Riverside Guitar Ensemble's September 2 concert has something for everyone. There's an item from Anime film and television animation, the classics are well represented the international premiere of Ginastera's Dream by Brazilian composer Chrystian Dozza, works by young Brisbane artists, and a Solstice Guitar interlude to the mix.

Let's welcome the brothers home as they launch their new album Sidekick. Ziggy says, "For us, concerts are about connecting with our audience and having a shared experience." To enjoy that connection, grasp the tail of these two shooting stars and pencil August 5 in your diary.

Chalklen and Parkinson have built a reputation

for their evocative song writing, keen harmonies and mesmerising live performances at home and abroad. If you were in Nashville recently you'd have caught them playing at the famous Bluebird Cafe. Otherwise, you may have heard tracks from their five studio albums, working alongside greats like Larry Campbell (think Bob Dylan and Levon Helm).

Kerbside Collection Returns

t's time to start spring cleaning because Brisbane City Council's kerbside collection service is back again next month.

Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner said the release of the 2023-24 kerbside collection schedule would help residents plan for the service and potentially avoid having to pay to take items to a Council resource recovery centre.

"Kerbside collection provides a safe and free way to discard large items, helping residents keep their homes clean while also reducing illegal dumping," Cr Schrinner said.

Residents will be able to put out large items like fridges, baths, sporting equipment, mattresses and furniture. Unacceptable items include batteries, bean bags, bricks, car parts and tyres, gas bottles, glass, garden waste and liquids, such as paint.

Cr Schrinner encouraged residents to also consider whether items could be donated or recycled rather than discarded.

"These could include donating items to friends, family, a local charity or recycling eligible items at one of Council's four recovery centres," he said.

Those living in Shorncliffe and Bracken Ridge should have their items ready for collection by 2 October. Sandgate, Deagon, Brighton and Taigum residents will need to have their items ready to be picked up by 9 October. Collection begins in Zillmere and Boondall on 16 October and Geebung on 23 October.

One Local Remembers

al, a longtime resident of Sandgate and former student of Sandgate State School, holds cherished memories from her time at the school. As the community celebrates the



school's 150th anniversary, Val shared some of her reminiscences with us.

In 1946, shortly after the end of World War II, Val, at the age of 5, entered Sandgate State School, eager to begin her educational journey. Transportation was different back then, as Val recalls, "When we went to school, we

either walked or rode our bikes because not many families had cars in those days."

Val vividly remembers various moments from her time at Sandgate State School, with the fancy dress balls at the Sandgate Town Hall being particularly special.

"For weeks before the ball, we had to learn the dances, and some of these had to be done holding a boy's hand," she reminisces. "This was met with a yuk - not the smelly boys!

"I went as a devil, wearing a red satin outfit, and my dad made me a pitchfork. My friend Glennis went as a cabbage girl. Her mum hollowed out a big cabbage, using the outside leaves and stalk as her hat, and sewing the leaves onto a dress!"

Val's experiences at the school not only left a lasting impact on her but also on her friends. She fondly recalls her close friend Janice, who would always panic during exam time. Although Janice didn't pass the scholarship exam, one of their teachers, Mr. Draper, wrote her a heartfelt letter expressing his understanding.

"Janice cherished that letter throughout her life." Val said.

Throughout her time at Sandgate State School, Val formed enduring friendships, some of which continue to this day. Val, Leigh, George, Glennis, Alice, and Janice (who passed away a couple of years ago) have been meeting for lunch since 13 July 2011. These gatherings not only allow them to enjoy each other's company but also provide an opportunity to reminisce about their school days, cherishing the moments that have shaped their lives.

New principal, Rebecca Campbell, said she felt privileged to be leading the school during this historic anniversary year.


"How many schools make it to 150 years? Not many, so it really is an honour for me to be here," she said.

"I've lived in Sandgate for more than 20 years, and I've always known it's a special place. We have a strong community, and I've always felt this school is at the heart of Sandgate."

The school will be celebrating the milestone with a Carnival that will feature all the fun of the fair – rides, sideshow alley, a bake stall, plant sale, raffle and more.

"Our 150th committee have been working really hard for the past year to organise this event," Ms Campbell said.

"In our school hall, each 25-year period of the school will have its own stand, with photos and displays.



"There'll also be Devonshire Tea in the hall, so people can catch up with friends and take a walk down memory lane."

The first classes for Sandgate State School were held in the chapel of the Baptist Church in 1873, with the first permanent school building opening the following year.

In 1875, the District Inspector reported the school's "buildings are in good order. The teacher and pupils have cleared the playground to a large extent, and a small flower garden has been enclosed. Swings are provided for the amusement of the scholars. The school is well furnished in all respects, and as a whole this is one of the pleasantest schoolhouses in the colony."

