THEY SHALL NOT GROW OLD

HISTORY SANDGATE

ow just names on a war memorial and over 100 years later that is all that remains of them. But once they were sons and brothers from all walks of life: farmers, printers, and shopkeepers.

Ultimately, though, they were soldiers who died in a war the causes, course and outcomes of which are hardly remembered today. Let's recall a few of these lost boys, all dead and buried in France, and those

they left behind.

Private Albert Edward Andresen died on 5 June 1918, aged 20. Albert embarked for the war in December 2016 leaving behind his parents, Nicholas and Maud Andresen of Signal Row, Sandgate (now Shorncliffe). Nicholas and Maud were no strangers to bereavement, having lost their baby daughter - Albert's little sister - Olive Maud, in 1913, aged six weeks. Before enlisting, Albert had been "a devoted officer and worker in the Sunday school" of the Sandgate Methodist Church. In the trenches he gained a reputation



for bravery, but one suspects that that would have been little comfort to his parents.

Sergeant Cedric Austin Bell, killed 14 September 1916, aged 20, was the son of Mr and Mrs E Austin Bell of Flinders Parade, Sandgate. Mr Bell was a certified accountant and Mrs Bell was an indefatigable worker for numerous causes - the Brisbane General Hospital, St Nicolas Church and, during the war, the Red Cross. Cedric sailed from Australia in April 1916. In February of that year, the Sandgate community had held a sendoff for 18 local men who had enlisted. A concert, dancing and refreshments (provided by Mrs Bell's ladies' committee) were provided. Cedric was probably among those being farewelled. After his death, his company commander wrote to Cedric's parents that he had the highest opinion of him "both as a soldier and a man" and that "he was beloved by all who knew him." Again, probably scant solace. Despite her loss, though, Mrs Bell continued to work for the benefit and comfort of soldiers both returned and abroad.

There are many more: Private Alex Macdonald of Sandgate, son and sole support of a widowed mother, who, upon embarkation, allotted three

> shillings of his daily pay to her, died, aged 24, in early 1918. Private George Walton, killed in August 1918, unluckily close to the end of the war, was a member of a musical family and soloist and song leader at the Sandgate Baptist Church.

> These people, soldiers and their families were the victims of a terrible conflict; putting stories to their names illuminates war's true cost.

followed by a parade along Brighton Road, with form up at 8.40am to march at 9am.

Veterans, their families and the community will get to share tales of mates and loved ones who served in all wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations.

"I actually tried to join the army when Korea was on," John said. "It took me about 12 weeks to grow a mustache and my dad signed a paper for me to join. I was 14 or 15 I suppose.

"Unfortunately the recruiting sergeant realised I was only a young bloke.

"He had me on for about six weeks... Eventually he said, 'I know how old you are! Thank you very much.'"

It took John a few extra years to join the army and he went on to serve for 21 years from 1956 to 1977 in the 1 RAR, 3 RAR, 6 RAR and 42 RQR.

There were also two years at jungle warfare school with the British Army, multiple trips to Malaya and time in the Vietnam War including the Battle of Coral-Balmoral.

here are many stories of teenagers faking their age to join the army and John Caruana has one of them.

It took him 12 weeks to grow a mustache in an attempt to fight with his country but he could not fool those in charge.

The Sandgate RSL Sub Branch veteran will be one of many people who will commemorate ANZAC Day on Thursday, April 25.

The dawn service will be held once again at Sandgate War Memorial Park just before 5am and "I was the smallest bloke in the battalion, they made me the policing sergeant," John said. "I looked after my blokes, particularly I worked with the premise that I was pretty hard on people but if they weren't there I wouldn't be there to command.

"I broke my back when I was in Vietnam, I didn't know that at the time but the cold used to get to me when I went to dawn services.

"But now it seems to be warmer so I am looking forward to it, for the comradery."

John eventually retired from the Australian Army as a warrant officer class two to spend time with his late wife Dorothy who he met at Enoggera and their three sons.

He is now a proud great grandfather and war veteran who is a familiar face at Sandgate RSL Sub Branch events including monthly morning teas, meetings and social nights held on the first Friday of each month at 4.30pm.

Sandgate Toastmasters is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year, while worldwide the organisation is commemorating its centenary.

Local member John Topping said the Sandgate branch started in May 1974, with citizens from the 4017 business community joining up.

"Toastmasters started in the United States, and initially it was just men, but women were finally allowed to join in 1973," John said.

