

he Brighton Foreshore Parklands project is moving forward with the release of a draft concept plan.

Brisbane City Council is now seeking community input and feedback on the four-page plan until Sunday, 17 December.

Deagon Ward Councillor Jared Cassidy said the Brighton Foreshore upgrade had been a priority for him since he was elected.

"I'm really proud to have worked alongside Anika Wells MP to get this long overdue project underway," Cr Cassidy said. "This upgrade will provide a world-class space on the foreshore for locals and visitors alike and will have a real focus on the natural beauty of our area, including more access to the beach."

The Brighton Foreshore Parklands draft concept plan focuses on the linear esplanade section along Flinders Parade and includes Decker Park, Brighton Health Campus and Sandgate Foreshores Park. The proposed improvements aim to enhance the area between the high tide water mark and the Flinders Parade roadway.

Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner said Council was excited to release the draft concept plan for the new and improved Brighton Foreshore.

"Shaped from community input shared earlier this year, the draft plan proposes a number

of options from widening pathways, to increasing shade and improving coastal protection for the foreshore area, so it can remain a relaxed and picturesque part of Brisbane's shoreline," Cr Schrinner said.

Other key enhancements in the plan include a new kerbside pathway, a low seating wall, additional picnic areas and facilities, and improved access to the tidal flats.

Residents will have the opportunity to voice their opinions by completing an online feedback survey, or at in-person information kiosks located in Brighton. These information kiosks will be open on Saturday, 2 December and Sunday, 10 December, from 9am to

11am at the parkland picnic shelter between 11th and 12th Avenues. There will also be an information kiosk on Wednesday, 6 December, from 4pm to 6pm at the Brighton Bowls Club.

"It is really important residents take the time to have their say on this concept, which has been designed based on the initial feedback from the community," Cr Cassidy said.

group of homeschooled kids are taking on the worlds of robotics, science, engineering, and marketing – all by building Lego.

Abi and Jack Degen, Jacob and Eli Wersin, and Riley Jessett were part of the First Lego League Challenge, which took place in late November.

They're known as the Brick Rolled Red team, and together they had to build and code Lego robots, as well as solve a problem through innovation.

"We brainstormed all our hobbies, like crochet, and coding, and beach volleyball," Abi said.

"And we decided there's not enough kids playing beach volleyball, so that's what we solved by making an ad."

The beach volleyball video ad uses Lego and stop motion, as well as live action, to promote the game.

On the day of the competition, their Lego robots had to be built and coded to travel around a special mat, completing missions and challenges along the way – all in just two and a half minutes. schooled.

"Home school is great because you can pretty much do school whenever you want, and there's less curriculum stuff," he said.

"You have more time to do other things that you like."

And according to Abi, homeschooled kids did not miss out on the social aspect of normal school.

"We have lots of park catch ups and there's homeschool groups that meet up all the time, so that's how we all became friends and formed the team," she said.

If the team does well in the regional competition, they can progress to the national championships being held in Gladstone, and from there, the Lego League World Festival, held in the US each year.

"That probably won't happen," Eli said. "But you never know!"

EDITOR UPDATE: As we go to print I have received the great news that BRR Team received two trophies in the regionals and are on their way to Gladstone for Nationals! Good Luck BRR!

This is the second year Abi and Jack have competed in the Lego League Competition, while for the other team members, it's their first time.

Some of the Brick Rolled Red team were coders for the project, and others were builders, but on the day of the competition, all the students had to do both.

Jack said the team was both "nervous and excited" for the event.

And Jacob added taking part in events like the Lego League was one of the advantages of being home-

SANDGATE MP FAREWELLS POLITICS

C tirling Hinchliffe wants everyone to know he's not tired and he's definitely not retiring.

But after 18 years in State Parliament, the Member for Sandgate is hanging up his political hat.

Mr Hinchliffe said the time was right.

"I love what I do, I love what I do in this community, and I'm not 'over it' at all," he said.

"But under the Labor Party rules, it's time to start the pre-selection process for the next election, so I had to make the announcement that I would not be standing again.

"And the main reason I'm not running again is my wife, Megan.

"I was first elected 18 years ago – but really it was 25 years ago that we had this discussion – and Megan agreed to let me pursue this craziness.

"She has been a solid home base for me and for our children, and now it's time for her. I could not have done this job as effectively or as happily without her, I just could not."

Mr Hinchliffe was first elected in 2006 as the State MP for Stafford, but a career in politics was not always on the cards.

"I actually started a teaching degree," he said. "I met a lot of people at teachers' college that were part of the Labor crowd, and to be honest I didn't realise you could just turn up and join the Labor Party, I thought you had to be invited!"