The school's most famous alumni is Australian TV star Kerri-Anne Kennerley.

Ms Campbell added the whole community was invited to celebrate the school's historic anniversary, and see the improvements made to the grounds in recent years.

"Of course, we are hoping to see lots of our former students, parents, principals, and teachers," she said.

"All our former music students are invited to come along and perform with the band on the day as well, which will be something special."

Often we talk about our lives as though we are reporting the news. We think we are presenting the facts about what happened but like news today, a lot is editorialised making them more story than fact.

We forget these "facts" are just beliefs we've adopted about ourselves like:

o l'm no good at math.

o I've never had any self-control when it comes to food.

Negative beliefs undermine our growth. Try helping your children with maths when your beliefs about your maths expertise are laced with judgement.

How much harder is it to lose weight when your story's narrative says you have no selfcontrol?

We believe these thoughts because they are well-rehearsed. They play on repeat in our minds, and we find lots of evidence in our lives to "prove" them.

Learning how to retell your story and change your beliefs takes practice and repetition. You believe and accept the old thoughts not because they are true, but because you accept them as truth. And you listen to them a lot.

You can do the same with new beliefs. It's possible to believe something new about yourself on purpose. In part, it requires deciding to change your thinking and it takes practice.

What new truths can you tell yourself about your life? Your past is just the story you tell, so how can you make yourself a hero?

LUCAS TAKES A SHOT AT SECOND WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

ocal high school student Lucas Fenech will have his eye on the ball when he represents Australia at the World Blackball Championships in Malta next year.

This will be the second time the 16-year-old Deagon resident has represented Australia in blackball, having played for the U15 team at the 2022 World Blackball Championships in France.

Lucas said representing his country at a world championship was an opportunity he never thought he would experience.

"I didn't know what to expect when I played for Australia in the U15 team last year, but it turned out to be a great experience that I will never forget," he said.

"I was both honoured and proud to not only be representing my country at such a high level, but to be playing alongside and sharing the experience with my friends and teammates.

"To have that honour again and relive the awesome experience of representing Australia is something really special."

Lucas earnt his spot on the Australian U18 team following a successful performance at the 2023 Australian National Blackball Championships in Perth.

He finished in fourth place in the U18 Singles and runner-up in the U18 Scotch Doubles final alongside one of his Queensland team mates. He has also been selected as captain of the U18 Australian team.

He first started playing snooker with his grandfather before beginning weekly junior snooker coaching at pool hall, Q-Masters.

He's now been competing in cue sports for four years, playing snooker, billiards, eight-ball and blackball.



"They all have different challenging aspects with rules and ball changes for each, but require similar skills," he said.

In the lead-up to the world championships, Lucas will be working with his coach, Phil Haycock and learning from more experienced players.

He said his goals for the future included being the best he could be, both on and off the table.

"Also to be known and respected as an honest player who always gives more than 100 percent for his team, and supporting my mates the best way I can," he said.

September gardening

opefully you nurtured both yourself and your soil over winter because spring is the time to plant, plant, plant!

September brings mild weather and gentle rain giving the perfect window to plant seeds and seedlings. Before you fill every space, consider your capacity to keep your garden regularly watered in the coming months.


If you didn't start planting tomatoes, capsicum, eggplants, cucumber, zucchini, beetroot, carrots, lettuce, and corn last month, now is the ideal time.

Other fruit and vegetables to plant include pumpkins, watermelons, rockmelons, tamarillos, beans, radish, rosella, okra and choko.

Keep an eye out for heritage varieties - it's fun to grow something different, and important to keep older varieties alive and available. Some have handy qualities such as drought tolerance and better resistance to pests and disease, even if they don't produce as much.

HOP ALONG FOR FUN WITH FROGS

B ayside gardeners should hop to the latest event being hosted by the Keep Sandgate Beautiful Association.

The workshop on frog-friendly gardening aims to help locals make the right choices for their backyards when it comes to attracting amphibians.

Keep Sandgate Beautiful Association secretary, Linda McMahon, said the group had a lot of enquiries about frogs after their display at this year's Einbunpin Festival.

"One of our goals is to promote the conservation of the natural environment and to help people connect with the environment – we've had talks before about kangaroos, and bats, and now frogs," she said.

"If you have frogs in your garden, it shows that the natural systems are working well, and many frog populations are in decline, so whatever gardeners can do to help is great."

Queensland Frog Society Events Coordinator, Jono Hooper, will be conducting the talk.





"One of the main benefits to having frogs in your garden is to keep insects under control," he said.

"There are two important components that frogs need – habitat and shelter. A water source, which can be an old bathtub, a pond, or even a kids clam shell sandpit is great, and I've even seen green tree frogs lay eggs in a bucket of water, so some species aren't too fussy.