"For a lot of people, public speaking is their number one fear, so they join because they might have an event coming up – like a business presentation or a speech at a wedding – and they want to know how they can best approach it."

John added Toastmasters was a supportive environment.

"Every meeting has a different theme, and new members are encouraged to start small – everyone gets a chance to speak," he said.

"I found it very welcoming. No one sits in a corner. Everyone gets a mentor.

"Your first speech is called an 'ice breaker' and that can be on any topic you like. Everyone is evaluated, but in a positive way." Marlene Hatton is one of the original members of the Sandgate branch.

"Before women were officially allowed to join, a lot of women just joined up anyway using men's names – and then they had to re-join after women were allowed in," she said.

"I joined because it sounded like fun, and we do have fun. We do learn a lot from what our members talk about at each meeting, and it's a valuable skill to have."

John said Toastmasters was for anyone aged over 18 and encouraged young people to sign up.

"It's great for advancing your career, and Toastmasters is gaining a lot of growth in Asia, because people there see the benefit of being able to speak in English," he said.

"Locally, we're a strong club.

"There's a certain structure that goes with Toastmasters, and Sandgate has been what's known as President's Distinguished for the past four years and Select Distinguished for the past 10 years."

Sandgate Toastmasters meets on the second and fourth Tuesday of each month at 7pm at the RSL Sub-Branch Hall, 12 Burnett Place, Sandgate.

Preparing to enter the housing market

n previous editions we spoke about getting into the housing market, and today we will work through some of the schemes and initiatives that are available to Home Buyers.



• Home Guarantee Scheme: this allows eligible Home Buyers to purchase a home with as little as 5% deposit.

Usually, home buyers with less than 20% deposit would be required to pay "Lenders Mortgage Insurance" (LMI). Under the First Home Guarantee however, the

Government is guaranteeing the loan and so in essence paying the LMI. This could save you up to \$25,000 in LMI fees.

This incentive is for houses up to \$700,000 in Metro QLD and \$550,000 in Rural QLD Applicants can be First Home Buyers or previous homeowners who haven't owned a property in Australia in the past 10 years.

This previously was only available to singles or partners, but now siblings can apply.

• Family Guarantor Support: This is a Bank/Lender initiative for Parents/Family Member(s) to help their children get into the property market.

A Guarantor is someone, for example Parents/ Family Member(s), who can help secure a home loan by agreeing to offer their own property as additional security for the home loan.

Both the deposit/equity loan and the main purchase home loan are in the Buyer's name, and the Parents/Family Member(s) as the Guarantor. It is becoming more difficult to save a deposit currently with the rent as high as it is, so this is a very popular initiative.

There are many terms and conditions with each individual Bank/Lender, so I would recommend doing your research or contacting a Mortgage Broker to discuss your options.

The middle-grade novel, aimed at children between the ages of 8 to 12, was published by Walker Books last month and launched at a special event at Sandgate Town Hall.

Annaleise said Losing the Plot was rejected by publishers twelve times before it was finally accepted.

"That's par for the course for children's writers," she said. "Often when we submit our work, we don't hear back from the publishers at all, because they get such a huge volume of submissions.

"But I had come close several times with this particular story – a few publishers had requested the full manuscript but it had never gotten quite over the line with them."

She met her publisher at the CYA Conference, an annual writing event in Brisbane.

"From the enthusiasm she showed for my story, I knew right away that this time it was going somewhere," she said. "I think that's what we're all waiting for – someone who completely gets what we're trying to do. "I was very determined to become an author and just kept steadily working towards that dream."

Losing the Plot tells the story of two modern-day children who find themselves in the world of Grimms' original fairy tales.

"We know the original versions of those stories are a lot darker and scarier than the versions that are often told now...so, I wondered, what skills would those modern-day kids need?" Annaleise said. "What would their interactions with the fairytale characters be like? Would the fairytale characters even know they were fairytale characters? That was the initial seed of the idea."

For aspiring authors, Annaleise recommends reading lots, joining a writer's group and thinking outside the box to achieve their goals.

"Consider whether there are any aspects of becoming an author that you don't feel confident about and figure out how to address those things," she said. "For example, if you need to

improve your writing skills or learn how to use social media, take a course.

> "Be proactive and think of creative ways to work towards your dreams, whatever they may be."

hings are certainly blooming at the Brighton Handmade Collective, with a new garden centre set to open this month.

Business owner, Sara Boase, said she was delighted to be expanding the space on Brighton Road.

"The garden centre will run the length of the building and out into the backyard, it's probably around 100 square metres," she said.