Mr Hinchliffe worked in a Federal MP's office, before working for the Speaker of the Queensland Parliament and spending some time as a property industry analyst.

"Then I met Wayne Swan at a function – before he was the Federal Member for Lilley – and he pulled me aside and said, 'I think you've got the chops for this,'" he said.

He added his family had never been "particularly political" but there was an awareness of keeping up with the news as he grew up.

"My grandmother, Alice Reddy, had nine children, one of whom had a disability and she always said to me that working people need Labor governments," Mr Hinchliffe said.

"My parents were always involved in the community in some way, whether it was the football club or the cricket club, and we always talked about what was on the news.

"And in high school, I started to see that you could be involved in the community and make change."

It was in high school that Mr Hinchliffe met his future wife, although he says they weren't high school sweethearts.

"Megan and I had known each other a long time and she is passionate about Labor politics – she was a policy advisor in the Goss government, she was an advisor to Peter Beattie when he was in opposition," he said.

"Early on, we knew this (politics) was where things were going for us – and you know, it could have been her. But we decided we needed one person to be the front person, and someone else needed to be at home."

A short time into his first stint as a state politician, Mr Hinchliffe found himself in a role beyond being a backbencher.

"I thought I would just settle in, and we would get the feel for how all of this worked, as a family," he said.

"Then 56 days in, there were some events and I ended up being a parliamentary secretary – so this whole time, I have been in executive government, as well as being an MP and that adds to the intensity, it adds to the time you're away from home."

He said his defeat in Stafford in 2012 was a "challenging period".

"I knew the community had shifted against the government of the day and for Stafford, that issue was the health payroll," he said.

"In the lead up to that election, I had a lot of people say to me, 'Thank you for your service', which means, 'Thanks for coming, time to go.'"

The Hinchliffe family – which by now included their three children, Jack, Tom, and May – moved to Sandgate just prior to the 2015 election.

"Our boys were playing basketball with the Northside Wizards, I was on the board, and we were driving from West Chermside to Boondall eight times a week or more," he said.

"We as a family had always come to Sandgate on Christmas Eve to have a picnic on the foreshore and we had a lovely group of friends here, including the person from teacher's college that I had signed up for the Labor Party with – Victoria Newton.

"I thought she was going to run for the State seat, and I said, 'What can I do to help you', and she said, 'Actually, we think you'd be great.'

"That was a contested pre-selection, and I was grateful to have the support from the branch."

Mr Hinchliffe said he had several highlights from his time in politics. "I'm very proud of the amazing facilities and upgrades at our local public schools, particularly the new arts facility at Sandgate High and the K Block at Bracken Ridge High," he said.

"Saving and reimagining the Brighton Health Campus was a real highlight – there is still some work to do there, so I guess that's a bit of unfinished business.

"And on the broader issues, being involved in the 2032 Olympics bid was super exciting."

Mr Hinchliffe said he wanted to see a young woman succeed him as the Labor candidate for Sandgate.

"The demographic of this electorate has changed dramatically and I think we need someone younger in tune with those issues, and more culturally diverse," he said.

"And the Queensland parliament needs more women."

He added he was excited about his remaining 12 months in office and was "honoured" Premier Annastacia Palaszczuk had asked him to stay on in his ministerial portfolios until then.

And what's next for the long-serving MP? Quite simply, a break.

"Megan and I plan on taking a holiday and doing some travel – we got married quite young and had a young family, so we didn't travel in our 20s," he said.

"But I am not retiring, I still have time to have another career and find another way to contribute. I'll always want to contribute to the community, just in something that is not as intense as this job."

The next Queensland state election will be held on 24 Oct 2024.

he new Bill Brown Reserve path in Fitzgibbon is now open to the community and has improved connectivity between Telegraph Road and Roghan Road and access to local businesses and amenities.

For residents travelling to the Bill Brown Sports Reserve Netball Courts, Emily Seebohm Aquatic Centre, skate park, BMX facility and dog park from Hidden World Playground, active travel opportunities have been provided and a safer path for walkers and for cyclists.

It has created more opportunities for residents and visitors to come and enjoy the natural areas and explore on bike or on foot. The track is 850 metres in length, and three metres wide. There are six culverts along it that will improve drainage and a bridge at the Telegraph Road end. The fenced path has LED lighting for safety and wayfinding and line marking.

"This is just one of the many active travel projects we're investing in so more people can enjoy our active, outdoor lifestyle, while taking cars off the road and easing congestion" said Cr Sandy Landers.

