring change within local communities to develop innovative approaches to solving conservation challenges.

"I'm looking forward to getting to know the locals at the walk (human and kangaroo) and to share my knowledge of kangaroo ecology and the risks the kangaroos face here in SE Qld," Dr Brunton said.

# LUMINOUS FESTIVAL LIGHTS UP THE NIGHT

t began as a candlelight walk with a handful of people and has since become Queensland's largest parade celebrating cultural diversity.

Now in its sixteenth year, Multicultural Australia's LUMINOUS Lantern Parade returns to South Bank Parklands on Friday, 9 June, with more than 10,000 people expected to attend the demonstration of solidarity and support.

Multicultural Australia CEO, Christine Castley, said the free event was an important celebration of Queensland's cultural diversity.

"LUMINOUS is all about highlighting the warm spirit of welcome, connection and belonging that is extended to everyone living in Queensland and celebrating the many culturally and linguistically diverse communities who have made their home here, letting them know that their cultures are accepted and embraced," Christine said.

"For 25 years, Multicultural Australia has worked in the Queensland community to create belonging and to change the conversation about the many communities and cultures who live here and who make a significant economic, social and cultural contribution in Queensland."

More than 100 groups will join the symbolic walk, from cultural groups and schools to religious communities and government and corporate organisations. Lanterns will take the form of giant wildlife and flora, celestial bodies and symbols of kindness.