"We're thrilled and the locals are so excited – as soon as you say, 'garden centre' people's heads whip around.

"This will double our footprint and we're excited to be offering this new addition."

Qualified horticulturist and landscaper, Harrison Schell, will be running the garden centre.

He has been a part of the Brighton Handmade Collective since the beginning and has been planning the garden centre expansion for some time.

"There will be lots of indoor plants, and we will also be dabbling in chillies and other produce plants," Harrison said.

"People can expect to see terrariums, carnivorous

plants, and some larger landscaping plants, along with specialised soil and fertiliser."

Harrison added gardening had become a popular hobby in recent years, with the rise of "plant mamas" on Instagram contributing to the craze. "The thing about gardening is, it's the joy of caring for something and the peace of mind it brings – it takes you away from the mundane life stuff," he said.

"You can create your own little sanctuary and there's a social side to it too. It's a hobby lots of people relate to and people can learn from each other, they trade plants and tips."

Harrison has spent a large part of his career in garden design and installation, and that service would also be on offer in the new garden centre.

"People will be able to come here and talk to me about those bigger gardening plans, those big plant installs, and to have that here locally is going to be great," he said.

"A lot of the bigger plant centres don't offer that kind of landscaping advice, so hopefully people will take advantage of that.

The garden centre will officially launch with an open day.

COMMUNITY RALLIES BEHIND LOCAL'S FUNDRAISING FOR CANCER RESEARCH

ocal resident Karen Broadhurst is reaching out to her community to help fundraise for a cause that is near and dear to her heart.

Karen and her partner Rich Hodgson have signed up for the Box Rallies, the largest community-based fundraiser for the Cancer Council in Australia, after learning that their close friend has terminal cancer.

Karen said her friend, Amy Roberts, had been diagnosed with stage 4 inflammatory breast cancer last year at the age of 54.

"I was in Thailand when she phoned to tell me," she said. "I was shocked.

"We met about 14 years ago. She was looking to buy our house and we just clicked."

Karen and Rich will be participating with the team name Restless Gypsies in the Sh*tbox Rally, a 3200 journey from Bendigo to Townsville in a car worth just \$1500. The dynamic duo, both in their sixties, will travel from 19 to 25 October on some of the most formidable roads in Australia to raise awareness and funds for cancer research in honour of Amy and others affected by the disease.

The Box Rallies, founded in 2009, have raised more than \$38 million for cancer research. All teams must raise a minimum of \$5000 to participate, with most teams hoping to surpass that target.

At the time of going to print, the Restless Gypsies had raised \$3500 and were actively seeking support from the community to reach their goal.

Karen said they were planning fundraising events, including a Bunnings sausage sizzle, and were also hoping people would donate online at their fundraising page.

"Unless we raise \$5000 we cannot go," Karen said. "We can't do this without your help. Every little bit helps."

Karen also reached out to local businesses like the Full Moon Hotel, JK Electrical and Bridgestone Sandgate for sponsorship and they have stepped up to support the cause.

"It's fabulous they are supporting us," she said. "They are both very involved with the community. We can't do it without them." Amy and her husband Greg, residents of Canberra, are also participating in the rally and have raised an impressive \$14,000 for cancer research so far.



FRESH FACE FOR LABOR IN SANDGATE

s State Member for Sandgate, Stirling Hinchliffe prepares to exit the political arena, the Labor Party have announced Bisma Asif as their candidate for this year's Queensland election.

The 27-year-old public policy advisor lives in Sandgate with her husband, and said she was excited to be running for office.

"Sandgate is one of the best places I've lived in, it's so unique," Bisma said. "It's an amazing, vibrant area, and I want to see it grow and flourish."

Bisma has an economics degree majoring in public policy from the University of Queensland, and currently works as a policy advisor for Federal MP for Lilley, Anika Wells.

"I've never been put off or been scared by the prospect of being a woman in politics," she said.

"Here in Queensland, we have such amazing examples – women like Anika, like Kate Jones, like Megan Scanlon – it's inspiring.

"I became interested in politics at university, when I worked on (former Lilley MP) Wayne Swan's campaign. I understand that good government can make an impact on people's lives."

After being endorsed by the party, Bisma has started door-knocking ahead of the state election.

"Going door to door can be daunting, but people

are so friendly, and I've found that if people are going through something, they want to share that, they want to talk about it with you," she said.

"Stirling has been such a tireless advocate for this area and seeing his example, it's really about talking to people about what their issues are.