"It also provides recreational opportunities for residents and visitors to enjoy our natural areas and explore our city by bike or on foot. It was great to join with locals to officially open the Bill Brown Reserve Shared Path with Lord Mayor Adrian Schrinner" she said.

"The Fitzgibbon Bushland is an important part of our community and sits in the heart of the Bracken Ridge Ward. To join the two suburbs of Bracken Ridge and Fitzgibbon with a more central and guicker connection provides an important link to locals."

FRESH FRUIT KEBABS WITH A SPICY YOGHURT DIP

Prepare fruit kebabs or a platter.

For the dip:

125grms of " lite" cream cheese.6 teaspoons of sugar free citrus marmalade.

- 1 teaspoon of lemon zest.
- 1/4 teaspoon of ground ginger or cinnamon.1 x 200grm tub of reduced fat Vanilla yoghurt.

Beat the cream cheese until "fluffy" then beat in marmalade, lemon zest and spice. Stir the yoghurt through the mixture. Refrigerate in serving bowl (covered) for at least an hour before serving with the fruit.

For a super healthy option use plain Greek yoghurt, stir through some ginger pieces. This makes a refreshing alternative and is quick to prepare!

- 1 cup coconut
- 1 cup icing sugar
- 1 cup mixed fruit
- 1 cup powdered milk

Melt 250gms Copha, pour over combined ingredients and mix well

Spread in a slice tin and press down, smoothing top

Refrigerate overnight or until firm. Cut into squares and store in the fridge.

TRADITIONAL RUM BALLS

Chop 250 grams of Raisins, soak in 2 tablespoons of Rum.

Crush 8 Weetbix in a bowl.

Add 2 tablespoons Cocoa powder, ½ cup of Coconut.

Add soaked raisins and 1 can of Condensed Milk.

Mix thoroughly then roll into small balls roll balls in Coconut to coat them.

Store in an airtight container in the fridge

or singer/songwriter Rexy, winning the Sandgate Youth Festival was just the first step in a hopefully long and successful career.

Rex Fonacier, known professionally as Rexy, was the first solo artist to win in the history of the festival and he said he "honestly didn't believe it" when his name was announced.

"I thought for sure one of the bands was going to win," he said.

"I really couldn't believe it when they announced me as the winner. Like, it's still insane to think about."

The 17-year-old said he had been singing in

choirs since prep and had learnt to play guitar and piano.

"I'd consider the genre of music I write to be indie pop, which I absolutely love," Rexy said.

"But I pull influence from a lot of genres like jazz, R'n'B, hip-hop, rock, and anything else I listen to.

"I'd also say my set list is pretty diverse – it's not all the time you see someone perform a Frank Ocean song and then follow it up with a Frankie Valli tune.

"I love music so much because it's creative and freeing."

Youth Festival organiser, Deagon Ward Councillor Jared Cassidy, said this year's event had been a massive success.

"There's been a huge increase in talent, in skill, and in song choice – this year's festival was better than ever," he said.

"The judges were really blown away, and Rexy was a universally popular choice.

"There were music industry people there in

the crowd, so it's great to see that we're really building this into a way to support young artists."

Rexy is about to graduate from Year 12 at St Patrick's College and has been accepted into the Pop Course at the Queensland Conservatorium of Music.

"Music is such a big part of my life I couldn't see myself doing anything else," he said.

"I really want to try and get out there and share my music to anyone willing to listen.

"Playing shows for people who like me is the real dream.

"I love performing every time I do it and I couldn't imagine stopping that anytime soon, so hopefully one day I'll be touring around playing my own original songs to everyone who wants to listen."

The digital licence includes international standards of security and gives users the ability to only share the information they need to, such as proof of age and no other personal details such as street address.

To download the app, you require the licence you intend to digitise which includes a driver's licence, proof of age card or marine licence and an additional piece of identification including a passport, birth certificate or marriage certificate. 

While this amazing fish is listed as a protected and vulnerable species, I see them quite often while fishing North Pine Dam and the upper reaches of the Brisbane River. They are called lungfish due to their ability to breathe air using a single lung when the water is very low or devoid of oxygen.

Brown to green and an orange belly, with large scales, a flat head, flipper-like fins and a broad eel-like tail they are quite an unusual looking Aussie native. Found only in south east and central Queensland lungfish can grow to more than 1.5 metres and weigh up to 40 kilograms.

Fossil records indicate that the Queensland lungfish has existed in Australia for at least 100 million years, making it a living fossil and one of the oldest living vertebrate genera on the planet.

Around this time of year if you sit quietly when it's calm in the morning at Bullockys Rest on North Pine Dam, you can see them breaking the surface and when they come to the surface for a breath, you can hear the intake and exhalation of air.