"Frog hotels are great – I've seen some pretty magnificent set ups, but it can be just some old PVC pipe buried 30cms in the ground in an area that provides shade.

"Gardeners can also reduce or limit the amount of chemicals they use, provide areas of shelter for frogs and also don't have yards that are too manicured – a flat lawn is not going to provide shelter for frogs."

At the end of the talk, attendees can go outside for a frog hunt, which Jono said was always fun, particularly for children.

"The frog hunt is a really cool way for kids to see the frogs and I find it very rewarding to show people some of the species we've been talking and hearing about," he said.

"The biggest takeaway I think is that the number one risk to frogs, particularly in coastal areas, is habitat degradation – people think it's cane toads, but they're actually further down the list."



eople love running for many reasons, yet what they agree on is how much clearer their mind is and how exhilarated they feel afterwards.

Clive Gross, is no exception. A Sandgate local and engineer, Clive began running early 2019, when he and his family moved to Sandgate. This was a turning point for him as he began recognising the reality of his then lifestyle.



"I was a smoker, eating poorly, drinking and I realised I needed to reform my life," said Clive. "As a dad, I wanted to really play with my kids, not just for 20min here or there. I noticed there was quite an active running community here and it piqued my interest."

Let's face it, when we love something so much, we just want to enjoy it all the time. Right? So even during the pandemic and after multiple race cancellations, Clive and his friends organised the Sandgate Marathon.

Dr Paul

A MAN OF MANY PARTS

f, as Voltaire said, "the art of medicine consists in amusing the patient", then an early Sandgate medical man, Dr Frederic Paul, was the ideal practitioner. From when Dr Paul arrived in Sandgate in about 1887, until he left 12 years later, he was deservedly lauded for both his cultural pursuits and as a physician. As one of the few doctors in the district, his medical work was varied and demanding. His cases included broken bones, snakebite, food poisoning, burns and typhoid as well as mental health issues, such as the man "of apparently unsound mind" who, suffering from hallucinations, was taken to the Sandgate lockup, where Dr Paul "pronounced him insane and recommended his removal to the reception house", that is, the insane asylum.

As health officer for the Sandgate municipality, Dr Paul was responsible for public health, reporting to the council on "the sanitary conditions of the borough" and the management of epidemics such as the measles outbreak of 1898, for the treatment and control of which he, as health officer, was allocated £37 13s. 8d by the council's finance committee. Beyond his medical practice, he served the community as a magistrate at the Sandgate police court and chair of the Sandgate Ratepayers Association. He also stood for election and won a seat on the council.

But it was as a man of culture and a mainstay of the arts that Dr Paul was best known. He was, at various times, an office holder of the Sandgate Literary and Debating Society, the Sandgate regatta committee, the cricket club, the Sandgate Chess Club, the School of Arts and the Sandgate Amateur Dramatic Club.

He was a stalwart of various fund-raising committees to which he lent his talents as an entertainer. In 1895, during a concert in aid of library funds, he and a Mr Jagger performed the quarrel scene from Julius Caesar so effectively that "a number of young people, thinking there was a dispute on, rushed up to the door of the hall in quite an excited state." He was also a musician, accompanying others on the piano, and himself singing at many amateur entertainments.

To the great regret of his fellow citizens, Dr Paul departed Sandgate in 1899, garlanded with praise – and in possession of "a purse of sovereigns" presented in appreciation for his efforts. The popular doctor, said Mayor Bell, "had always given his services willingly to all the institutions of Sandgate". His absence must have been acutely felt.

GINGER CAKE

ember of Sandgate QCWA, Lynette, has provided the recipe for a fabulous Ginger Cake which she made for a Branch meeting last month and members thought they should share it with the Sandgate Guide Community.

"This recipe I copied from my Mothers recipe book 50 years ago when I first started baking, but as with so many inherited recipes it didn't come with any instructions! So this is what's worked for me over the years. A very simple cake, not a lot of work and a good use for any leftover cream".

INGREDIENTS

1 ¼ cups S.R. flour 1 teaspoon ginger powder 1 cup sugar Pinch salt 2 eggs 1 cup cream 1 teaspoon vanilla ¼ cup chopped ginger

METHOD

Grease a 22cm cake tin and preheat a fan forced oven to 170 degrees.

Sift the flour, salt and ginger powder into a bowl, add caster sugar and stir to combine.

In a separate bowl combine the cream, eggs, and vanilla. Stir the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients and combine.

Add the chopped ginger pieces and pour into the prepared tin.

Bake for 40-50 minutes. Cake is cooked when a skewer comes out clean. Let the cake stand in the tin for 5 minutes then turn onto a wire rack to cool completely.

Ice with ginger or lemon icing and sprinkle with extra ginger pieces.