"I want to hear from the people of the 4017 about what is important to them."

The latest public opinion polls paint a daunting picture for the current government, but Bisma said the only poll that mattered to her was election day.

"I'm talking to people about the issues that matter to them, and my job is to get on with it, meet people, and we will see what happens in October," she said. "Walking around with Stirling, everyone wants to stop and talk to him, and I hope I can be the same kind of representative that people can talk to and make positive change."

Bisma's family moved to Australia from Pakistan when she was eight years old, and she speaks four languages.

"My parents wanted a better life for us, and a better education, and I'm so lucky to have had that," she said. "I hope they're proud – their advice to me has always been, 'just be a good human' and really, that's all any of us can do."

The Queensland State election is scheduled to be held on October 26.

"They said, 'You can go in the 2000 metre, 1000 metre, 500 metre and the 300 metre,' and ended up with three golds and one silver.

"The lady who got the gold in the 500 metre said to me, 'Oh, I'm sorry you didn't get the clean sweep,' and I said, 'Don't worry, I've never even done this before!'"

Rowing might be a new sport, but when it comes to swimming, chasing the black line has been a lifelong love for Claire.

"I started swimming when I was four and swam all through high school, but you know as you grow up you get jobs and I'm a mum and you do other things," she said.

"I took it up again in June last year when I joined the Belgravia Masters team at Burpengary.

"I find swimming so soothing, it's relaxing – I'd rather swim than walk around the block."

Claire's 13-year-old son also swims, putting in the laps at the Emily Seebohm Centre in Bracken Ridge.

She added it was never too late to start some form of exercise.

"I'd say to people, just do it," Claire said.

"Don't procrastinate, you've got nothing to lose. For the first few months, I was so tired, but now it's great.

"I'd tell people it's never too late, just sign up for six months and see how you go."

Claire recently met with Sandgate MP Stirling Hinchliffe to talk about her experiences at the Masters Games.

"I just want to give a big shout-out to my family, and my team, we had raffles at work to help get me there, and I had help from Stirling and local councillors as well, so I just want to really extend my appreciation to everyone for cheering me on," she said.

"I'll definitely be going back for next year's Games."



ORGANIC GARDENING IN APRIL

ompanion plants - useful herbs and flowers for a super healthy garden.

Achieve your goal of an abundant, healthy garden without the use of chemical fertilisers or toxic insecticides through companion planting.

These herbs and flowers make great companion plants for various reasons –

- Pyrethrum repels bugs.
- Basil helps repel flies and mosquitoes.
- Garlic keeps aphids away from roses.
- Mint repels cabbage white moth.

• Rue (Rutus, not Peganum) keeps cats and dogs off garden beds if planted round the borders.

• Nasturtium attracts pollinators. The flowers repel aphids.

• Chamomile gives strength to its neighbour plants, deters flies and mosquitoes.

• Elderberry is a general insecticide, also the leaves encourage compost fermentation. Make a lovely wine with the flowers and berries!

• Fennel (not F. vulgare or F. officionale) repels flies, fleas and ants.

• French Marigold root secretions kill nematodes in the soil. Will repel white fly amongst tomatoes.

• Sage protects cabbages from cabbage white moths.

• Tansy (Tanacetum, not Senecio) repels moths, flies and ants.

Autumn plantings include lots of leafy greens (mizuna, lettuce, cabbage, spinach, rocket etc), potatoes, carrots, beetroot, broccoli, cauliflower, tomatoes, chilli, and garlic.

Protect your precious seedlings with some of the suggested herbs and flowers so you get fed more than the bugs.





How to keep hearing aids sounding new?

Hearing aids are usually sitting inside the ear canals, probably for 10 hours a day or more, where sebaceous glands and apocrine glands produce oil and sweat. The body temperature can also warm up the hearing aids. They are also exposed to dust, dead skin and interference from the hairs inside the ears. All these factors result in hearing aids becoming weak and muffled. Therefore, it is very important to keep your hearing aids clean. Follow these steps below to keep your hearing aids in tip-top condition.

- 1. Wipe the hearing aids with cleaning wipes.
- 2. If your hearing aids are fitted with wax filters, replace them regularly.
- 3. Some hearing aids and ear moulds are fitted with air vents. The vent size is usually small and can be easily blocked. Inserting a cleaning wire or using an air blower will unblock the air vent.
- 4. Purchase a D-Dryer device equipped with a UV light to kill the germs on your hearing aid's surface and to remove moisture.
